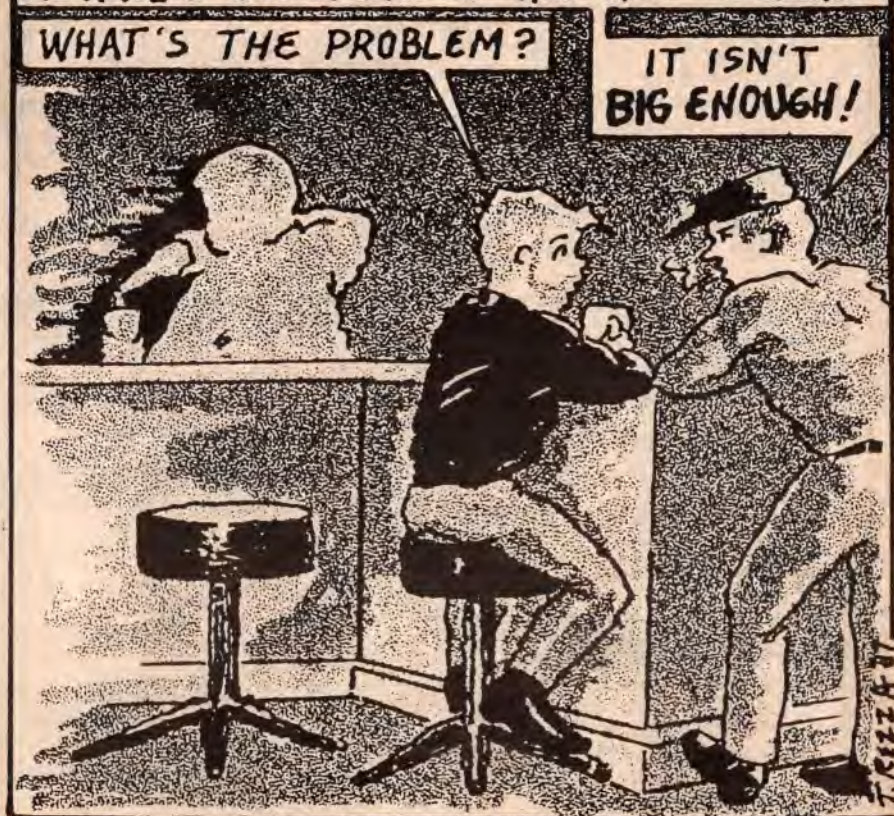

### Infighting May Delay Naming of AIDS Panel

Washington, D.C. [Milw. Journal]— A backstage White House battle over whether a proposed AIDS commission should include homosexual members has snarled hopes that President Reagan would announce the commission's makeup before the June 1 opening of the third international conference on AIDS.

At the urging of his wife, Reagan is scheduled to deliver a major speech on AIDS May 31 at a dinner honoring controversial Surgeon General C. Everett Koop — and some White House officials had hoped the president would use that occasion to announce the composition of the commission.

But because of the membership controversy, and what White House domestic policy chief Gary L. Bauer called the "logistics" of establishing the commission and deciding on its budget and its powers, the membership list is not expected to be completed in time for the speech.

Bauer, who is responsible for making recommendations to the president regarding the membership of the commission, opposes recruiting homosexuals for the panel.

"I don't want people who have axes to grind," he said, adding, "I can't in good conscience recommend anyone on the basis of their sexual preference. I don't want to know what people do in the privacy of their own bedrooms. I don't feel that we have to have an IV (intravenous) drug user on the commission. Therefore it doesn't follow that we have to have a homosexual."

On the other side of the issue, governors, mayors, medical specialists and others who have confronted the disease have recommended for membership homosexuals and other activists because they are knowledgeable about acquired immune deficiency syndrome and they have been among the leaders in devising ways to fight the disease.

Reagan, who announced on May 4 his intention to create a commission, is to

speak at a dinner sponsored by the American Foundation for AIDS Research, which is headed by actress Elizabeth Taylor. Knowledgeable sources said Taylor, who became active on the issue following the 1985 death from AIDS of actor Rock Hudson, wrote letters to the president and to first lady Nancy Reagan asking that Reagan speak at the dinner.

### Clarenbach Proposes Strengthening Laws

An American Red Cross chapter and the UW-Madison ROTC program violated a state law governing the confidentiality of AIDS exposure tests, says State Representative David Clarenbach (D-Madison).

