

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Together in Pride. What does that mean? In October of 1990 at the International Association of Gay Pride Coordinators Conference, I voted for that slogan as the International Theme mostly because it sounded better to me than any of the other suggested ideas. Over the past nine months, I hope I have discovered a deeper meaning behind that phrase.

To me, Together in Pride means that every person who considers himself a part of the Lesbian/Gay/Bisexual community will be given the opportunity to fully self-express their pride or self respect without fear of reprisal either from within our communities or from society at large. Whether Black or White, Male or Female, HIV+ or -, Drag or Leather, we must never judge that one person's sense of Pride or self respect is any less valid than another's.

I believe it is time to set the past aside and to create a new vision of the future. One that is inclusive rather than exclusive. We must each, in our own way, set aside the prejudices we have acquired whether they be racial, gender based or other. By working Together in Pride we can create a community that is supportive and nurturing for all of its diverse elements.

THE 1991 LOGO DESIGN

The 1991 Logo Design winner was submitted by Ms. Cynthia L. Lampman of Racine, a Quality Control Inspector in the plastics industry. Cynthia loves cartooning and has produced animated television commercials. She gave the following account of how she developed this year's logo.

"While remembering the 1990 Pride Parade, I vividly recall how the color guard leading the parade were verbally and emotionally harassed by a black minister and various others identified as fundamentalist Christians -- or so their picket signs suggested. This minister walked the parade route continually demanding (shouting) that the members of the color guard 'put that flag down, you don't deserve to carry that flag, the American Flag does not belong to you.'" Lampman further said that "through my design, I wanted to portray community, solidarity, and a feeling of strength by having the 'walking' lambdas carrying 'our' flag. I do not want anyone telling me and other members of the gay and lesbian community which flag(s) 'belong' to us."

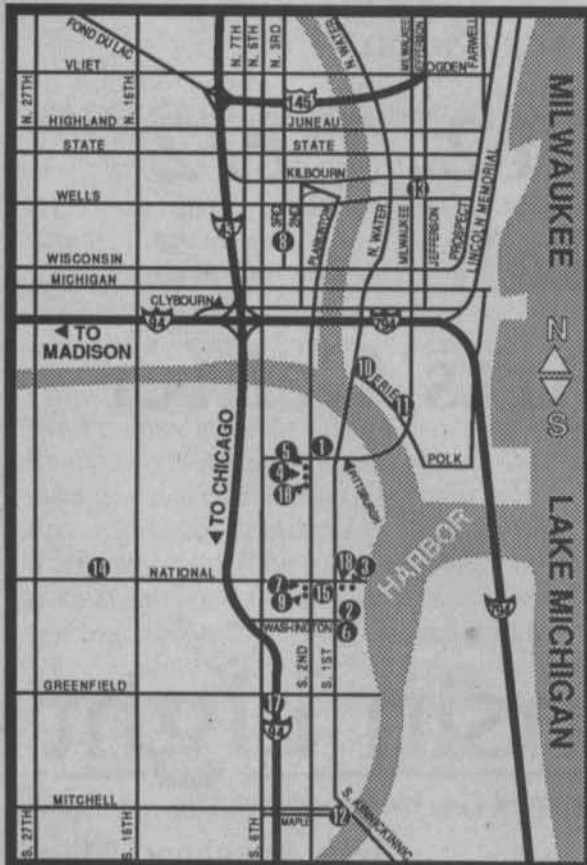

RALLY SPEAKERS

State Representative David Clarenbach (D-Madison) is Speaker Pro Tem of the Wisconsin State Assembly and has served in the legislature for nearly 18 years. In 1972, David was elected to two terms on the Dane County Board of Supervisors, and in 1974 he served on the Madison City Council. That same year, he was elected to the Assembly, representing east and central Madison.

As a member of the Assembly, David has chaired two standing committees — Tax Exemptions in 1979 and Government Operations in 1981. Since 1983, David's colleagues have elected him Speaker Pro Tem. He is the senior member of Dane County's delegation to the Assembly and is the ranking Democrat on the Labor and Agriculture Committees.

David chairs the Special Committee on Reform of Health Insurance and is a member of the Assembly Committee on Financial Institutions and Insurance.

Some of David's accomplishments include the nation's first Gay Rights Law, guaranteeing equal protection for Gays and Lesbians in Wisconsin; legalization of homosexual sex acts through enactment of the Consenting Adults Bill; a budget amendment providing 1.2 million dollars in state funding for AIDS service organizations to provide direct care and treatment; Hate Crimes Protection that creates special criminal penalties for gay bashing and other violence motivated by bigotry; a comprehensive Bill of Rights for people with AIDS and HIV infection that outlaws discrimination and mandates increased insurance and drug treatment benefits.

David Clarenbach's topic will be "Wisconsin's Place in the Gay/Lesbian Rights Movement." He will be introduced by Doug Nelson, Executive Director of Milwaukee AIDS Project.

Peri Jude Radecic is the Legislative Director of the National Gay & Lesbian Task Force. She has worked with NGLTF since 1987. Peri was the former National Lesbian Rights Program Director for the National Organization of Women.

