#### Rhode Island Becomes 9th Gay Rights State

#### After an 11 Year Effort, GOP Governor Sians Bill

Providence, RI - On May 22, with the final signature of Republican Gov. Lincoln C. Almond. Rhode Island became the ninth state in the union to adopt a law prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation. The bill, which defines sexual orientation as heterosexuality. homosexuality and bisexuality, forbids bias in housing, employment, credit and public accommodations.

"This legislation is not about endorsing a particular lifestyle," Gov. Almond said at the bill signing ceremony. "It is about extending Rhode Island's rich tradition of tolerance to prohibit discrimination based on sexual

orientation "

"It's a small state, but it's a big victory," declared State Sen. William Fitzpatrick (D), a Gay man who helped shepherd the bill through the Rhode Island legislature.

Indeed, the victory gave a boost to Gay and Lesbian rights activists throughout the country who have been battling a growing number of anti-Gay initiatives at the city and state levels.

"It is encouraging — even inspiring — that Rhode Island has passed this measure of fairness while Lesbians, Gay men and Bisexuals in other states are being attacked by divisive campaigns," Melinda Paras of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force commented

"It is a victory not only for Rhode Islanders, but also for Gay men and Lesbians everywhere," said Christine Nickerson of the Rhode Island Alliance for Lesbian and Gay Civil Rights, the group which lobbied for the civil rights bill for eleven years. "Rhode Island has set an example for 41 more states to follow, saying yes to fairness, equality and basic human rights."

#### RECIPE FOR VICTORY

The Alliance built a broad-based coalition of supporters across the state which included an interfaith coalition of religious leaders, educators, labor and civil rights groups, Parents, Friends and Families of Lesbians and Gays and heterosexual supporters organized as the Straight But Not Narrow Coalition.

This year, we had many more hard-working supporters," said James Stascavage of the Alliance. "It's a powerful thing to have mothers, straight

people and clergy lobbying legislators on a daily basis."

Within the legislature Sens Fitzpatrick and Rhoda Perry (D) and State Rep. Francis Gaschen (D) sponsored and gathered bipartisan support for the bill. Hearings were held in which Gays and Lesbians testified about being the victims of discrimination Opponents of the bill, led by the Coalition to Preserve Traditional Values, spoke against extending "special rights" and giving "moral approval" to homosexuality.

March, the House of Representatives passed the bill by a vote of 57-41. In May, opponents tried to attach six amendments to the bill in the Senate. One would have exempted from the bill's provisions businesses with less than 25 employees. Another sought to require a voter referendum before the measure could become law. All were defeated, and on May 19, the Rhode Island Senate passed the bill, 26-21.

One Lesbian activist suggested that the cumulative effect of eleven years of education, testimony, lobbying and working to elect pro-Gay legislators ultimately contributed to the margin of

Rhode Island now joins Wisconsin (the "Original Gay Rights State" in 1982). Massachusetts, Hawaii, Connecticut, New Jersey, Vermont. California. Minnesota and the District of Columbia in protecting its citizens from discrimination based on sexual orientation

Activists at the Human Rights Campaign Fund seized on the Rhode Island victory to urge the US Congress to take action against sexual orientation bias in the workplace by passing the federal Employment Non-Discrimination

Act (ENDA).

"Congress should follow the example of Rhode Island and recognize the widespread problem of anti-Gay discrimination," said HRCF's Daniel Zingale. "ENDA would create a level playing field and ensure that no one loses their job for reasons unrelated to their abilities."

#### INTERNATIONAL Briefs

#### British to Retain Ban on Gays in Military

London - Just days before three Gay and one Lesbian service member appealed their discharges before Britain's High Court, a Defense Ministry official declared that the ban against homosexuals in the military would continue

British policy states that homosexuality is "incompatible" with military service and that the presence of Gays would "damage morale and unit effectiveness." Procurement Minister Roger Freeman also said that as one third of new recruits are under age 18, the Defense Ministry has "a responsibility for the welfare and morale of their young recruits."

Labor MP's vowed that a Labor government would set up a commission to study the experiences of other countries that have integrated Gays into the armed forces.

Meanwhile, an attorney for four openly Gay and Lesbian service members appealed their discharges before the High Court, saying the policy against Gays is "pandering to irrational prejudice and intolerance." The service members are arguing that their discharges violate rights granted to them under European equality laws.

#### Victory, Loss in Canadian Courts

Toronto - The Supreme Court of Canada ruled on May 26 that although homosexuals are protected under the country's Charter of Rights, a Gay man

has no right to spousal benefits under Canada's Old Age Security Act. Meanwhile, a lower court judge granted eight Lesbians adoption decrees after determining that the definition of spouse in Ontario's adoption law was biased and a violation of the Charter of Rights.

On May 20, Judge David Nevins ruled that the Child and Family Services Act, which forbids Gays and Lesbians to adopt, was unjustifiable in a democratic society and that the ban violates the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. He then issued adoption decrees to the four Lesbian couples. "We would like to think that the law caught up with reality," an attorney for the women said.

A week later, the Canadian Supreme Court voted 5-4 against the appeal of James Egan, 73, and John Nesbitt, 67 - together for 46 years that Nesbitt be allowed to receive the benefit available to all spouses of old age pensioners who are in married or

common law relationships.

The Court acknowledged that while "sexual orientation" does not appear in the list of protected classes in the Charter of Rights, homosexuals are implicitly included in the Charter's guarantees of "equal protection and equal benefit of the law." However, the majority declared that the pension law, as it now stands, is only applicable to heterosexuals. Noting that the history of the old age pension law was one of "evolving expansion," the court implied that pension rights could be broadened to include same-gender partners through legislative action.

Mexican Police Accused of Anti-Gay Oppression

Chihuahua — The International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission reports that Gay men and transvestites in the Mexican city of Chihuahua are under a continuing reign of police oppression which began last fall.

A wide range of rights violations by law enforcement officers have been documented, including verbal harassment, beatings, mass police sweeps of bars and homes, extortion, arbitrary arrests and torture while in custody. One common tactic is for officers to nab Gavs for alleged violations of prostitution and morals laws. They are then asked to pay exorbitant "fines" and often illegally detained for days.

Evidence suggests high level involvement in the anti-Gay oppression. One victim says the police raiding his house were led by the brother of Chihuahua's municipal president. Official complaints have not been pursued because Chihuahua's police chief calls homosexuals a "social problem."

### Gays Welcomed, Expelled at WWII Commemorations

Berlin - At ceremonies marking the 50th anniversary of the liberation of the Nazi concentration camp Sachsenhausen, a historian spoke of Hitler's war against homosexuals, while at a V-E Day parade in Oslo, participants angered at the "homo" presence had a Gay contingent ejected from the event.

At Sachsenhausen, north of Berlin, the Gay historian Guenter Grau said it was past time recognition be given to the Gay victims of Nazism. He said Nazi courts had sentenced 50,000 for violating anti-Gay statutes (which prohibited even same gender kissing and fantasies), and that thousands had died at camps like Sachsenhausen.

Guenter said no recognition of Gay victims had been allowed at previous commemorations because of the sense that "the honor of other prisoners would be besmirched if they were placed on the same level" as homosexuals.

