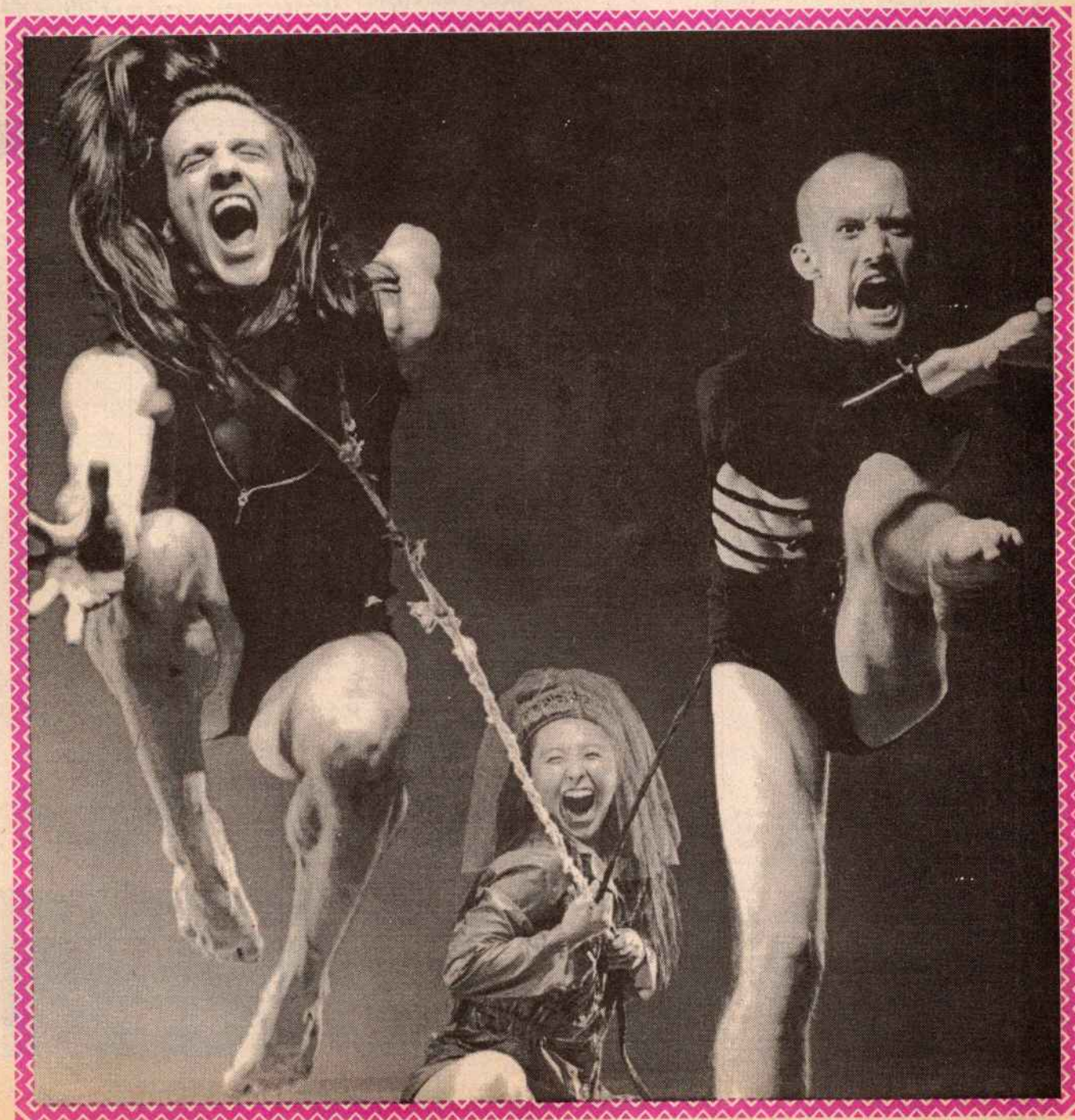

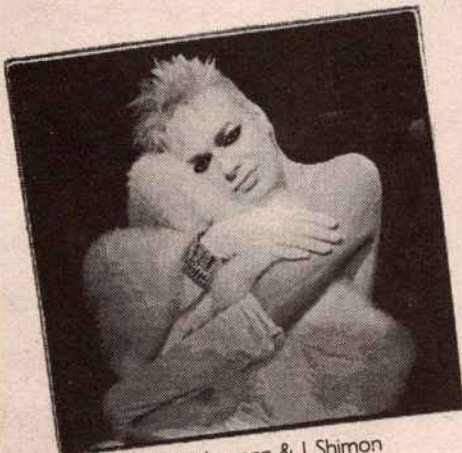

Presidential Order Ends Anti-Gay Bias in Security Clearances First Executive Order to Address Sexual Orientation

Washington, DC — On August 4, President Clinton issued an executive order that establishes a uniform US government policy against discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in the granting of security clearances. It reverses decades of overt discrimination against LesBiGay government employees, and is the very first Presidential order to address the subject of anti-Gay bias.

The Executive Order, entitled "Access to Classified Information," establishes a uniform, government-wide federal personnel security program for all federal employees and contractors who are being considered for initial or continued access to classified information.

