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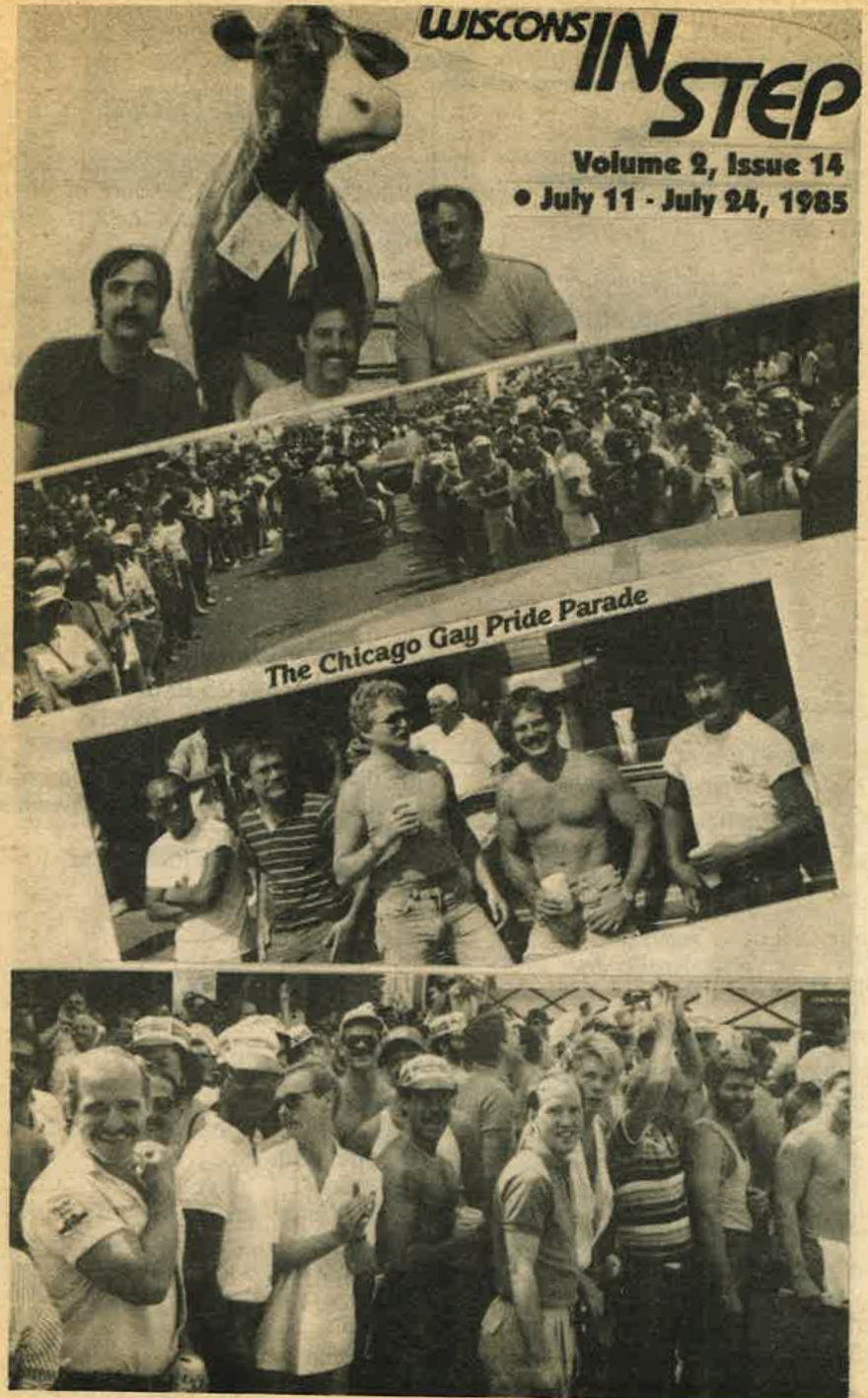

