"KEEP HOPE ALIVE"

Healing Hope and Holistics By Jimmy C. Foster

It is common knowledge that AIDS is an incurable condition. It is described as progressive, irreversible and, to reiterate, without cure. This epidemic has been raging now for about fifteen years. Summing up the situation in 1995, in the words of Mark Konlee at "Keep Hope Alive", "Next to nothing has been accomplished." With all the bilions of dollars applied to research, fifteen years later we have a very, very narrow approach to treatment. This approach which consists, in the main, of what are called nucleosides, continues to be under intense debate both within and outside medical circles. The pharmaceutical manufacturers, starting with Burroughs Wellcome, cite (from principally their own studies and statistics) life-extending benefits from treatment with these DNA terminators. The first drug in this class to be 'fast-tracked' to AIDS suffers, was AZT. Since its introduction, the AIDS establishment has rushed onto the market DDI, DDC, D4T, 3TC and now, Nevrepine. DDI was introduced in 1989 with virtually no trials/studies conducted on it. This drug, it is worthy to mention, is more cytotoxic than AZT. What do these drugs share in common? They are alike, slight vari-

ations on AZT. Interestingly, side-effects produced by these drugs mimic some of the same symptomology produced by AIDS itself! AIDS research has centered and stalled on first, the development of more variations on AZT, and, secondly, finding combinations among these drugs to "enhance efficiency" in slowing viral replication.

Mark's response to this: "And this is considered credible science? Mixing and matching drugs in a similar class? Spending billions in the last two vears attempting to find a most "optimal" cocktail?" Mark will remind his listeners of something that is iust simply unavoidable. That is, with all these drugs in use to combat AIDS, either singly or in combinations of two or more, the morality rate of this conditions continues unabated. Mark also cites significant studies that indicate no life-extending benefits from these drugs at all. Two well-conducted studies are, first, the 1989 VA study on AZT and the European Concorde study of 1993, both concluding that AZT offers no benefits to AIDS sufferers, and indeed does not prolong life.

Mark, sweeping aside the entire 'establishment' approach, thinks he has a better one. An approach that is sensible, sane and delivers results. He claims that he can solidly support these claims - and apparently he can do just that. His approach is this: rather than attempt to inactivate the immune





Dinner date a smash, court date a dud More than a hundred supporters primarily from northeast Wisconsin joined Georgie and Annie Grinkey May 19 to raise over \$2700 at the "Help Adopt Angel" Benefit dinner and concert at the Swan Club in DePere.

"It was wonderful evening, seeing all these people coming out to support us," Georgie said. "The gay community really showed it cared about what we're going through."

In addition to the large turnout from the Green Bay and Fox Cities gay communities, a significant number of straight supporters from the Grinkeys' church also attended.

The combined proceeds from the dinner, silent auction and donations will be used to offset the nearly \$12,000 in legal bills generated by the couple in their ongoing effort to have Annie legally recognized as Angel's co-parent.

Those bills have continued to climb as a result of a new round of court hearings earlier this month, in which circuit court Judge William M. Atkinson denied the Grinkeys' latest motion, which would have permitted Georgie to relinquish her parental rights as the natural mother and then granted the adoption to both Georgie and Annie as a same gender couple, following recent precedents for same-gender couple adoptions in other Wisconsin courts.

The event featured a silent auction of items donated by dozens supportive Green Bay area businesses and individuals. Auction items fea-

tured original artwork, dining and weekend getaway packages and an autographed Packer football.

The evening was both entertaining and informative, featuring music by Madison entertainer Mary Waitrovich and a legal update on the Grinkeys' case and its impact by attorney Judy Newton.

Ms. Newton stressed the larger issue of the case was the legal recognition of "families in fact" which can include same gender couples but also other basic units of people connected genetic, affectional and other ties. Ms. Newton also encouraged gay couples to substitute the term "same gender" for "same sex" when they speak of their relationships because those relationships primarily concern everyday affectional ties rather than the periodic episodes of sexual activity.

The May 19 benefit, sponsored by Northern Womyn, Positive Voice, GLEEDA, Brandy's II, SASS and the Pivot Club, was the first community-wide fundraiser for the Grinkeys. Another fundraising show tentatively scheduled for late October is now in the planning stages.
