

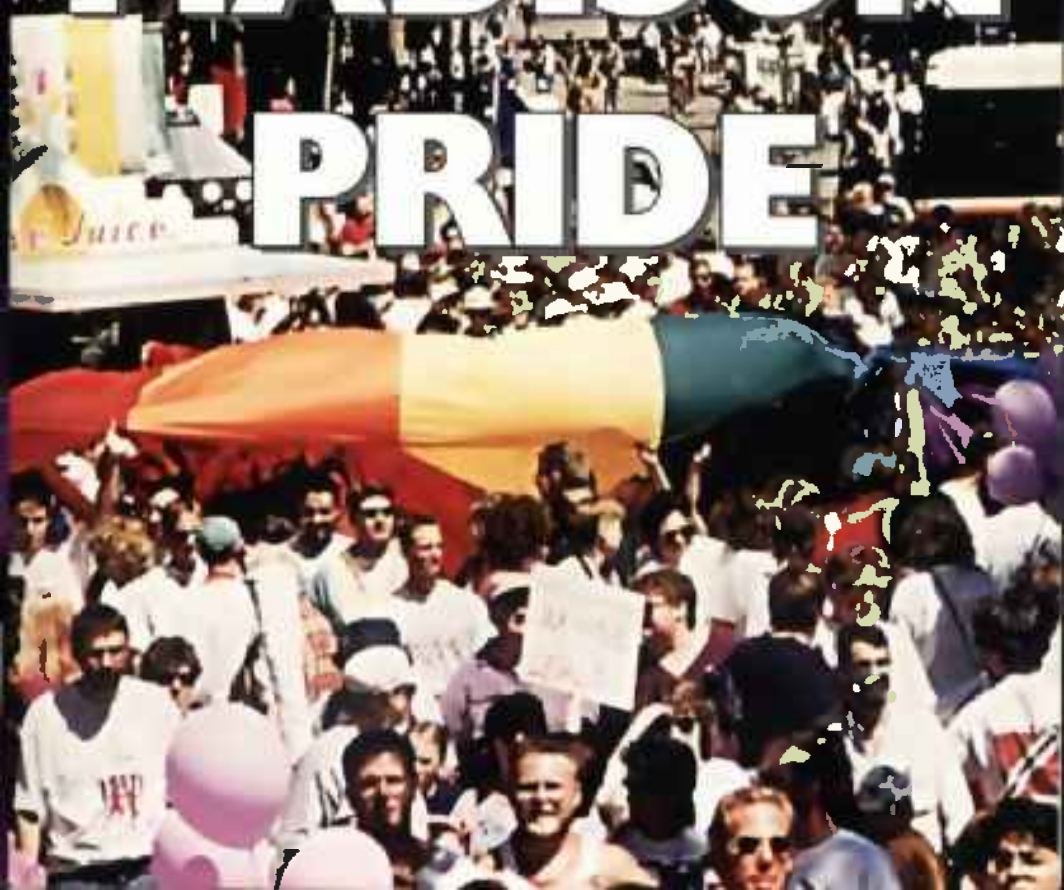

SAME-SEX HOUSEHOLDS SKYROCKET

WASHINGTON - The latest statistics released by the U.S. Census Bureau show the world what gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people have known all along: that GLBT people exist in small towns and rural areas and not just in large urban areas, as the stereotype often holds.

Census statistics show that same-sex couples live in every one of the 105 counties in Kansas - ranging from sparsely populated Greeley County, with just over 1,500 residents to Sedgwick County, Kansas' most populated county with more than 450,000 residents.

The new data show that the number of respondents who reported in the year 2000 that they make up same-sex partner households increased since 1990 by more than 600 percent in Alabama; more than 500 percent in Kansas; more than 400 percent in Ohio; more than 300 percent in Missouri; and more than 200 percent in New York. The new statistics reveal the most comprehensive picture ever recorded of the changing nature of the U.S. family in the 21st Century.

