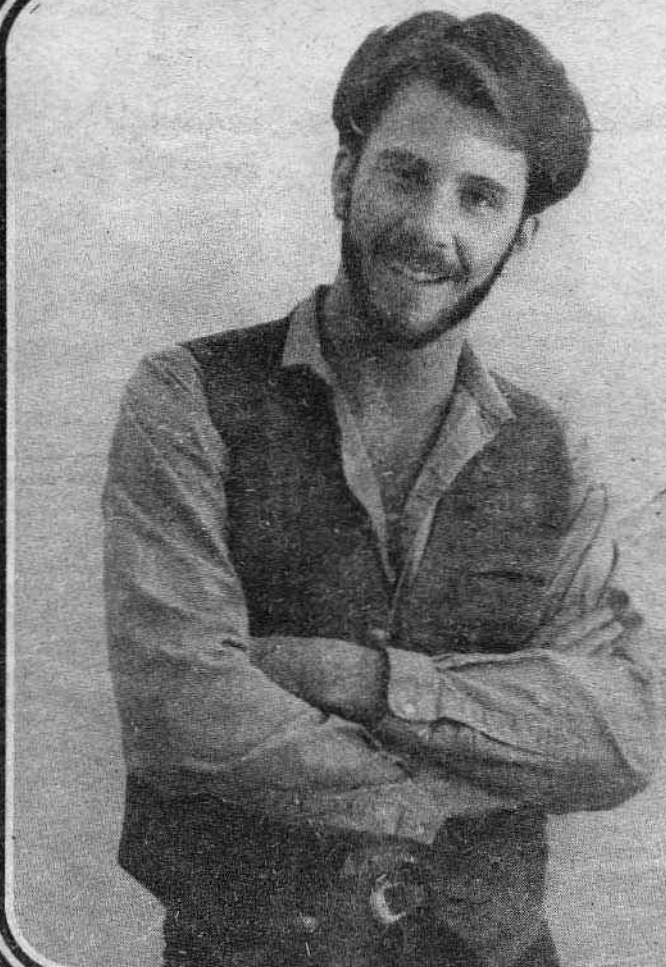


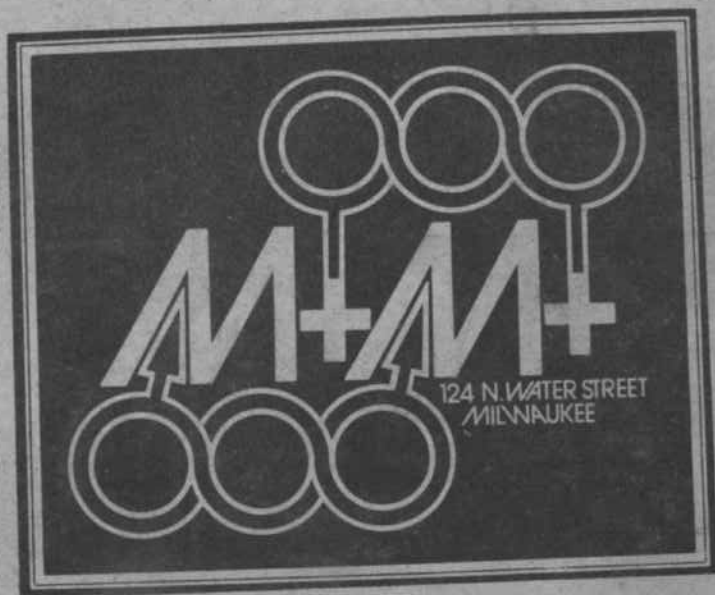

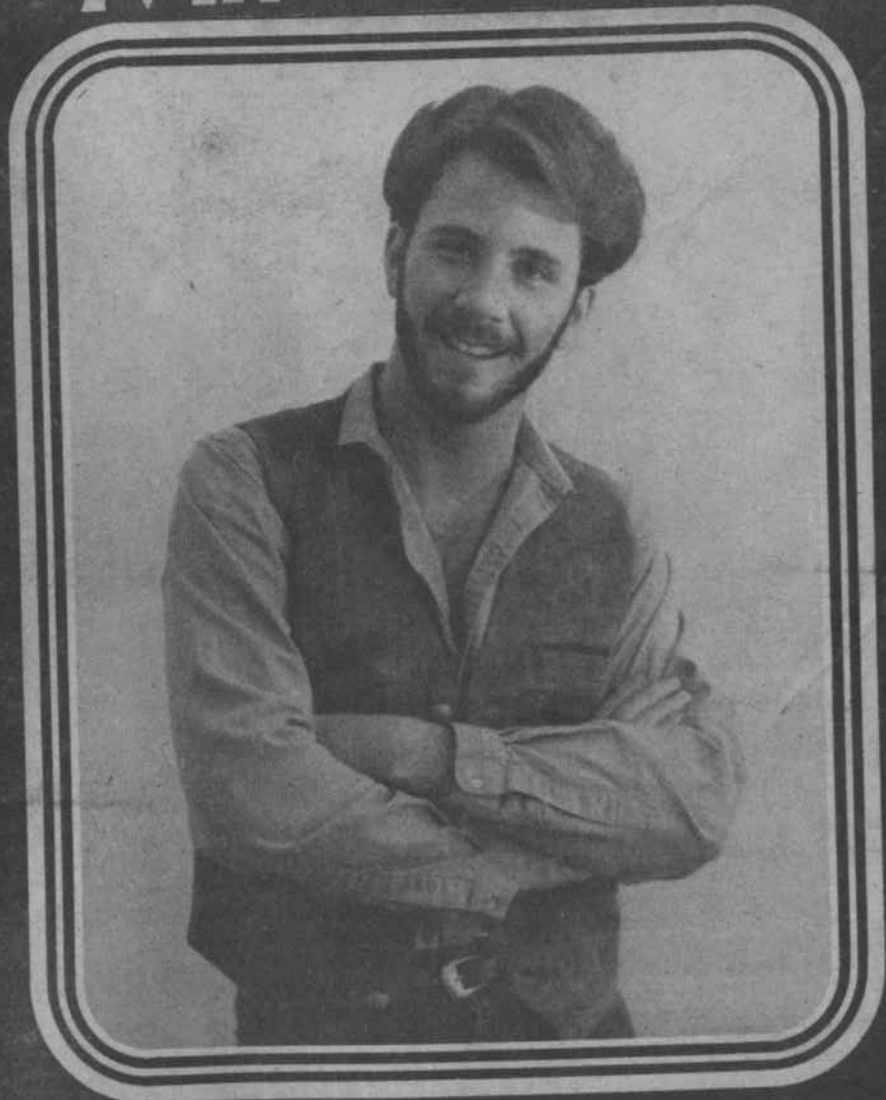

Medically Speaking

This week I would like to answer the question—what can I do to reduce my chance for getting a disease? The following is adopted from the guidelines developed by the National Coalition of Gay Sexually Transmitted Disease Services (SDT). You may not find all the suggestions to be practical for your particular lifestyle. Yet they all have merit and if you use only a few, you will still reduce your risk.

Making First Contact

1. Always exchange your name and telephone number. If you develop

signs and symptoms of an STD, you can contact the individual you had sex with. They may be symptomless and unless told may only spread disease further.

2. Tactfully talk about health before sexual activity begins. If the person just got over hepatitis, make it a friend's encounter without sex. You may be susceptible.

3. If you go to bed, undress in a lighted area and casually inspect your partner for growths, sores, or rashes, especially around the genitals. If no reasonable explanation is given, postpone the encounter.

Hygiene

1. Gargling with hydrogen peroxide after sex may help prevent oral gonorrhea but this has not been proven.

2. Washing the genitals before and after sex is recommended by all authorities.

3. Urinating after anal insertive intercourse (fucking) is generally recommended.

4. Putting antibiotics, soaps, and other agents into the penis before anal insertive intercourse has not been proven to reduce risk and may be harmful.

5. Use only unscented lubricants—scented products can cause rectal irritation.

6. Rectal douching may be aesthetically pleasing but it is not proven to prevent disease and may increase risk for acquiring hepatitis B.

7. Self-digital rectal exam in the shower (finger in the butt) to detect

warts and other abnormalities is recommended.

If you add any of these suggestions to what you already do, then you should be safer. However, anyone who is sexually active is still at risk for getting an STD.