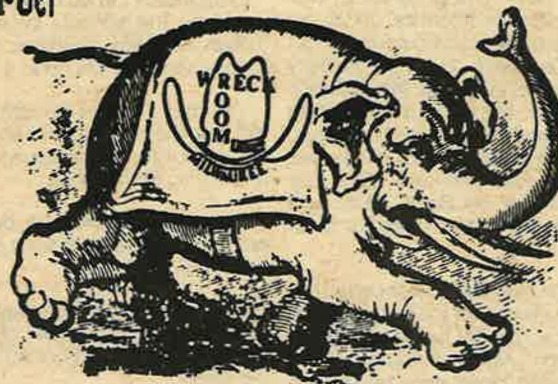

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Briefs

The Chicago Parade - A Reason To Be Proud

The 16th annual Chicago Gay Pride Parade drew an official police estimate of 50,000 participants to the streets of the windy city (the 50,000 figure represents marchers and those who watched and then joined in to follow the parade to the lakefront rally).

There were 120 official entries, representing 142 different interests, up 20 entries from last year. Wisconsin participation was the highest ever with 10 groups officially entering the parade, including: Milwaukee's Christian Gay OK, the Mixed Festival City Chorus, Black and White Men Together, *InStep* & La Cage. Madison entries included Rod's/The New Bar, Mr. and Miss Gay Madison sponsored by Back East, and Lesbians of Color. Kenosha's new bar, Club 94, also entered.

Rod's and The New Bar float received the 'Special Judges Award' for the best float that doesn't fit into a specific judged category. The float featured 1,000's of balloons, and a column with a video cameraman on top, and featuring 4 video monitors showing a 'live video' of the parade.

At the rally after the parade, Chicago Mayor Harold Washington set precedent by becoming the first mayor ever to speak to the rally crowd. Former Mayor Bryne had issued proclamations, etc., but never spoke at the rally. Mayor Washington's appearance there, along with his Pride Week Proclamation, and Parade Proclamation, gave an added emotional boost to the festivities.

COURT ASKED TO REVIVE TEXAS SODOMY LAW

NEW ORLEANS (GNIC) — Lawyers declared recently that homosexuality undermines the dignity of the state of Texas and asked the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals to reinstate a law that made homosexual activity illegal.

The law, allowing fines up to \$200 for homosexual acts, was struck down three years ago by U.S. District Judge Jerry Buckmeyer of Dallas. The state of Texas decided not to appeal.

But Potter County District Attorney Danny Hill, backed by a group called Dallas Doctors Against AIDS, wants permission to appeal the ruling in an effort to revive the sodomy statute.

Hill, already turned down by a three-judge panel on the appeals court, asked all 16 judges to let him intervene in the case. The judges said they will issue a ruling later.

Attorney Charles Bundren, representing Hill, said the case focuses on 'whether or not this court will endorse conduct that is against the dignity of this state.'

'Homosexual conduct by public policy and by our laws have long been held to be immoral,' he said.

But opponents of the law, including lawyers representing the state of Texas, said the 5th Circuit should let Buckmeyer's 1982 ruling stand.

Attorney James Barber accused Hill of conducting a 'personal moral crusade' and said only the Texas attorney general, not a local district attorney, has legal standing to appeal the ruling.

COURT: HOMOSEXUALITY AN ISSUE IN CHILD CUSTODY

PHILADELPHIA (GNIC) — A parent's homosexuality can be considered in determining custody of children after a divorce, the Pennsylvania Superior Court has ruled.

The appeals court panel ruled 2-1 Monday to uphold a Northampton County Court decision that denied the request of a woman, who was involved in a lesbian relationship, for expanded shared custody of her two children.

