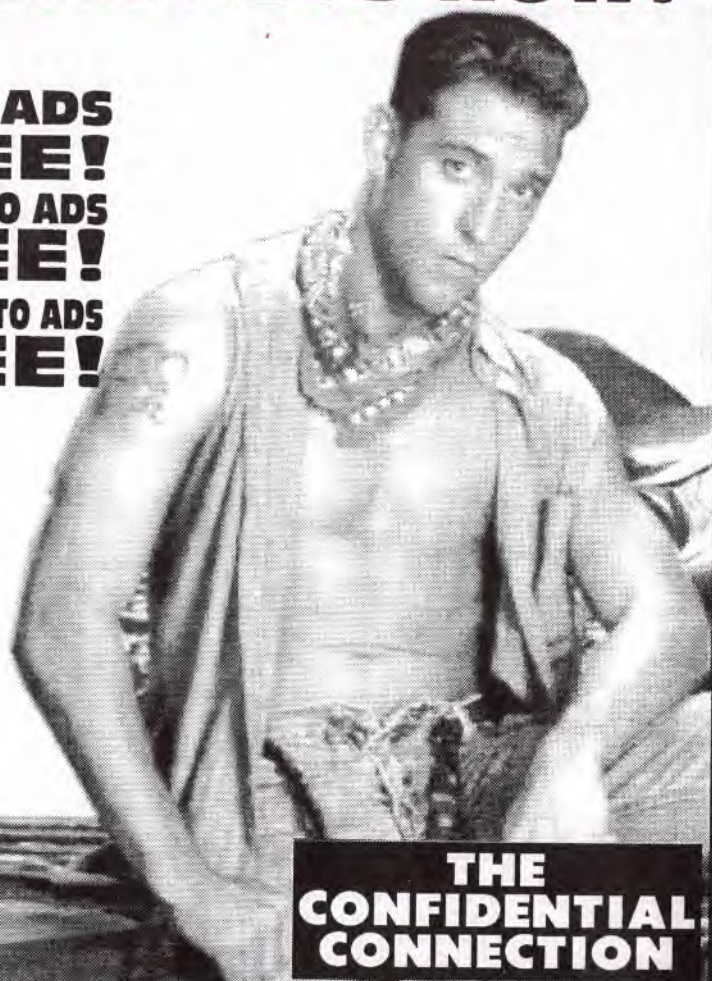

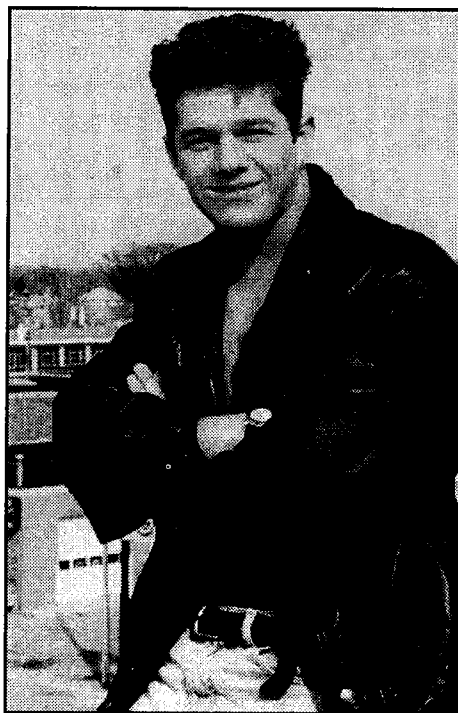

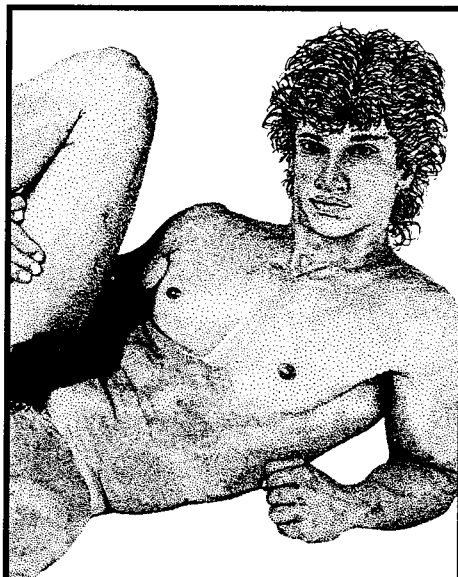

~ Prevention efforts must address profound
 emotional/psychological issues affecting HIV-
 negative gay and bisexual men that may be
 causing them to risk their lives.

~ Prevention must be redefined; the emphasis
 should shift from disseminating facts to helping
 people explore their sexual motivations and pri-
 orities.

~ Building stronger gay/lesbian/bisexual com-
 munities and combating homophobia are essen-
 tial to fighting the spread of AIDS in these pop-
 ulations.

~ HIV is a lesbian issue: there are disturbingly
 high rates of HIV among certain populations of
 lesbian and bisexual women.

~ More and better research and evaluation is
 needed; existing prevention programs have too
 often failed to incorporate research or undergo
 meaningful evaluation.

~ Gay and lesbian communities must be willing
 to critically re-examine their own norms.

~ Gays, bisexuals and lesbians in differing
 racial, regional, and age populations have differ-
 ent prevention needs and need resources to
 design their own prevention strategies.

"The gay community and AIDS organizations
 must start demanding adequate prevention
 resources for gay and bisexual men," says
 Schatz. He described as "tragic; but typical" a
 study showing that only 9% of prevention dol-
 lars in California target gay and bisexual men
 even though nearly 80% of the AIDS cases in
 the state have taken place among this popula-
 tion. "We've been afraid to ask for what we
 deserve: AIDS organizations don't want to

appear too focused on homosexually-transmitted
 AIDS," noted Schatz. "As a result, gay HIV
 prevention issues have often fallen through the
 cracks."