Until now, government employees and contractors were subject to a patchwork system of regulations which were, at best, unclear or ambiguous on the topic. With the President's new order, which becomes effective immediately upon its publication in the **Federal Register**, it is mandated that:

"The United States does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability or sexual orientation in granting access to classified information...No inference con-

cerning the standards in this section may be raised solely on the basis of the sexual orientation of the employee."

"The language and tone of the order, developed at the President's direction by the National Security Council at the White House, together with input from the Department of Justice and the Office of Management and Budget, is definite, precise, and binding government-wide," Martha Scott, Clinton's liaison to the Gay and Lesbian community commented.

"It means that for the first time the government has clearly stated its policy on the subject — that no one will be discriminated against in access to classified material on the basis of sexual orientation."

AN END TO WITCH HUNTS

The order reverses decades of overt discrimination against homosexuals who were presumed by the government to be at greater risk for blackmail or intimidation by foreign agents seeking US secrets. Referring to the anti-Gay witch hunts the government conducted in the 1950's and 60's, longtime Gay activist Frank Kameny told the *New York Times*: "There were many hundreds of personal tragedies."

"There has been a gradual falloff of enforcement over the years," Kameny commented. Indeed, a report by the Gen-

eral Accounting Office earlier this year found that eight federal agencies or departments had already stopped using homosexuality as a premise for denying security clearances.

"What [the order] represents is the next step," Kameny told the *Times*. "The government has gone beyond simply ceasing to be a hostile and vicious adversary and has now become an ally."

"Significant numbers of jobs in both the private and public sector require government-issued security clearances," said Kevin Cathcart of the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund. "This is an important order in that it shows that the federal government has finally recognized that sexual orientation has no bearing on the performance of these jobs."

The new policy regarding sexual orientation is just part of a more comprehensive order designed to revise all security procedures in the wake of the Aldrich Ames CIA spy scandal last year. The order requires individuals applying for or in possession of security clearances to submit more information on their personal finances. It also bars discrimination against people solely on the basis that they have undergone psychiatric treatment in the past.

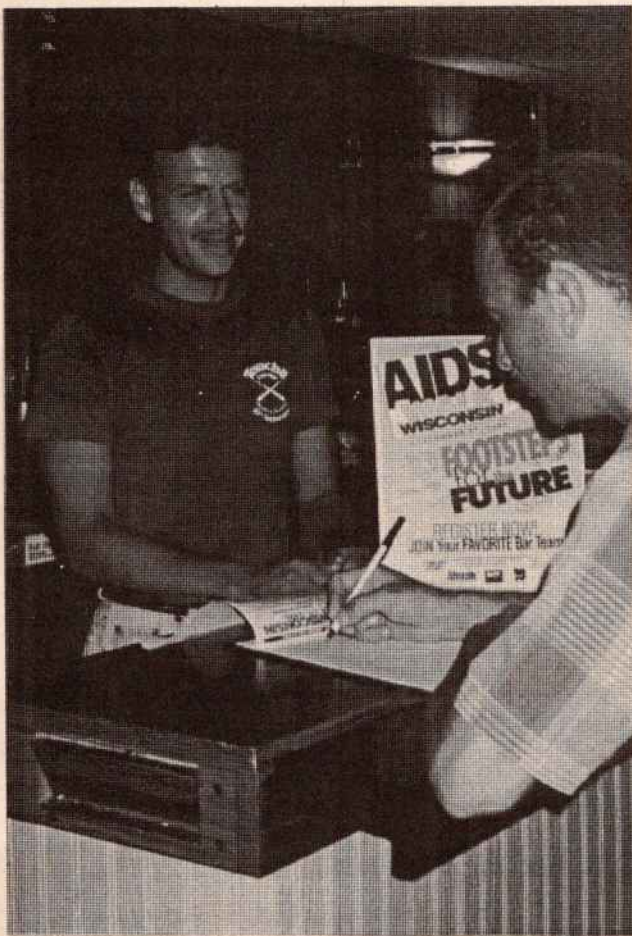

"Advocate" Publishes Results of Lesbian Sex Survey

Los Angeles, CA — The Advocate has published the findings of its first-ever Lesbian sex survey in its August 22 issue. Eight thousand women responded to the 186-question survey, which was included in *The Advocate* earlier this year.

Among the findings, 83% of the Lesbians surveyed said they'd had at least one orgasm in their last sexual encounter with a woman. Thirty-two percent said they had more than one orgasm. These rates are considerably higher than those reported by heterosexual women (having sex with men) in a similar survey. About two thirds of the Lesbians said that either they or their partner played a more aggressive role in initiating sex. One third said each partner shared in taking the initiative.

Almost half of the Lesbians surveyed said they had engaged in oral sex with their partner during their most recent lovemaking. Ninety-one percent said they love non-genital activities as well — hugging, caressing and cuddling. Eighty-two percent love french-kissing, while 74% enjoy holding hands. While one third of Lesbian couples reported having sex 3 or more times per week during their first year together, only 20% had sex that often in their second year together.

Half of the Lesbians became aware of their attraction to women by age 15, 75% by age 19, and 95% by age 29. Half had fallen in love with a woman by age 19. Half the Lesbians surveyed had come out to a family member by the age of 24. Ten percent had still not come out to their families.