The Madison chapter of the Red Cross released test results of 27 Navy ROTC cadets to their unit's medical coordinator, Lt. Gerald Matthews, upon request. Clarenbach said the law, which he authored, provided that results be released only to certain health-care providers and that military officials and employers were not among them.

"This incident is an obvious violation of the law," said Clarenbach, "and demonstrates in graphic terms the need for more stringent regulations." Clarenbach said the incident has prompted him to propose legislation to stiffen penalties against those who violate the confidentiality law.

Information about the cadets was released after they had participated in a blood drive on the UW campus. The Red Cross screens all blood donations for AIDS contamination.

The incident surfaced after an ROTC cadet, upon quitting the military program this year, received his medical records.

The cadet, who did not wish to be identified, showed Clarenbach the file which contained a photo-copied list of 27 cadets and their test status. Lt. Matthews said a similar master list was in the medical files of all the students who took the test.

Matthews insisted that no harm was done because none of the tests was positive. If any had tested positive, those

results would have been expunged from the list.

In a letter to Clarenbach on Feb. 25, Gary Becker, director of the Red Cross, wrote: "I want to apologize for this error, and will do so personally to your constituent if desired."

Red Cross Associate Attorney General Karen Shoos Lipton said in a letter to Becker that "the disclosures...do not constitute a violation of the statute."

**Minn. Sodomy Law Repeal Fails**

**(Equal Times)**-- Last-ditch efforts to revive a proposed repeal of Minnesota's sodomy law appear to have failed, probably stalling sodomy repeal until at least 1989, the director of a group formed to work for repeal said.

Julia Classen, director of Coalition for Privacy, said a bill replacing the sodomy law with one banning public sex "looks pretty much dead at this point in time."

Revival efforts focused on persuading at least two members of the House Judiciary Committee to change their initial votes against the bill. The committee voted 14-11 to reject the bill last month, after the Senate Judiciary Committee sent it to the floor of the Senate.

Despite "a considerable number of phone calls" from constituents complaining about the vote, none of the opponents have changed their votes, she said.

"That's not too surprising," she said. "It was a hard vote to take the first time, and they don't want to take it again."

Classen said attempts to repeal the law next year, during an election year, probably would not be "realistic." She said gays and lesbians should use the two-year interval to find the most practical way to repeal the law.

**Police Lose In Kissing Incident**

**Philadelphia, PA [Equal Times]**-- The Upper Darby, Pennsylvania, Police Department must pay a gay man \$1,500 for his wrongful arrest on disorderly conduct charges for allegedly kissing another man.

A federal court arbitration board's ruling, which became final April 9, agreed that Michael Foley, 36, was wrongfully arrested by Upper Darby Police Officer James Sands in an area of town popular with some gay men.

Sands contended he arrested Foley after seeing him kiss another man whom, Sands said, Foley was holding in a headlock. Foley said he was walking alone on the night in question and that he was followed by Sands who was driving a police van.

His attorney, David Webber, said that even if Foley had kissed a man on the street, such conduct does not constitute disorderly conduct or a basis for arrest.

**Catholics v. Michelangelo**

**Jackson Heights, NY [Equal Times]**-- Two self-identified "militant Catholic organizations" have urged New York's Cardinal O'Connor to remove all works by the "homosexualist" artist Michelangelo from St. Patrick's Cathedral.

The Morality Action Committee and the General Franco League claim that Michelangelo's works "glorify the naked male body." They say that conservative Catholics "should not have to be reminded of the perverted homosexualist lifestyle" which is represented in the artist's works.

**Insurers' Option Opposed**

**Milw. Journal**--A ruling by the state insurance commissioner's office that could allow insurance companies to test applicants for health insurance for exposure AIDS viruses should be revoked, a Milwaukee County committee has urged.

The County Board's Health Committee voted 4-3 for a resolution that would seek the repeal of a rule allowing the use of blood tests in determining eligibility for health insurance.

The board adopted a similar resolution in February, but County Executive O'Donnell vetoed it.

Backers of the new resolution said allowing insurers to deny coverage to potential AIDS victims was discriminatory and would force those suffering from acquired immune deficiency syndrome to turn to the county for medical assistance.