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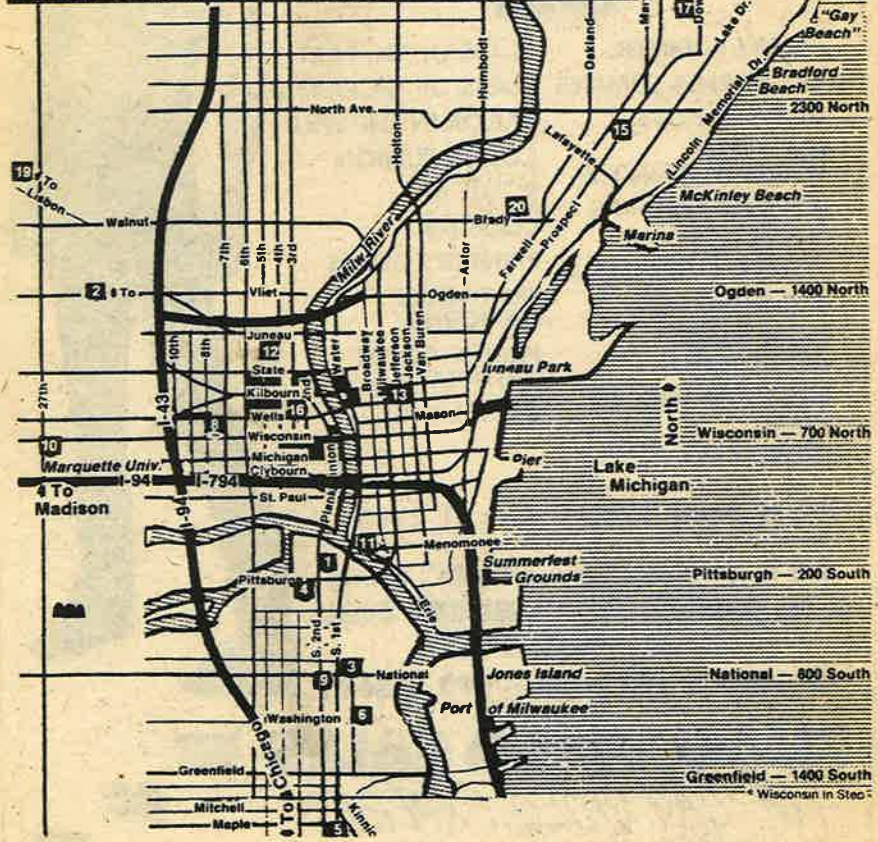

Pipe Bomber Sentenced

Stillwater, MI (Sentinel) — Earl Steven Karr, 25, accused of planting pipe bombs in several Midwestern states, including Milwaukee, was sentenced last week, to 18 months in prison on one charge of possessing an explosive device.

He pleaded guilty to the charge May 9 as part of a plea bargain, which is expected to result in guilty pleas in other states and sentences totaling 15 years in a prison hospital, followed by 10 years probation.

GAY Hostages

Two of the TWA Flight 847 former hostages admitted upon their arrival back in the USA that they're gay, and tried to hide that fact from their Shiite Moslem captors-fearing for their lives. Two San Francisco 'room-mates,' Jack McCarty, 40 and Victor Amburgy, 31, a native of White Lake, WI, were on a world tour when their plane was hijacked to Beirut.

They tried to hide their homosexuality by claiming to be brothers, fearing death in a region where homosexuality is considered a crime against god, and where there are documented cases of gays being sentenced to death by 'revolutionary courts. According to a copyright interview in the *San Francisco Examiner*, McCarty said, 'They could have justified killing us.'

In the interview McCarty said in addition to telling the captors they were brothers, he tried to act tough and was helped by his military fatigue style clothing. The captors didn't know that style is popular with gays in S.F.'s Castro area. One of the captors called him a 'good man,' giving him a thumbs up sign, when the two of them arm wrestled.

On their arrival in the US, the two men disembarked the plane, arms around each other, declaring their gayness.

McCarty is a volunteer counselor with SF's Shanti Project, which is the pioneering AIDS Support group which offers housing, support services and counseling for AIDS victims. He drew upon his experience counseling people facing death many times in Lebanon, and tried to help counsel other captives by getting them to meditate. ●

The court noted the woman, identified only as Constant A., was involved in a lesbian relationship in Boston while the children were living with their father, Paul C.A., and stepmother in Northampton County.

The state Superior Court ruled the mother's sexual involvement with another woman was properly considered by the lower court when it denied her request for expanded custody.

It also rejected her contention that a parent's homosexuality is not an issue unless it can be shown that it would adversely affect the children.

In its decision, the court pointed out sexual relations between members of the same sex are still against the law in many states and said it would not rule that a homosexual relationship was commonly accepted as the same as the married state of a man and woman.

The appeals court also said a change in custody may only occur when one of the parties shows a 'substantial change of circumstance,' and it said the only change in the woman's case was her belief that she had resolved her sexual identity problems.

