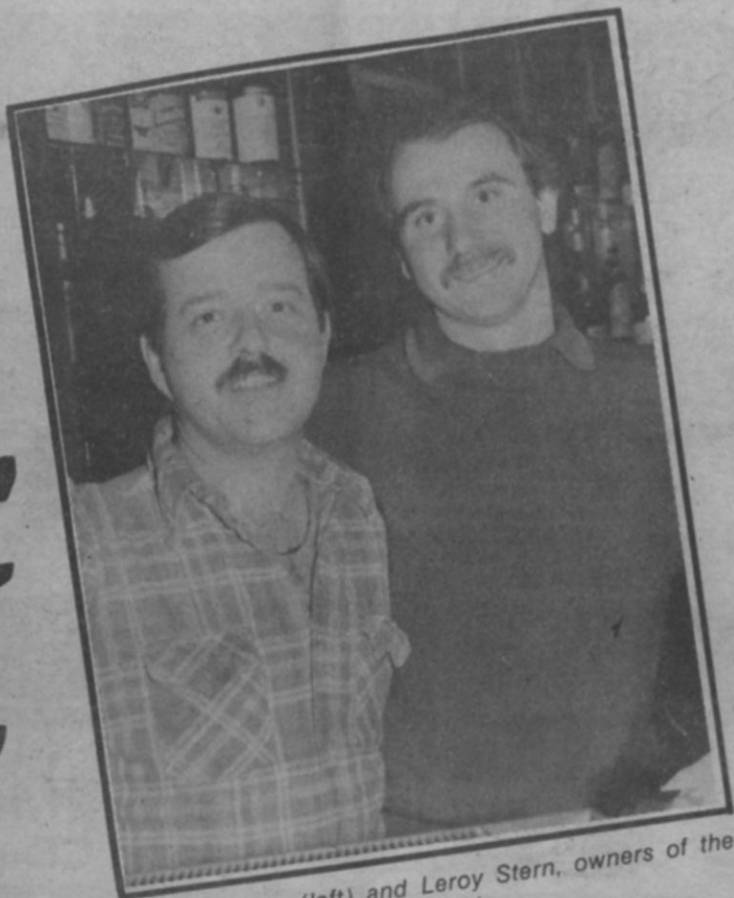

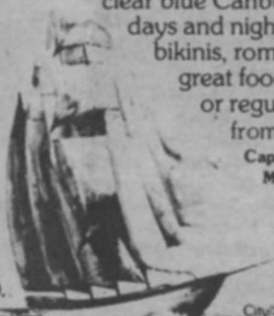

Speaking Out

Speaking Of Making Love

Love is never having to say you're sorry...

When I received press tickets for the movie, "Making Love," I did not intend to write a review. Not usually a film critic, I entered the screening room a "patron" intent on judging for myself Hollywood's most recent look at gay people.

During the next two hours, I experienced a unique sense of concord... I could relate to the love on the scene.

"Making Love" is about homosexuals, but much more, it is about love. Love which isn't always the way it is in fairytales, love which isn't always the way it "should" be.

"Making Love" according to its co-star Kate Jackson, "is about being true to yourself."

And, "Making Love" is about reality.

It is perhaps the honest reality of "Making Love" which will make or break this controversial film. If the

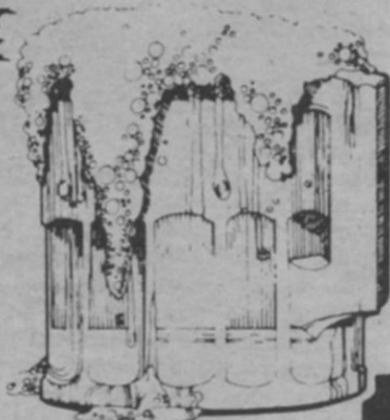

audience can get past the first kiss between two men, many will, for the first time, see an honest and realistic picture of homosexual love.

The film's honesty may also be what gets the audience beyond that first kiss. In a surprisingly superb performance, Kate Jackson bridges the gap between the straight audience and the gay theme. As a wife who is confronted with her husband's homosexuality, she plays to the camera until the audience shares her anger, frustration, and pain... and when they are totally merged with her character's emotions, she shares her eventual understanding.

More important than mentioning the few technical flairs, the photography of the producer's technique, I watched the film with an eye to how it would impress straight people. If this film flops at the box office, it will be some time before Hollywood again produces a positive gay film.

I have no doubt that a certain number of people will walk out of the theatre, just as I have no doubt that many will crusade against the two non-explicit gay sex scenes. What they lack in sexual explicitness they manifest in unqualified emotional sensitivity.

As members of a community with a stake in this movie's success, we need concern ourselves with the treatment it gets from critics and reviewers. Along that vein, Gene Siskel must again be complimented. His comments in last week's Sunday *Chicago Tribune* are important... "Making Love" is sober and thoughtful and honorable, without being pabulum. It's an honest beginning at correcting the pathetic image of homosexuals as doomed figures that has been Hollywood's staple since the advent of movies."

This movie should be shared with

someone you love, someone you can hold hands with and someone who will understand if you shed a few tears... and it should be shared with those people you love who might not understand how you love. Even accounting for my prejudice as a gay person, if it's viewed in its entirety I don't believe it's possible not to understand that.

Directed by Arthur Hiller, who also brought us "Love Story" in the '70s, what he bills as "a love story for the '80s" contains every bit the same emotional impact as his earlier work. And if it is true that love's never having to say you're sorry, the gay community has nothing to apologize for in this movie.

"Understanding," states Kate Jackson, "is what 'Making Love' is all about."
