





CAIR Investigator Receives Achievement & Major NIH Research Project Awards

Dr. Ostrow Cited for "Outstanding Contributions"

Milwaukee — David G. Ostrow, MD, PhD, Associate Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine and Director of the Mental Health & Behavioral Medicine Core of CAIR, received the Jane Addams/Howard Brown Medical Achievement Award on June 20th.

The award, presented by the National Lesbian & Gay Health Association, was given for "his outstanding contributions to the Health of the Lesbian and Gay Community." In 1974, Dr. Ostrow was among the founders of the first community-based clinic for the diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases, which eventually became known as the Howard Brown Clinic of Chicago.

During his ten year as medical director and then research director of the Howard Brown Clinic, Dr. Ostrow demonstrated that Hepatitis B could be sexually transmitted among Gay men and was one of the principle investigators in the clinical trials of the

first Hepatitis B vaccine.

Following the conclusion of that study, Dr. Ostrow was one of the original investigators involved in the formation of the Multi-site AIDS Cohort Study (or MACS), the longest study of the epidemiology and natural history of HIV

and AIDS among Gay men.

In 1985, Dr. Ostrow started the Coping and Change Study, to examine the behavioral and mental health adaptation of men at-risk of HIV infection or AIDS, a study which continues to this day. The Coping and Change Study has contributed significantly to our understanding of the factors involved in Gay men changing their behavior to reduce the spread of HIV and the optimal ways to cope with HIV infection among those already infected.

Recent discoveries of the Coping and Change Study team include demonstrating that oral transmission of HIV is extremely rare and that the use of drugs, such as cocaine or "poppers" can contribute significantly to the risk of HIV infection during unprotected anal

intercourse.

Dr. Ostrow is the author of over 150 scientific manuscripts and eight books, most on the subject of AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases and their mental health implications.

He has received numerous prior awards for his research and clinical contributions to the fields of STDs,



mental health, and prevention. He joined the faculty of the Medical College of Wisconsin and CAIR in December, 1993.

NIDA GRANT

Almostsimultaneouslywithreceiving the Jane Addams/Howard Brown Achievement Award, Dr. Ostrow was the recipient of a major research funding award from the National Institutes of Drug Abuse (NIDA). This four-year, three million dollar research award will be used by Dr. Ostrow and his colleagues both at CAIR and the Howard Brown Medical Center of Chicago to develop innovative interventions for men who combine substance use with risky sex.

The study will focus on both white and African-American men who are Gay or Bisexual and volunteer to participate in one of the interventions being tested. This study is exceptional in that it is the first major funding award from the NIDA to study Gay/ Bisexual men who are not intravenous drug users. Since the earliest days of the AIDS epidemic, Dr. Ostrow has been writing and lecturing about the importance of studying "recreational" drug use, as opposed to just intravenous drug use, as an important contributor to the spread of HIV among at-risk persons.

Supreme Court: St. Pat's Parade Sponsors Can Exclude Gays

Organizers' Freedom of Speech Overrides Bias Claim

Washington, DC — In a unanimous decision issued June 19, the US Supreme Court ruled that sponsors of Boston's annual St. Patrick's Day Parade have the right to exclude the Irish-American Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Group (GLIB). The decision overturns a ruling by Massachusetts' high court which found the exclusion of Irish Gays to be a violation of the state's public accommodations act.

The Supreme Court rejected GLIB's claim that the St. Patrick's parade is a place of public accommodation under Massachusetts law and therefore subject to non-bias guidelines. The court ruled instead that as a privately organized event, the St. Pat's parade and its organizers (the South Boston Allied War Veterans Council) have the First Amendment right to control the message of their parade by including or excluding whoever they choose.

"The issue in this case is whether Massachusetts may require private citizens who organize a parade to include among the marchers a group imparting a message the organizers do not wish to convey. We hold that such a mandate violates the First Amendment," wrote Justice David Souter for the Court.

While GLIB and members of New York's Irish Gay and Lesbian Organization, which fought its own unsuccessful court battle, were disappointed by the high court's ruling — especially its unanimity — some legal experts said the ruling will have a positive impact on Gays and Lesbians. They note that a victory by GLIB in this case may have forced organizers of Gay Pride parades to include contingents of skinheads, fundamentalists or "ex-Gay" ministries — groups whose interests are antithetical to civil rights for homosexuals.

"On such a fundamental issue — freedom of speech and association — we must set aside our personal feelings and stand up for what is universally right," said David Morris, President of the libertarian group Gays and Lesbians for Individual Liberty.

"The First Amendment protects Gay and Lesbian Americans," Morris noted,

"but only if it also protects those who disagree with us or those who wish to exclude us. True freedom means we respect the rights of others as much as our own rights."

Professor Arthur S. Leonard of New York Law School told the New York Times the Supreme Court's decision "should generate a collective sigh of relief among the Lesbian-Gay legal

groups."

"We all feared that this case, in the hands of a [Justice Antonin] Scalia or [Justice Clarence] Thomas could well rip a big loophole in Gay rights laws all over the country," said Leonard. "Instead, we have a carefully crafted opinion that narrowly addresses the issue of the parade, while at the same time upholding the authority of the state to ban sexual orientation discrimination."

SOUTER'S WORDS

Justice Souter explained the court's reasoning about parades in this way: "We use the word 'parade' to indicate marchers who are making some sort of collective point, not just to each other but to bystanders along the way... Parades are thus a form of expression, not just motion...[U]nder the First Amendment, a speaker has the autonomy to choose the content of his own message."

"The [Veterans] Council clearly decided to exclude a message it did not like from the communication it chose to make, and that is enough to invoke its right as a private speaker to shape its expression by speaking on one subject while remaining silent on another...

"Whatever the reason, it boils down to the choice of a speaker not to propound a particular point of view, and that choice is presumed to lie beyond the government's own power to control...Our holding today rests not on any particular view about the Council's message but on the nation's commitment to protect freedom of speech."

Souter discussed the Bay State's public accommodations law as "protective legislation" whose legitimate purpose "is to prevent any denial of access to (or discriminatory treatment in) public accommodations on proscribed grounds, including sexual orientation." But the court concluded the law could not be applied to private "expressive activity

in the way it was done here."

The court's finding that GLIB's banner was also a form of expression could have implications in a future case challenging the Pentagon's anti-Gay policy. (The banner merely identified the group as Gay and Lesbian Irish.) Attorneys for Gay and Lesbian service members will argue in court that disclosing or identifying oneself as Gay is a First Amendment right and that prohibiting or punishing such expressions violate the Constitution.

This fall, the Supreme Court will

hear arguments about the constitutionality of Colorado's anti-Gay Amendment 2. That case is likely to have a much greater impact on the civil rights of Gays and Lesbians because the court will decide whether such civil rights and protective legislation can be repealed or forbidden through public referendum.

Gay Officials Get Apology From Clinton

Madison — State Rep. Tammy Baldwin and Dane County Supervisors Mark Pocan and Scott McCormick, who as part of a delegation of openly Gay officials were greeted at the White House last month by security guards with rubber gloves, have received a letter of apology from President Clinton.

Clinton thanked the officials for attending meetings with his cabinet members and senior White House staff, called the discussions "productive," and wrote, "we have set in place a process

for a continued dialogue."

"I want to apologize for the inappropriate and insensitive treatment several of the participants were subjected to at the entrance gate to the

White House. It was wrong.

"As you know, Secret Service Director Eljay Bowron issued a statement expressing regret for these actions. I have spoken personally with Director Bowron, and he is taking steps to ensure that it will not happen again. He is already redoubling his efforts on training and education.

"Again, I thank you for coming. I deeply regret any insult or embarrassment you suffered. You are welcome in the White House, and I look forward to continuing to work with you in

the future."

Barnett, Villasenor to Get Distinguished Alumni Awards

Madison — Carrie Barnett, a business owner and community activist, and Richard L. Villasenor, an attorney who has worked on Gay/Lesbian issues, are slated to receive 1995's Distinguished Alumni Awards from the University of Wisconsin Gay/Lesbian/Bisexual Alumni Council.

Barnett, the owner of People Like Us Bookstore in Chicago, received a Masters degree in Business from the UW in 1990. She has served as a Youth Advisor at Horizons Community Services in Chicago, as a member of the Chicago Health Department's AIDS Prevention Grants panel, as a board member of the Gerber/Hart Library and Archives (the country's oldest Gay and Lesbian

library), and as a Lambda Literary

Awards judge for six years.

Before earning his BA in Chinese and International Relations, Villasenor was co-President of the Ten Percent Society at UW where he founded the Task Force on ROTC Policy Reform. He went on to UCLA where he was co-President of the Coalition on Lesbian and Gay Issues. While in law school, Villasenor worked for the Gay/Lesbian Rights Project of the ACLU and, since graduation, has been active in Lawyers for Human Rights.