"These new figures continue to show a national trend where a record number of people are willing to acknowledge living in a

household with a same-sex partner," said David M. Smith, HRC's communications director and senior strategist. "While the census data suggest incredible progress, we believe the census continues to undercount same-sex partners because many people are still not comfortable disclosing in a federal survey that they are in a same-sex relationship. And despite an educational effort by HRC and other groups, not all respondents were aware of the census question."

"The census data have important social implications because Americans will become acutely aware that gay and lesbian families are numerous and face discriminatory barriers in terms of public policy," said Smith. "As more of these families become visible in their communities, people will work to end the unfair treatment and legal discrimination they often face."

U.S. Census Bureau figures documenting

same-sex partner households have now been released from 15 states and the District of Columbia.

"The Kansas statistics show that we are indeed everywhere," said Lorri L. Jean, executive director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force. "We are in large cities and small cities, farm counties and tiny hamlets. This knowledge will help us move forward on the local level as we work to ensure that every gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender family receives the same services, benefits and treatment given to other families."

Paula Eitelbrick, NGLTF's family policy director, noted that the U.S. Census does not count single GLBT people, but since 1990 has counted unmarried, same-sex partner households. In 1990, the category of "unmarried partner" appeared on the Census form for the first time. Approximately 150,000 households nationwide self-reported as same-sex unmarried partners - a severe undercount compounded by the U.S. Census Bureau's

disqualification of same-sex couples who marked "spouse" to describe their relationship. This year, Ettelbrick noted, the Census reported that it would change same-sex partners who marked "spouse" to "unmarried partner," resulting in a better count.

"The Census numbers reflect the changing face of our society," Ettelbrick said. "As a community, we clearly shifted our focus in the 1990s to securing our family relationships through domestic partner benefits, adoption rights and same-sex marriage. The Census numbers mirror the unprecedented rise in the visibility of our families during the past decade."

During the spring of 2000, the NGLTF Policy Institute and the Institute for Gay and Lesbian Strategic Studies sponsored a nationwide campaign called "Make Your Family Count!" This public education cam-

paign, which reached approximately 18 million newspaper readers, was aimed at encouraging same-sex couples within

was a "homosexual Eden" in the 1920s, with authorities largely ignoring Paragraph 175, and sexual pioneers like Dr. Magnus Hirschfeld leading campaigns for gay emancipation. She describes the atmosphere of Berlin clubs that catered to lesbians, many of whom dressed as men, and remembers having a crush on a Marlene Dietrich lookalike who later "saved my life" by getting her a permit that allowed her to flee Germany during the war.

Gay survivors were subjected to further persecution in postwar Germany, where they were seen not as political prisoners, but as criminals under the Nazi sodomy law, which remained on the books through the late '60s. All were excluded from reparations by the German government, with their time spent in concentration camps deducted from their pensions. Escape by suicide, marriage, or retreat into isolation was common. Even today, the German government refuses to officially acknowledge homosexual men as victims of the Nazi regime

The Nazis re-wrote Paragraph 175, a portion of the German penal code dating back to 1871, to broaden the definition of illegal homosexual behavior (though they viewed lesbianism as a curable "condition"), and it was brutally enforced as part of the Nazi campaign to eliminate "undesirables." Between 1933 and 1945, 100,000 men were arrested under the aegis of Paragraph 175. Gay men, mostly German Christians, were branded with pink triangles, imprisoned and often sent to concentration camps. About 4,000 survived; of the nine extant, six appear on camera to tell the little-known stories of their devastating experiences.

Pierre Seel tells of brutal torture at the hands of Nazis and of his post-war life raising a family. Tortured in an internment camp, he has experienced life-long health problems as a result. In the 1980s Seel began to speak publicly of his imprisonment experiences and continues to argue for official acknowledgement of his case. He now lives in France.