The average age of the 8,000 respondents, who came from all 50 states and the District of Columbia, was 34. The youngest was 15; the oldest was 75. Nearly two thirds have college degrees, and the average personal income was high (in relation to the average of most American women) at \$32,000. Sixty-nine percent identify as Democrats, and 58% prefer to be called *Lesbian* rather than *Gay*. Respondents were 86% white, 8% Hispanic/Latina, 2% African American, 1% each Native American or Asian, 2% "other."

More details are available in the August 22 *Advocate*.

Cal Anderson, Frank Maya Succumb to AIDS

Seattle, WA — The Gay and Lesbian community lost two important leaders in early August when Oregon State Senator Cal Anderson and New York comedian Frank Maya both succumbed to AIDS. Anderson died August 4 at age 47. Maya died August 7 at 45.

Cal Anderson, a decorated Vietnam veteran, was the first openly Gay person to serve in the Washington State legislature and became a mentor to other Gay and Lesbian candidates and politicians. He was appointed to the Washington House of Representatives to an unexpired term in 1987 and was then elected to the House in 1988, 1990 and 1992. Despite acknowledging his illness, Anderson won a State Senate seat in 1994 with 81% of the vote.

Anderson successfully guided a Gay rights bill through the House three times, only to have it rejected in the Senate. But he was philosophical about his role: "My being in the House has helped, because they see that Gay men care about the same issues that they do, that we are not monsters."

Frank Maya was born in Queens and raised on Long Island. After college, he began his career as a singer and poet but advanced into avant garde theater and performance art in the 1980's. He performed three of his own shows in New York: *Frank Maya Talks*, *Get Out of the House* and *Unauthorized Autobiography: An Outing for the Whole Family*.

In the 1990's, Maya performed as an openly Gay comic, appearing on MTV and Comedy Central as well as many talk shows and in comedy clubs around the country. Much of his humor revolved around his Catholic upbringing and his family's response to his being Gay. Some of his work can be found in the anthology *Out Loud and Laughing*, published by Anchor Books.

Iranian Gay Man Granted Asylum in US

New York, NY — An Iranian Gay man living in New York has been granted political asylum by the US Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). He is about the 12th Gay person to win asylum since Attorney General Janet Reno declared that Gays and Lesbians can be considered part of a particular social group facing repression for purposes of asylum eligibility.

The asylum application was approved after INS officials determined that the man, known as "A.T.," had "a well-founded fear of persecution" if he were deported to Iran. According to Islamic penal law, the punishment for sodomy is death.

Lesbianism is punishable by up to 100 lashes for the first conviction, and death after the third.

A.T., who has been working as a designer and living in Brooklyn since his arrival in 1984, said: "I feel 100 pounds lighter, as if a weight has been lifted off my shoulders. Now I can start planning my life, and begin pursuing my dreams without the fear that I might be facing a death sentence simply for being Gay."

"Persecution of Lesbians and Gay men around the world has escalated to epidemic proportions," Suzanne Goldberg of the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund commented. "This ruling reflects our nation's commitment to providing refuge for all persecuted persons, including Lesbians and Gay men, who meet the strict eligibility requirements for political asylum."

Judge: HIV May Justify Reduced Prison Term

Cleveland, OH — In the first federal court ruling to recognize that defendants with symptomatic HIV infection may be eligible for reduced sentences, a judge in Ohio ruled August 4 that the virus that causes AIDS may be considered an "extraordinary physical impairment" under federal sentencing guidelines. The decision will impact how other courts rule in such cases.

Federal Judge Ann Aldrich of the Northern District Court of Ohio ruled that while HIV status alone does not warrant a sentence reduction, "once a defendant has developed infections...related to his or her compromised immune system, those impairments may be sufficient to warrant a [reduced sentence]."

Judge Aldrich's decision is the first in the country to hold that a prisoner's pre-AIDS condition (as opposed to "full blown AIDS") may justify a reduction in jail sentence. Most rulings on the issue have flatly rejected HIV as any basis for a downward departure.

"This is an important step forward for prisoners with HIV," said Catherine Hanssens, the Director of the Lambda Legal Defense AIDS Project. "It makes little sense from a criminal justice standpoint to incarcerate people with symptomatic HIV disease when they cannot pose a threat to society. Alternative sentencing for these prisoners, whether through home confinement, hospice placement or release, is a far more compassionate response, and a far more judicious use of taxpayers' dollars."

Gay Leader Delivers AIDS Message to Clinton and Gore

Washington, DC — Benjamin Schatz, the Executive Director of the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association, delivered an impassioned message about AIDS to President Clinton and Vice President Gore at the White House in late July. The occasion was a meeting of the President's new Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS.

Schatz gave Clinton and Gore a reality check on discrimination issues, saying, "Between the official policies of discrimination by the Peace Corps, the foreign service and the military, and the maintenance by the CDC of scientifically discredited guidelines about infected health care workers, it is the federal government that is the leading perpetrator of AIDS-related discrimination in this country. This sets a terrible example for the private sector."

"We need to see the political will of this administration to lead the fight against discrimination and to clean up its own house. Discrimination is the very fuel that feeds the AIDS

epidemic, that scares people away from testing, treatment and education."

"Mr. President," Schatz urged, "we need you to send a message to young women of color and to Gay men, that their lives are as cherished as those of any other American. And we need you to send a strong message — from top White House staffers and cabinet officials to agency employees — that it's not acceptable for them to marginalize us, to deny us appropriate grant dollars, to refuse to return our phone calls and to fail to include us in decision-making because we're not on the radar screen and we don't count."