In Oslo on May 7, a Gay contingent in the V-E parade was forced to disburse when other participants became belligerent and a spokesman for the

Sports Federation demanded their expulsion, calling their presence "improper." The Sports Federation cosponsored the event with the Red Cross. which later said the Gay participants deserved an apology.

The Norwegian Gay group had marched under the rainbow flag with a hanner that declared: "The Nazis marked us with a pink triangle - thousands died for their love."

#### Lesbians Included in Platform at Beijing Confab

New York - Officials at the United Nations again reversed themselves and decided to include several references to Lesbians and sexual orientation in the draft platform to be discussed at the U.N.'s 4th World Conference on Women

in Beijing in late summer.

Planning for the conference has been a topsy-turvy affair for Lesbian activists who were first denied access to the forum of non-government agencies that will accompany the conference. After a formal protest by US Representative Madeline Albright, Lesbian activists with the International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission (based in San Francisco) and the Mary Helen Mautner Project for Lesbians with Cancer will be allowed to participate.

While several resolutions on Lesbian issues and sexual orientation discrimination were submitted to the U.N. by the North American and European planning delegations, early drafts of the platform proposed omitted resolutions. After lobbying by Lesbian groups, the latest draft of the platform includes Lesbian issues within brackets, which means that the delegates themselves will decide whether the resolutions should be discussed and

#### Also Around the Globe...

Sharjah - Gulf Times recently reported that two foreign Lesbians were flogged and given up to two years in prison for "illegitimate relationships" and "indecency" in the United Arab Emirates. UAR is on the Arabian peninsula. The women, unnamed in the report, were given 90 lashes and will be expelled from the country after serving their sentences.

London - The Archbishop of Canterbury, George Carey, recently asserted that the Anglican Church has no plans to allow the ordination of homosexual priests or to recognize same gender unions on the same terms as heterosexual marriage. He said the Church "will not be stampeded into changing its theological position or its pastoral practice."

Moscow - Sergei Ryachovsky, suspected of committing up to 19

murders in the Moscow area over the past ten years, has told investigators he was trying to rid society of "good-for-nothing people." Among his victims were Gay men whom Ryachovsky says he hated.


Stockholm - Several thousand people attended a march in Sweden recently to protest the Gay-bashing death of Peter Karlsson, a popular hockey player. Karlsson was reportedly stabbed 64 times by a 19-year-old skinhead who confessed to the crime. He claims he lashed out after Karlsson made a pass at him

Warsaw - A parliamentary commission charged with drafting a new constitution for Poland has voted to include a ban on sexual orientation bias into the country's civil rights guarantees. The draft constitution must be approved by both houses of Parliament and then be submitted to a public referendum

before becoming law.

Tirana — The International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission reports that the Albanian Parliament has repealed Article 137 of the penal code, which made homosexuality illegal. Punishment for merely homosexual" had included up to ten years in prison. The only Gay group in the country, Shoqata Gay Albania, was formed illegally last year and has been harassed by police.

London, Ontario - The President of the Homophile Association of London, Ontario is charging that a police crackdown on child pornography, which has resulted in 54 arrests, is unfairly scapegoating the Gay community. "This is not about children or pedophilia,"
Richard Hudler told the New York
Times, "the target is Gay male sex."

#### National News Briefs

Committee OK's Discharges for **HIV+ Service Members** 

Washington, DC — On May 24, the House Committee on National Security passed by a 37-16 vote a measure that will require the immediate discharge of all military personnel who are found to be HIV-positive. The proposal, part of the Defense Department's 1996 appropriations bill, was introduced by the virulently anti-Gay Congressman and GOP Presidential candidate Bob Dornan (R-CA).

Current Pentagon policy is to retain service members who are HIV-positive as long as they are healthy and can perform their duties. The only restriction is that they are not

deployed outside the country.

Dornan contends that in a time of tighter budgets and reduced personnel, the Pentagon needs to maximize its manpower: "We need each and every member of our military to be worldwide deployable. How can we afford to retain those who cannot perform all military duties?"

Pentagon officials are content with the current policy and have not asked for a change. Assistant Defense Secretary Frederick F.Y. Pang, in a statement to the committee, called the mandatory discharge provision "unnecessary." He wrote: "As long as these members can perform their required duties, we see no prudent reason to separate and replace them."

The discharge provision is likely to advance to a floor vote in the House of Representatives in June. AIDS and Gay lobbyists are urging people to contact their members of Congress to express opposition to Dornan's measure.

Seven Attorneys General Support Amendment 2

Sacramento, CA - California Attorney General Dan Lungren has joined the Attorneys General of six other states in submitting a brief to the US Supreme Court in support of Colorado's anti-Gay Amendment 2. The measure was struck down by the Colorado Supreme Court last year, but proponents have appealed to the US Supreme Court, which will hear arguments in the case next fall.

Amendment 2, passed by 53% of Colorado voters in 1992, will repeal Gay rights laws already adopted in Denver, Boulder and Aspen and forbid the state, its counties and localities from ever including sexual orientation as a protected

class in civil rights laws.

Lungren joined the Attorneys General of Alabama, Idaho, Nebraska, South Carolina, South Dakota and Virginia expressing support for Amendment 2. Lungren argued that Gays and Lesbians are not the victims of persistent discrimination, that the Constitution was not meant to protect "every and any special interest group," and that the amendment is a legitimate expression of "state's rights."

A spokesman for the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force called Amendment 2 a "travesty of civil rights" and Lungren's support of it "unconscionable." "Should Amendment 2 be upheld, it will foster an open season of discrimination and harassment of Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Americans, and place

all civil rights in jeopardy."

Stonewall Vet Sylvia Rivera

Mending After Suicide Attempt
New York, NY — Sylvia Rivera, the transvestite who
played a pivotal role in the Stonewall Rebellion in 1969, is recovering from a recent suicide attempt, according to the New York Times. The rebellion against a police raid on the Stonewall Inn in Greenwich Village was a catalyst for the Gay rights movement.

Rivera, 44, tried to commit suicide in mid-May by walking into the Hudson River. A passer-by notified police who fished her out of the water and sent her to a psychiatric ward. Rivera told the Times she had been drinking heavily and was depressed after being kicked out of her apartment by roommates. She and her partner Frank had been living in a boxcar which disappeared with all of their possessions.

Rivera said she often went down to the Hudson to meditate and remember Marsha P. Johnson, the legendary drag queen and Stonewall veteran whose body was found floating in the river three years ago. "Her ashes went into the river, and I draw strength when I go down there and think about her." Drinking and growing more depressed however, Rivera

took the plunge.

Rivera spoke wistfully of her moment in the limelight at last year's Stonewall anniversary celebration: "[1]t was beautiful. I walked down 58th Street and the young ones were calling from the sidewalk, 'Sylvia, Sylvia, thank you, we know what you did.' After that I went back on the shelf. It would be wonderful if the movement took care of its own. But don't worry about Sylvia. I should be out of here in a week and I should be

GLAAD Attacks Mel Gibson for

Homophobic "Braveheart"
San Francisco, CA — Angered by the offensive portrayal of Gay men in Mel Gibson's new film, Braveheart, the San Francisco Bay Area chapter of the Gay and Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD) joined with other GLAAD chapters in conducting informational leafleting outside several theaters in an effort to expose Hollywood's "persistent homophobia."