Heinz F. (last name withheld) remembers the wild cabarets of pre-war Berlin. "Everything went topsy-turvy," he says. "Men danced together and so did women. those were the golden years." He was sent to Dachau and spent more than eight years in the concentration camps.



he could not comfortably live in the village where he grew up, because all the men had left to join the army, so he enlisted. Becker shares photos of his lovers from before the war and from his time in the army.

Heinz Dörner remembers being part of a youth movement that spawned a generation of idealistic young Germans proclaiming a romantic, sensual, physical vision of the world. He tells of having sex with other boys in his group, which ended up being overcome by, or assimilated into, the burgeoning Hitler Youth movement. Dörner also describes the horror of the "singing forest": the screams of prisoners hung from trees in the forest as their captors prolonged their agonizing final hours.

Gad Beck, whose father was Jewish, was victimized by the brown-uniformed Hitler Youth. As a youth he watched as his best friend and lover, also a Jew, was arrested with his entire family and sent to the camps. Beck tried to liberate the young man by posing as a member of the Hitler Youth. The charade was successful, but instead of escaping, the young man chose to return to his family, all of whom perished in the camps.

Madison Pride MAGIC Time in July

28th Annual Madison WI MAGIC Picnic

The 28th Annual MAGIC Picnic will be held on Saturday, July 21st, from 1:00 PM until 7:00 PM at Brittingham Park, on the beautiful shores of Monona Bay, as part of Madison's Pride Weekend.

Long considered Madison's LGBT social event of the summer, the MAGIC Picnic is a fundraiser for many of the Madison area non-profit organizations serving the LGBT community. All proceeds from the Picnic benefit the organizations who provide volunteers to organize and staff this event.

The MAGIC Picnic was first organized in 1973 as a customer and staff appreciation event for The Back Door, Rodney Scheel's first bar. In 1977 the Picnic became the Madison Area Gay Interim Committee (MAGIC) Picnic in response to a need to raise funds and consciousness for an impending vote on Gay Rights legislation. In the years that followed, the single-day event has attracted several thousand men and women from across Wisconsin and the Midwest, with donation proceeds in excess of \$5,000 each year going to the participating organizations. In 1994, the GALVANize and MAGIC Picnic committees coordinated the first two-day event: the MAGIC Picnic on Saturday and the Gay Rights Pride March on Sunday.

The MAGIC Picnic is open from 1:00 PM to 7:00 PM with food beginning at 1:30 PM. Games, including a High-Heel Race, Water Balloon Toss and Purse Toss begin at 3:00 PM. There will also be a Dunk Tank and other carnival games, with a midway of vendors and informational tables. The Beer Garden will be open from 1:00 PM to 7:00 PM, with dancing to a DJ in the park pavilion. The event costs \$10.00 and includes a picnic meal

plus unlimited beer and soda.

Madison's 9th annual Pride March Ready to Step Off July 22

When February, 1998 rolled around it became apparent that there wouldn't be a march that year. GALVANize was responsible for the parade at the time and their volunteers were understandably burnt out, or so people believed. Fortunately (or unfortunately in some folks' opinions) long-time community activist and organizer David Wilcox got wind of the situation and decided to step up and take on the challenge.

Madison Pride, the new organization that resulted, successfully produced the march that year and has continued to do so every year - volunteer deficiencies, Milwaukee-based media smear campaigns and planetary core explosions notwithstanding. "Butt then again," says Pride Chair David Wilcox with a mischievous glint in his eye, "some of us like a bumpy ride."

This year's Madison Pride celebration begins with a rally at 1:30pm on the State Street steps of the state capital building. Featured speakers include Congresswoman Tammy Baldwin, Representative Mark Pocan, Dane County Executive Kathleen Falk, and Madison Mayor Sue Bauman. Following the rally the march begins and everyone will head down State St. and over to Brittingham Park.