## Cat's MAP Benefit CANCELLED

The Milwaukee AIDS Project and the national touring company of CATS regret that the benefit cabaret show "An Evening With the Company of Cats" scheduled for June 22, 1987 at the Hyatt Regency Hotel has been cancelled. The producers and the company had to cancel due to a last minute schedule change. Anyone with tickets may return them to the ticketron outlet where they were purchased and receive a refund. The Milwaukee AIDS Project and the touring company apologize for any inconvenience that this cancellation has caused.

## Chicago Gay Pride Parade

Chicago's 18th annual Gay/Lesbian Pride Parade is scheduled June 28th, with the theme "Proud, Strong, United." Interested organizations, groups, businesses and individuals are urged to pre-register for the parade if planning on entering a float, decorated vehicle, car, or a marching unit. Individuals interested in marching without a banner need not register for the parade.

To officially register for the parade, the cost is \$60 for a commercial entry, or \$35 for non-profit groups. You may contact the committee for information on where to rent a float or where to buy materials to make a float or a contingent banner.

As a reminder, this year the parade has a new line-up corner, a new disbanding corner, and a new rally site. (The parade now lines up at the corner of Halsted and

Grace, 2 blocks north of the old site.) Step off time is 2pm. The lead banner, color guard, and committee van will lead the way, with other enteries lining up in order of arrival at the site, with help of parade marshalls.

As far as guidelines - there are no alcoholic beverages, no drugs (including poppers), no animals, and no nudity allowed in the parade. Recorded music, and musical groups are encouraged, but sound must be lowered when passing churches on the parade route.

In case of heavy rain, the parade will be rescheduled on Sunday, July 12.

Buses will depart from Milwaukee the day of the parade from in front of C'est La Vie. Tickets will be on sale at C'est La Vie and from BWMT members, in advance. Last minute tickets may be available the day of the parade, but there is no guarantee.

## Hormones Help Fight AIDS, Cancer

Boston, MA [Milw. Journal]-- Studies show that two human growth hormones manufactured in the laboratory have proven capable of at least temporarily boosting the immune systems of advanced AIDS and cancer patients, according to a published report.

The Boston Sunday Globe said preliminary tests of the two genetically engineered hormones, called GM-CSF and G-CSF, showed that they triggered few side effects while causing a big increase in levels of disease-fighting white blood cells.

"Now we can 'dial up' the white blood count to essentially any level we want with minimal toxicity," said Jerome Groopman, chief of hematology and oncology at Boston's New England Deaconess Hospital.

"This is the first demonstration of the ability to regulate the white blood count in man in a dose-dependent fashion," he told the Globe.

Scientists warn, however, that the hormones theoretically also could stimulate latent leukemia, a proliferation of transformed white cells. They also said the drugs didn't stimulate T-cells, the cells most damaged by the AIDS virus, and thus likely wouldn't be a direct remedy for acquired immune deficiency syndrome.

But because they protect bone marrow in general and stimulate production of other key immune cells, they may be of benefit when used in combination with antiviral drugs, such as AZT, which attack the AIDS virus but can be toxic to bone marrow, researchers say.

## MAP's AIDSLINE

By James Lembcke, AIDSLine Chair--

In the next issues of *In Step*, each of the standing committees will be highlighted as to their functions within the Milwaukee AIDS Project.

The AIDSLine Committee provides information and confidential referral services for callers who have questions regarding Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome. The telephone numbers are 273-AIDS (within the Metro Milwaukee area) and the state toll-free number of 1-800-334-AIDS for callers outside of the Milwaukee area. The lines are answered by trained volunteers between 9:00 a.m. through 9 p.m. Monday through Friday and between 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays. The phone lines are financed through grants received from the State of Wisconsin and the Centers for Disease Control administered through the Division of Health.

The first month of statistics regarding calls received began in April of 1986. There were a total of 194 calls received. the

majority from heterosexual and gay men, questioning the transmission and prevention of AIDS, with each call lasting approximately 6 1/2 minutes. Since that time, the number of calls per month have steadily increased.

One year later in April 1987, we logged a total of 1,048 phone calls, evenly mixed between female and male callers, the majority being heterosexual, asking questions about AIDS itself and antibody testing. The calls are still averaging 6 1/2 minutes.