Barnett and Villasenor will receive their awards at the annual meeting and brunch of the LesBiGay Alumni Council July 16 in the Memorial Union at UW-Madison. Anyone wishing to attend should call Russell Bretts at (608)

Portage — Prison guards at the Columbia Correctional Institution have received suspensions for dereliction of duty on the day last November when inmate Christopher Scarver murdered serial killer Jeffrey Dahmer and wife killer Jesse Anderson. Donovan Dittbernerwas making personal calls on the phone while the murders took place, and Robert Theiler had left his post in the gym watching the prisoners to socialize with fellow guards.

Madison — An HIV-positive Madison woman has sued her landlord for allegedly evicting her and her two sons, who have AIDS, after learning of their medical conditions. Koua C. Vang rented Bridget McGrane the apartment in 1993 but evicted her family shortly after learning they have HIV/AIDS late last year. In February, the state Equal Rights Division found probable cause that Vang had violated Wisconsin's fair housing laws, opening the way for McGrave's suit

June Pride Celebrations Draw Big Crowds

San Francisco, CA — Record crowds turned out in both small and large cities across the US to join in or cheer on Gay and Lesbian Pride celebrations last month. This year's parades and festivals, marking the 26th year since the Stonewall Rebellion in Greenwich Village, occurred on various weekends in June.

place a week earlier than usual (June 18) because major events marking the 50th anniversary of the United Nations took place there June 25. More than 400,000 people joined the fun in a miles-long parade led by Grand Marshal Candace Gingrich. For the first time, a local TV station ran the celebration live.

In New York City, a quarter million people filled the streets of midtown Manhattan for the annual Heritage of Pride parade, while celebrations in Chicago and Los Angeles drew nearly as many. In Washington, DC and Atlanta, Denver and Boston, crowd estimates ranged from 50-100,000. Just as remarkable, smaller cities in conservative states also drew big crowds: 5,000 in Salt Lake City; 2,000 in Durham, NC; and 1,000 in Boise, Idaho.

National media coverage of the Pride parades and festivals was positive. CNN and ABC ran segments with footage from cities across the US. Their reporters noted that the annual events have become "traditions," garnering ever

more public acceptance.

Four Activists Win National Stonewall **Awards**

Chicago, IL - The Anderson Prize Foundation has announced the names of four people who will receive Stonewall Awards in recognition of their contributions to the Gay and Lesbian community. The awards include a no-strings-attached grant of \$25,000 to each recipient.

This winners year's include: longtime activist Mandy Carter, 46, a political organizer with the Human Rights Campaign Fund and the Black Gay and Lesbian Leadership Forum; Jim Thomas, 38, editor of the News-Telegraph, a Gay paper distributed in Missouri, Kansas, Illinois, Arkansas and Tennessee; Franklyn Whitworth, 51, who founded the first Gay political organization in Virginia and another in Colorado Springs; and Peggy Shaw, 51, an actress, performance artist, playwright and producer who manages the Split Britches Theater Company with her partner, Lois

The Anderson Prize Foundation was established by the late Paul A. Anderson of Chicago, who provided initial funding and then a bequest of \$1.2 million to endow the prizes after his death. Owners of "The Advocate" Buy Alvson **Publications**

Los Angeles, CA — Liberation

Publications Inc., the company that produces The Advocate, has reached agreement with publisher Sasha Alyson to acquire Alyson Publications, the biggest Gay and Lesbian book company

in the US.

"We are particularly proud to bring together America's most established and prominent Gay and Lesbian newsmagazine and America's most established and finest independent Gay and Lesbian book publisher," said Sam Watters of Liberation Publications.

Sasha Alyson founded Alyson in 1980. Its first title was Young, Gay and Proud. Since then, it has published books by Paul Monette, Michael Nava, Scoppetone and Leslea Newman. Its catalogue includes books of Gay and Lesbian humor, history, fiction, essays and erotica. Its subdivision, Alyson Wonderland, has published two of the most controversial and most-banned books in the US, the children's books Heather Has Two Mommies and Daddy's Roommate.

Alyson has wanted to sell his business for several years. He said of the deal: "For almost three decades, The Advocate has been the magazine of record for the Gay and Lesbian community. It's run by people with a rare blend of business savvy and commitment to Gay issues. I'm confident that they will continue The Advocate and Alyson traditions, with many groundbreaking

books in the years ahead.'

Dornan Rips "Gay Agenda" in Federal AIDS Effort

Washington, DC - At a hearing before the House Subcommittee on Civil Service, Rep. Bob Dornan, a GOP Presidential candidate, accused the AIDS training program for federal workers of promoting "a blatant pro-homosexual

The hearings were called to investigate complaints by some federal workers that the AIDS training seminars they attended included material that vas too explicit and that advocated tolerance of Gays. Subcommittee Chairman John Mica (R-FL) called the hearings "fair and objective," but a spokeswoman for the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force said: "Lynching would be a better word."

Dornan thundered that AIDS education is "being used to aggressively advance a redefinition of the family and, in many cases, a blatant pro-homosexual agenda...The last time I checked, abusing drugs and having sex in the workplace [were] not specified job responsibilities for any federal worker."

When Rep. James Moran (D-VA) tried to humanize the issue by talking about a friend, a priest, who had just died from AIDS, Dornan shot back: "If your priest friend had not sought a cheap thrill, he would be alive today.

About a dozen members of the Wisconsin Republican Party walked out of an event featuring Dornan at the State GOP convention in Appleton in June. One delegate referred to him as "an egomaniac.'

"Gay Gene" Scientist Under Investigation

Chicago, IL - The Chicago Tribune reports that Dean Hamer, the scientist who claimed to find evidence of a genetic marker for homosexuality in men in a much publicized study in 1993, is under investigation for charges that he used data selectively to arrive at his conclusion.

A researcher working under Hamer the National Cancer Institute's Laboratory of Biochemistry expressed concern about how the data was being used. But when she voiced her skepticism, she was reportedly transferred out of Hamer's lab. The researcher then took her suspicions to higher-ups at the National Institutes of Health, who referred the matter to the Office of Research Integrity, a federal agency that investigates scientific misconduct.

The Office of Research Integrity opened its inquiry in January after determining there was sufficient evidence to merit further investigation. The whistle-blowing researcher has impeccable credentials, so professional jealousy has been ruled out as a motive for her complaint. Only one independent study has been conducted to attempt to replicate Hamer's findings. Scientists at the University of Western Ontario say they have found no evidence to support Hamer's conclusion.

NAMES Project Begins Archives for 31,000 Quilt Panels

Washington, DC -Through photography and digital technology, the AIDS Memorial Quilt Archive Project, an offshoot of the NAMES Project Foundation, will create a permanent visual record of the world's most recognizable symbol of the AIDS epidemic. The work will make electronic images of the Quilt available around the world through online technology and in multimedia packages.

"The Archive Project is the unique merging of American folk art, computer technology and AIDS awareness," said NAMES Foundation spokesman Anthony Turney. "This Archive of Quilt images will not replace the Quilt, but it will radically amplify the Quilt's powerful message about the global tragedy that is AIDS and the steps we can take to stop it."

The first step of photographing each Quilt panel is underway. The photos will then be converted into digital images and

Taos, NM - Ernest O. Flatt, who won four Emmy Awards for directing and choreographing TV shows, died during heart surgery on June 24. He was 76. Flatt worked with Gene Kelly on Singin' in the Rain and An American in Paris. other credits, many choreographed the movie Anything Goes and the Broadway hit Lorelei. Atlanta, GA - Candace Gingrich, the half-sister of Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich, says she does not believe her brother will run for President in 1996 but if he does, she plans to oppose his bid. Candace Gingrich is currently touring the country as a spokesperson for the Human Rights Campaign Fund's Coming

Out Project.

Chicago, IL - Chicago Tribune editor Jack Fuller has refused to take action against columnist Mike Royko, who made anti-Gay slurs when he was arrested for drunk driving. The police report indicates that Royko called the arresting officer a "fucking fag" and asked an ambulance crew summoned to the scene, "What are you, fags? Why are you wearing those fag gloves for?" The Illinois Federation for Human Rights has

demanded Royko's dismissal. Federation's leader, Rick Garcia, received a death threat after publicly

calling for Royko's firing.

Fort Lauderdale, FL - On June 13, the Broward County Commission voted 6-1 in support of a measure that prohibits discrimination based on sexual orientation in employment, accommodations and real estate transactions. The Commission took the action despite threats by the American Family Association that it would launch an effort to have the law repealed.