Once everyone is at the park, let the party

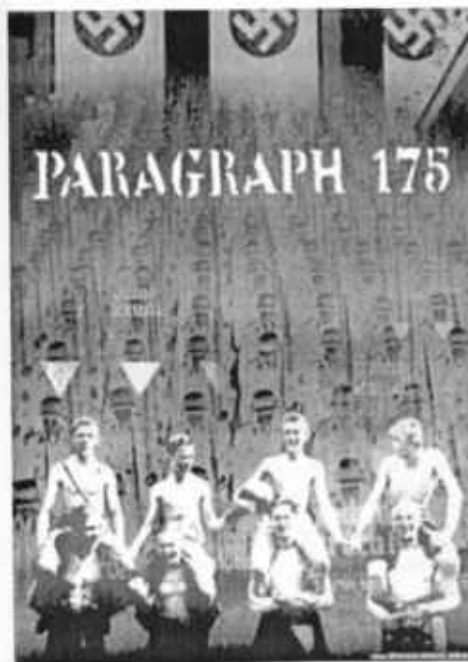

Paragraph 175: An unnatural sex act committed between persons of male sex or by humans with animals is punishable by imprisonment; the loss of civil rights may also be imposed.

-- German Penal Code, 1871

Between the world wars, German homosexuals lived relatively openly within a free-spirited, intellectual environment. Berlin's col-



orful nightlife was known worldwide, and gay men and women found that

the spirit of tolerance made Germany's capital city a magnet for international personalities in the arts and culture. But when the Nazis came to power, everything changed.

Narrated by Rupert Everett,

PARAGRAPH 175 explores the

personal stories of homosexuals who experienced persecution under the Nazis when it debuts MONDAY, JULY 9 (8:00-9:30 p.m. ET). Winner of the Grand Jury Award for Directing, Sundance Film Festival 2000, and the International Film Critics Association Award, Berlin International Film Festival 2000, the exclusive HBO presentation was produced and directed by Rob Epstein and Jeffrey Friedman, whose previous HBO credits include "The Celluloid Closet" and 1989's "Common Threads: Stories from the Quilt," winner of the Academy Award® for Documentary Feature.

"When Rob Epstein and Jeffrey Friedman initially came to HBO with the idea for PARAGRAPH 175, we felt compelled to support it from its early development stage through final production," notes Sheila Nevins, executive vice president, original programming, HBO. "The film reveals an untold story about the Holocaust - one that should be told."

PARAGRAPH 175 combines recent interviews with six of the nine known survivors, some speaking publicly for the first time, and a wealth of archival and personal photographs and film footage taken before and during the war. Adding another grim chapter to the brutal Nazi legacy, the film shows how Hitler changed his laissez-faire policy towards the homosexual culture that flourished in Berlin during the Weimar years by making scapegoats of gays, who often met the same fate as the millions of Jews who were eliminated in the Final Solution.

