Gearing up for H.I.T.

The fourth annual Holiday Invitational Bowling Tournament will be held in Milwaukee over Thanks-

giving weekend, Nov. 25-27. About 80 teams (400 bowlers) are expected to participate in this event. Bowlers will be coming here from all over the United States and

Canada, and many new cities are expected to be represented. Invitations have been sent to Atlanta, Louisville, Seattle, Chicago, Minneapolis - St. Paul, Houston, New York, Kansas City, Dallas, Toronto, Vancouver, Los Angeles, Miami, Detroit, and Washington, D.C. Deadline for entries is Nov. 1. The fee is \$50 per bowler for all

events. The fee includes a ticket to the banquet and an official HIT '82 T-shirt.

The tournament will get under way with a get-acquainted party on Wednesday, November 24 at the Factory. Bowling will begin at 9 a.m. Thursday at the Red Carpet Lanes near the airport.

Music Update

Once again, techno-pop has struck the charts of the U.S., but this time in a very, very fine LP, much in the tradition of The Human League.

ABC's *The Lexicon of Love* (Mercury LP) is a much more human creation than the Human League, due to more brass, strings, and acoustic orchestral sections on almost every cut. "Tears Are Not Enough" and "Poison Arrow" have already circulated as imports; other notable standouts are "Show Me" and "Date Stamps," along with the fantastic "The Look of Love." The latter is available on Neutron/UK import and is a very good feel-the-funk long version, perfect for the late night. Just as the League achieved it, ABC has instant success.

You Can't Have Your Cake And Eat It Too by Brenda Taylor (West End 12") is now commercially available, and what a hot one! Coming off with your basic rhythm, which is nothing special, it's the vocals that sell this one. Brenda's performance turns an ordinary R&B record into something extra special. Although not geared for high energy, the low BPMs give it the excitement needed to make this a super smash. Two vocal versions and a "souped-up" instrumental version make this one a must for a dance music fan. Check it out, and you'll see what I mean!

Fans of girl groups are going to love the Flirts ("O" Records LP), a three-girl group whose songs are danceable and bouncy rock n' roll, performed with just the right combination of humor and innuendo. The Flirts have also been something of a sleeper phenomenon: A Canadian remix of "Passion" has been selling steadily all summer, lengthening producer Bobby Orlando's track record. "Juke Box (10 cents A Dance)" is crisp, entertaining pop, which sounds both funky and new wave. Other rockers include "I Just Wanna Dance" and "Jungle Rock," plus a neat version of "I Only Wanna Be With You" and the uptempo "Boy Crazy." Look out for these three talented girls, as here they provide the right textures and phrasing to make it work. The LP is already getting extensive club play.

Returning to the album scene is the one and only Diana Ross. Ross' second album for RCA, "Silk Electric," is one of many "colors." In her most varied collection to date, she blends pop cuts like "Anywhere You Run To" with a hard-rocking track, "Fool For Your Love." Of course, there are the ballads, too, including "So Close," boasting a little of the '50s. Besides producing all but one of the cuts, Ross increased her overall involvement by co-writing three of the tunes. But the one standout here is "Muscles." With the help of Michael Jackson, Ross makes this one a "steamer." It may be a novelty tune, but it's off to a fast start, even on pop radio!

Short takes: Two key uptempo cuts are out: The Western Girls' *It's Raining Now* (Columbia 12-inch) is a deliciously outrageous ditty written by Paul Jabara and sung with much gusto by Martha Wash and Izara Redman, AKA the Two Tons, formerly Sylvester's backup singers. Double Discovery's *Can He Find Another One* (Polydor 12-inch), the Jim Burgess/Boris Midney collaboration, carries Midney trademarks throughout: It's considerably more "up" than Midney's other recent productions. Crazy, quick-change breaks make this one very interesting!

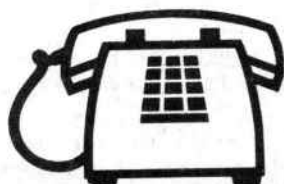

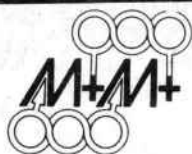

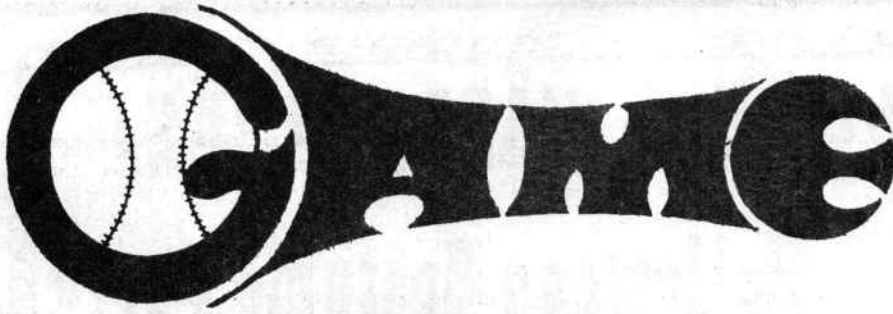