Willowick, OH — Megan Parsons, a fire captain with 21 years in the department, claims that her recent demotion to firefighter was caused by the city's discomfort with her transsexual. Parsons was known as Garry Edward Strater until she began sex-change medical treatments last year. think it's nothing more than harassment," said Parsons, who is appealing the demotion and threatening

San Francisco, CA - After 14 years of the AIDS epidemic and almost 15,000 deaths in the Bay area, the first AIDS service agency has finally opened in the Castro district. The AIDS Health Project Castro Center is affiliated with the University of California and gets city funding as well. It will provide HIV testing and counseling, support groups and substance abuse treatment for people with HIV/AIDS

Los Angeles, CA - Film director Steven Spielberg, a former Eagle Scout and a member of the Boy Scouts of America National Advisory Council, has reportedly urged fellow Council members to reconsider the BSA's rigid policy excluding Gays as both scouts and leaders. Spielberg's lobbying hasn't had much effect because BSA officials recently defended their policy before a Chicago Human Rights Commission hearing going so far as to say that even heterosexuals who support the inclusion of Gays should not be involved in

Washington, DC — The D.C. Coalition of Black Lesbians, Gay Men and Bisexuals, which raised \$2,200 for National Association for Advancement of Colored People, is miffed that the NAACP representative scheduled to pick up the donation canceled the meeting and no one at the NAACP's national office is returning the Coalition's calls. Earlier this year, the head of the NAACP's Washington, DC chapter refused to accept a similar donation, saying it would be endorsing

Washington, DC — Author and historian John D'Emilio has taken a leave of absence from his professorship at the University of North Carolina to assume the role of Director of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force's Policy Institute. D'Emilio will help transform the Institute into a formal research arm, recruiting academics, writers, lobbyists and others to produce pragmatic background reports for activists in the field

Rockville, MD — The American Foundation for AIDS Research, the largest nonprofit group dedicated to AIDS research, has had to close its Rockville office and lay-off an office worker in Washington due to a \$4 million budget cut. AmFAR President Mervyn Silverman said: "It is becoming increasingly difficult to raise money for AIDS research programs because of growing complacency and a sense of resignation about the epidemic."

Britain's High Court Upholds Ban on Gays in Military

London — On June 7, the British High Court ruled that the Defense Ministry could continue its policy of banning Gays and Lesbians from military service. The government had argued that the presence of homosexuals reduced military effectiveness and morale.

The court ruled that the anti-Gay restriction did not violate British or European law and that if changes are to be made the policy is a matter for

Parliament to decide.

But in an unprecedented statement, one of the judges, Lord Justice Simon Brown, commented: "The tide of history is against the Ministry. Prejudices are breaking down — old barriers are being removed. It seems to me improbable, whatever this court may say, that the existing policy can survive much longer."

"I think it is clear that this particular battleship of bigotry has been holed beneath the waterline and is sinking," former Royal Navy Commander Duncan

Lustig-Prean told the press.

Lustig-Prean was one of four Gay and Lesbian service members who had been forcibly discharged after revealing their homosexuality. They will now take their case to the Court of Appeal and, if necessary, to the European Court of Human Rights.

Romania Accused of Jailing, Abusing Gays

Bucharest — Reuters reports that officials of the Romanian government have denied charges by Amnesty International that Romanian police regularly violate the human rights of

Gays and Gypsies.

Anne Burley, Amnesty's Director for Europe, recently announced that dozens of Romanians have been jailed for engaging in homosexual activities. She expressed concern about "people still being imprisoned for being homosexuals...Reports indicate that tortures, beatings and other forms of ill-treatment of detainees continue to be widespread."

The Romanian National Police faxed a statement to the Associated Press which attacked Burley's claims: "Rumors about the so-called tortures of people in prisons are totally unreal. Abuses are totally isolated and have been severely

punished."

Nevertheless, Amnesty has evidence of at least 56 people who have been imprisoned for homosexuality just since last November. Article 200 of the Romanian penal code says that "Sexual intercourse between persons of the same sex is punishable by one to five years imprisonment."

Romania is one of the last European countries to maintain and enforce such a

punitive statute.

Cross-Dressers Find Acceptance, Hostility in Brazil

Rio De Janeiro — The flamboyant transvestites and transsexuals of Rio de Janeiro, who have given Rio its reputation as a Gay Mecca, are reaching a level of acceptance once thought unimaginable in this overwhelmingly Catholic country. But they also face a frightening backlash in the form of police repression and murder.

Legislators in the capital city of Brasilia recently gave preliminary support to a measure that will legalize sex change surgery in Brazil and allow transsexuals to legally change their male names for female names. Due to the generally conservative political culture, strongly influenced by the Catholic Church, sex reassignment surgery is

currently a crime.

There are more drag balls and Gay clubs than ever before in Rio, and drag entertainers like Rogeria have become nationally recognized stars. Even Renato Russo, a member of Brazil's most popular rock group, Legiao Urbana, has come out and recorded an album called Stonewall Celebration.

But the International Gay and Lesbian Human Rights Commission reports an alarming tide of anti-Gay, anti-drag violence in Brazil. In January, Gisele Gaga, a transvestite prostitute and well-known activist from Curitiba, was shot dead at point blank range by an off-duty policeman. The cop, who claims he acted in self-defense, is unlikely to be prosecuted because of a Brazilian law which excuses manslaughter "in the defense of one's honor."

Last year, Claudio Orlando dos Santos died as the result of beatings he received at the hands of military police in Santa Catarina. Dos Santos, the President of the Association in Defense of Homosexual Rights, was harassed by police as he distributed condoms in public. After he reported the intimidation to authorities, police found him and this time kicked and beat him severely.

Speculating on the progress and repression Gay/Transgender people experience in Brazil, anthropologist Luis Mott told Veja: "It's a country of

contradictions."

Gay MP Seeks Party Leadership in Canada

Vancouver — Svend Robinson, Canada's first openly Gay member of Parliament, has announced his intention to seek the leadership position in his party, the New Democratic Party, which means he would also be its choice for Prime Minister.

Robinson, 43, was first elected to Parliament in 1979 to a working-class district in Vancouver. He came out as a Gay man in 1988 and has been

re-elected twice since then.

Robinson is an unabashed liberal, vocal in his support for abortion rights, Gay rights, euthanasia, environmental protection and economic reform. He has been arrested twice for trying to block logging from unprotected forests. He was nearly prosecuted for being present during the assisted suicide of a terminally-ill friend. He blames the federal debt not on expensive social programs but on an unfair tax system. And he raised eyebrows most recently by introducing a bill which would make parental spanking of children illegal.

When asked how his liberal activism will play around the country, Robinson said: "If ever people were looking for a strong, clear democratic socialist voice,

that time is now."

Robinson faces a daunting task. Even if he can win the leadership of his party, the party itself is reeling from losing 80% of its seats in the last election. Political observers note that the resurgence of the Liberal Party and the emergence of new splinter groups in Quebec and western Canada are likely to educe further the New Democratic Party's limited constituency.

Gay Organizing Slowly Emerging in China

Beijing — A recent article in the Baltimore Sun described the slow emergence of Gay organizations and activism in the People's Republic of China.

For decades, communist ideology condemned homosexuality as a disease or as an evil product from the decadent West. Homosexuals were often imprisoned for "re-education." But Gay organizer Wan Yanhai told the Sun: "Their attitude toward us now is not to bother us. Ignore and don't ask, that's their attitude."

China does not yet have anything like the variety of Gay and Lesbian groups found in most democratic nations, and Chinese Gays are nowhere near lobbying the government for legal reforms. But groups of Gay people often meet in parks to socialize and sometimes share information about Gays they've received from outside China.

Wan works with a network of about 50 other Gay activists in Beijing. They help counsel Gays, distribute literature on AIDS prevention and conduct opinion polls, the results of which are providing some of the first information about Gay life and culture in communist China.

A newspaper recently reported on Lesbianism in Chinese prisons, and legend has it that Lesbianism is endemic among silk workers, but apparently no Lesbian organizations have formulated vet

Also Around the World...

Ottawa — On June 15, the Canadian House of Commons passed a hate crimes bill which provides for more severe penalties in cases where the crime is motivated by sexual orientation, along with race, religion and other factors. Gay lobbyists expect the Senate to approve the measure, which will become a federal statute enforceable throughout Canada.

Bangkok — Reuters reports that a small bomb went off outside an AIDS hospice north of Bangkok May 21. No one was injured in the blast and the damage was minor. Police believe it might be the work of neighbors of the center who have demanded that it be

Paris — ACT UP/Paris has demanded that newly inaugurated French President Jacques Chirac fire his Health Minister, Elisabeth Hubert. ACT UP members say she is homophobic and oppose her plans to introduce mandatory HIV testing.

Sydney — The Attorney General of the Australian state of New South Wales has ordered a review into the "homosexual panic" defense which has been used in a number of murder cases there in the past few years. The review was ordered after a jury acquitted a man of both murder and manslaughter in the fatal stabbing of a man who allegedly made a sexual pass at him.

London — The widow of Look Back in Anger playwright John Osborne placed a sign outside his memorial service denying entry to several individuals, including Gay theater critic Nicholas de Jongh. De Jongh had outted the notoriously homophobic Osborne for a secret affair Osborne conducted with another playwright, Anthony Creighton.





I recently attended both Pride Parades in Milwaukee and Chicago. Although Chicago's Gay community is larger and therefore they had a larger parade, I was disappointed in the lack of participation by the Milwaukee Gay bars compared to Chicago.

