

YOUR STUB IS WORTH A FREE DRINK TONIGHT AT THE WRECK

Medically Speaking

Hello again. This week I would like to talk about routine testing-the why and how often. First routine testing for gonorrhea and syphilis are recommended because 80 to 90% of both oral and rectal gonorrhea infections are without symptoms. Syphilis can also go undetected for several months. These symptomless infections are one of the major reasons there is so much gopnorhea and syphilis in the gay population. Routine screening is meant to pick up the symptomless infection earlier and so decrease the spread of disease. I sincerely believe that if all sexually active gay men in the Milwaukee area came in for routine screening, we could greatly reduce gonorrhea and syphilis in our community. And if you are not concerned about the community at large-it is very elusive-at least your health would be better cared for.

Secondly, how often does one need to get routine testing? A rather complicated formula has been devised and is available at GPU STD Clinic. I wish to present a simplified version. The formula is based on frequency of sex, type of sexual activity, place of contact for sex, and type of relationship with sexual partner. High risk is incurred with activities such as fist fucking, rimming, scat, and anal intercourse. Also high risk is meeting in baths and bookstores. One night stands and

group sex bear more risk.

Generally as a rule of thumb we recommend maximum screening of once monthly for the highly active person—more than 12 new partners per month. Minimum screening for the committed person rarely active outside the relationship or for persons rarely active should be done yearly. For everyone else screening should be done after every 12 new partners or sooner if high risk factors mentioned above are present.

Routine testing should include tri-site (mouth, penis, rectum) go-noerrhea culturing and the blood testing for syphilis. Anoscopic exam or direct examination of the rectum should be done only when symptoms are present. Stool culturing should be done when bowel symptoms are present for longer than one week; symptoms such as cramping, bloating, excessive gas, loose bowels, diarrhea.

Hopefully the above suggestions will help you take better care of yourself. If anything is unclear or if you still have questions call the clinic or ask one of the clinic volunteers.

GAY WORLD SERIES DATES ANNOUNCED

The dates have been set for the 1981 Gay Softball World Series, Meeting for three days in Toronto, the commissioners of the 11 members of the North American Gay Amateur Athletic Alliance (official name adopted for the prior North American Gay Alliance) approved a schedule with softball games beginning on Sunday. Aug. 30, and ending on Saturday. Sept. 5. Opening day will feature three games, Los Angeles vs. San Francisco, Boston vs. Atlanta, and host city Toronto taking on Chicago. Milwaukee's first game will be played on Monday against the winner of the Toronto-Chicago game. The series is tentatively set for six days, with one day set aside as a rain date.

An application for membership into the alliance from Atlanta was approved, bringing the number of leagues in the Alliance to 11. An application by the Riverdale Softball League of Toronto was denied.

An official constitution for the alliance as well as bylaws for a soft-ball division, was approved by the members during the meeting. Mark Upham, head umpire of Milwaukee's Saturday Softball Beer League, was designated umpire-in-chief for the 1981 Gay Softball World Series, and he will be responsible for the assignment of umpires for all games played during the tournament. An attempt by Chicago to review the "all-gay" requirement for the 1981 World Series.

was disallowed by the commissioner of the alliance, and this action was affirmed by a majority of the voting delegates. An attempt by Chicago to clarify the word "gay" was referred to a committee which will report at the next meeting.

Bill Muldoon, commissioner of the Twin Cities Good Times Softball League was elected commissioner, replacing Warren Shepell of Toronto. John Panarace of New York defeated Chicago's Windy City Athletic Association's commissioner Frank Bostic as assistant commissioner and Tom Salzsieder of Milwaukee's SSBL was elected treasurer. Ray Kush of Minneapolis continues as secretary until the next meeting. The next meeting of the alliance will be held during the World Series in Toronto.

Things are shaping up for the Wreck Room Classic softball tournament to be held in Milwaukee over Memorial Day weekend. It now appears that at least 11 teams from outside Milwaukee will join the 11 in Milwaukee. New York is planning to send five teams. Toronto is sending two, and Southern New England. Minneapolis, Chicago, and San Francisco each will send at least one team. Still to be heard from are Atlanta. Boston, Los Angeles, and Denver. Help will be needed to house out out-of-town guests. If you have housing available from Friday, May 22, to Sunday May 24, please contact Dick Krekowski (643-1129). Get ready for a hot weekend with all those hunky men in town.