Currently, Peri organizes annual National Lobby Days for Lesbian and Gay Rights at the congressional and grassroots level to enact the federal gay and lesbian civil rights bill. She lobbies Congress on issues as diverse as the National Endowment for the Arts, Department of Defense's homophobic policies, gay and lesbian families, anti-gay violence, civil rights, anti-gay judicial nominations, and security clearances.

She received her B.A. in Rhetoric and Speech Communications from the University of Pittsburgh in 1983 and was a collegiate All-American Discus thrower for the University of Pittsburgh.

Sergeant Perry Watkins was drafted in the U.S. army in 1967. Despite his declaration on the Army's pre-induction physical forms that he had "homosexual tendencies," he spent the next 14 years in the service of his country.

He's always been open about his homosexuality. Despite his open acknowledgement of his homosexuality, the Army repeatedly allowed him to re-enlist before moving to discharge him in 1981. Last November, the U.S. Supreme Court let stand a lower court ruling that the Army must allow him to resume his career because of his "exceptionally outstanding military record" and the earlier decisions to allow him to re-enlist.

The court decision did not address the Department of Defense's overall ban on gay and lesbians in the military, but Watkins has said that he will continue to work to overturn the policy. In the settlement ending this 10-year legal battle, the Army has agreed to pay Perry \$135,000 in back wages and provide full retirement benefits.

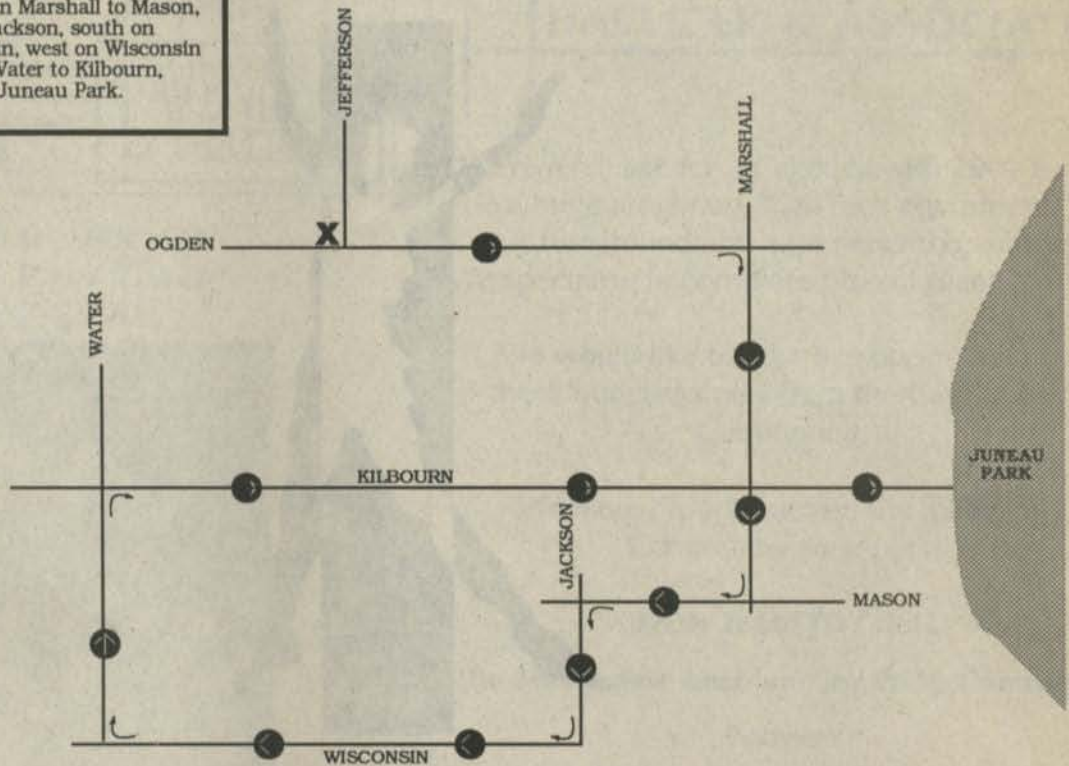

David found peace with Jesus on October 31, 1990 after a courageous battle with AIDS at the age of 33.

David was a very talented, intelligent and special person, with a gift for graphic artistry. He was a founder of In Step Magazine along with Ron Geiman, and moved to Palm Springs, California where he started The Bottom Line. A recent example of his work is the 1990 Pride Guide, along with various other promotional pieces he did for Galano Club, Women Touched by AIDS and others.

I'm grateful I was able to share David's final days with him. It gave me the opportunity to say good-bye . . . and to let him know how much I'd miss him, to let him know he wouldn't be forgotten.

To many, David is a statistic, just another AIDS death. And that's what's really wrong. He was my friend, my mentor and my confidant.

I vowed to think of my friend every day. It's not difficult. Some days I'm sad - most days, I'm mad. Anger motivates me.

The "Hands-on Quilt Workshop" we presented on March 30 at MAP's offices came from my anger. Participants thanked me for motivating them to do a panel. They also told me they hoped we'd do the quilt workshop again. And we will . . . for others that need to be motivated.

Hopefully, the small part we play in this world will mean something. We'll leave our mark. Together, David & I worked hard at leaving our mark. I'll continue on . . . it's becoming a tradition.