The Milwaukee Gay bars (except Nut Hut, Loose Ends and Just Us) were not represented. The cost of using someone's convertible or truck with a few signs and decorations with some staff

from the bar is minimal.

I think businesses whose life blood depends directly on the Gay community should show their support of that community. If we, as a community, don't support one another, how can we expect the straight community to??

I am writing to you from the Racine County Jail, asking you to print this and asking your readers and the Gay community for their assistance, if possible.

My name is Dan Scheidell and I was a member of the Milwaukee community for many years. I worked the bar scene — the Wreck Room in its early days, the River Queen, shortly before its demise, and for Chuck at the old Factory.

In February of 1994 my mother became seriously ill and was hospitalized for several weeks and then recovered in a nursing home for several months. During that time I quit my job at the Marc Plaza Hotel and moved back here to Racine where I grew up, to be near my mother and sister. I went to work at the Chancery Harbor Walk on the lake front in the Reef-Point Marina, and moved into an apartment building in downtown Racine where shortly after, I became the resident manager. Several of may fellow employees ended up moving into the same building.

I became friends with Jennifer Dickert, who was one of the managers of the Chancery during the previous year. She moved into the first floor apartment.

On the 19th of May, 1995, we had a country western show here at the Festival Park on the lake front, and the Chancery brought in a local country group for the bar that evening. At about 10pm, I went down to see friends and have a few beers. I was there from 10pm until about 12:30am. Before leaving the bar I saw Jennifer and she told me that she had to be up early for work the next morning. Being an early riser, I offered to call her at 5:30am to make sure that she was up.

The next morning when the alarm went off at 5:30, I phoned her about twenty to 6, and when she answered she started screaming at me, and hung up IN STEP V July 6-19, 1995 V Page 14

the phone. Not knowing what was going on, I got up and dressed to go down and see what was going on. As I left my apartment and started downstairs, I was met by three officers from the Racine Police Department and Jennifer telling them that I was the one. I was handcuffed and taken back to my apartment.

Someone had broken into her apartment and tried to rape her. She awoke with the covers pulled off of her and her t-shirt pulled up and a man in jeans and a t-shirt with jacket wrapped around his head as a mask, on top of

her

She fought off the attacker who she states was armed with some type of knife (she was cut on the hand according to police reports). She fought this person off two or three times before breaking away and grabbing a gun from a dresser where she threatened to shoot, and the attacker fled.

During the struggle she says the "jacket-mask" came undone enough to see his eye and part of his cheek. Upon this she has identified me as the attacker. I was arrested that morning and

brought to the jail.

The charges filed were Burglary while armed and masked, and attempted First Degree Sexual Assault while armed and masked. A bond of \$20,000 was placed on each charge, and I was placed in a cell. On the following Monday I was assigned a court-appointed Public Defender who I spoke with for maybe five minutes through a hole in a door where I was held in a cell with 9 others awaiting to be formally charged.

Shackled and wearing an orange jail

uniform, I was lead into a courtroom where the charges were stated and the judge raised the bond to \$125,000 because this is a hate crime against a woman. And I was lead back to my cell in a state of shock.

My sister was able to hire a private attorney (Thank God!) who has been very good. The arraignment was on the second of June when Ms. Dickert testified on the stand to the events and again stated that I was her attacker.

My attorney entered a plea of not guilty and I have been held over for a jury trial on August 28th. In the original police report it does state that I informed the officers that I was Gay. But to this date, it apparently doesn't matter.

Being the apartment manager, I did have a key to her apartment, because of work I was doing on the apartment and the District Attorney is saying that I used said key to gain access to her apartment and to attack her.

I am innocent of these horrendous charges and am going through a mental and physical hell during this ordeal. My family and a few of my friends have been 100% supportive while others have turned their backs on me.

We are trying to raise money to continue paying the attorney and the private investigator. My family does not own property that we could post for the bond, even though my attorney thinks if we can raise ten to twenty thousand dollars that she might be able to get a bond reduction and I could possibly be free until the trial.

I don't know how this will come out.

I pray to God that the truth will be proven and that I will be cleared of these

Editor's Note: I've known Dan since 1973. These charges are completely out of character and based on slim, circumstantial evidence.

Editor:

Did I miss it? Since I'm not a subscriber to the Milwaukee Jourinel [sic], perhaps I did. I mean a particular news story present in past years but not this.

One night I heard fireworks at the lakefront, which is where I live. It sounded like a display worthy of any of Milwaukee's famous festivals. It turned out to be from the Gay Pride Celebration.

The only mention I noticed of that celebration in the **Milwaukee Jourinel** [sic] was two brief messages, a 6-line notice on June 9, and a caption under a picture on June 12. Of course the picture, with its epigraph "Showing their pride," was a significant amount of space.

The Jourinel [sic] "coverage" of this event should upset anyone concerned about those who stoke the fires of hatred in our community. The notice on June 9 was tacked onto a story about an AIDS fighter who died of it and the organization he led. The picture showed that same group marching with AIDS

What was the message of the Jourinel [sic] news coverage? It was very clear: the epigraph above the picture Showing Their Pride, clearly intended to send the message that the only thing these people have to be "proud" of is AIDS, AIDS, AIDS. The notice of the festival, "PrideFest," was incorporated into an AIDS story, again sending the message that their "pride" is an epidemic of disease.

I'm reminded of the coverage Nazis gave to Jews in the 1930s. The Jews were scapegoated as carriers of disease, especially typhus. The Nazis justified setting up ghettoes for Jews in Poland on the grounds that Jews were lice-ridden spreaders of typhus who had to be isolated from the population. The fact

isolated from the population. The fact was that the crowding imposed on the Jews and the difficulty of getting adequate health care, their very uprooting by the German army, was the cause of the disease that was used as an excuse to isolate and later exterminate these "disease carriers."

And now we have the Milwaukee Jourinel [sic] using disease to stigmatize another small and unpopular group. I wonder if the Jourinel [sic] is proud of its attempt to use Nazi health-scare tactics to associate Gays with disease. Maybe it ought to break out the swastikas and change its name to Milwaukische Beobachter.



People With Advanced AIDS Sought for Invirase Trials

Washington, DC — The government has given approval to a lottery system by which 2,000 people with advanced AIDS who are not currently enrolled in other drug tests will be chosen to participate in clinical trials of the experimental drug Invirase.

Invirase, developed by Hoffman-LaRoche, is the first in a new group of drugs called protease inhibitors that has gained the Food and Drug Administration's approval to proceed to human trials. Protease inhibitors are drugs that block protease, an enzyme believed to play a key role in the replication of HIV in cells.

A dozen companies are rushing to develop protease inhibitors after preliminary research on products developed by Hoffman- LaRoche and Merck indicated they may be effective in reducing, at least temporarily, HIV levels in the blood. The protease inhibitors tested so far seem to have less severe side effects than other AIDS medications,

another reason they are looked on with such hope. But researchers have also found that HIV can develop a resistance to protease inhibitors, just as it can to other drug therapies.


HIV Infection in Men of Color Skyrockets

Atlanta, GA — New data released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention confirm long-held predictions that the rates of HIV infection among African-American and Latino Gay men

are increasing dramatically.

The statistics trace the rates of HIV infection among various groups between 1989 and 1994, when the last complete figures are available. While the rate for white Gay men increased 14% (from 10.7 cases per 100,000 in 1989 to 12.2 cases per 100,000 in 1994), the rate for black Gay men jumped by 79% (from 20.8 cases per 100,000 in 1989 to 37.3 cases in '94). The rate for Latino Gay men increased 61% (from 14.0 per 100,000 to 22.6).

Great Time! epidemiologist who conducted the study, told the Washington Blade: "The numbers represent black and Hispanic men who were infected in the '80's but for a myriad of reasons, not the least of which was a lack of focused intervention, are just now showing up in emergency rooms around the country — only now with diagnoses of full-blown AIDS."

Cornelius Baker of the National Association of People with AIDS, who is African-American and HIV-positive, cited three primary reasons for the alarming statistics: "Disparate ways of handling or mishandling the epidemic, homophobia within communities of color, and a lack of appropriate levels of funding. When



San Francisco — Pansy Division, rock'n'roll queers in-your-face. While most Gay musicians have tried to hide their orientation to maintain their careers, Pansy Division has tried the opposite approach — be as boldly Out as possible and let the chips fall where they may.

Combining humorously sexual, overtly queer lyrics with catchy-as-hell, guitar-driven melodies, their blend of guitar pop and punk rock references the past without dwelling on it. Plus, the songs handle sex in an open, honest and celebratory way, which has political consequences in a country where squeamishness about sex in general is a national preoccupation. Though entertaining and humorous, these songs deal with serious issues below the surface. Their CD booklets include plain-spoken safe sex information and Gay youth hotline numbers.