"Mr. President, we need you to visibly and vocally take the lead in sending a strong moral message to all Americans: that people with HIV, that poor people, that men and women of color, that Gay and Lesbian people count as much as any American, and that you will mobilize the resources of your administration to combat discrimination against them. We also need you, even more than you have, to vocally oppose any amendments to HIV-related legislation which are designed to divide the American people along lines of sexual orientation, substance use history, race or other factors."

Spokane Coroner Attacked for Anti-Gay Diatribe

Spokane, WA — The Spokane Human Rights Commission and many Gay organizations nationwide have called for the resignation of Dr. Dexter Amend, the county coroner, after Amend made highly erroneous and inflammatory statements about homosexuals being responsible for the sexual assault and murder of a little girl.

The body of the nine-year-old girl, Rachel Carson, was found near the Spokane River June 15. The autopsy indicates Rachel was beaten and repeatedly sexually assaulted. The girl's uncle, Jason Wickenhagen, has confessed to the crime. Court records show that Rachel's father, uncle and mother's boyfriend may all have molested her over the years.

But Dr. Amend blamed all homosexuals for the crime: "She's been sodomized over and over, and sodomy is a homosexual act — it is. To have everybody think homosexuality is OK is a bunch of baloney...It's a horrible, unbelievable thing that this child went through and they [homosexuals] destroyed her life."

"It's a crime that we don't expose the homosexual community...It is an aberrant sex activity that is promoted by the thoughts and sensations that are associated with the sex act that drive people to do abnormal things and animalistic things, and as a result, bring about cancers and death on the part of the recipients and the active individuals..." The last part is an apparent reference to AIDS.

The Spokane Human Rights Commission issued a statement calling for Amend's resignation, saying: "Dr. Amend has scapegoated an entire group of people. His comments are personal in nature and devoid of fact. Most sex crimes are not perpetrated by Gays or Lesbians, but by heterosexual males. Homosexuality and pedophilia are not the same thing. The Commission welcomes the opportunity to help the public distinguish between the myth and reality regarding our Gay and Lesbian neighbors."

Also on the Newswire. . .

Phoenix, AZ — Arson is the likely cause of a July 26 fire that destroyed the offices of *Echo*, a Gay and Lesbian magazine that is distributed throughout the southwest. The fire began in a stairwell just outside the newspaper office. It destroyed four other businesses as well, causing nearly \$900,000 in damages. "We're

a target, there's no doubt about it," said Jeff Ofstedahl of *Echo*. "A lot of people out there think Gays and Lesbians have no right to exist."

Pittsburgh, PA — Samuel Sethman, 19, has been convicted of third degree murder in the beating death of 46-year-old Gay musician Paul Steckman in 1994. The youth claimed he acted out of fear he might be raped by Steckman, but bragged to police at the time he was apprehended: "I killed a fag! I killed a fag!" Prosecutors sought a first degree murder conviction, but the jury decided on a lesser charge because the killer was intoxicated.

New York, NY — Mulryan/Nash, a New York advertising firm that specializes in the Gay market, says that advertising spending in Gay print publications will reach \$61.6 million this year, a major increase over the \$53 million expended by ad firms last year. The figures were based on a nationwide study of 128 Gay magazines and newspapers.

Cincinnati, OH — The Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund and the American Civil Liberties Union have asked the US Supreme Court to review an anti-Gay charter amendment adopted by Cincinnati voters that will deny LesBiGay citizens an equal voice in government by preventing their inclusion in non-discrimination laws. The petition seeks to overturn a federal appeals court decision which upheld the constitutionality of the measure earlier this year.

Pontiac, MI — October 16 has been chosen as the trial date for Jonathan Schmitz, 25, charged with first-degree murder in the shooting death of Scott Amedure, 32. The murder occurred just days after Amedure had confessed he had a crush on Schmitz at a taping of the *Jenny Jones* TV talk show. The victim's father has also filed a civil suit against Schmitz.

Washington, DC — On October 10, the US Postal Service plans to issue a stamp featuring the likeness of Gay playwright Tennessee Williams, author of such classics as *The Glass Menagerie*, *A Streetcar Named Desire* and *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*. It is apparently the first postage stamp honoring an openly Gay man.

Abilene, TX — *The Chronicle of Higher Education* reports that Abilene Christian University fired the director of a summer Shakespeare production after learning he is Gay. The director, a graduate of the school, said the administrator "told me that I had been deemed an unfit representative of the school and that I was no longer needed."

"Long Road to Freedom" History Exhibit Tours Wisconsin in September

Milwaukee — The nationally renowned exhibit of Gay and Lesbian history, *The Long Road to Freedom*, will be shown in Milwaukee and Madison during the month of September. The traveling exhibit is sponsored by the Seagram Company and *The Advocate*.

Wisconsin PrideFest and Attorney Steve Brondino are sponsoring the Badger State tour. PrideFest calls the exhibit "a very important, professionally presented chronicle of our history from the time before Stonewall to the present. Through text and pictures, it offers a wealth of information about who we are and where we've been."

The Wisconsin showings will begin on Tuesday, September 5 with a gala opening night reception at Milwaukee's City Hall. The gala will include an open bar, music, silent auction and food. Tickets are \$25 each. Proceeds will benefit PrideFest.

