The Pendulum Pirates of San Francisco defeated Gay 90's of Minneapolis-St. Paul to capture the 4th annual Wreck Room Classic Invitational Softball Tournament held in Milwaukee over the Memorial Day weekend. The victory by the Pendulum team was the first time the traveling trophy has left Milwaukee since the Eagles of New York won the first Classic. Participating in the tournament were 22 teams-Armory of Atlanta; 5 teams from Chicago-Annex, Gold Coast, Paradise Island, Redoubt, and Touche; 4 teams from Twin Cities-Alternates, Gallery V, Gay 90's, and Saloon; Partners of New Haven; Spike of New York; Pendulum of San Francisco; Cabbagetown Group of Toronto; and 8 teams from Milwaukee's Saturday Softball Beer League-Beer Garden, Factory, Finale, First Street, M&M, Wreck Room Chaps, Wreck Room Spurs; and Your Place.


In the championship bracket, first round action which began on Friday saw Alter-

nates, Wreck Room Chaps, Partners, Spike, Finale, Pendulum, Saloon, Paradise Island, Toronto, and Gay 90's advance. On Saturday, Wreck Room Chaps easily defeated Alternates 29-5, Spike edged Partners, 3-1, Pendulum beat Finale 8-1; Saloon routed Paradise Island 17-1, while Toronto squeaked by a 6-5 victory over Gay 90's. It was then time for the official Opening Ceremonies as all 22 teams with their banners were led onto the field by the Silver Star color auard. The Canadian and American National Anthems were then played. Play then resumed as the Wreck Room Chaps held on to defeat Spike 5-3, Pendulum's big bats were too much for Redoubt as they won 11-2, and Saloon held off Toronto 5-4. Pendulum then easily defeated defending champion Wreck Room Chaps 9-3 to join Saloon as the only undefeated teams going into Sunday's games. Seven other teams with one loss were still alive for the title after Saturday's action. On Sunday, Annex scored early and often as they defeated Toronto 15-6 to eliminate Toronto. Gay 90's scored 2 in the 7th inning to knock Redoubt out of the tournament 4-3, while Spike edged Atlanta 8-7. The Wreck Room Chaps held off a late flurry to defeat Annex 12-10 eliminating the last Chicago team from the tournament. The Gay 90's then held off a last inning rally by the Wreck Room Chaps, winning 8-7, and insuring a new champion for the tournament. The loss earned the Milwaukee team a gorgeous 4th place trophy. It was then time for an all Twin Cities battle, as Gay 90's and Saloon met. A 5 run sixth inning explosion carried the 90's past Saloon, giving Saloon 3rd place in the tournament. Playing their 5th game of the day and 9th of the