Summit co-chair Alvin Novick, MD, added
 that the report has an equally important goal:
 redefining prevention. "For prevention to be
 effective in 1995, we must understand the con-
 text of the lives of gay and bisexual men and
 what we are feeling. While some of us still need
 basic information about condoms and safer sex,
 more of us need help in finding the motivation
 to incorporate what we already know into our
 lives," noted Novick, who chairs GLMA's AIDS
 Task Force.

The summit report details the findings of an
 intensive two and one half day meeting that took
 place in July, 1994, in Dallas. One hundred and
 fifty U.S. and Canadian community leaders,
 AIDS activists and scholars participated in the
 invitational event. Funding for the summit was
 provided by the Office of AIDS Research of the
 National Institutes of Health, the U.S. Centers
 for Disease Control and Prevention, the
 American Foundation for AIDS Research, the
 Kaiser Family Foundation, The Robert Wood
 Johnson Foundation, and the members of
 GLMA.

HIV/AIDS UPDATE:

**New study projects majority of
U.S. gay men will become infected**

(San Francisco/GLMA)-A report recently
released by the Gay and Lesbian Medical
Association (GLMA) warns that massive num-
bers of gay, bisexual and lesbian Americans and
Canadians will become newly infected with the
HIV virus unless dramatic new steps are taken.

Entitled, "The Silent Crises: Ongoing HIV
Infections Among Gay Men, Bisexuals and
Lesbians at Risk," the 108-page report presents
the results of the first broad-based summit of
scholars and community leaders ever convened
to address prevention in the gay community.
Alarming, the report cites a study projecting
that a majority of young, HIV-negative gay and
bisexual men in the U.S. will eventually become
infected.

According to summit co-chair and GLMA
Executive Director Benjamin Schatz, the goal of
the report is to help re-awaken the community to
the severity of new infections and to place the
issue at the top of community and national agen-
das. "Despite the popular perception that AIDS
has moved out of the gay community and that
gay men are somehow taken care of, nothing
could be farther from the truth. Unless serious
action is taken, far more gay men will become
infected in the years to come that have been
infected to date," he said.

The report identifies key themes and urgent
priorities that emerged from the summit:

~ The rate of new infections among gay and
bisexual men is staggering, particularly among
men of color and youth; reversing this must be -

As a statewide congress for human rights, Action Wisconsin educates and informs local and state elected representatives and politicians about issues important to the lesbian and transgendered community.

The meeting is open to the public.

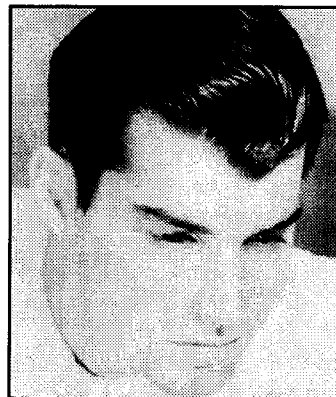

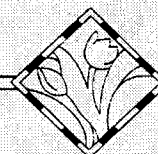

enjoy. The Grinkeys' battle took them to the Wisconsin Supreme Court, into the pages of USA TODAY and into newspapers nationwide via syndicated lesbian columnist Deb Price. It also left them deeply in debt and feeling isolated.

"We were just standing out there by ourselves," says Annie, a Brown County sheriff's deputy who seeks legal recognition as the co-parent of Georgie's daughter, Angel. "It gets kind of lonely."

The Grinkeys' battle is far from over. After losing in June at the state Supreme Court, they're starting over in Brown County with a new strategy. The Grinkeys' next hearing is set for late May. If they win, the couple will have the security of knowing Angel will be able to continue living with Annie - and won't be ripped out of her home - if anything happens to Georgie.

They'll also be able to better provide for her in practical ways, like getting her covered under Annie's Brown County Sheriff's Department insurance.

Until now, the Grinkeys have been battling alone, partly because Green Bay's gay-lesbian organizations were in their infancy. The oldest, Northern Womyn, didn't elect its first board of directors until April 1991.

Even now, Annie Grinke is skeptical about how well the area's traditionally closeted community will support them. Contemplating the possibility that hundreds may show up May 19 to help she and Georgie, Annie says "It's like

I've got to see it to believe it."

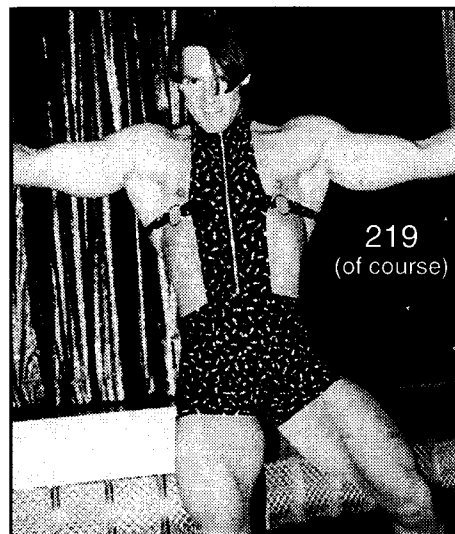

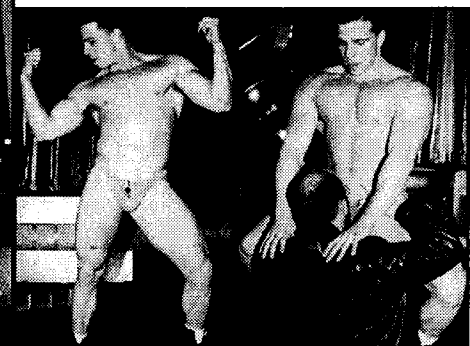