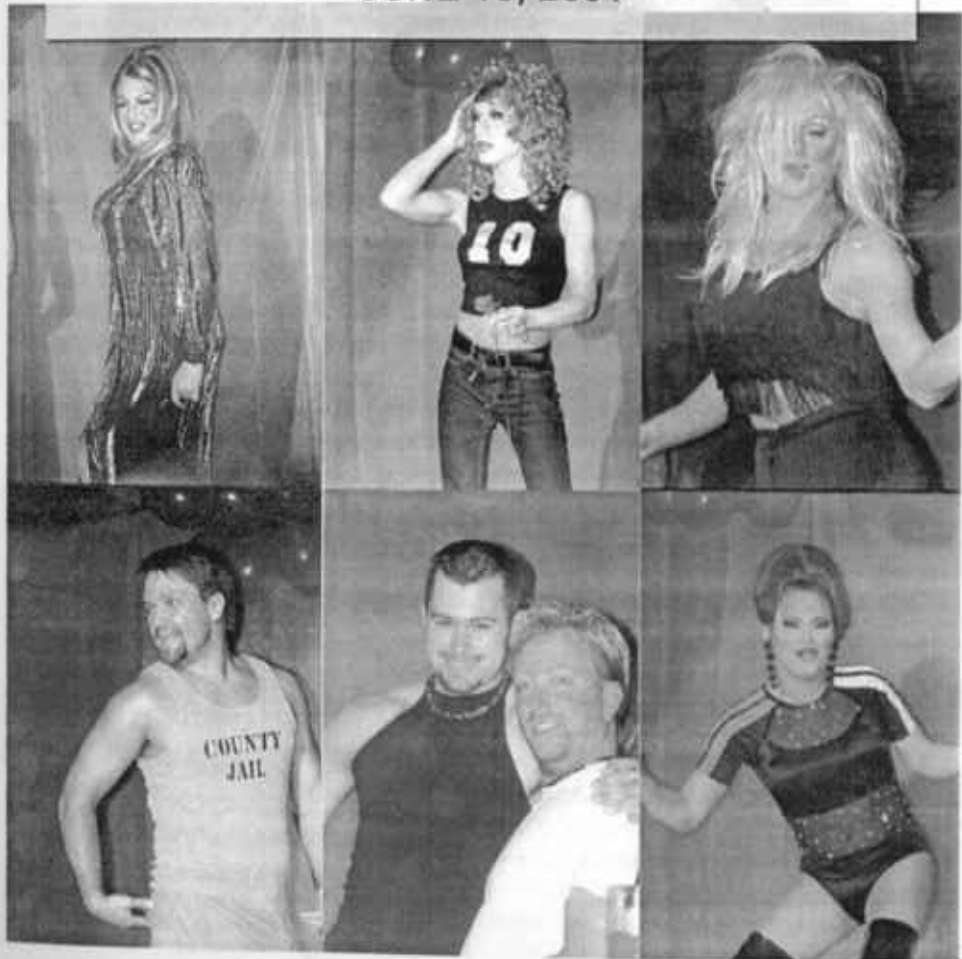

The month past has been filled with gay pride celebrations all over the nation and even throughout the world and there are still some to come in the remaining months of summer. We must ask ourselves the following question:

What are we celebrating as LGBT people?

We hear the word pride and think of something totally different than the people who aren't members of our community. The only word they hear is "arrogance" when they think of pride. They think of drunk faggots and loud music. They think of Dykes on bikes and people dressed in bizarre outfits flaunting to sexuality for all to see. This, of course, is a part of our community and a part of our ethnocultural heritage as LGBT people. But it isn't the only thing that makes us what we are as LGBT people. We come from many different walks of life. As the saying goes: we are everywhere! Remember that, without the riot at the Stonewall in New York City by a group of drag queens and other queers we wouldn't be where we are today.

The words that truly describe gay pride are these following words...

Self-respect, honor, self esteem, and dignity.

All noble words filled with the emotion and great power. However, we must surround ourselves with true Transfiguration. The community that we live in as LGBT people is filled with people who claim to be followers of Jesus Christ.

And yet they stand on the street corners

with signs proclaiming: God hates faggots and remember Sodom and Gomorrah.

What are we to do is LGBT people when we encounter such ignorance? Should we run? Should we hide? Should we argue with them? What is a poor queer to do? Well last year I stood on Hennepin Avenue and watched people march in the gay pride celebrations in the Twin Cities. I can't tell you what joy it brought to my heart to see my brothers and sisters of the Episcopal Church in the USA, Pastor of the MCC (Metropolitan Community Church) and Lutherans and other people of faith marching to show their support for us as LGBT people. I wanted to cry when I saw the children of LGBT people marching, waving signs that said they love their moms and dads. I wanted to shout, and as a matter fact I did shout in a loud voice asking God to bless the Episcopal Church! Although we have a long way to go as members of Christian communities, we have made great headway to bring a personhood and the concerns of our community into the arena that we call the Church. Remember my article back in April when I said that I didn't know one person in the LGBT community who was recruited into the life? Well I'm here to tell you again the God has made us all images of himself. This is the teaching of the ancient Church and is so proclaimed on the first Sunday of great Lent in the Orthodox East. Christians are still in the darkness of ignorance are ready to call us fags, Dykes, queers, sissies, pansies, puffs, etc., but God calls us his children; sons and daughters adopted heirs to the kingdom and promises of Christ. So when you encounter those who hate you, taunt you, call you names and proclaim to be Christians, ask them if they know the two great Commandments that Jesus gave us to replace the immaturity and ignorance of those who sat in the darkness of sin and ignorance: love the Lord your God with your whole mind, your whole heart, your whole soul, and with all your strength to, and love your neighbor as yourself. You can see this reminder for every Christian