Each phone call, other than business calls, is logged so that the information can be sent to our funding sources.

Frequently, the callers ask what the symptoms are of AIDS. The symptoms include:

- Red to purplish, flat or raised blotches, bumps or spots which are usually painless, and that occur on or under the skin, inside the mouth, nose, eyelids or rectum and that do not go away. Initially, they may look like bruises, but usually are harder than the skin around them.

•Swollen glands or lymph nodes in the neck, armpit, or groin that may or may not be painful, and have been present for several months.

•White patches in the mouth and persistent pain in swallowing.

•Persistent dry cough or shortness of breath unrelated to smoking that has lasted too long to be from an upper respiratory infection or cold.

•Fever (greater than 99 degrees) or drenching night sweats that may occur on and off and that last for several days to weeks which are unexplained by other causes.

•Severe tiredness unrelated to exercise, tension or drug use.

•Persistent diarrhea unexplained by other causes.

•Weight loss for more than 10 lbs. within two or less months for an unknown reason.

•Visual disturbances, personality changes, memory loss, confusion or depression which are unexplained by any other causes.

These symptoms may represent other disease or conditions.

They also ask where they can get the "AIDS TEST". The volunteer then explains to them that the test is not to determine if someone has AIDS, but whether or not an individual has been exposed to HIV, the virus believed to cause AIDS. The caller is given an opportunity to receive addresses and telephone numbers of alternate testing sites and advised to question the confidentiality of the test as well as to find out if counseling is offered before the test is performed. They are also advised that testing is done on an appointment basis only.

Sometimes, people call to find out what is and what is not considered safer sex. The trained phone line personnel would explain three categories:

•SAFER SEX PRACTICES include massage, hugging, mutual masturbation, social or dry kissing, fantasy and body-to-body rubbing or frottage.

•POSSIBLY SAFER SEX PRACTICES would include French kissing (wet), anal intercourse with a condom, vaginal inter-

course with a condom, oral sex if they stop before ejaculation, and watersports (external only). The risk increases with multiple partners.

•UNSAFE SEX PRACTICES would include rimming, any blood contact, the sharing of sex toys or needles, semen or urine in the mouth, anal intercourse without a condom, and vaginal intercourse without a condom.

None of this information could be presented without the help of our trained, dedicated volunteers, who donate a large portion of their free time to answering the phones. Most of the AIDSLINE Volunteers put in more than the suggested three hours a month phone shift. These volunteers are one of the greatest resources for providing accurate information regarding AIDS in this area of the state. The increase in the number of calls received reflects the public's desire for knowledge regarding AIDS.

Also, a big thank you to our AIDSLINE Coordinator, Michael McFadden, who also works many hours at MAP. He is the paid staff member responsible for training and scheduling of volunteers. He also is responsible for AIDSLINE publicity, and the reporting and recording of statistics to our granting sources.

The AIDSLINE Committee needs more volunteers, especially during the day to keep up with the increasing number of calls. Get involved now by attending a volunteer orientation which will acquaint you with the different committees and the functions and services they provide. ## A Feast of Provocative Art: An Investigation

Theatre X presents a performance/presentation, **The History of Sexuality: An Investigation**, in conjunction with **A Museum of Sexuality** from presenters, Taffnie Bogart and Sandra L. Greuel. **The History of Sexuality: An Investigation** will open Friday, June 5 and run Wednesdays through Sundays to Thursday, June 25 and Sunday, June 28, all performances 8:00 p.m. at 158 North Broadway in the Historic Third Ward. Viewing of **A Museum of Sexuality** will directly follow the Theatre X performance, 9:30 each performance evening. Tickets are \$5 - \$10 and this price includes a \$1 donation for **A Museum of Sexuality** catalog.

**The History of Sexuality: An Investigation** is a performance/presentation of outtakes compiled from a year's worth of improvisation and dialogue among a variety of collaborators; actors, writers, musicians and visual artists. A substantial amount of material was realized; on one hand, ideas from a play script and on the other hand, a wealth of material which subsequently became **The History of Sexuality: An Investigation**, the performance/presentation.