In the medieval epic Braveheart, Gays are singled out for contempt. England's King Edward II is portrayed as an effeminate, foolish and vain homosexual, deserving of ridicule. In many screenings, audiences laugh when the character appears on screen and cheer when his lover is tossed out a

window to his death.

"While Braveheart is inconsistent with historical fact, it is certainly consistent with Mel Gibson's contempt for Gay men," said GLAAD's Al Kielwasser. "Gibson has regularly made

a point of ridiculing the Gay community."

Gibson has said that Gay men and Gay sex are unnatural and that he fears being perceived as Gay because he is an actor. "I became an actor despite that," he has said. "But with this look, who's going to think I'm Gay? It would be hard to take me for someone like that." Gibson removed all mention of the main character's homosexuality in his movie The Man Without a Face.

GLAAD is not calling for people to boycott Braveheart. "If they choose to see Braveheart, we only hope that filmgoers will also see - and begin to understand - Hollywood



NGLTF Announces Stands on "Controversial" Issues

Washington, DC — The Board of Directors of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force has unanimously adopted three resolutions on welfare, immigration and affirmative action which are admittedly "controversial."

"Current events call on us to be clear on these issues as we move forward on the national, state and local level in alliance with other organizations and movements," said Board Co-Chair Deborah Johnson-Rolon. "We recognize that in order for this society to offer us the compassion and justice we seek as Gay and Lesbian people, that compassion must exist for all...We believe it's important to take a stand, for our coalition efforts and for our educational work within the community."

A preamble to each resolution reads, "Recognizing that the civil rights of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgendered people are inextricably linked to the civil rights of all people..." The resolution on welfare reads: "[NGLTF]



opposes the elimination or reduction of government programs that provide needed food, housing, health care and

other basic services.

The resolution on affirmative action "[NGLTF] supports the establishment and continuation of policies and programs that attempt to address the continuing effects of this nation's legacy of genderrace-based discrimination, and opposes the wholesale elimination of the concept of affirmative action."

The resolution on immigration reads: "[NGLTF] opposes all legislative measures that deny immigrants provision of basic needs, especially health care.

Washington, DC - The nation's largest Gay and Lesbian political organization is launching a massive membership drive to counter the growth of anti-Gay groups across the country. The Human Rights Campaign Fund (HRCF), with 100,000 members, is still dwarfed by Pat Robertson's Christian Coalition, which boasts a membership of

The HRCF will be signing up members at Pride events throughout the summer, including those in Milwaukee and Madison. Candace Gingrich, Lesbian sister of the Speaker of the House, will also be touring the country, urging more active involvement to counter the right wing. "The more people who come out for equal rights and join HRCF, the better we'll be able to fight the battles ahead,"

says HRCF's Brian Albert.

Membership in HRCF is only \$20 a year. Members receive "Action Alerts" about pressing issues before Congress, the HRCF Quarterly, and advance news of special events in Washington and around the country. Washington, DC - The Board of Directors of NGLTF has agreed to continue its current practice of not accepting donations or sponsorship from the Coors Brewing Co. and the Coors Foundation due to the well-documented connection between those two entities and Radical Right organizations. The decision followed a meeting with Coors representatives, who declined to provide NGLTF with financial and stockholder information on the company and foundation.

Orlando, FL - While the American Family Association lodged protests with Disney, thousands of Gays and Lesbians descended on Disney World June 3 to celebrate the 5th annual observance of Gay Day in the Magic Kingdom. The event has grown from several dozen attenders in its first year to more than 15,000 today. "It shows solidarity in a non-political way," said one organizer. "It's just a completely enjoyable environment."

New Ipswich, NH - Saying they were not part of the approved curriculum, School Board members in New Ipswich ordered that copies of E.M. Forster's Maurice and May Sarton's The Education of Harriet Hatfield be confiscated from high school classrooms.

The Gay-themed books were not required reading but listed as supplements to junior and senior English classes. Students "can read what they want to at home," School Board President Steve Lizotte declared

Olympia, ME — In May, the Judiciary Committee of the Maine legislature rejected a measure that would limit the groups given protected status under Maine law, clearing the way for the proposal to appear as a public referendum this November. spokesperson for Maine Won't Discriminate said, "The Judiciary clearly recognized the flaws with this bill. It is poorly worded. It would deliberately mislead the voters, and it would have a wide range of unintended consequences."

Washington, DC - The Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund has endorsed Roberta Achtenberg for Mayor of San Francisco. Achtenberg, a former San Francisco Supervisor, served for two years as an Assistant Secretary for Fair Housing in the Clinton administration. "We're proud to put the power of our national donor network behind the first out Lesbian to run in a big city mayoral race," said the Victory Fund's Kathleen DeBold.

New York, NY — Among those ing "Obies," the award for winning excellence in Off-Broadway productions sponsored by the Village Voice, were the Five Lesbian Brothers for the black comedy The Secretaries, Tony Kushner for his play Slavs, Terrence McNally for Love! Valour! Compassion! and Vanessa Redgrave and Eileen Atkins for their two-women show depicting the relationship between Virginia Woolf and Vita Sackville-West.

San Antonio, TX - Matt Young, an openly Gay sophomore at Trinity University, recently won 63% of the student vote to become President of the student body. His opponent, Jason Powell, was denounced by many for remarks in which he claimed that a Gay person could not fairly represent the interests of all students.

New York, NY - Tony Azito, who led the Keystone Kops in the acclaimed stage and film version of The Pirates of Penzance in 1980-81, died of AIDS complications May 26. He was 46. Azito played many roles in the New York Shakespeare Festival, had the recurring role of the drug dealer Manolo in TV's Miami Vice, and appeared in the movies Moonstruck and The Addams Family.

New York, NY — Peter Degen, 47, a New York Stock Exchange trading supervisor, has filed a \$22 million lawsuit charging that Stock Exchange officials fired him because he is Gay. Degen began working at the Stock Exchange in 1970. After colleagues learned he is Gay in 1992, Degen charges that they created a "hostile, threatening, abusive, frightening work environment."

#### Gay Doctors OK Artificial Insemination, Marijuana Trials

San Francisco — The Gay and Lesbian Medical Association, which represents 1,600 Gay and Lesbian physicians in the US and Canada, has formally endorsed access to artificial insemination services without regard to sexual orientation or marital status as well as clinical trials for the therapeutic use of marijuana in AIDS patients.

The GLMA's position on insemination is meant to counter ongoing barriers experienced by Lesbians and others who seek insemination services.

"No one should be denied access to artificial insemination services solely on the basis of sexual orientation or marital status," said Dr. Jocelyn White of GLMA. "Lesbians, Gay men, Bisexuals, Transgenderedindividuals and unmarried heterosexuals can be loving, capable parents. They should not be subjected to a 'family values' litmus test in order to gain access to a medical procedure."

The GLMA's stance on marijuana trials was formulated in response to the continuing resistance of the Department of Health and Human Services to approve such trials despite evidence that

"Marijuana has been shown to be clinically beneficial for symptomatic relief of people with cancer, multiple sclerosis and glaucoma," said Dr. Alvin Novick. "It has also been reported anecdotally to be clinically beneficial for symptomatic relief in persons with AIDS. The Clinton administration should not let political fears about being labeled 'soft on drugs' prevent it from allowing legitimate scientific research designed to alleviate the suffering of thousands of Americans."