Superior Court noted the two children testified they did not wish to have a closer relationship with their mother, that they were unaware of their mother's lesbian relationship and that the lower court had no chance to evaluate the mother's companion because she did not appear at the legal proceedings.

In her dissent, Judge Phyllis Beck ruled the majority failed to consider the different kinds of custody in making its ruling about the consideration of a parent's sexual preference.

'In order for homosexuality to be relevant there must be a clear factual showing of a connection between the parent's homosexuality and its adverse effect on the well-being of the children,' she said.

New Network for Greater Ripon Area

The Greater Ripon Area Network Developed for Lesbian and Gay Support (GRANDFLAGS for short) recently became a reality. After two years of work, and several disappointments, a few gays along with some supporters decided to develop a community network. The network will establish a means for lesbians and gays to meet, discuss problems, fears, and most important, help one another.

A meeting for those interested in working with, or interested in knowing what is going on in the greater Ripon area, will be held on July 27. The time and place of meeting is yet to be determined. Further details will be made available as soon as possible.

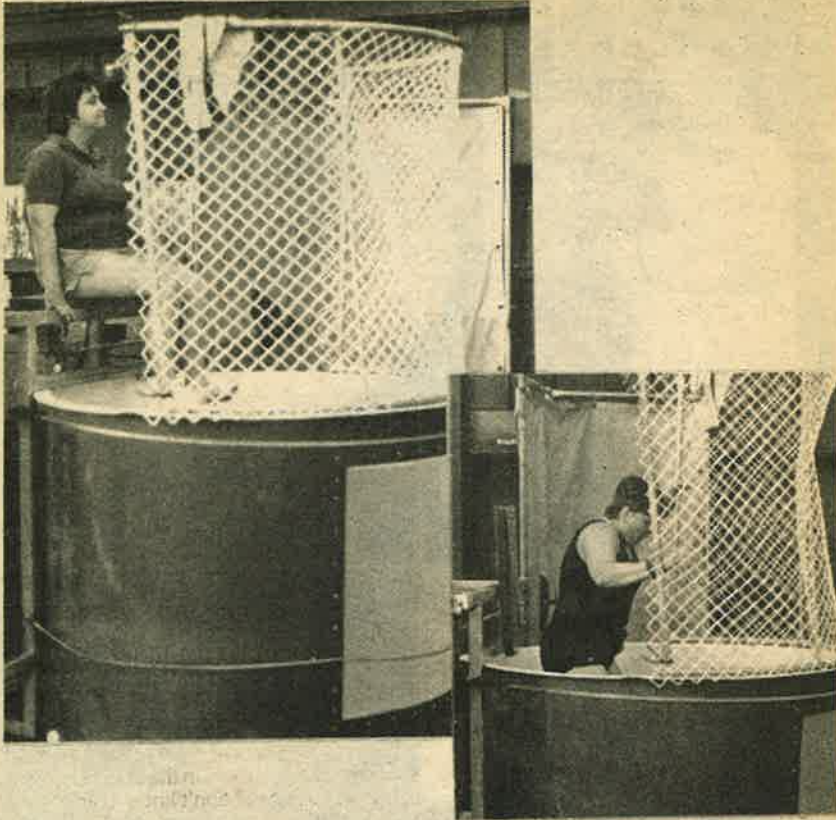

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The Arts Review

'A Chorus Line'

'A Chorus Line,' the 1975 Tony Award Winner as Best Musical, became this year the longest running musical on Broadway ever. If you have ever experienced the power of this show, you should understand why

It speaks to us as a contemporary metaphor for life. In it, we come to participate in the try-out experience for an upcoming Broadway musical with winners and losers, both strong and weak, the vulnerable and calloused, and those fresh and alive and others with the strength and limitations of experience. Zach, the director of the new show, explores, probes, dialogues, challenges and interpersonally relates with each of the dancers before making his final selection of eight.

Guy Little, Melody Top's producer, is to be commended for being one of the first regional theatre's to present this classic and also risk the potential criticism for adaptation of this work to an 'in the round' space. I can recall discussions of at least two years ago with members of his artistic staff with the thought of mounting this production in the Melody Top's space. Honestly, at the time I was, to say the least, sceptical. Having experienced the production firsthand, I have to say in all sincerity, I was wrong. It worked. This issue was discussed in great depth in a Sunday issue of the *Milwaukee Journal*, and I see no need to rehash it here.