PrideFest co-chair Bill Meunier says the location of the exhibit itself is historic: "This marks the first time there has ever been an official public Gay/Les/Bi event at City Hall. We will be making history even as we display our history." Souvenir programs will be given out at the reception to mark the occasion.

Following the opening night gala, the exhibit will be moved to the downtown Milwaukee Public Library. It will be

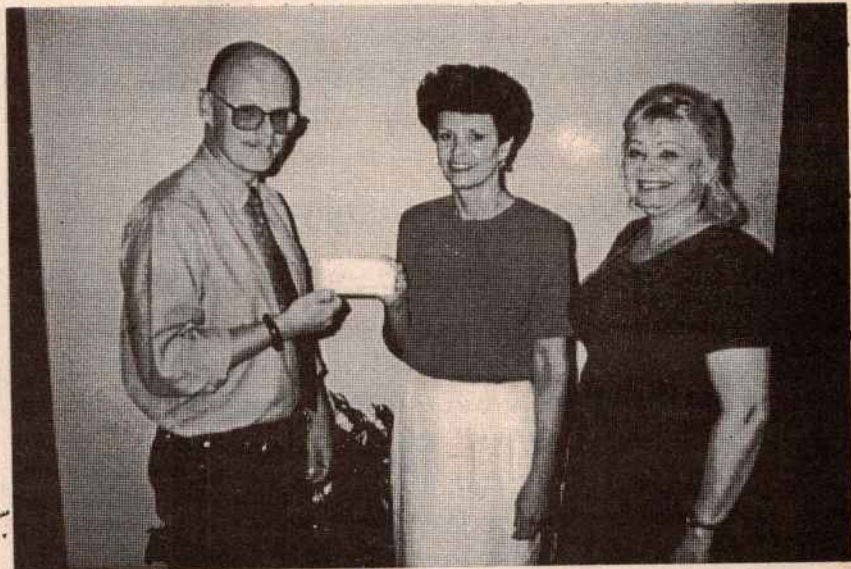
displayed in the second floor Humanities section through September 14 where everyone can view it free of charge. *The Long Road to Freedom* will then open a two-week run at Madison's Civic Center, 211 State Street. The Madison exhibition is being sponsored by The United.

Firefighters & Police Recruits Sought by City of Milwaukee

Milwaukee — The City of Milwaukee Fire and Police Commission is currently accepting applications for the positions of Firefighter and Police Officer for individuals who meet the minimum qualifications.

Firefighter applicants must be at least 18 years old, US citizens, have a high school diploma or GED and a valid driver's license. Police officer candidates must be at least 21 years old, US citizens, have a high school diploma or GED and a valid driver's license. A felony conviction disqualifies candidates, though an arrest record or misdemeanor convictions are not an automatic bar to application.

After successful completion of a training program and a 16-month probationary period (during which recruits are compensated about \$25,000), firefighters

can expect to be paid at least \$28,223 for their first year of service. Police officers' starting pay is \$28,875. By the fifth year of service, police officers can expect to make \$39,101.

Applications for firefighters will be issued and accepted *in person* from August 21-25 from 8:30am to 4pm (August 24 to 8pm) at the Municipal Building, 841 N. Broadway. Applications for police officer positions are ongoing and can be obtained and submitted at the Fire and Police Commission office, Room 104, 809 N. Broadway. AIDS Death Toll in Wisconsin Stands at 1,700

Madison — The AIDS/HIV Program of the Wisconsin Division of Health reports that 160 new cases of HIV infection were reported in the second quarter of 1995. One hundred-thirty-two individuals were diagnosed with AIDS while 67 more people died from AIDS complications, bringing the total of AIDS deaths in Wisconsin to 1,700.

The number of state residents contracting HIV infections since figures were compiled in 1982 now stands at 4,957. Of these cases, 12.8% are female. The total

number of AIDS cases, based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's definition, is 2,932. Of those, 64.7% were exposed through unprotected sex with other men, 12.8% were infected through injection drug use, 6.2% through heterosexual contact, 5.7% through drug use and unprotected sex between men, with 3.8% hemophilia or blood transfusion-related.

New York, NY — Paul Harding Douglas, an AIDS researcher and writer based at New York Hospital/Cornell Medical Center, died of AIDS complications on August 2. He was 37. Douglas wrote *The Essential AIDS Fact Book* and *The Essential HIV Treatment Fact Book*.

Washington, DC — A 63-year-old Korean War veteran was removed by federal police from the Korean War Veterans Parade July 30 because other participants complained that he is Gay. James Darby, a Navy veteran who served on the USS Midway and USS Bennington during the Korean War, said: "My removal from the parade was the biggest insult of my life. I earned the right to march in this parade."

Dallas, TX — Norma McCorvey, who was the "Jane Roe" in the 1973 Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion, was baptized by a leader of Operation Rescue August 8 and is now speaking out against abortion. McCorvey, a Lesbian who has been in a relationship with her partner Connie Gonzalez for 22 years, did not indicate whether her new born-again status meant she would disavow her Lesbianism.

Drag Diva BJ Daniels Takes Final Bow Aug. 27

BJ Daniels, one of Milwaukee's most noted drag performers, has announced that he plans to retire from his position as MC and star entertainer at Club 219+'s popular Sunday Night Drag Revue. His farewell show, "No Regrets, Many Thanks," will take place Sunday evening, August 27 at Club 219+, 219 S. 2nd Street.

