When she asked me to assist, I was humbled... well, so I wasn't all that humble. But, I was happy. The ability to reach other gay people, whether it be through my writing, my law practice, or

my community involvement is important to me... it strengthens both my self image and my committment to strengthen the self images of others.

Brian McNaught, a gay writer much better known than I, once wrote that he was thankful for being born gay at this particular point in gay history. He views today's openly gay people as pioneers on the frontier of acceptance. I share





He later tells you he doesn't like to kiss and cuddle, that's sissy stuff. But later he lets you in on his "secret," he likes to get spanked with a paddle.

You, on the other hand, can't even get interested without a lot of foreplay, kissing, and hugging. You begin to wonder what exactly is same-sex sex. This guy really could be called your "opposite sex."

Suddenly, you both come down with headaches and very important things you have to do early next morning, and get away from each other.

You vow to yourself the next time you get the hots for a guy dancing in the shadows at the Factory, you will pull him out near the light before you ask him home. And you also learned that when you read an astrology column that says "watch out for encounter with opposite sex," it could be referring to one of your fellow same-sex gays.

The term homosexual is so misleading. The very thing we are not is the same. Being a homosexual does not make you the same, but different. In that sense, we could twist words around and say we are the true "heterosexuals." Being a homo-sexual does not make you the same kind of person as other homosexuals, it makes you different from almost everyone else: it doesn not make you a more public person, but a more private person: it does not put you in the same social class as much as it puts you in a special class: nor does it necessarily make you a psychological person with problemsoften it can make you a physic person with uncanny insights.

Coming out gay should make you have greater respect for individuality,

and value more each single person as a single person. In the beginning in our initial enthusiasm at finding other gays, we will often loan money, take in a roommate, give someone a job because they are gay like us. But when they don't give back the money, keep up their share of rent and household duties, or come to work on time, you realize your mistake. Being gay cannot cover over bad behavior or defective character.

In business, when you are gay, you try to deal with other gays. If you are gay, you might feel more comfortable having a gay lawyer, accountant, or physician. But in business you use people for their skill and professional knowledge, not for their sexual preference. Go to a dentist because he is a good dentist, not because he gives you poppers with your novocain.

To assume that all gay are the same, and that if you can only figure out the underlying formula, you can run a business or a political organization, or a publication even, that will appeal to all gays, will cause you frustration, bankrupt your business, and collapse your organization.

Say you plan a march to City Hall against the ogre Police Chief. First you usually get your numbers wrong: you calculate that because gays are 10% of the population, there must be at least 100,000 gays in your area, so you will have thousands marching. When only 75 show up, and half the people in the bar you go to everynight didn't show, two of your three roommates didn't show at the last minute, you are ready to cry. All that work and planning down the tube. "If gays would only get unified, we could run this city."

Actually, 75 was a good turn out. On television it looks like a forceful mob.

The Moral Majority against abortion or school busing seldom get more than 75 at their protests either. The disappointment comes from the original miscalculation.

I have been at fundraisers for good gay causes where the promoters were convinced that 300 would show for sure. So when only 40 arrive, and they raise \$250 instead of \$2,000 all the leaders get angry and say "see, we don't have a unified community."

Actually what we don't have is 10% of all the population that is only a theoretical model that has been accepted by lazy copy editors. We have more like 15% of the total, and probably 10% of them are visibly gay. So when the few do consistently show, and put their bodies on the visible line, and put their few dollars behind Toys For Tots or other

worthy causes, we are working more effeciently than we realize.

So many gay organizations, businesses, are really run by a lover and a friend. Gay liberation is not a mass movement, it is a remarkable force carried on everywhere by a few lovers and their friends.

Michael Foucault has suggested that when we left the Garden of Eden we did not lose our innocence, we lost out similitude. Things have never been the same since.

So when you meet someone new and say, "I am gay and you are gay," know that we are also probably different. And that when we run our differences together, we come up with something better than stale uniformity, we come up with a reality that is very lively and very gay.