The performance/presentation will include films, guest speakers from the community, video interviews, a slide presentation of the history of sexuality in advertising, vignettes by Theatre X and other performers, live music and an exhibition of art works by over 90 artists working in all media. The two films integrated into each performance are: **June Brides** by Cathy Cook and Claudia Looze, a film that explores the traditions, obsessions and expectations of brides in action. The brides are the spectacle, subject and creators of their destination while contrasting fantasy with reality, and **Makeover**, a compelling film made by Paul Cotter based on the experiences of a person caught in a gender dispute imposed by nature; a film about a hermaphrodite. Interviews with community professionals, a different

speaker each night, will be incorporated in the performance and the evening will end with a tour of **The Museum of Sexuality**. Exhibiting artists will act as guides for the audience.

From its inception in the summer of 1986, **The History of Sexuality: An Investigation** rapidly developed into a community effort. The resulting involvement of over 100 contributing artists demonstrates that. Rather than an edited single view of the subject, focus is on the array of compelling statements from a diversity of individuals.

**The History of Sexuality: An Investigation** and **A Museum of Sexuality** presents a feast of provocative art and entertainment to the public.

The project will culminate in a symposium on June 26, 27 and 28.

## A Museum of Sexuality

Taffnie Bogart and Sandra L. Greuel present, **A Museum of Sexuality**, an exhibition of works of over 90 artists in conjunction with Theatre X's performance/presentation, **The History of Sexuality: An Investigation**, at 158 North Broadway, in the Historic Third Ward. The exhibit will continue through June 28 and opens for viewing directly following the Theatre X performance/presentation at 9:30 p.m. each performance evening. Audiences will tour the exhibition guided by a contributing artist. \$1 donation at the door at 9:30 p.m. or free if attending the performance. Opening reception, Friday, June 5, 1987, 10:00 p.m. to 1 a.m.

**A Museum of Sexuality** will be housed in Milwaukee's Contemporary Arts Center, new home of Theatre X. The building, at 158 North Broadway, has a somewhat dubious history. It was formerly home for a bath house purportedly closed by Milwaukee's vice squad in 1978. The exhibition will also include performance, video, artifacts, sculpture and 3d works.

**A Museum of Sexuality** forms a major statement by artists from Milwaukee, Chicago and New York on sexuality during

of our own lives. Lesbians supporting children and many gay people of color often aren't economically middle-class.

However, the majority of us are at least economically middle-class and consequently, should understand our power.

The problem, however, is how to use that power without the risk of losing it. I recently heard about a unique strategy that made a statement about gay economic power while protecting the individuals involved. Several women, alumni of a Catholic college, sent their annual contributions to the college. In the memo section of their checks, they wrote "gay money." As they were alumni, not current students, they were protected from administrative harassment and at the same time, they were making a statement about the student body, past and present, of the college.

I'm sure there are many more ways we could make statements about who we are and our power and still protect ourselves from damaging repercussions. Refusing to laugh at homophobic comments, anonymous letters to the editor, financial support

for those of us willing to stand on the battlelines, supporting businesses that advertise in the gay press and telling them where you saw the ad, are all small steps that, if done often enough and by enough of us, can make an impact.

The phenomena of minority assimilation and acceptance into mainstream culture via economic success seems to be working for us. We should leverage this economic power to gain social respect and legal privilege that is our due for a job well done.