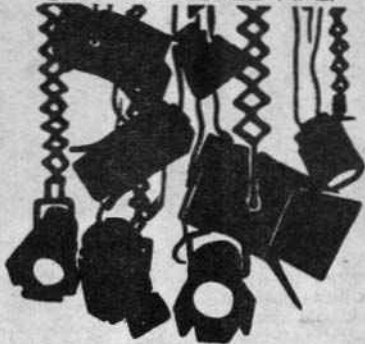

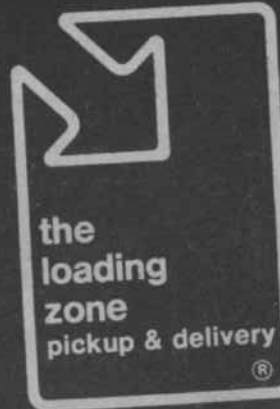

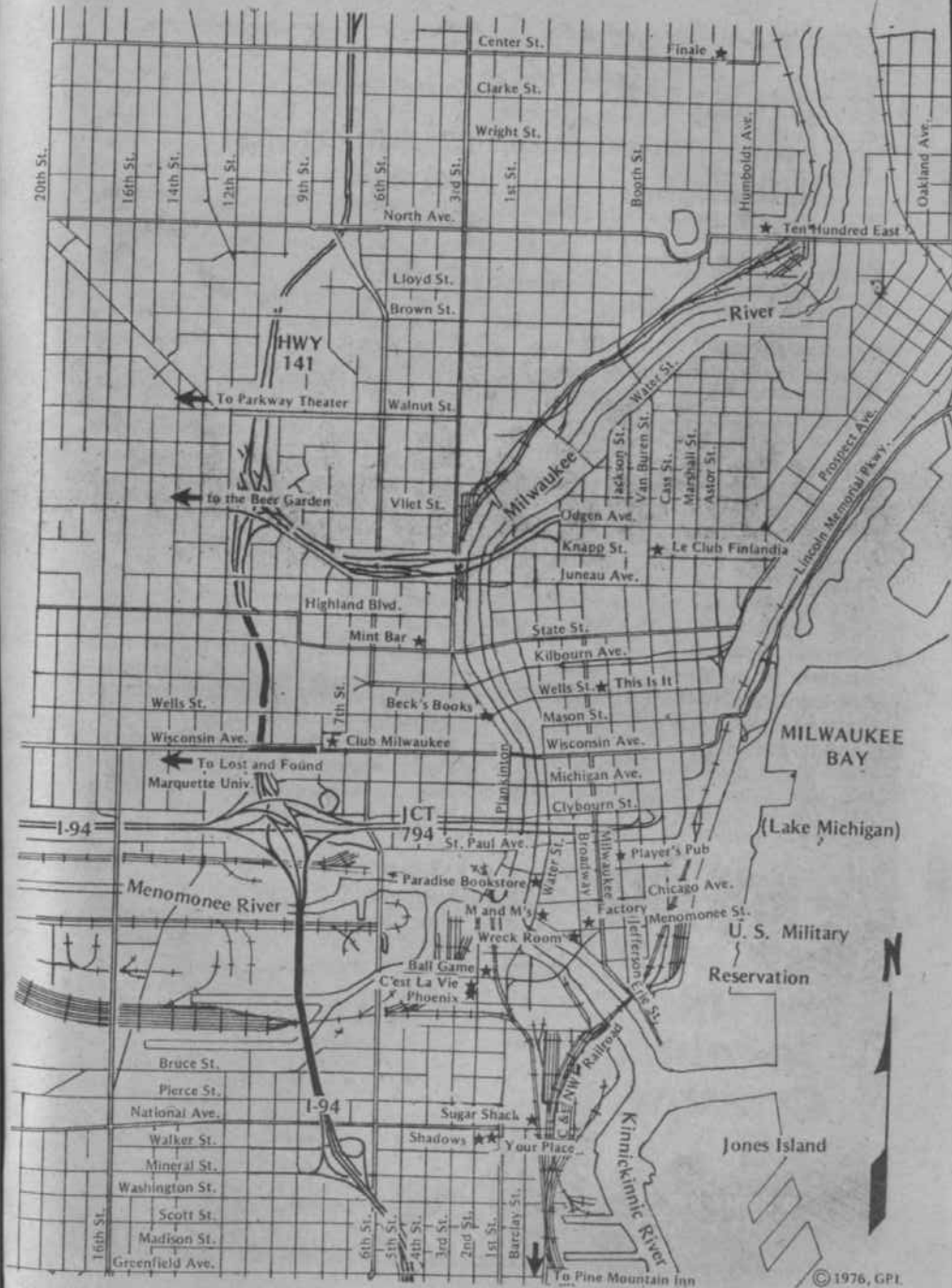