Daniels, who is also a hair stylist and make-up artist, told *In Step*: "The drag shows have helped me figure out alot about myself as a Gay person and gave me a good vantage point to see our whole community. I'd like to find new ways to become active in the Gay community. I don't want to become stagnant. I want to change my life and move in new directions. I want to use the energy from past achievements to propel my life forward."

Daniels was born in tiny Rockdale, Wisconsin in 1960. He became something of a "club kid," hanging out at bars in nearby Madison in his late teens. He performed in his first drag shows there at about age 20 just as the classic disco era was ending.

Daniels began his drag career in earnest in 1982. Since then, he has held numerous local and regional titles, including Miss Gay Wisconsin 1984 and Miss Continental Wisconsin 1987. The *Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel* has named Daniels one of Milwaukee's Top 10 Entertainers.

Over the years, Daniels has used the drag medium to reach a broad audience. He has donated his time and his talent to benefit such organizations as *Art Muscle*, the Milwaukee AIDS Project, the BESTD

Clinic and the AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin. In 1994, the PrideFest Committee honored Daniels with its Community Service Award.

Daniels, "a proud 35" years old, plans to pursue new opportunities in his hairstyling career. These may include more traveling, teaching classes and working as an independent artist.

"I've only just begun — to live..." Daniels began to sing, tongue-in-cheek, while chatting with *In Step* staff members.

"The bottom line is that one day you just know it's time to move on," Daniels said. "I consider myself lucky. Things happen to us for odd reasons to take us to the next stages of our lives. You're lucky when you realize it's time to move on, because some people never do."

Although he is retiring from live drag performance, Daniels will continue to be active in the art, drag and Gay communities as a producer and consultant. He's already organizing a benefit show and party at the Milwaukee AIDS Project's Survival Revival Resale Shop on September 30 from 8-11pm. It will feature bands, a fashion show and drag show.

Meanwhile, Daniels hopes to see both old and new faces at his final performance on August 27. The show at Club 219+ begins at midnight. Tickets are \$6 (50% of which will go to benefit AIDS services).

Milwaukeeans Win National Awards

Three members of People of All Colors Together (PACT) in Milwaukee were honored with awards at the Crystal Celebration of the National Association of Black and White Men Together (NABWMT) in Key West, Florida on July 22. The Crystal celebration was held in conjunction with the 15th annual convention of the BWMT national group.

David Rompa received the Founders Award. It was bestowed for his efforts to rejuvenate and sustain the affiliated NABWMT chapter in the Milwaukee metropolitan area. Under the tutelage of David Rompa, PACT/Milwaukee has been combatting racism in the Gay community and homophobia in the straight majority and minority communities of the area.

Michael S. Lisowski and W. Michael Ross (aka Echo Chambers) both received the Special Achievement Award. This award was presented for their work outside the NABWMT that counters racism, homophobia and/or sexism.

Lisowski received his Special Achievement Award as co-producer and co-host of *The Queer Program*, running for

two years on public access cable TV channel 47 in Milwaukee. *The Queer Program* serves as positive reinforcement to the LesBiGay community as well as educational outreach to the general straight community. Lisowski has been singled out for hateful name-calling via the phone and on the streets because of his involvement on the program.

Ross received his Special Achievement Award for his work with the PrideFest Committee, the Children of Color Coalition and the Human Rights League. He is the PrideFest minority liaison and coordinates the Children of Color Revue, a 90-minute show showcasing minority talent at PrideFest. Ross is the chairman of the Children of Color Coalition, which ensures that the white Gay community is aware of minority issues and that the black community is aware of LesBiGay issues. The group has begun outreach to the Hispanic LesBiGay community as well. In addition, in conjunction with the Human Rights League, Ross has assisted in providing sensitivity training on racism and homophobia to police recruits in the city of Milwaukee.

Mary Turnquist Named New MASN Director

After an extensive search that included more than 96 applicants, the Board of Directors of the Madison AIDS Support Network (MASN) has chosen Mary Turnquist as the agency's new Executive Director.

Turnquist comes to MASN from Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan Inc. where she spent 19 years in management. She was instrumental in creating the Women's Community in Wausau, developing services for Indochinese refugees, developmentally disabled, and runaway youth.

"I am honored to be part of the Madison AIDS Support Network as it enters its second decade of service to communities in south central Wisconsin," Turnquist said. "MASN was born of a grass-roots concern for individuals and families who were being devastated by an alarming tragedy sweeping the country."

"We must continue to advocate for funding for necessary research and services. We must continue to provide essential life care services to people living with HIV disease. We must continue to give effective prevention tools and strategies to the communities we serve."

MASN provides case management to any person with HIV, free of charge. It

The Police at the Bathhouse

While you're at the beach this summer, the police will continue shutting down Gay bathhouses and bookstores across the country with blessings, even proddings, from some within the Gay community itself. In the mid-eighties, self-styled savior of the Gay community Randy Shilts became a millionaire through his calls for the state to discipline "irresponsible" Gays. Shilts himself would then die of AIDS, apparently unable to live by the advice he would have the government coercively impose upon others. Doctor, heal thyself.