#### Women Doctors More Thorough With Women Patients

Minneapolis, MN — The results of a study published in the Journal of General Internal Medicine indicate that female physicians are more aggressive than male doctors in screening female patients for breast and cervical cancers

and other health problems.

The study examined the health care services received by 1,850 women in North Carolina over a 6-month period. It found that women under the care of female doctors were 47% more likely to receive a Pap test than those under the care of male physicians. Pap tests help to determine any changes in the cervix which might indicate the development of cancer or other diseases. In addition, women were much more likely to receive mammograms and cholesterol screening when under a female physician's care.

Dr. Nicole Lurie, one of the researchers conducting the study, said that important questions remain: "Is it because the women who are seeing women doctors are themselves different? Or is it that the women doctors have a different prevention agenda than the men doctors?"

Many Lesbians feel more comfortable with female health care providers, citing better listening skills and communication on the part of women practitioners. This perception of greater sensitivity is reinforced by the thoroughness of care given by women doctors in the North Carolina study.

TAG Issues Recommendations on AIDS-Related Lymphoma

Los Angeles, CA — The Treatment Action Group, the nation's first AIDS activist organization dedicated solely to the efforts to find effective treatments for AIDS and AIDS-related diseases, has issued a report with recommendations on the research, diagnosis and treatment of AIDS-related lymphomas.

Lymphomas are cancers of the lymphatic system, causing uncontrolled growth in certain immune-system cells. The disease frequently affects the neurologic system. Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma (NHL) is the type most often found in people with HIV, affecting 5-12% of all HIV-infected persons. Median life expectancy for AIDS-related NHL is about 8 months. Treatment currently involves combinations of chemotherapeutic agents. While initial response to chemotherapy is good, the relapse rate is high.

The TAG report made these recommendations to better advance treatments for NHL: increased cooperation between the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), which oversees most government-sponsored AIDS research, and the National Cancer Institute (NCI) on basic and clinical research related to AIDS-related NHL; and increased research on all lymphomas, including the study of possible causes such as Epstein-Barr Virus and the new Kaposi's Sarcoma Herpes Virus.

TAG also recommends: research on novel treatment approaches that inhibit the production of natural chemicals, such as Interleukin- 6 and IL-10, that may stimulate lymphoma growth; educational campaigns to inform patients and physicians about the diagnosis and treatment of AIDS-related lymphoma; and improved mechanisms for encouraging patient participation in basic

and clinical research.

He will be joined by Drs. Robert Redfield and William Blattner, who together will focus on "an end to AIDS." Gallo called the new Institute "unprecedented" in that it will combine "basic research with clinical research and population studies."



#### Rethinking Gay Pride

To put more pride in Gay Pride, we need to put more "Gay" there.

Consider Gays' first trip to the

Supreme Court in nearly a decade. In April, our lawyers shamefully argued before the justices that in Boston's St. Patrick's Day Parade a banner identifying its bearers as Gay conveyed no message at all. The justices were understandably skeptical. Right-wing Justice Scalia mocked that surely the banner "is an expression of pride in what Gays are. How else does one show pride." And he was right. Our lawyers sold us down the river by denying the importance of coming out and being out, of Gay presence and Gay sociability. The Gay movement must abandon its figleaf timidity and start asserting that Gayness

Too often Gays and our allies have argued that Gayness is irrelevant - that, after all, Gays are just humans too. These rhetorical moves are inadvertent. even well intentioned, erasures of Gay being. They suppose that Gayness is a property, like having an eye color or wearing an earring, which a person could have in isolation from all other people and without significant effect on others. And it is perfectly understandable though wrong - that Gays and others have taken up this strategy.

First, the Gay rights movement for the longest part of its duration was singularly focused on civil rights legislation. In this context, if one could argue that Gayness is irrelevant in general, then presumptively it is irrelevant to flying a plane, serving a meal, teaching a class, or being a cop. And so it would be unjust for society to discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation, since sexual orientation is not the basis for anything - or so it goes. The view that Gayness doesn't matter had a strategic pull as well. If a person's being Gay was an irrelevant (or, even better, an immutable) characteristic, then other people would not have to be so afraid of it, afraid that they might be it or get it. As a tactic against persecution and a plea for tolerance, it wasn't a bad strategy. But if we stick with it now, we will be stuck indeed.

In our social projects, we need to be thinking of Gayness not as something that a person can have in splendid isolation. It takes two to be queer.

We need to conceptualize Gayness as a relational property, a connection between persons, a human bonding, one in need of tendance and social concern. Gayness situates the Gay person in social and interpersonal contexts. It is both an outflow and a reception of affection, perception, desire, knowing - both Biblical and cognitive. We need to stop claiming that Gayness is an irrelevant property and begin recognizing that it is crucially important to people's lives and identities, to social history, and, as the Gay studies crowd is showing, to understanding central components of many of society's most important concepts and cherished institutions.


We need to take more seriously that fundamental form of connectedness which is sex and cease treating the sexual law reform movement as an awkward political and educational stepchild. Even when unenforced, sodomy laws have many spin-off effects. The courts use them to justify employment discrimination, to deny Gays equal protection rights, and - as we and Sharon Bottoms painfully learned - to destroy Gay families. On the plane of the nation's ideals, sodomy laws tell Gays and Lesbians "You are alone. Your being is not a form of connection."

Add to this, the sexual gloom emanating from the AIDS crisis, and it is now time not only to defend sex against this tide but to valorize it, indeed acknowledge that it is one of the central values of human life: as the chief portal to ecstasy, as the satisfaction of a recurrent natural need, and as the near occasion of, undergirding for, and necessary prompt to love. Strategically nothing is to be gained and potentially much is to be lost by avoiding these issues, especially now that the nation seems again, as in the early 'thirties, to be sailing into an intensely anti-sexual period, even - remember Joycelyn Elders' departure - into sexual hysteria.

In understanding Gayness as connectedness, we need to begin paying more attention to issues of Gay marriage, domestic partnership, child rearing, and mentoring. We cannot simply cede the "family values" agenda to the Right. Caught up in the old defensiveGayness-doesn't-mattermode, our national Gay lobbying and legal groups have been slow to take up these issues. Here "the people" have far

## Independent Thoughts

Commentary by Marvin Liebman

May 8th, 1995, marked the 50th Anniversary of VE Day. Here at home, and throughout Europe, there were celebrations, parades, nostalgia, remembrances of victory, and salutes to the living veterans and the countless dead. For me, the celebrations commemorated a bleaker fifty-year benchmark — the beginnings of the US military's campaign to rid its ranks of homosexual American citizens like me.

During World War II, some nine thousand Lesbian and Gay service members were hunted down and thrown out without any veteran benefits or thanks - as if they had never existed. Since that time, almost one hundred thousand other homosexuals have shared the fate of us early outcasts branded, humiliated, and expelled. Our story is recounted in the documentary film, Coming Out Under Fire, directed by Arthur Dong and based on the book by Alan Berube. It is scheduled to be shown in many cities around the country sometime in June. It behooves all who believe that "it can't happen here" to watch. It airs locally June 21st at 10pm on Wisconsin Public TV stations.