Pansy Division has 3 full-length releases on the Berkeley-based Lookout! label: Undressed (1993), Deflowered (1994) and Pile Up (1995). Over the past 3 years they've released numerous singles and have been on several compilations (these songs have been gathered together on Pile Up). Their next album will be recorded later this year for a late '95-early '96 target release date.

They've toured extensively, covering the US, Canada, Australia and New Zealand. They spent a big chunk of '94 as the opening act for Green Day, taking their unique repertoire to the arenas where they blew the minds of thousands of teenage Green Day fans. The last gig of the tour was at New York City's Square Garden. Shortly Madison afterward, a profile of the band appeared on MTV News, spreading their name and music far and wide. They don't claim to be for everyone, but their fast-growing (and very diverse) audience reveals that the time for their message has truly come

They'll be on tour most of the rest of '95 including gigs in Madison & Milwaukee. See the queer sensation that's rockin' the nation! The band will appear at the MAGIC Picnic the afternoon of July 15 in a free outdoor show. Later that night you can find them at Club deWash. They'll appear at the Unicom in Milwaukee on July 16.

"Love and Human Remains" is Tedious Melodrama

Cardboard Characters, Predictable Plot to Blame

Early in the movie Love and Human Remains, Candy, a book reviewer, says that the challenge of critiquing badly written books is saying "It's shit," but stretching that sentiment to fill three pages. I'll spare you the three pages here and cut to the chase.

At least a dozen times during my viewing of this supposedly Gay- friendly film I had the urge to jump onscreen and slap the characters around to knock some sense into them. Worse yet, I sort of hoped a serial killer on the prowl in the movie would dispatch a few of these annoying people.

A character study about a variety of 20-somethings searching for love in all the wrong places, the cliche-ridden Love and Human Remains drowns in a sea of self-consciousness and bathos. The characters are one-dimensional, the dialogue is alternately overwritten and underwritten (but most of all obviously written), and every plot development is signaled in advance.

Oh, and have I mentioned yet that the serial killer is a repressed Gay man? I haven't given anything away. If you see this movie, you'll figure it out pretty early on. He's the guy with a nervous twitch who spits at strangers and scowls at every woman he sees and calls them "cunt." Oy-vay...

Candy, an apparently straight woman, is in love with her ex-lover and Gay roommate David. David, for his part, enjoys casual sex but doesn't believe in love. Of course, he secretly craves it. Bernie, a twitchy wreck, is conflicted over an affair he had with David, whom he still loves. His outlet is murder.

David, meanwhile, is also tempted by an innocent 17-year-old busboy from work who is beginning to explore his sexuality. Will they or won't they? Candy, still pining for David, unexpectedly comes across two new suitors, a married man and a lonely Lesbian (referred to as "The Psycho Lesbian"). The scene in the film when they both show up at the same time to woo Candy is meant to be a dramatic/comedic high point. It's clumsy and ludicrous instead.

And have I mentioned David's friend Benita, the clairvoyant dominatrix? In a

throwaway line delivered after a session with a masochist, Benita says vacantly, "My father was never that gentle." That's the extent of her character's motivation. Her primary role seems to be to add some completely gratuitous S&M scenes into the movie and to drive home the already obvious point that we are all, in one way or another, damaged, vulnerable human beings.

Human Remains underlines everything repeatedly so we DON'T MISS IT. David constantly reminds MISS IT. David constantly reminds Candy to eat something. Later, as things get rough, this healthy looking gal is revealed to be a binge eater. (Her manic eating episode is idiotic and misleading.) The killer saves his victims earrings, so naturally the camera zooms in on the earrings of every woman in the film just before she's attacked. Jerri, the "psycho Lesbian," is the only sensible one to not wear earrings and thus emerges unscathed. But in another stupid touch. meant to be a red herring, I guess, she buys her beloved, Candy, a pair of earrings!

Well, I won't go on any longer. I think I've made my point that Love and Human Remains is a deeply flawed film. Director Denys Arcand is an award-winning filmmaker, so the failure is doubly disappointing.

The one positive thing I can say is that most of the actors are visually appealing and show great promise, especially Thomas Gibson as David, Cameron Bancroft as Bernie and Joanne Vannicola as Jerri. In this case, however, they are all weighted down by really bad material.



New York Drag Stars Shine in "Wigstock"

"Hallelujah, We're Alive!"

By Jamakaya Wigstock: The Movie, a madcap drag entertainment that will have audiences laughing and grooving to the music, makes a joyful noise unto the world. It showcases many of the top stars in New York's club/theater scene and is likely to introduce them, and drag culture generally, to a mainstream audience.

At just 85 minutes, Wigstock moves at a deliciously frenetic pace. It consists of concert scenes, interviews with drag artists and rehearsal footage shot at the annual Labor Day drag festival in Manhattan in 1993 and 1994. The growth of the festival since its inception in 1984. and the added attention the movie is expected to bring it, means Wigstock may have to be held in Central Park this September.

Producer Dean Silvers noted that hundreds of thousands of people might show up this year and worried about the possibility of rain: "If you thought Woodstock was something else, picture 100,000 high heels in the mud!

Wigstock is, of course, a take-off on Woodstock but touted as a "celebration of life, liberty and the pursuit of big hair. Homage is paid to the sexual revolution and the "let-it-all-hang- out" ethos of the '60's in the songs that serve as bookends to Wigstock. The opening tune has Mistress Formika singing "The Age of Aquarius" while John Kelly sings a haunting version of "Woodstock" ("Wigstock" with queer-positive lyrics) toward the end.

In between there are colorful costumes, great dance numbers, powerful vocals (and a lot of lip-synching), wild wigs, tons of make-up, feathers, sequins, a pumped-up audience and plenty of queenly attitude.

Among the more established performers featured are Lypsinka, who assays Lauren Bacall's vibrant Alive!" number from Applause! Joey Arias astonishes with his brilliant impersonation of Billie Holliday. He sounds so much like Lady Day, it's

RuPaul struts her stuff and inspires the crowd in several numbers, including "A Shade Shady (Now Prance)" and "House of Love." Every time I see RuPaul perform, I'm reminded of what a really great star she is and why she has risen above the pack. Her utter

confidence while on stage, her poise, her power, her charisma and her deep compassion, win audiences over. We love you, Ru!

Otherhighlights include "Somebody" and "Say Ahhh" by Deee-Lite and the wonderfully overheated "100% Pure Love" by Crystal Waters. Whew!

Among the drag artists new to me is Mistress Formika, who lip-syncs "Aquarius" and later performs "Fight for Your Right." Behind the scenes, Mistress Formika explains how she got into drag and offers humorous commentaries about mainstream culture: "They're trying to brainwash us to be closed-minded, to be prejudiced, to be - Republican. It's not going to happen while I'm around."

WORK IT, GIRLS!

Some of the best scenes juxtapose footage of the entertainers and dancers sweating and practicing during rehearsals with the finished product they present on stage. It gives you a sense of the work and commitment put into it. Look for the Wigstock Dancers shakin' it to "Chic Cheer.

One disappointment I have with Wigstock is that so many numbers are crammed into the short film (about 25), they are often cut short in favor of interviews with participants or audience members. With a couple of the clumsier acts, you don't mind the cutting away, but some of the better routines you can't

get enough of! The combination concert/documentary format was probably too much to fit effectively into such a compact film. Because the interviewees' comments are more amusing than insightful. Winstock's strength is as a concert film.

than insightful, Wigstock's strength is as a concert film.

The lack of analysis about drag culture also disappointed me. Paris is Burning, the documentary about drag balls several years back, managed to convey the excitement of performance and the drive and ambition of the artists while also looking into the darker side of drag culture: competition, drug use, unemployment, dangerous tricks, etc.

Paris is Burning turned a sharp on eye on how the balls provide an escape from the unrelenting racism and classism contestants experience in their daily lives and offered a reality check to those queens (like most in Wigstock) who say they "respect" and "idealize" women. Pepper Labeija talked bluntly about woman-hating.

But the director of Wigstock, Barry Shils, wanted to balance the image presented in Paris: "I don't see drag queens as being inherently full of despair. On the contrary, they are often leaders of the Gay community. The queens at Wigstock are fulfilling their dreams and inspiring others. They are talented performers, outspoken, both avant-garde and successfully penetrating mainstream popular culture."

Wigstock co-founder Lady Bunny responds this way to the charge of a lack of politics: "Wigstock is a party and nothing else. Individual performers may have a political agenda, but I think we need to have a day without politics. That's all. Just say, 'Hallelujah, we're alive!' and nothing else deeper than that."

On those terms, Wigstock: The Movie succeeds. Everybody say, "Hallelujah!"

Playwright Brad Fraser is Hot Property

"Love & Human Remains" Adaptation of His Hit Off-Broadway Play

What luck to cause a scandal in Cincinnati! It used to be that you prayed to get banned in Boston because then the ensuing press coverage would practically guarantee you a large, sale elsewhere. These days, however, it takes the non-progressive Ohioan city to help put you on the map: remember Mapplethorpe? Well, friends, add Brad Fraser to that limited and honorable list of put-upon and spat-upon Gay artists.