Michelangelo Signorile and Gabriel Rotello are Shilts' avatars for the mid-nineties - founders of a euphemistically baptized organization, Gay and Lesbian HIV Prevention Activists, which calls for the state to close Gay bathhouses to stop irresponsible Gay behavior. In NYC's new Gay paper, LGNY (6.15.95), Signorile claims the state is needed in our sex lives because "there are a million reasons why someone is not in the right frame of mind to say no when someone is not using a condom." But Signorile himself not three seasons earlier had written a column for *Out* (10.94) in which he recounts his own recent unsheathed rectal penetration by a sailor in Hawaii.

Clearly the Gay community has its share of Elmer Gantry's. But are Gay men being sexually irresponsible in the AIDS crisis? The question is particularly poignant, for now everybody is educated about modes of HIV transmission and yet the rate of new infections among Gay men has crept back up to a level where, over time, as many Gay men will become infected as if no one took any preventive measures against infection in the first place. This number is what epidemiologists call a disease's saturation point - for AIDS around fifty percent.

GAY MEN SCAPEGOATS?

While you were at the beach last summer, the *New England Journal of Medicine* (8.11.94) reported a study which strongly suggests that Gay men are not being unusually irresponsible - or which at least gives us a benchmark for what counts as "irresponsible" for purposes of public policy. For twenty months the study tracked 256 heterosexually married couples who had one HIV+ spouse at the start of the study. All couples received HIV testing and safe-sex counseling every six months. The results: "Of the 256 couples who continued to have sexual relations for more than three months after enrollment in the study, only 124 (48.4 percent) used condoms consistently for vaginal and anal intercourse." Bluntly put: less than half practiced safe sex. Among the couples who did not use condoms consistently, the infection rate was 4.8% annually - twice the infection

rate among Gay men now and well above the rate leading to saturation among the heterosexual spouses.

Since it would never cross anyone's mind to have the state coercively intervene in these marriages for their members' own good, there must be something other than genuine paternalistic concern motivating those who would use the coercive power of the state to intervene in the sex lives of Gay men. Anti-Gay attitudes on the part of the police and self-hatred on the part of purportedly Gay-affirming bathhouse activists seem the likeliest candidates.

But even if activists' motives were pure, is paternalistic intervention by the state - intervention for Gays' own good - legitimate in bathhouses and backrooms? No. To see that this is so, one need only believe that consensual sexual behavior falls under the right to privacy. When a person's interest in liberty rises to the level of a right, then the interest is morally insulated from paternalistic interventions. For what having a right means is that its possessor is sovereign - has final authority - in making decisions and acting on them across the range of activities covered by the right.

IMMUNITY FROM COERCION

This immunity from coercion holds even if the exercise of the right involves the death of its possessor. We see this principle at work when health and the free exercise of religion come in conflict. For example, the state cannot legitimately coerce a person - for the very sake of preserving his own life - to have a blood transfusion against his religious belief that a transfusion will damn him for all eternity. So too if a person's sexual behavior is covered by a right, then paternalistic interventions against it are morally impermissible. Gabriel Rotello in *Out* (7-8.95) states that he is willing to see civil liberties for Gays suspended. By comparison, Rotello's position makes Jesse Helms look like Harvey Milk.

More subtle bathhouse opponents have recycled Old-Left slogans claiming that bathhouses unchecked put "profits over people." These activists try, at least nominally, to preserve privacy rights while attacking commercialism. But given that the only thing that goes on in bathhouses is sex and that everyone recognizes that is why people go there, to close a bathhouse is directly to target private behavior. To try to justify state coercion of bathhouses because they charge a fee for admission is as good as arguing that the state gets to tell you what you can pray to an icon because you have purchased a votive candle to light before it from the church that houses it.

Indeed, bathhouses are more obviously sites of privacy than are hotels,

where all sorts of non-private activities go on, like conferences, dining, and shoe-shining. As a reality check, Leftist bathhouse activists should ask themselves when the state is going to close the Ritz-Carlton because men and women are having sex without condoms there. Not in our life time, not ever.

More generally, we respect people as people when we respect them as choosers and deciders - as molders of their own destiny, as agents acting in freedom. By providing sites for consensual encounters resting at the very core of liberty, bathhouses are star cases of institutions that respect persons as persons.

Bathhouse activists - all of us - would do well to heed Justice Brandeis' vindicated dissent of 1928 on the greatest perils to liberty: "Experience should teach us to be most on our guard to protect liberty when the Government's purposes are beneficent. Men born to freedom are naturally alert to repel invasions of their liberty by evil-minded rulers. The greatest dangers to liberty lurk in insidious encroachments by men of zeal, well-meaning but without understanding."

Independently Speaking

Seventy-Two

Gay men are never supposed to grow old (but they should not fall to the scourge of AIDS, either). They should be forever cute and in their twenties. Forever young. But then, you're thirty. Not bad, still looks amazingly young. Forty? Remarkably well preserved. Fifty? Distinguished looking, but getting to be almost a dirty old man. Sixty and over. Forget it!

When I was thirty, I never thought I'd be forty, and then fifty, and then sixty,

and then I stopped counting. I started counting again on my sixty-seventh birthday when I, at long last, was able to fully accept myself as a Gay man. When I was able to articulate it to my family, my straight friends and conservative associates, that very instant of total self-acceptance became the definitive moment of my life. I was at last free of the shackles of my decades of self-hatred.

Why did I wait so long? Because I could never really accept the fact that I was a homosexual. All my many Gay and Lesbian friends knew. My mostly conservative friends and associates probably knew or assumed it. So, why bother talking about it? What does it matter?