I tried to enlist in February, 1942, and was rejected because of poor eyesight. After trying again and again, I was finally accepted for "limited service" and inducted into the Army of the United States on January 6, 1943. I was as happy as any other patriotic 19-year old finally able to serve his country in its war against the forces of evil.

I was assigned to the Army Air Corps and, after serving in the United States for 18 months, was finally sent overseas to the Italian theater of war. On the troopship, I met my first groups of Gay Gl's. I seemed to find dozens of new comrades, brothers who shared the same secret and were unashamed. It was a revelation to me.


I went from Italy to North Africa and finally ended up in Cairo where I was assigned to a squadron waiting relocation to another area of war. I had just passed my 21st birthday. I whiled away my time in Cairo carrying on a voluminous V-Mail correspondence with my pals from the troopship who were scattered around Europe and Africa. We used the campy and flamboyant language of the protagonist in a Dorothy Parker story — From the Diary of a New York Lady: During Days of Horror, Despair & World Change — which we had read out loud and which amused us because it seemed so removed from the war.

Although all mail was censored, I was scarcely worried about what I thought were amusing letter. Wrong! The witch-hunt against homosexuals had begun, and I was one of those caught in

its net. I was summoned to squadron headquarters, and my Commanding Officer confronted me with a letter I had written and asked, before the 10 or 15 men and women working there, "Are you one of those New York pervert Jew faggots?" Thus began my nightmare.

I was sent to the Section 8 Ward of the hospital which was surrounded by barbed wire and housed GI's with psychiatric problems. I was interrogated twice each day about my "perversion" and asked to name other airman who were "perverts." I was finally given a court marshal before three officers and admitted that I was a homosexual but, as far as I knew, I was the only homosexual in the whole world. I was given a General Discharge and sent back to my squadron to await final travel orders.

At my first formation that evening, when the flag was lowered, my Commanding Officer barked an order



It was November 2, 1944, just short of two years since my induction. The officer had a sheaf of papers, and he called out names one at a time. There were about a hundred of us. One by one, each man went up to receive a white sheet of paper, an honorable discharge.

There were four of us left. My named was called, and I went up to receive a blue piece of paper. An MP came over telling me to follow him. I was told to take off my uniform, and I was given a used black suit and a white sport shirt. I was permitted to keep my Army boots, socks, khaki undershorts, and my dog tags. That's all. This treatment was the rule for all soldiers with blue discharges.

I left Fort Dix with a blue sheet of paper which read, "Discharged... for habits and traits of character not beneficial to the Armed Forces of the United States." I took a bus to New York and arrived in the city in the early afternoon. With the final pay of \$40 they had given me, I bought a cheap raincoat to protect me from the cold. I telephoned home to Brooklyn. My mother's shrieks of joy were followed by questions. "Where are you? When are you coming home? Oh, thank God, thank God," and she began to weep.

I took the subway to Brooklyn. When I came to my street, I could see my mother waiting on the porch just as she had said good-bye less than two years before. She shouted, "Sonny, Sonny," and my father, mother and sister rushed out of the house to hug and kiss me and welcome me home.


"Where's your uniform," my father asked.

"I didn't want to wear it any more. I got rid of it."

"How did you get out?" he asked.

"I had a slight sun stroke in Egypt, and I got a medical discharge."

No other questions were asked. The lying had begun to try to erase the pink triangle with which my government had branded me and to escape my identity that no amount of lies could ever deny.

#### Mobilizing to Protect Civil Rights

The Sixth Circuit decision in Equality Foundation vs City of Cincinnati, which upheld Cincinnati's anti-Gay initiative, is the worst federal court decision on a Gay issue since the Supreme Court's 1986 Hardwick decision. Hardwick at least had four dissenting opinions, including Justice Blackmun's eloquent defense of the right to privacy and of the right of Gay men and Lesbians to love and intimacy. The Equality Foundation decision was a 3-0 disaster.

With the Supreme Court case looming over the validity of the virtually identical Colorado anti-Gay amendment, the Sixth Circuit decision provides powerful ammunition for anti-Gay forces. It is critical that the Lesbian and Gay community, together with its allies, not simply adopt a "wait and see" and "leave it to the lawyers" approach to the upcoming Supreme Court decision over anti-Gay initiatives. Although the legal challenging the anti-Gay amendments are performing a yeoman's service, they cannot carry the ball alone. The Supreme Court is influenced by the general political climate, perhaps as much as by the legal briefs it receives.

The community needs to attack the Cincinnati decision publicly, in a variety of ways, and expose it for what it is — part and parcel of a long term anti-civil rights strategy of the radical right. This means letters to the editor, op-ed pieces in the mainstream press, and educating religious and community groups.

Adopting hook, line and sinker, the "special rights" rhetoric of the rightwing, the ideology underlying the Sixth Circuit's decision threatens all other civil rights protections. The court repeatedly characterized the Cincinnati civil rights ordinance that prohibited discrimination based on sexual orientation as "special

legal protection for homosexuals." It claimed that the anti-Gay amendment's only effect was to make it useless to lobby the City Council "for preferential enactments for homosexuals."

If laws prohibiting sexual orientation "special discrimination are protections for homosexuals' preferential enactments," prohibitions against race discrimination are "special legal protections for racial minority groups," prohibitions against religious discrimination are "special legal protections for non-Christians," etc. Calling protections against discrimination "preferential enactments" and "special protections" on behalf of minority groups works hand-in-glove with anti-affirmative rhetoric. Those attacking affirmative action label all affirmative steps to eliminate discrimination as "preferences," even though only a very small percentage of affirmative action remedies involve quotas (and those only in cases where there's been a history of discrimination). By implying in its decision that all civil rights laws amount to "preferences" for minority groups, the Sixth Circuit was building the ideological

The Sixth Circuit conveniently ignored the fact that anti-discrimination lawsprotect everyone from discrimination based on certain reasons, and do not grant "special rights" to minority groups. Even a member of a majority group (e.g. a white person) can file a claim if subjected to discrimination based on a characteristic that is protected from discrimination.

framework for repeal of other civil rights

It is critical to point out that the litany of reasons that the Sixth Circuit gave as "valid community interests" in adopting the anti-Gay amendment include several that can be used just as easily to argue against any and all civil rights laws. The first of these—"enhancing associational liberty"—would, according to the court, eliminate "exposure to the punishment mandated by the Human Rights Ordinance against certain persons who elected to disassociate themselves from homosexuals." This freedom-of-association rhetoric is the very same

type of rhetoric used by opponents of the 1964 Civil Rights Act. Another of the litany — "reducing governmental regulation of the private social and economic conduct of Cincinnati residents" — uses the anti-regulatory ideology of the Republican Contract on America as a reason to oppose Civil Rights. A third — cost savings for taxpayers — would apply to any civil rights protections.


It is also important to expose the court's twisted logic that "invisible" Gay men and Lesbians (invisible because they generally are not identifiable "on sight") do not suffer employment discrimination because of their sexual orientation. The court argued, instead, that they face discrimination only when their "homosexual conduct" (the court's examples are "public displays of homosexual affection or self-proclamation of homosexual tendencies") makes them visible.