person that makes a sign of the cross over themselves before they pray. It isn't done as a ritual but done as a reminder of the two great Commandments, and to ask for God's blessing upon oneself. So when you receive a blessing for me it's done with the intention of helping, saving, and asking for God's mercy upon you and yours. If they won't listen to this the next best thing to do is tell them to read Matthew 7:1-5

Do not judge, criticize and condemn others, so that you may not be judged criticized and condemned. For just as you judge, criticize and condemn others you will be judged, criticized, and condemned, in accordance with the measure you deal to others it will be dealt out again to you. Why do you stare from without at the very small particle that is in your brothers eye, but do not become aware of the considerable beam of timber that is in your own eye? Or how

can he say to your brother, let me get the tiny particle out of your eye, when there's a beam of timber in your own eye? You hypocrite, first get the beam of timber out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the tiny particle out of your brothers eye.

So here we see the answer that should be given to those who distort the truth of the gospel. Jesus did not come to condemn the world but to save it. So be proud of the facts and don't be afraid of ignorance of those who claim sonship or daughterhood under the great creator and continue to judge, condemn, and criticized while they still have a beam of timber in their eyes.

To close, this month think about and ponder and be proud of the importance of being yourself. Be proud that you have come out of the closet of ignorance, shame, and doubt. Be proud of the fact that you have seen the truth and the truth has made you a free person to whom God created you to be a new creation in Christ!

"Human Rights Ordinance" finally for Duluth??

Back in the mid-1980's, Duluth tried to pass a Human Rights Ordinance that would have included the GLBT community but the issue ran headlong into the ugly "Medusa's Head of Prejudice" which divided support in the community - leaving many human rights supporters petrified, "snake-bitten" and, generally, shy from proposing such an ordinance again long after it became commonplace in many other communities. Longtime GLBT activist, Main Club owner, and Duluth Human Rights Commission member Bob Jansen noted, "It's about time!"

The currently proposed ordinance will include prohibitions of discrimination based upon race, age, sexual orientation, religion, education, disability, income, and employment. It would work with "fair housing provisions" and create a staffed office with a "human rights officer". A local commission of 15 members would deal with complaints from those who feel their human rights have been violated and legal actions resulting in fines up to \$8500.00 could result from infractions. The proposed version looks like it has the support to fly but there will be more reviews and hearings with an opportunity for public input before coming to the council for a vote and, hopefully, an endorsement by the Mayor. Keep your fingers crossed! If you live in Duluth, please do more than that; call, write, or e-mail your city councilperson to express your support!!! It is regrettable that the Mariner Mall management displayed such discrimination and lack of good judgment. 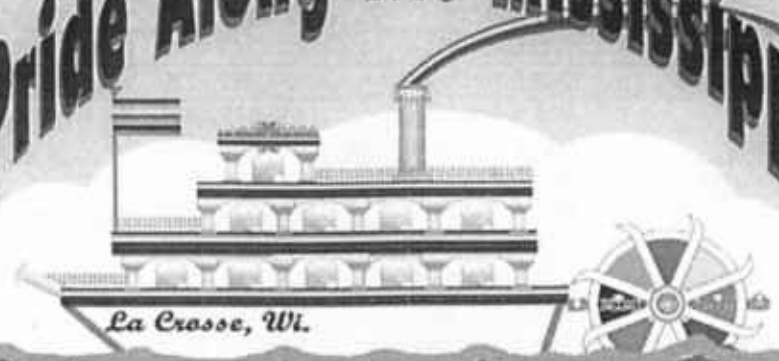