Playwright Fraser, 36, is a Canadian from Edmonton, Alberta, the central wheatlands of our companions to the north. He cut his theatrical teeth there by winning several provincial awards early in his career for his writings. "I write alternative theatre; I'm not interested in writing for middle-class audiences." Which has, surprisingly, allowed him to make quite a comfortable living since 1989. And now the solid bets go towards him doing even better, since his first feature-film is finally released in the US.

The film, Love & Human Remains, is the Denys Arcand (Jesus of Montreal) directed version of Fraser's controversial 1989 play Unexamined Human Remains and the True Nature of Love (which had a successful run off-Broadway

a few seasons ago). Starring Thomas Gibson (the only American amongst a talented Canadian bunch), it examines the inherent problems with relationships, spread evenly between men and men, women and women, and men and women. The plot features all of the above, spiced with the phantom menace of a serial killer. It's getting a nationwide release from the increasingly adventurous Goldwan Pictures.

Oh, did we mention that Fraser's Gay? But he's more than Gay; he's Queer! A lot of his life is lived in moments fueled by being spelling in capital letters, no better-explored than in his latest play (the source of the Cincinnati scandal), "Poor Super Man," which is labeled "a play with captions," as it uses a theatrically brilliant device of flashing captions onto the characters and the set, reflecting the subtext of the individual scenes. Fraser came to his career by originally studying to be an actor.

"In Edmonton, trapped in winter for half a year, you have to entertain yourself inside, out of the cold." Which has lead that small, northern city to develop a phenomenal number of professional theatres — 17 in all. "During the hectic '70s, oil money paid for the arts, but now it's reversing itself. But as a teen, acting in plays, I kept thinking, 'I could write better than this!"

And so he's proving. "With all my work, it's become clear to me that there are reasons for Gays and non-Gays to be here on earth — that happiness goes to all peoples. When I write, I want to create the world we actually live in, not the one we wished we lived in — too much theatre is, 'All is fine, don't worry.' I want to say, 'No, it's not fine, let's worry!' And so I use sex and language to increase people's vocabularies. There are more exciting ways which demand real reactions than being trapped in the simple ways TV looks at ourselves. Mostly, audiences have seen (this frankness) before, but they don't want to acknowledge that they have."

Fraser has had eight plays professionally produced; Love lies in the middle of his oeveur, and Super Man is his latest. It was Super Man which got the flack in Ohio, but he's been stirring up that hornet's nest in Canada too, where he's thought of as their very own Peck's Bad Boy. But then this is a man who survived having Keanu Reeves, then a gangly, homely, 18-year-old, nearly screwing up the debut of his play, Wolfboy in Edmonton. "Well, the play could have used some work as well, along with better direction.

If Fraser, a tall, intense-looking man sounds as if he should be directing, well, by St. Kushner, he does. But he's mainly still a writer: "I need to write about the importance of all human experience. I believe in how Gay peoples have been forced to reinvent the notion of family, as we're forced to go out into the world to replace the families we were born into." That's a huge theme in all his work, coming as he does from a dysfunctional family.

"Alcoholism was a standard. My father worked road construction and by the time I was 16, I'd never lived more than a year in one house. In the second grade I went to five different elementary schools. And I was subjected to constant beatings and sexual abuse from an older adult relative I've never confronted (nor will he name). I've not bothered with psychotherapy; I use my writing for that "

Perhaps as a result. Fraser hasn't settled down in any one spot but is "on the move or prowl a lot. I lived in hotel rooms and airplanes when I'm out of Canada, but I've an apartment in Toronto, and a house in Edmonton." He's not married, exactly, but is sustaining relationships with three different guys, "who know about each other. I don't believe in monogamy for men — it's a lie, something foisted on us by Judeo-Christian history - which I think is a basis for most of our unhappiness. I can't speak on behalf of women, but it's true for men, Gay or straight. Part of my criteria in a successful relationship is my being able to see other men. I'm not necessarily promoting promiscuity, but if I meet someone who excites me. I believe I should have the freedom (to stray) without feeling guilty."

It becomes even more interesting when learning that one of his lovers is ostensibly otherwise straight, and one of them is HIV+. "My sexuality is not relegated to a black-andwhite situation. I'm mainly Gay, but women have played a part in my development, too, and I lived successfully with a straight

friends for 3-1/2 years.

At 6'1", and a strapping 190 lbs., Fraser can pretty well call his shots - personal as well as professional - as he sees them. "I'm totally out in my life (as a Gay man), and I'm all for people being out as it's better for the world. But for the actor - whose money depends on being quiet - they shouldn't be forced to say whether they're Gay or straight. I speak at a lot of schools and drama clubs since, as someone who's out and fairly successful, I can teach kids that they can be all the things they want to be.'

The response to him is "invariably positive in that at least there's no hostility to my face. I've noticed that while young people are more able to be out today, there's still a great deal of fear that if they really are themselves, they'll get nowhere in society, college students worried about getting jobs: high school students reflect the fear of being (socially) penalized for being Gay. It's all because of the conservative

governments have created situations in which everyone is frightened for their jobs and futures. That's why it's important to show them someone who can succeed by saving what the government doesn't want you to hear. Things are changing: they're fighting like hell to stop the flood, but they're slowly

Fraser, who has tested negative for the HIV virus since 1985, feels that it's actually becoming more acceptable to be known as someone who is living with HIV/AIDS. "I'm alive because I made safe sex an integral part of my sexual life. 'Poor Superman' starts to touch on it, where people get up and still function while dying. I want us to get our shit together and begin to counteract the scare tactics so successfully waged by the right wing. It's true that I'm a bit unfair in the play, in that the Gays live a far superior lifestyle than do the straights; they have money; they live lives that are full and fun. I'm promoting homosexuality! Well, why not? I'm tired of being represented (in art) as tired, pathetic people who only die. Some straight male critics are pissed off at my chauvinism; it scares them. The Gay critics have tended to come from more academic backgrounds, and have been annoyed at what they feel is my lack of good role models; the characters aren't representative of the best of us to them."

Fraser's not afraid to speak out about American Gay theatre either: "I really liked Angels in America, but like so much of your theatre, it's too literal, and it was too long (at six hours). But so much of Kushner's writing was so brilliant. I quite often feel insulted by American writers: they tell me what I should feel."

Fraser has had the chance recently, however, to "go

Hollywood." The Disney corporation, of all entities, hired him to write a film, Beauty, which in the best tradition of LaLaland is now in turnaround (meaning Disney has let it go to whomever will buy it). "The producer is Roger Davies and although it's not a Gay script, it has several Gay characters in it; sort of a Generation-X thriller/romance." He's also been hired to write a series for Fox Television called "Insomnia," set in a night-time world of an adult soap-opera. "It's esoteric in that it deals with other issues than just sex. I really don't like to use the words Gay or Straight for my characters; I'm trying to create a supportive world for all sexuality."

To those ends, he has written the pilot and long-lead plot line, the 'bible' for the show. He has also written a screenplay for a Canadian film company. Our Man in Manila, based on a true story of a Canadian journalist based in the Philippines, who disappeared for years, only to surface running a brothel for teenage girls. He's also written a musical based on the late Craig Russell's mad excursion, Outrageous.

Now, while Love is a terrific watch, there were subtle changes from the transition to film which occurred as a result of a non-Gay director in his 50's meeting the writings of a Gay man in his 30's. "I have mixed feelings about the result. Denys' attitude about the depth and humanity of the women is like mine, but I would very much have liked to rethink the serial killer angle — it's too much of a cliche. What I like most is the fact that the lead Gay man (Thomas Gibson) is not dying of AIDS, not coming out of the closet, and not whining about his situation. I like how well he's reacted to (by the other characters). Everyone was nervous about the sexuality between the men, and, in truth, Denys didn't relate to the male sexuality, so it got played down."

So now you'll go see it, go back and read the play, and make up your own minds.

The film opens in Milwaukee at the Oriental Theatre on Friday, July 7.

Exploring the Gender Frontier

Talking with Kate Bornstein, Author of "Gender Outlaw"

A decade ago, Al Bornstein underwent genital reconstruction surgery to become Kate Bornstein and soon fell in love with a Lesbian who recently had female-to-male surgery. Kate Bornstein's very existence is a defiance of gender labels, so it's no wonder it should be the

topic of her first book.

Bornstein, a transsexual S&M feminist, performance artist, playwright, NEA casualty, spokesperson, and talk show regular became a celebrated theorist as well with the publication of Gender Outlaw. This fascinating and informative account of her own experiences is also an accessible exploration of gender politics and the current bipolar gender breakdown as an oppressive class system. Drawing on numerous sources and told with frankness and humor, the book covers a great deal of territory such as the mental preparation for and the logistics of genital reconstructive surgery, her reentry into the world, her argument for gender as a social construct, the script of her art/theory play "Hidden: A Gender," and roles the transgendered have played in other cultures.