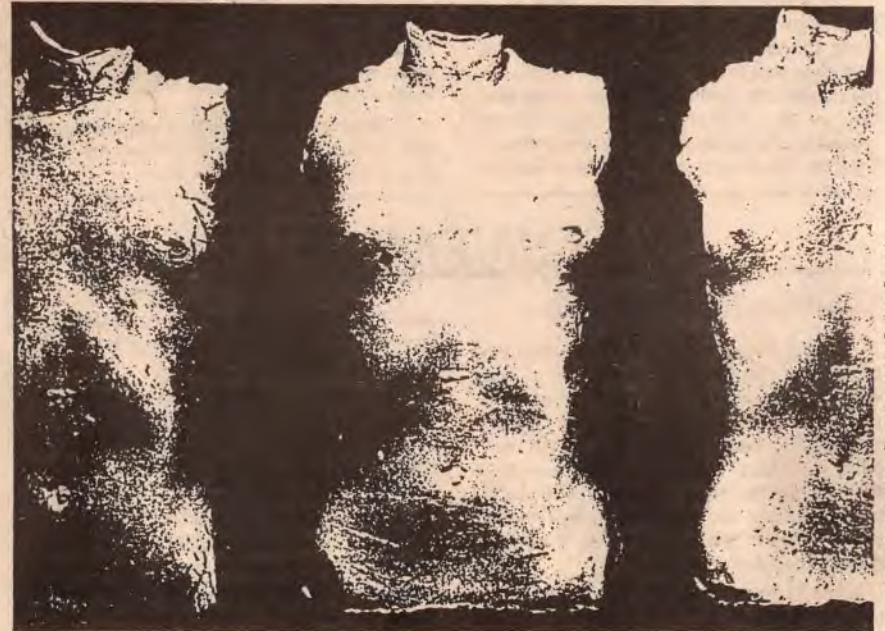

### Waiting for the Moon

A delightful and thoroughly entertaining offering at the Oriental Theater as of late was **Waiting For The Moon**. It chronicles three months in France during the 39 year relationship between Gertrude Stein and Alice B. Toklas. It must be noted however that the film is a supposed biography of the two based on feeling and interpretation rather than fact only, as such, it does a formidable job indeed.

Linda Hunt as Alice B. is marvelous. She is upfront and direct with her thoughts and feelings as is Linda Bassett as Stein, at least on the intellectual level. The feeling side of Toklas and the lack of it expressively in Stein clearly separates the two both in the writing and in characterization.

Stein could talk about feelings but had, from this supposed view, an extraordinary difficulty expressing them. Bassett incorporates this tension ever so well in her portrayal. As an example, she wrestles with a significant health problem singularly because she can not bring it to Toklas. Yet, by the same token, she can discuss the problem with their mutual friend, the poet, Guillaume Apollinaire.

Alice B. on the other hand, clearly senses what is wrong even to the point of reading Stein's mail (she was her secretary), to discover what the problem is. However, even knowing this, she will not broach the subject until Stein reveals it to her first.

Herein lies the conflict and each wo-

man's reaction to this situation has distinct and clear ramifications on their relationship and drives the drama forward.

A complaint might be raised that only once is there any hint of a physical bond between the two, in a frightened bedroom scene. But it is clearly the above mentioned conflict which does not allow for their freedom of expression.

Screenwriter Bruce McGill also portrays Ernest Hemingway on screen and also doubled as co-director with Jill Godmilow. He very definitely has captured a "feel" for Stein in his script and phrases it much as she would have. Therefore it should not come as a great surprise that the film is extremely literate in the telling. Rather, it is what one might term a filmed literary work.

Thus, it is because the dialogue is definitely vital that a muffled soundtrack was at times a definite distraction. In a film such as this, all the dialogue was of extreme import to the viewer. None seemed extraneous.

The time frame encompassing Apollinaire, Hemingway, Picasso, and an amusing note to Henry Ford on the demise of Gertrude's Model A tells the tale extremely well.

Undoubtedly, a good film. Well worth your time.

## A WOMAN'S VIEW by Linda Hendersen

### Money & Power

One of the things that I do to make money, in addition to writing this column, is selling advertising for **Gay Chicago**. I like doing that. I like paying my bills, I like making contact with the gay community through my work, and I like working with "straight" owned businesses as a representative of **Gay Chicago** and as an "out" lesbian. The heterosexual business owners I contact are often a good barometer of the attitudes of the middle-class business "power-structure" toward gay people.

Two recent comments brought home to me in a very practical way the dormant power we have as gay people.

The first was a comment made by a manager of a mid-size service business who said that, while she wasn't the person I should talk to regarding advertising, she would be happy to refer me to the person who handled that "market."

The second "click" was at a gay

business symposium. During a presentation by J. Walter Thompson, Inc. a prestigious advertising agency here in Chicago, the presenter quoted statistics that predict 20% of the disposable income in this city is controlled by gay people.

So, we're no longer queers, faggots, dykes or perverts, we're a market. Not only are we a market, considering that other statistics contend we are 10% of the population, we control a disproportionately large percentage of disposable income.

In this country that equates money with power, that's a lot of power albeit mostly unrealized and historically unacknowledged power. It seems the times are changing and I wonder if "they" don't understand our power better than "we" do.

Most of us certainly don't feel powerful, nor rich. The fear of lost jobs, verbal harassment, alienated friends and family, legal abuse and just plain disapproval diminish our capacity to ever feel in control