I did find one major flaw with the show at the Top though. This would relate both to the work of the director and choreographer of the piece. They adapted the show 'in the round' space all right, but they didn't think in terms of the space they were using. I will admit the staging and dance numbers pivoted for all to see but it seemed to me the proscenium arch (the wall separating a traditional stage from an auditorium and the arch that frames it) could have been placed around the action at most points during the show. These professionals just quite simply didn't spend the preparation time necessary before a Milwaukee arrival. I know rehearsal time is limited, but the director had worked

this theatre before and should have known better. Thus, my criticism has little to do with the space, but a great deal to do with choices poorly made. The stage looked cluttered and quite messy at times. As many actors have been on that stage before, and created a much more visually appealing and satisfying performance.

P.J. Benjamin, returned to Milwaukee after his appearance here as Arnold in *Torch Song Trilogy* and brief stint on Broadway in that role, to play Zach, the director. He was convincing and with his presence created an interesting mix of strength tempered with compassion. There were just a few places that he overplayed his character.

Donna Morgan and Jerry Clonts married couple and 'Sing' number was extremely entertaining. David Loring's monologue, as Paul, was beyond a doubt the finest dramatic work of the evening! Helen Anne Barcey's Shiela made us notice her. Laura Solfus' 'Dance 10, Looks 3' was amusing but very weakly sung. Cassie's dancing wasn't fully up to the challenge of 'The Music and the Mirror.' She was too mechanical and lacked the ability to be 'head and shoulders' above the other dancers. The utilization of members of the *Milwaukee Ballet* beyond those who previously have been company members was a most welcome addition.

We empathize with, relate to, bleed for, and come to appreciate and value these dancing gypsies if we but let the play 'Speak' to us. This is its allure—its charm—and pain also. If we but feel then we can see how we deal with our own life-lived try-outs. Cassie poses the initial query about 'putting myself on the line' and Zach challenges lastly with 'What are you gonna do when you can't dance anymore?' Isn't that what it's all about?

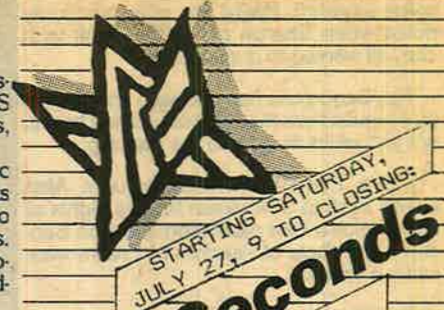

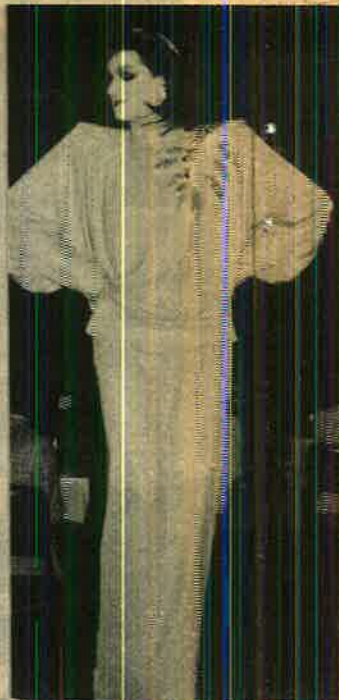

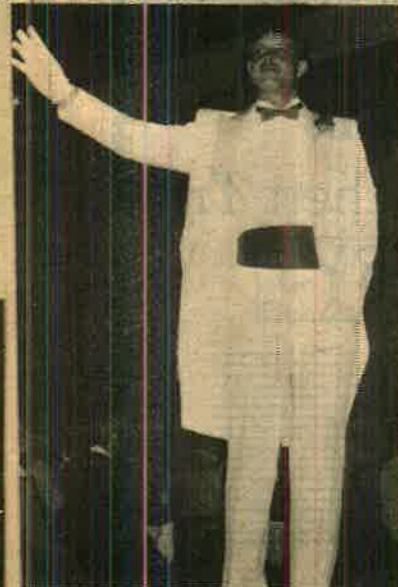