With her plays, her book, her talk show appearances, and her lectures, Kate Bornstein is working to break the myths and mystery of the transgendered. Her work is a true union of life and art with education and understanding as the end goal. Talking to her about gender was a fascinating exploration of a topic mostly taken for granted in our culture. Is gender more

than genitalia?

Owen: If you had opposed the bipolar view of gender ten years ago, would you still have felt a need to have a vagina rather than a penis?

Kate: Yes, It's a lot more fun. I've regretted having extra piercings in my ears, but I've never regretted the surgery.

As a transgender Lesbian, how have you been accepted by the Lesbian

I want to start off by saying I do not call myself a Lesbian anymore. There's many who would agree with the definition of Lesbian as a woman who loves a woman. I don't fall into that definition. I'm

not a woman. I love women, but I'm not one and I'm also sexually attracted to quite a few men though not romantically — so what does that make me? My sexuality depends upon what people do and if they turn me on, but as far as romantic and sexual attachment, it's women.

Given that statement, and your lover's recent decision to have female-to male surgery, do you foresee a problem?

So much has happened since the book came out. He's now a boy named David and we stayed together for a year and a half during his transition into a guy and realized it wasn't working. We're not lovers anymore, but we're still very good friends, we're very tight. It wasn't sex. I've enjoyed sex with David as a woman and as a man. It's the romance part.

In "Gender Outlaw," you discuss gender as neither a male or female, but as an outsider. How do you see our culture create gender from that place?

That's the subject of next book! It's called My Gender Workbook. It's one thing to say there's no such thing, and gender is all a social construct, it's another to explain it. In the new book I'm going to trace the way gender enters the culture primarily through advertising, television and the media — through capitalism. Gender is used as an amazing marketing opportunity. You've got these two huge classes and if you can hold up a standard for each and say "To be a real man you have to buy this and to be a real woman you have to buy this" - they you can sell an awful lot of goods. It's one of the big things holding gender in place in our particular culture.

What hurdles do you think need to be overcome for our culture to dismantle gender?


To dismantle the gender system will take a clear majority of the people. Minnie Bruce Pratt and Leslie Feinberg have come up with an amazing coalition idea. Look at who the political right is targeting - women, Lesbians, Gays, the transgendered, bisexuals, SM workers, sex workers - all are in the area of sex and gender. Why hasn't the Gay and Lesbian movement, the movement, the SM movement, the sex worker movement, aligned themselves with the women's movement which is clearly where most of the violence is being targeted. More people are being wounded because they are women than any other group in the world. I think the fledglingtransgendermovementprovides the missing piece to this puzzle. Any

uppity woman, any feminist, is transgressing rules of gender by not following rules that say real men love women and real women love men. When you love a man or a Lesbian loves a woman you are breaking a rule of gender, you are transgendered. Unless we join forces and begin to back the women's movement where most of the damage is being done, we can't make any clear headway.

In "Gender Outlaw" you also discuss the losing of male privilege after your operation, what did that entail?

As soon as I became a woman and was walking around in the world as one I took a pay cut of about 30%. That was amazing to me. As soon as I started walking around as a woman I realized how unsafe I was on the streets. I'd never thought twice about it as a man. As far as what's ingrained, most boys are raised with a sense of entitlement, a sense that women are less than, and they behave that way as they do with anything that isn't the norm. I still have a lot of that left over. I think that's why I can be so vocal. I use that bravado, but not to oppress. I think male privilege also means violence, and intruding on someone else's space of person without their permission.

Much of your book reflects heavy feminist theory, is that the basis of your gender politics?



Feminism has come this far because it's been right on the mark in terms of the target, the patriarchy. I think what they are missing, which the Gay and Lesbian movement brought, was the freedom to love the freedom of sexuality. But yes, I'd align myself mainly with feminism. It's the front line that needs to be fought right now.

In different societies the transgendered have had specific roles like the shaman and berdache in Native American cultures. Do you redefine that trickster role for yourself in contemporary society?

Absolutely. Look at what's happened with the women's movement. If you call yourself a feminist you can join. If you come out of the closet as Gay or Lesbian, it's scary, but you can land in a community. If transsexuals go from one socially accepted gender to another there is a place to land, but if you move out of a socially approved gender into some other gender there is no place to land. You're left in this kind of... "Oh my gosh" state and you either develop a sense of humor or go suck on the tail pipe of a school bus. We see it all because we do not have a real culture or sense of community as yet.

What are the advantages of seeing things from that vantage point?

You see a whole lot more laughs in the world. It's also increased my compassion. I want to understand people and I want people to understand that transgendered. That's why I wrote the book, to start people asking questions.

So is education your goal?

Yeah, and I think education begins with questions rather than being lectured to, we're lectured at way too much.

Going back to your comment about the transgendered not having a community — what do you think it will take before a formal community can be established?

It's happening big. We're coming together under so many different banners, but we are coming together. I was just at a conference in Atlanta for The International Foundation for Gender Education. There were drag queens, heterosexual male crossdressers, malesto-females, females-to-males, butches, femmes, you name it. There were a couple hundred people and I have never performed for an almost exclusively transgendered audience before. I did my show, "The Opposite Sex B Neither. When I finished I got a standing ovation and started crying and said, "This is my family." I was there hugging straight white boys in dresses and I was saying, "You're brave." I think a lot of the communication is a result of the InterNet. People are talking more and more deeply on a daily basis with each other. Ideas are being exchanged at an exciting rate.

You're Outlaw Gal aren't you? That's my screen name.

Is it an extension of your role as educator?

People ask me all kinds of questions. I just got something from a male-to-female seventeen year old in Toronto. I said, "Baby, do you have anyone to talk to?" And he said "no," so we stayed on line and talked for a while. Sometimes there's more counseling like that too.

It's been a decade since your genital reconstruction surgery. How clear is the male-to-female split in your mind? Is it "the" dividing line in your past or just another part of it?

We all have major turning points, getting sober was a lot harder to do. Another major turning point was getting into and then the fuck out of Scientology. Usually we're counselled by our psychologists, peer group, and families to forget our past as a boy or girl. They're like, "All right, be a woman, be a man, but we don't want to hear what you were." That robs us of our history. Transsexuality is the only state where approved therapy is to lie. Fortunately there are some therapists who don't buy into that.

Besides "My Gender Workbook," what else do you have lined up in the future?

I'm writing a novel called **Nearly Roadkill** with Caitlin Sullivan. The most I can say is that it's a cyber romance thriller. I'm also really getting excited about the idea of coalition building and plan on getting more involved with that.

A native of Charlestown, SC, Gibson graduated from Julliard's prestigious School of the Arts, and hasn't stopped working as an actor since then. They shot Love & Human Remains in Montreal, after the Alberta Film Commission, the province where the play was originally set, backed away from the financing.

As played by Gibson, the character David resists being labeled simply as "Gay." "What I found interesting is that although he's only recently come out of the closet, emotionally he went back in — love doesn't exist for him. He embraces himself in a totally new sexual life, then denies the entire reason all these kids are fighting the good fight; looking for a purpose and trying to survive in this hostile, urban environment."

Gibson likes the idea that as a non-Gay actor, he can play someone different than he. "The idea of being an actor is to be able to put yourself into someone else's shoes. And there's something about David wanting to break out someway, exercising control over his destiny. I share that feeling of bitter disappointment. But I also felt that he could be quite exuberant in his Gayness." Although he embraces the idea of researching a role, he reports that his wife wouldn't let him sleep around. "I've seen plenty of my Gay friends through our adolescence and adulthood, embracing their own sexuality."

Asked why he thought a straight actor was hired to play a Gay character, "to a certain extent, the showbiz establishment is very homophobic, although they're trying to come to terms; they still treat it gingerly — homophobia

is still a deep-seated fear. People have to be educated — it's so much easier to be a reactionary. Certainly, the worst (Gay-haters) have been the Gay ones themselves: people like J. Edgar Hoover or Roy Cohn. But it's never been an issue for me. No anxiety about being with Gays — none at all. If there's any agenda that you adhere to before you pick a project, you end up missing out: selling yourself short."

Surprise: You're Bisexual

Marjorie Garber, Vice Versa: Bisexuality and the Eroticism of Everyday Life New York: Simon & Schuster, 1995 606 pp. Illustrated. \$30.

In Vice Versa, her just-released book on bisexuality, Harvard English Professor Marjorie Garber repeatedly reminds the reader that her last book, Vested Interests, on cross-dressing landed her on the television talk-show circuit. Geraldo cast "Dr." Garber in the role of "expert" brought in to determine whether her transvestite couch-mates were normal. Her answer: "rare, but normal." Given bisexual chic's current status as a talk-show staple, Garber's important new book may cast her again in the same role. But when asked whether bisexuals are normal, her answer will be that they are more than normal: virtually everyone is bisexual and society will be better off for acknowledging this fact.