The Sixth Circuit's "logic" would mean that a company that states it wishes to hire only Christians is not discriminating against non-Christians, because a person's religion is not visible and therefore there is no effective way to identify non-Christians. It would only be when someone engaged in conduct (e.g. wearing a Jewish star) revealing themselves to be a non-Christian that the person would face discrimination.

Taking the Sixth Circuit's argument to its "logical" conclusion, wearing a Jewish star is "Jewish conduct." Thus, if the employee who wore a Jewish star is fired, this would not be discrimination based on religion, but rather discrimination based on "Jewish conduct."

This scenario is not as far-fetched as it may seem. In 1986, the Supreme Court upheld the right of the Air Force to prohibit an Orthodox Jewish psychologist from wearing a yarmulke while on active

We are facing the second postreconstruction era in the United States. The rightwing is on a path whose ultimate destination is elimination of all civil rights protections. Gay men and Lesbians, racial and religious minorities, and women are all in their cross-hairs. The Lavender community needs to be building genuine coalitions with other civil rights groups, to preserve and expand civil rights protections. This means not simply seeking support from other groups in opposing anti-Gay initiatives, but offering support for preserving other civil rights protections. There's not a moment to lose.





## Interview

# The Case of the Successful Sequel

A Talk with Mabel Maney

Last year, Mabel Maney did a
howlingly funny and painstakingly
accurate parody of young adult female
detective and nurse novels called The
Case of the Not-So-Nice Nurse. Set in
the late fifties, the book expertly
captures the feel of the 'gosh-golly'
genre. Only Ms. Maney populates her
opus with a lovable band of plucky, loyal
and resourceful Lesbians. It's hilarious,
sweet, suspenseful, and it also reestablishes myth in Gay terms. There
are peeks and clues into the hidden
world of women who loved women
during that socially and politically
repressive era.

Fans of her first novel will be clapping their hands and spinning in a series of small, excited circles to hear that the sequel, The Case of the Good-For-Nothing Girlfriend, is out by Cleis Press. The second books picks up precisely where the first novel ends.

Once again the results are winning.

Recently I called Mabel on the phone in San Francisco and true to her characters, she informed me that, though the interview was going to be conducted by telephone, she had groomed and dressed herself in an appropriate manner.

Owen: I've heard you have been a big fan of detective stories since you

were a kid?

Mabel: Of Nancy Drew and Cherry Ames, who's not as well known, she's a nurse character. She was invented in the 1940's to try and get girls to be war nurses so they focused a lot on uniforms, so they have this incredible uniform fetish going on in them, which is great because so do I. In fact, the woman I'm currently chasing is a cop.

Having just finished "The Case of the Good-For-Nothing Girlfriend" I could

say that's sort of life imitating art. What was your intent when you began writing the first in the series, "The Case of the Not-So-Nice Nurse?

Actually I wrote it because I had a back injury and was stuck in bed. I'm a very hyperactive and compulsive worker and after three days of lying around thinking my life was over I thought "This is a good time to write that book I've been thinking about." I think my intent was to write something I wish I had read



as a kid, something very positive with sexy Lesbian characters. Something fun too - I think humor is really important these days.

You recreate so much of the genre with such detail, do you feel more as though you're creating myth, or giving existing myth a Gay sensibility?

I think I'm creating it. I talked about this with a lawyer, about what is true parody. I don't want to just lift a character, but to talk about Nancy as an icon of proper middle class America and create characters that show the hidden world of women that's always been there. I wanted to create a world that was a whole lot nicer.

This type of writing was your thesis in college...

Specifically on Cherry and the homoerotic subtext of these nurse books. It's this world of women that emerged during the war when there were very few men around. They were always admiring each other, the cut of one another's uniform. They're very sexy. Often Cherry will stare at a woman and think, "If I were a man I'd love her." It's very interesting and very sexy. In the Nancy Drew books I was very interested in the missing mother and the sort of incestuous love. She's her father's partner. He's young and handsome, but there's never any mention of a lover. I think it has a creepy incestuous undertone.

That's a theme you definitely explore more fully in the new book.

Exactly. Plus, in Nancy Drew you had George "The giggly girl with the boy's name." Come on, everybody knew George was a dyke. It was great.'

What do you think was the overall contribution of the genre?

Nancy Drew was invented by the same man who invented the Hardy Boys, so he gave her some traditionally, for the time, male qualities. She's fearless, though she will stop and change before chasing a crook, which I can certainly understand. She doesn't doubt herself, she's stubborn, she's smart, and she has an incredible energy. That's what it did for girls - it gave girls like me a great role model.

You've really mastered the cornerstones of that style. Do you have more fun naming characters, describing their clothes, or toying with the syntax?

I try to focus on all three. I fuss and write very slowly. It's a learned language and different from my other writing.

Cluespeak.

That's a great name for it. I have to read them every night and study those books and keep them in my head. When I get to the point when I talk like that on a daily basis I know I'm ready to write. I

have to be totally in that world.

Which characters do you most closely resemble?

I think Lauren, the bratty girl with a lot of interests. But I'm in love with Midge. I'm really hot for my character Midge.

Midge certainly comes to the forefront in this novel as the voice of reason.

She's also passionate and a bit of a hot head, and she is extremely loyal. Actually I think I'm all the characters... only Cherry is who I used to be and Velma, Cherry's look-alike and Midge's lover, is where I'm going.

Your cast is rapidly expanding. Is it fun to create this big Gay and Lesbian community in 1957 Americana style?

It's the best. I wish I had two brains so I could do an off shoot. I keep wanting to take them to all these different places. I like them as a group. In the next book The Hardly Boys come to visit them so there will be a cast of thousands. I'm working out how to do that.

Something else very clear in your books is the delineation between butch and femme. Is that a commentary on Lesbianism in general or more on 1957?

It's fifties and it's fun. I don't think it accurately divides the world, but it does my world. I'm clearly a femme and I love to tease butches. I love to tease butches in the same way that I'm a Lesbian. I love my people, my group, my girls... but I like to tease girls about romance because everyone knows Lesbian romance is a really funny subject.

Does writing this perky prose require a certain frame of mind for writing?

Absolutely. I'm perky anyway, but I have to be completely into it. Often I'll go days where I don't want to have conversation with anyone - what I really want to think about is the language, the drama, the clothing.

The great themes. Tell me about the Hardly Boys book you're working on for release next fall from Cleis press.

It's called The Ghost in the Closet. It's a continuation of The Case of the Good-For-Nothing Girlfriend. Frank Hardly shows up, curious about the announcement that he has been married. Then both Hardly Boys move in to try and save Nancy and Cherry's relationship, and along the way discover some secrets of their own...

I'm sorry this is over the phone because after reading both books I've got to know what you're wearing.

## Milwaukee Rolls Out the Lavender Carpet

## Anticipation Runs High as PrideFest is Inundated With Calls From Out-of-Towner's

Milwaukee — People from throughout the Midwest have gotten "the word" about PrideFest '95... don't miss out! Milwaukee and Wisconsin's LesBiGay community has "talked up" the Festival to their friends and the Gay Grapevine is abuzz. The PrideFest Committee has been nearly overwhelmed with last minute parade and booth applications in the last few weeks as businesses, vendors and entertainers want in on the building excitement. Bill Meunier, PrideFest co-chair, is ecstatic over the volume of calls coming in on PrideFest's local and 800 numbers.

