Thanks to Man's Country's Dick Guenther for making Abba's "Lay All Your Love On Me" go on and on the other night. He followed it with "The Way Old Friends Do." After dancing the first, everyone cleared the floor for the second. The lights went down, and you got a sense of that brotherhood of affection that sometimes breaks through all the . . . other.

A lot of the music this Swedish group seems apocalyptic (end-of-the-world)—something Scandanavian no doubt: According to their myths, the world is destroyed because of a broken promise, and a

shining new hero who has been killed off in the old world returns in a resurrection. Not that I thought of this at the time, but it must be what lies behind the quality of Abba to give it that feeling of sweet hope.

This turns my thoughts to how everyone is talking about affection, or intimacy, or the loving feeling, lately. But it seems we have no easy way to get to it, which is very revealing. I mean sex is so easy to get by means of various signals and so on but there is no come-hither vocabulary for affection. You can't, during a song, like "The Way Old Friends Do" just embrace the nearest person in a spirit of loving without it being taken as a prelude to action. I understand women can do this but I suspect it crosses the minds of many men as well.

Truly the old world has to be swept away and it is especially in the gay community that I always think there is some glorious chance of this. Enough of us may take our preference difference as a cue to examine other unconventional areas. The old world is lacking in ordinary loving and affection and we still live in it.

Maybe if human beings had tails and just let them hang during sex and other activities, but wagged them during affection or just prior to it as an invitation, we would be better off. But before we go for the tail mounting operation, there might be some other things we could think up.

Suppose you said look I don't want to go through all the expertise of this and that scene right now. Maybe later or with someone else, but right now, with you, I just want to be close. Who would believe it? We are trained that affection is supposed to "lead to" sex Many men are capable of exhibiting behavior that looks like affection but isn't, in order to "get" a romantic female or other male.

Then too, asking for something is asking for something—it puts the other person in the position of having to respond. What is better as something spontaneous and nonverbal is changed into matter for rational choice! And look at our literature including movies: a woman asks a man for affection and he shown as either fleeing or complaining that she is "suffocating" him.

Of course men do feel affection but those who can show it tend to reserve it for special partners. Perhaps they feel it is all right to be promiscuous when it comes to sex, but not when it comes to affection.

Now what would promiscuous affection mean? A completely different world, the one they talk about then they talk about peace on earth, good will toward men, brotherhood, and all the rest of the loving vocabulary. But people are evidently still tending to save loving feelings (affection) for some official lover of theirs, on the old heterosexual model of building "commitments" and "relationships." Trying to be everything for one person, trying to make one person be everything... As long as this goes on as the ideal situation (it's fine as one


of many alternatives), there can be no peace on earth or general spreading out of loving.

Any two given people are "hopelessly" different when it comes to intellectual contact or sharing of interests, but the affections don't know such boundaries, and neither does sex.

# Medically Speaking

This week I would like to discuss ameba infections or amebic dysentery. For years this disease was thought to be spread mainly by contaminated food and drinking water, This is seen especially in foreign countries with poor sanitation to this day. Recently hundreds of gay men have been afflicted especially in New York and San Francisco, Last year San Francisco had about 500 cases and with 85 to 90% of infections having no symptoms, that means San Francisco has up to 10,000 gay men infected. That would be about 1 in 10 gay men. The way one gets it is by stool contamination during sex especially by scat and rimming.

The disease is caused by an ameba called Entameba Hystolytica. It occurs in two forms. The ameba in the shapeless one-celled form eats into the bowel wall and causes disease. It also occurs in a form which has a hard coat called a cyst which easily survives outside the body whereas the shapeless form can't. The cysts are infectious to others but they do not cause disease in the carrier. However, at any time the cysts can convert to the shapeless ameba and cause disease. The amebas causing disease account for 10% of the infections. The cysts not causing disease accounts for 90%. So only symptomless cyst carriers are infectious.

When symptoms occur, they may be mild with loose bowel movements or very severe with heavy diarrhea—bloody at times, constant urge to stool, abdominal cramping. Common complications include the forming of pus pockets in the bowel wall or liver. Many other complications can occur.

some life threatening.

Treatment can be very difficult depending on the presence of complications. The diagnosis is made by examination of stool which is still fresh within one hour at the city lab. You need a doctor's order to have the stool examined. Once diagnosed, you must tell all sexual partners especially those who rimmed you. They all need stool exams too.

At GPU/STD Clinic, we looked for ameba for more than two years. In October of '80 we found our first case and since have found a few more. In fact for 1980 we diagnosed 50% of the ameba infections reported in Milwaukee. So it has arrived. To prevent an epidemic here, I would like to make a few recommendations. First, rimming is dangerous and should only be practiced with a constant sex partner. Especially do not rim individuals from San Francisco or New York, Because a person has no symptoms, does not mean it is safe to rim him. Hopefully, with these precautions much disease and suffering can be avoided here.

Some people I guess have trouble finding the clinic. It is at 2578 N. Booth (Booth & Clarke). Booth is located one block east of Holton and Clarke is one block south of Center. Please consult the Cruise Map in the back of this magazine for streets. It is about four blocks from the Finale. Clinic hours, all with doctor present for treatment are, Tuesday, 7-10pm and Saturday, 1-3pm. Also please note, there is testing at Milwaukee Club Baths every second and fourth Friday from 7-10pm.