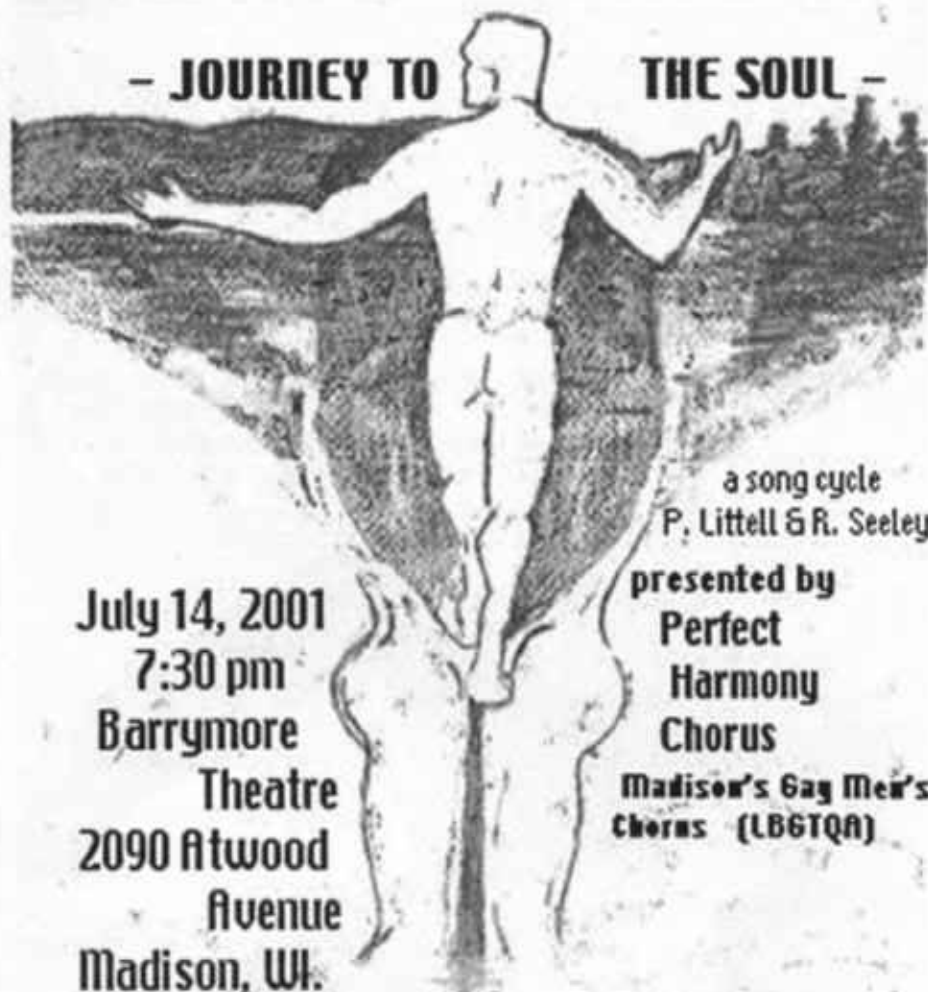

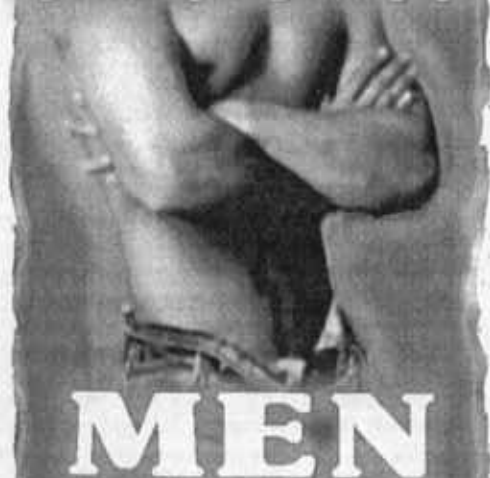