Attendance at the June 10-11 lakefront festival will far surpass last years record breaking crowds. Three months ago the committee estimated up to 25,000 people would attend the two day festival if the inquiries attendance if thousands to visitors the weekend of June 10th and 11th. The '95 celebration will be held in Veterans Park for the second year because previous growth demanded a new venue.

The lakefront setting, on the north grounds of the Milwaukee War Memorial Art Center, is only blocks north of the famous Summerfest grounds. Visitors can follow all the freeway Summerfest directional signs until they hit Lincoln Memorial Drive and turn left.

The two day event features Saturday night fireworks, the Sunday Wisconsin Pride Parade, dozens of exhibits, five stages including three entertainment stages (where over 250 singers, dancers, actors and musicians will perform); a Lecture Stage and an Activity Tent. As if that isn't enough, the festival will also include a Dance Tent, Volleyball Tournament, a Classic Car Show and more.

There will be plenty to eat and drink as well. Seven food stands will serve up everything from chicken dinners and stuffed baked potatoes, to sandwiches and snacks.

Entertainment offerings range from a Baroque music hour to high energy music. Performers from three states: Wisconsin, Illinois and Minnesota, will be exhibiting their talents. All of the entertainers including a number of well known non-gay groups have donated their time and talents to the festival.

#### SATURDAY FIREWORKS

Louder than the biggest disco sound system, and more colorful then the Rainbow Flags lining downtown Milwaukee streets, the PrideFest Lite Up the Sky With Pride Fireworks display sponsored by the Miller Brewing Company will take place on Saturday June 10th at 10pm. (Rain date Sunday June 11th at 9:45) There will be blazing pink triangles, and rainbow flags painted in the sky. Produced by the Bartolotta family the show has been specially designed to



celebrate Gay and Lesbian Pride.

PrideFest Co-Director Bill Meunier says, "We have wanted fireworks for a couple of years, but when we were in Juneau Park, it would have been impossible to safely shoot off a display. Then, last year, we put all of our money into expanding the event. This display tells Milwaukee that we are not hiding in the closet anymore... we are making lots of noise in celebration of that fact."

#### **EXPANDED HISTORY TENT**

PrideFest exhibits include an even larger LesBiGay History Tent featuring a national history display provided by the International Lesbian and Gay Archives of Los Angeles and an all new display of Milwaukee LesBiGay history put together after much research by Steve Brondino.

The **PrideFest Mall** and exhibit areas will be in two large tents on the north end of the grounds. New lighting will allow 80 businesses, organizations and public agencies from around the country to operate until closing. Dubbed the PrideFest Mall, it's the perfect place to pick up information, new ideas and that perfect accessory for your home or wardrobe.

#### LIGHTED BOATS, CLASSIC CARS

A Venice-style Lighted Boat Parade will sail past the PrideFest grounds on Sunday June 11th at 9:15pm. Boats will be decorated with lights and displays, and will be competing for prizes and trophies and is sponsored by the Greater Milwaukee Maritime Association.

Enough hot chrome and leather to satisfy everyone's fetish will be on display at the PrideFest Classic Car Show which will include vehicles from throughout the Midwest. Viewers will be able to get a close up look at the cars and vote for their favorites. Sponsored by the Great Lakes Region of the Lambda Car Club, last year's show drew 25 beautiful autos, including a turn of the century Model T.

#### NEW FINE ARTS FESTIVAL STONEWALL CULTURAL TENTS

PrideFest now has it own Fine Arts Festival. The Fine Arts Festival is being sponsored by the **Milwaukee Journal/Sentinel**. It is being produced by Milwaukee's renowned Dale Gutzmann and will feature performers from his own company; plus performs from Sky Light Opera, First Stage, Cream City Chorus, Womyn Song and more

The Stonewall Tent offers educational and idea exchange opportunities. Discussions and lectures on Gay and Lesbian Spirituality, Fighting the Right Wing, and coming out to your parents will be featured. The tent will house a Midwestern Regional Square Dance on Saturday evening. The Stonewall Tent is sponsored by The Wisconsin Light.

In Step Magazine and the Hotel Washington are cosponsoring the Dance Tent. Wisconsin's best DJ's will be spinning everyone's favorite dance music from open to close on both days.

The Volleyball Tournament will take place all day on Saturday on the northeast end of the grounds. Last year's tournament attracted nearly 20 teams from around the Midwest.

The PrideFest Activity Tent features a variety of offerings. Visitors can participate in a statewide political caucus, meet famous authors, learn what you can do to fight for our rights, and even find out which end of the leather harness you bought goes to the front (as if you didn't already know the answer to that one!)

#### HUGE CAKE FOR THE WEDDING

For many, the most special and meaningful moment will come at 6:30pm on Sunday, June 11, when an expected 200 couples are joined together at the PrideFest Wedding at the CCF Alyn Hess Stage.

The PrideFest Wedding affords any couple the opportunity to express their love and commitment to each other. For some the ceremony is a reaffirmation; for others it is a first-

time experience.


Last year 180 couples were joined together. This year's wedding will be extra special. To accommodate the diversity of our community, there will be three celebrants. There will also be special music and special vows. The ceremony will be followed with the presentation of a huge wedding cake.

Baked at cost by Milwaukee's East Side Övens, the double tiered wedding cake will be complete with rainbow arches, dozens and dozens of roses, and yards of trim, and will feed 1,000 people. 

PrideFest is a great opportunity for our community to show the general public what it is really like to be Gay or Lesbian. But the PrideFest Committee is aware that some members of our community don't want to show up on the

The PrideFest Committee is well aware of the fact that many people who attend our festival are not out of the closet. It also knows that there some people who don't attend because they are afraid they will be on TV. Therefore PrideFest works hard to protect your privacy. PrideFest has yet to have anyone complain that they were inadvertently "outed" at the Festival. In the weeks before the fest PrideFest contacts local television stations. The committee make it clear that indiscriminate filming of the crowd is not welcome and request that permission be given before filming starts. Not one camera person has failed to honor that request.

When TV film crews come to the festival PrideFest volunteers escort them through the grounds. These volunteers work with the TV crews and the crowd to help protect privacy. For example they will accompany the crew into a tent, announce its presence and give people a chance to get out of the way before filming begins. If the crew is doing an interview the volunteers accompanying it will warn people who may inadvertently walk into the shot.

What as all the colors of the Rainbow, 4,000 legs, a band, and even an antique fire engine? The Wisconsin Pride Parade! Contrary to a persistent and thoroughly incorrect rumor, the Wisconsin Pride Parade will take place on Sunday, line 11.

Parade Co-ordinators Rick Finger and Sheldon Schur are looking for an even bigger crowd in 1995 (after '94's 2,000). "Last year's parade was really great. It was so long that those at the beginning nearly met those at the end, as they returned to the PrideFest grounds. It was the first time that nearly the entire route was covered with marchers," said Schur. "With everything going on in Washington, we need to let the politicians know that we are not giving up."

