Wonderful! Another issue of QUEST and yet another chance for me to climb onto my soap-box and bitch about the current state of dance music!

Today's topic - Great Dance Music with music videos that really suck! In the 'quest' by the record companies to have their dance music played on radio, the newest trick is to put our several versions of a record. The difference this time is the radio version is very slow, and the "good" dance version is much faster. Even Madonna got into the act releasing "Secret" as a slow dance ballad, fortunately Rockamerica reworked this one using the fast dance version.

If the record companies feel they must disguise the dance music to trick radio jocks into playing it, fine, but don't forget the rest of us.

In the past three months, at least four songs have been released on music video, each using the slow version of the song. The latest, "Mama Said" by Carleen Anderson. Since it took so long to get this video in the first place, why didn't they use the very successful K-Klass Remix?

I would say to the record companies; "There is life out there other than MTV & VHI! If you can afford to re-mix your music with faster versions aimed for the dance floor, remember to also create a video version for the dance video bars. We can't just speed the thing up, whereas, in the studio, you can! Be warned, dance clubs are already polarized on whether or not to use music video or stay with vinyl. There already is a lack of good dance video, and the latest practice of using the radio version, which is too slow, now makes the argument to forget about video even stronger!" I know video works, and it infuriates me when I have to bypass a great video because the audio portion is not the best version available.

The February Rockamerica Dance Reel is chock full of familiar favorites from the past as the trend to either re-release, re-work or do a cover of dance hits of the 70's and early 80's picks up steam — Blondie's "Atomic" is re-released with a Rockamerica Remix. Gloria

Estefan has done a dance version of "Everlasting Love," Thelma Houston has been totally re-worked on this release of her classic "Don't Leave Me this Way" and Newton does a great new version of "Sky High!" Each is a must see!

There are also a couple of songs that were slow to come to video. Livin Joy's "Dreamer" has been out for a while. I loved this song and the video is even better. Techno influences the video features non-stop quick edits of the lead singer in first one hairdoo, then another — the doos and outfits are nothing new; we've seen the same in dance videos from the early 80s, but the technical quality is much better!

The other cut slow to be released is Messiah's "I Feel Love." This is also a 70's cover version, this time a Donna Summer classic, but very techno. The video reminds me of a bad night at The Mental Health Center. Imagine long hallways with flourescent lights, but the walls are a hideous glossy lipstick pink! And all these women crawling around on their knees!