A sprawling book in equal measures fascinating and frustrating, Vice Versa is the first major cultural study of bisexuality. The book is an instant classic in that future discussions of the subject — there will be many — must take it as their point of departure.

The book rummages through virtually every dimension of twentieth-century Anglo-American culture for traces and sightings of bisexuality. The book fights the numerous cultural forces that try to erase, belittle, suppress, or re-categorize bisexuality out of existence. Garber examines and chronicles newspaper clippings, song lyrics, novels, movies, plays, psychoanalytical treatises, science journals, diaries, vampire legends, celebrity bios, and, yes, talk shows. We are treated to, sometimes swamped by, dozens upon dozens of capsule biographies and plot summaries. Ultimately Garber is more successful in finding bisexuals than explaining what bisexuality

But the findings are impressive. Bloomsbury group, for example, turn out to be bisexuals. The economist John Maynard Keynes is a star case - a man who had profound and openly acknowledged affairs with men, including the artist Duncan Grant, but who in later life married and lived happily, sexually, and long with the ballerina Lydia

Many of Garber's reclamations to bisexuality are reclamations away from perceived Gay status, even from canonized Gay status, as in the case of Oscar Wilde. Though Wilde launched Gayness as a cultural style, the facts of his life are more accurately described as bisexual than homosexual. Garber acknowledges that these reclamations could easily be read as fronting an anti-Gay agenda. But her sensitivity to lurking homophobia is so acute in so many cases - she trashes the movie Orlando for it - that she absolves herself of this charge

Or almost does. For one of Garber's strategies to get everybody under the big tent of bisexuality is to count as bisexual any man who marries a woman even if his sexual desires are always exclusively directed toward men. Garber there are no sham marriages. But here we have bisexuality valorized and FTPextended by a Gay erasure that depends upon privileging heterosexuality in its most

institutionalized form.

Other big tent strategies are equally dubious. Garber

counts everyone in a mixed-sex menage a trois as bisexual even if every sex act performed and desire expressed by the trio is of the boy-girl variety. The reason: the very idea of the sexual triangle is itself sexy and the triangle contains both

Garber also counts as bisexual any male who has ever admired a male movie star. The reason: even the butchest of movie stars has a feminine side (Garber's one example is Sylvester Stallone). And any student who has ever had a crush on a teacher is bisexual. Her views here will give principals and deans hissy fits. She holds that to be good, teaching must be eroticized: the student must be sexually attracted to the teacher and vice versa. Further, to work in passing on the love of learning, this reciprocal attraction must not be articulated or acknowledged. But widespread, homophobicly-enhanced sexual abuse in the Boy Scouts suggests that eroticism when unacknowledged between mentor

and apprentice is a recipe for disaster.

The book has many analytical failings. In keeping with fashionable academic skepticism about science, the book holds that bisexuality must be a product of choice, not nature, because in it one can fulfill one's sexual drive differently in relation to two different types of objects. But take the case of the lung fish. It seeks out the same thing (oxygen), from two different sources (air and water) in two different ways (though gill or lung), and yet no one would suppose that this state of affairs is anything but genetically caused or that the fish's vacillations between air and water are the product of choice. Garber also claims that because bisexuality is a phenomenon that falls across a spectrum (some bisexuals are more same-sex directed than others), bisexuality cannot be a subject of scientific investigation. But light is manifest across a spectrum and it is the subject of several sciences chromatics, optics, quantum mechanics.

On the practical side of things, the book helps dispel various bisexual stereotypes - that bisexuals are unstable, immature, or confused. And so the book may well help in the formation of bisexual communities, perhaps even serve as a banner for them, though this is not Garber's aim. Indeed she is skeptical that bisexuality should develop as a social or political identity. Garber is not a bisexual liberationist.

On the conceptual side of things, even after six-hundred pages of rummaging, Garber fails to give any positive definition of bisexuality. She steadfastly denies that bisexuality can be interpreted as an overlap of homosexual and heterosexual desires, but offers no alternative account. In the end, she punts, claiming that bisexuality confounds sexual categories, is unbounded liquidity, is contradiction. But these claims are just to say that there is nothing to say. A predicate that excludes nothing, asserts nothing. The book's richly detailed case studies, though, should provide the ground from which others who wish to brave questions of bisexual definition, classification, and meaning may begin to build a better theory.



pretty high on the way back, Sunday, Some woman in a mini-van would not move out of the left lane!



I've heard countless coming out stories. Painful remembrances of the agony of coming to terms with a sexual identity that is considered marginally unacceptable at best. Somewhere in that story is a part where most come out to their parents. In only a small percentage do I hear a truly positive reaction from

Now, this isn't to say that everyone coming out shouldn't expect a bit of angst filled hand wringing from the parental units. Often the question, "What did I do wrong," comes out. Sometimes it's worse, with Christian condemnation, fire, brimstone, and treacle spewing forth as if they held the power of damnation in

their hands.

Many are able to put this in perspective and still maintain a connection, no matter how tenuous, to the people who brought them up. Some need not justify their reasons, while others feel a sense of duty to those who gave birth/ shelter to them. More power to them.

I suggest something a bit different. I have a mother who cannot be supportive in any way, shape or form. I can't blame her for her beliefs, which she is more than welcome to. But, for the fervency of her venom when even the most subtle pointer of my sexual preference comes out, I decided well over a year ago that I could stomach her attitude no longer.

It isn't simply a negative attitude

towards me that I have seen, or homophobic comments spewed derisively about AIDS, her belief in the non-existent duration of Gay relationships, or her version of faith that says I and all like me are going to hell. It is more than that.

It is my inability to be someone I am

I refuse to allow a small minded person tell me what it means to be Gay. will not be told that being Gay is something that only occurs inside a bedroom. I will not endure being passed over at family functions when all the other single people are being asked whom they are seeing. I will not be talked to like my life is an illness that can be cured with the "healing power of

This can be endured for a short period of time, but over the long haul, it becomes impossible to endure. And it shouldn't have to be endured.

So, after being out for seven years, hearing years of tirades, offers to be healed, and being put on Pat Robertson's Ten Most Wanted List, I broke the connection. I wrote Coleen (formerly known as the biological mother) a letter, telling her why I was disowning her. It was liberating. I felt like I had removed shackles from my hands and feet. I was beholden to no one.

This isn't to say that this is the appropriate choice for everyone

You have to be at a point where you aren't willing to deal with anyone who can't truly be supportive. You have to know that your value as a person is independent of what anyone thinks of you, and that anyone who feels they need to sling shit will be cast aside. It's something you do for yourself, because you know you not only need it - you deserve it.

It's not an easy decision to make by


any means. I thought about disowning my mother for a few months before finally drafted the letter she received. It took a month to write the letter. I wanted to make sure that I said everything I thought I needed to say to create a complete sense of closure.

I pored over the letter, writing it, rewriting it, and chucking out the first two drafts to start the writing process all over

Then it was done...

Now it's one year later, and I don't regret it a bit ... I've let that anchor go, and now that part of my time and energy aren't consumed by dealing with my family anymore I've moved on and accomplished things I never thought possible.

So, if you've reached a place in your life where you're trying to decide how to deal with the family, remember: you don't have to endure it. Look inside yourself, and decide how much you are willing to endure in contrast to how much they put out. And if you have to go, go. Do it not out of hate or loathing for your parents, but for the best reason: because you love yourself and know that you're worth



traced the health histories of 756 prostitutes in Senegal from 1985 to 1994. At the outset, 138 women had HIV-2, while 618 had no HIV infection. Nine years later, women with HIV-2 were 70% less likely to have acquired HIV-1 compared to the women who were initially uninfected with either strain. (The persistence of gonorrhea infections among many of the women studied indicated that few of them had changed their behaviors, so the finding cannot be attributed to safer sex practices.)

The development of the smallpox vaccine around 1800 provides a hopeful model for a vaccine against AIDS. At that time in Britain, Dr. Edward Jenner noticed that people infected with a mild disease related to smallpox, cowpox, were less liable to contract the deadly smallpox. That knowledge led

to an effective vaccination against smallpox.

Dr. Anthony Fauci of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases said the findings from Senegal offer "circumstantial but not definitive proof that HIV-2 might protect against HIV-1 and thus add a little data that helps buoy an old thesis. It is interesting, but there are a lot of 'ifs' involved."

PN355 Shows Promise as Anti-Viral Therapy

New York, NY — Paracelsian Inc., a biotechnology drug company, claims that it has developed a new drug from a compound found in Chinese herbal medicines which shows

promise in blocking HIV replication.

The drug, called PN355, is part of a class of anti-viral agents called tyrosine kinease inhibitors. Early studies suggest these compounds interfere with HIV's attack on T-cells, slowing down the damage to an individual's immune system. Scientists with Paracelsian also believe that PN355 may work more directly against HIV, inducing cell death in HIV-infected cells.





More studies of PN355 must be conducted before the company applies for clinical trials.
