Murray credits Alderman Paul Henningsen, a downtown ward, for the city's role. "Anyone sexually active should get tested for AIDS on a regular basis."

Eldon reports, "Henningsen's first election twenty or so years ago, with a margin of eighty votes, was due in large part to our organizing in the gay community, and Paul has never forgotten it."

SAGE/Milwaukee (Senior Action in a Gay Environment) is Eldon Murray's latest organizational project, and it will become one year old very soon. Boasting a membership of 83 at interview time in mid-September, Murray says "older people must pass the torch to younger folks, and getting old comes faster than you think, I assure you!" The organization is in the process of setting goals for the fall-winter season. SAGE is open to all ages, Eldon stressed, and passes along its address: P.O. Box 92482, Milwaukee, WI 53202. (Eldon returned to Milwaukee from a New York SAGE ideas meeting on September 25.)

To young people who think they might be gay or lesbian, Murray's advice is that they "need to determine where their head is; a couple of same sex encounters might not tell the answer. I would strongly urge counseling, and, if they are convinced they are gay or lesbian, to come out; it's a lot easier today than it was in the '70s. Don't hide in the closet if it's unnecessary. There's a lot of support out there for you."

PFLAG (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) gets a big boost from Eldon. "They can help you, particularly on how to come out to your family and friends, the first step." Unlike groups that promote hatred and homophobia under the guide of 'family values,' PFLAG celebrates the true family values of unconditional love and acceptance. (PFLAG, 1012 14th St., N.W., Suite 700, Washington, DC 20005; Tele. 202/638-4200)

1994 being an election year, QUEST's interviewer succeeded in getting some political thoughts from pioneer Murray, who repeatedly stated, "I do not take political positions!"

On President Clinton: "The gay community is largely responsible for his election...he may not have gone into the White House without our votes and money." Murray praised the President for his many appointments of gays to high positions, many of whom he met at the Victory Dinner in New York to celebrate the 25th anniversary of Stonewall this past summer. Murray continues, "President Clinton bungled the gays in the military issue, and many of us are disappointed about that, of course. If given another term, in the latter part of a second term, he'd have an opportunity to issue an executive order on the gays in the military issue, and say 'screw you'."

Regarding the U.S. Senate race in Wisconsin this year, Murray said Senator Herb Kohl has "disappointed an awful lot of gay people," and said he "won't vote for Kohl or his Republican opponent, Robert T. Welch, in November. I might write in a candidate should someone come forward." Murray was strongly critical of Kohl, saying "he voted with Senator Jesse Helms on the 'don't ask - don't tell' matter," and that Kohl doesn't answer our letters or return calls to explain why. Of candidate Welch, Murray said he's "about as far right as you can get, almost fundamentalist church."

Murray is pro-Tammy Baldwin (State Rep., Madison Democrat), says he'll "vote for Dorothy Dean, a straight woman and good friend of the gay community, for lieutenant governor this November." (Dean was feted at the same time as Murray at PrideFest for her work in our favor; also serves on the SAGE advisory board.)

Acknowledging the Log Cabin Club, gay Republicans, Murray said "moderate Republicans are not necessarily anti-gay," and said Governor Thompson, "probably a shoo-in for re-election, is lukewarm on gay issues."



All are welcome.





PIONEER ELDON E. MURRAY; AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW



Eldon E. Murray, a pioneer of the gay movement in Milwaukee as well as the U.S.A., granted QUEST an exclusive interview covering a wide range of subjects recently — the beginning of the Gay People's Union, the start-up of the Brady Street Clinic (BESTD), the early history of MAP, more recently the launching of SAGE/Milwaukee, advice for young people on coming out of the closet, more political comment this election year than he's accustomed to making ("I am not a politician!), comments about being gay in the '70's, etc.

You may recall that Eldon Murray was feted at PrideFest this summer for a quarter century of work (a pioneer) in the movement! Eldon quotes John F. Kennedy's definition of a 'pioneer' as 'the guy with the arrows in the back....the Indian stuck full of arrows,' which was attributed to JFK in 1956 when passed over as the Democratic Party's vice presidential nominee. Does it hurt?, someone reportedly asked, and the future president replied, 'only when I laugh!'

Eldon will turn 65 on March 1. He makes his living as a stock broker, owns and lives in a lovely old Victorian house on the east side of Milwaukee and freely proclaims he does not have a college degree, but does have a high school diploma!

Eldon was the principal founder of Gay People's Union 25 years ago. "GPU started because a number of us were deeply concerned about gay rights and we thought other 'rights groups' — the Gay Liberation Front, later the Gay Liberation Organization — were rather radical and did not present a fair image of the gay and lesbian community." GPU sponsored the first public seminar about simply being gay in 1970 at the Schroeder Hotel (now the Marc Plaza); it was indeed the major local story of that week and featured the nationally known gay activist, Franklin Kameny, as the principal speaker.

Eldon speaks of being the first gay person to appear on local television about that time, in fact on WTMJ (channel 4). "They offered to disguise me...give me false whiskers, a mask, black me out, change my voice, all of that....but I rejected all, of course, explaining I may be gay, but I'm not a criminal!"

The Brady Street Clinic, now known as the BESTD Clinic, followed in 1974 when "there was an outbreak of syphilis in the community." Eldon was most instrumental in raising the necessary funds!

Ten years ago, Eldon informed QUEST, the Milwaukee Aids Project was born. "Raising money to get it started was quite a challenge." An initial \$15,000 was from the City of Milwaukee, another \$15,000 from Milwaukee County (matching funds), and Eldon made con-