Finger added, "We would like to see people who don't want to march to come out and cheer on those who do."

The parade will begin and end on the PrideFest grounds. Assembly begins at 11am at the southern end of the grounds. It will be preceded by a pre-parade rally, which will include entertainment and inspiring speakers. The rally will begin at 11:45am.

Led by members of the Minnesota Freedom Band and Grand Marshall State Representative Tammy Baldwin, the parade will step off at 12:30pm. The route will be the same as last year's: south on the Lincoln Memorial Drive Bridge to Mason/Prospect, south on Prospect to Wisconsin Avenue, west on Wisconsin Avenue to Van Buren, north on Van Buren to Kilbourn, east on Kilbourn to Prospect and then back to the PrideFest Grounds.

To encourage participation in the parade, PrideFest will offer free admission to everyone entering the grounds before 12:30pm.

PrideFest wants everyone to participate in the parade, but it also wants to remind participants that the Pride Parade rules prohibit bare chested participants (male or female), displays or depictions of genitalia, or signs, banners or groups promoting sex between adults and minors.

"Our society has many commemorations for the fallen, but seldom, if ever, do these rituals overtly include Gays and Lesbians," said PrideFest Co-Chair Bill Meunier. "If we don't remember these people, who will?"



In the words of producer Clinton Fein, "Wisconsin is at the heart of the movement for civil liberties for Lesbian and Gay men. It was the first in the United States to have a state wide "Gay civil rights law." In addition," Fein continued, "Wisconsin and Milwaukee are important in another aspect of our struggle - the addressing of military discrimination against Gays Lesbians. Milwaukee is the home of the very first person ever to win and go back into the military. This person is counted by almost all historians - and veterans, I might add — as being the singlehanded founder of today's movement among active duty people and veterans from our community? We chose deliberately to honor the foresight and integrity of Wisconsin and Miriam Ben-Shalom, it's remarkable and history-making daughter. We could think of no finer a place to have the national premier of our CD Rom than Milwaukee.

### History Tent Expands

The Milwaukee display will cover



#### Emphasis on Human Rights

Stonewall! The very word has come to be synonymous with our rights. Gay

The Stonewall Tent, sponsored by Wisconsin Light, will emphasize human rights in its varied line-up of speakers and presenters. "The focus on human rights just kind of fell into place as I was planning different topics that I thought would attract our interest as a community," says Bill Hanel, coordinator of the Stonewall Stage for PrideFest '95.

'I think it's crucial that we come together to celebrate our progress as a community in the area of Gay rights," says Hanel, who is coordinating the Stonewall Stage for the first time. "But we also need to acknowledge that the struggle continues and that there are people who would like to see our progress stopped, and even turned back.

Right wing religious groups are especially focused on challenging our progress, and on Saturday at 1:30pm, Sue Matulis from the Wisconsin Research Center, Inc. will kick off the line-up by speaking on her work monitoring various conservative religious groups and their attempts to thwart Lesbian and Gay rights.

In honor of the 50th Anniversary of the liberation of the Nazi death camps, Terry Boughner will present his extensive research of the suffering of Lesbian and Gay persons at the hands of Hitler's brutality during World War II.

#### Rainbow Flags Fly in Downtown Milwaukee

PrideFest volunteers have mounted 38 Rainbow Flags after it secured funding and city permits in downtown Milwaukee. Rainbow Flags are now flying on Wisconsin Ave from Wisconsin and Prospect to 8th and Wisconsin; on Juneau Avenue and Kilbourn. One flag will be flown on Astor as requested by a major donor.

PrideFest plans to begin installing the flags on May 18th. They will remain

in place until October 1st.

Show Our True Colors campaign was funded by the Lesbian Alliance of Metro Milwaukee, Gay People's Union and a private donation. "This is a great way for us to help people feel pride well beyond PrideFest," said PrideFest Co-Director, Bill Meunier. "We are thrilled at the response we've gotten. This is an idea that seems to have captured the imagination of the entire community. We are very gratified over the financial support being extended to this project."

In order to mount the flags, PrideFest had to purchase flag holders, flag poles, brackets and of course the flag themselves. In addition to those costs PrideFest had to pay a permit fee to the city for each pole being used. All told the cost for this project ran close to

All of that cost was picked up by other groups and individuals. "Its money well spent," said Meunier, "These flags

will serve as continuing reminder of the many contributions Gays and Lesbians have made to the community. We have already heard from people in other cities asking us what we had to do to get this done." In succeeding years the project costs will be limited to the city permit fees and to replacements for worn out

Meunier adds that PrideFest felt it was important to have "our flag" flying along side the ethnic and festival flags that line Wisconsin Ave during the summer. "We also wanted to fly them in the lower East Side area where we know there is a high concentration of Gay and Lesbians residents."

#### PrideFest Food & Drink Stands



Since their establishment, The Publishing Triangle and National Lesbian and Gay Book Month have sought to promote reading and the sale of Lesbian


and Gay books nationally.

Lesbian and Gay publishers continue to grow and prosper. Since 1973, Naiad Press has been dedicated solely to publishing Lesbian books. Alyson Publications, a Lesbian and Gay publisher for 15 years, has created Alyson Wonderland, an imprint dedicated to books for children in Lesbian and Gay families. Other thriving publishers include Firebrand Books, Rising Tide Press and

Following the success of small publishers, many mainstream ones have followed suit. St. Martin's Press, plus the Plume & Dutton imprints of Penguin USA have long been active in the field of publishing Lesbian and Gay titles. Since 1977, St. Martin's has published over 100 Gay and Lesbian titles. More recently, HarperCollins, Putnam, and Random House have increasingly added Gay and Lesbian titles to their publishing schedules

"In the past, our literature has been changed by writers from different ethnic and racial minorities, and that change has always involved struggle, a turf war for power. Now the time has come for Gay and Lesbian fiction to renew American literature in the only way it can be renewed - by contesting its social and literary assumptions," said editor, teacher and author George Stambolian.





## Stark Reality


Classic Update



outstripped their "leaders" in recognizing social needs and setting agendas.

Again, that's because Gayness matters. For Gays, sexuality affects - is a foreground presence in — everyday existence, whereas for straights sexuality, especially what might be called heterosexual presumption, is an unacknowledged background phenomenon. For straights, sexuality is like the air at room temperature, pervasive and dominant, yet entirely unnoticed. This socially induced asymmetry, which parallels a similar asymmetry between racial whiteness and blackness, unjustifiably permits straights and straight-identified Gays to accuse Gays of being obsessed with sex should Gays make any mention of sex at all, even while straight lives are themselves pervasively structured by sexuality.

The reason that Gay marriage has become such a major issue for Gays is that both Gayness and marriage have their roots in everyday existence.

Marriage is a way of incorporating Gayness as connectedness into day-today living. It should not be surprising then that Gay men and Lesbians - as a matter of pride and need - have shifted issues of family life to the top of their political agenda. Gay sex, Gay love, Gay life, and Gay presence all matter.

Before the Supreme Court, our lawyers should have argued that Gay presence is so important that government has a legitimate, indeed compelling interest in protecting it from discrimination even if our presence incidentally impinges on whatever message is being conveyed by plastic shamrocks and green bagels.