It matters! Although my "coming out" dismayed many of my political associates at the time, I purposefully did it and as publicly as possible — to show my conservative friends and colleagues that a Gay man was one of them, that they should be more accepting of me and the other Gays and Lesbians involved in the conservative movement and in the Republican Party, and that they should quit using homophobia as a political weapon and a fundraising tool. It was worth the trouble because there is a bit more tolerance of us in GOP and conservative circles, but not nearly enough.

"REAL LIFE" BEGINS

My real life therefore really began five years ago. All the searching, all the masks and role-playing of the past were no longer needed. I immersed myself in my new community, desperate to make up for lost time and somehow to absolve myself for my long silence. I worked with the Log Cabin Clubs, hoping to use my conservative GOP credentials to help Gays and Lesbians find a place in the Republicans' ever-shrinking "big tent." I was the first chairman of the Log Cabin Republicans, which was organized to give Gays and Lesbians a presence in the nation's capital.

I tried and failed to begin two new organizations — the Lambda Conservative Foundation and the National Coalition for Understanding. Both were aimed at enlisting straight friends to work with Lesbians and Gays in a national media campaign to show America our "real faces and lives" as against the stereotypes generally promulgated. The projects never really got off the ground because we have a multitude of faces — other than the WASP image so many of my colleagues wanted to present.

I wrote my autobiography, *Coming Out Conservative*, and I spoke at bookstores, on TV and radio, and was interviewed by the press. I went to Human Rights Campaign Fund black-tie dinners, and spoke at National Gay and Lesbian Task Force press conferences. I picketed with ACT UP, and demonstrated noisily with Queer Nation.

I started to write a monthly column which I distributed to the Gay press. Many papers printed it, while some ignored it. At first I called it *Conservatively Speaking*, and then changed the title to *Independently Speaking*. The reason for the change is that I could no longer tolerate the bigotry and hatred emanating from

my former bases of operation — conservatives, Republicans and "Christians." The latter was part of my relentless search for myself. I became a Christian (Roman Catholic) in 1978, but I reasserted my Jewishness last year at the Gay and Lesbian synagogue here in Washington, DC.

In essence, I am doing everything I can to participate and contribute to the future of Lesbians and Gay men. I am a truly contented man now, surrounded by so many of the children I could never have. I'm luckier than most fathers because they have become my close and beloved friends.

LESSONS LEARNED

During the past five years, I learned some lessons about our community and its politics. Most important, perhaps, is that we are *communities*, not one but many, in almost every city and state in the nation — Oregon, Colorado, Cincinnati, Dallas, Washington, Boston, San Francisco, and on and on. Our future lies in our cities and states. It is locally that we have to be seen and take action on every issue that comes up affecting us. We must be active in our neighborhoods, from the school and library boards to the state legislature.

Above all, we should take an active and open part in all aspects of mainstream community life and remain independent of political parties, giving our support *only* to those who openly support us and withholding it from those who do not. Our national "community," such as it is, is based on the shared experience of all of us — the fear and pain of first discovering who we were, and the joy of finally accepting it. We must reach out to each other — and to our families, friends, working associates and neighbors — as open and proud Lesbians and Gay men.

Finally, we dare not underestimate the strength, power and resolve of the enemy of all of us — the Christian Coalition and the dozens of its national and local clones. Pat Robertson and his legions consider each and every one of us — from flamboyant drag queen to the most straight-acting Log Cabin Republican — the children of Satan who, in the name of Jesus Christ himself, must be erased from the face of the earth. Remember the Holocaust, which could never happen in our enlightened century. But it happened. Believe, recognize and fight the danger, all of you, because it is out there. Waiting.

All I have left to say is: I'm here! I'm queer! I'm seventy-two! Get used to it!

Low Cost Meds Available from NAPWA's Air Express Pharmacy

Washington, DC — The National Association of People with AIDS (NAPWA), a non-profit voice of education and advocacy to the HIV community for more than 12 years, has established MedExpress, an air service pharmacy for HIV/AIDS drugs whose profits will fund more services and advocacy for people with the disease.

Unlike current mail-order pharmacies, MedExpress will combine low-cost medications available to the patient within 24 to 48 hours of ordering (via Airborne Express) and a wide array of additional services to help those infected with HIV/AIDS live longer, healthier lives.

"We developed MedExpress because people living with HIV need more than just medications. We need information and we need services. Our number one goal is to give patients not only low-cost medications, but access to crucial information and services as well," said William J. Freeman, Executive Director of NAPWA.

In addition to all FDA-approved medications, nutrients and supplements at low prices, MedExpress will provide each patient with a personal representative, a "member advocate," who will help them access an array of information and services: the latest in treatment and alternative therapies; stress management; nutrition; legal issues; the work environment; medication interactions and reactions; relationships; and living more healthfully with HIV/AIDS.

"MedExpress is much more than just a pharmacy," Freeman added. "It's a single source for everything you need to live well with HIV."

Medications and information arrive at the patient's door via overnight courier within 24 to 48 hours in discreet, confidential packaging. In addition, patients receive an automatic membership in NAPWA; a copy of the *Living With HIV Source Book*, a step-by-step guide to taking control of your life as a person living with HIV; and a *Living With HIV* video.

"People with HIV and AIDS need to get their vital medications at fair prices — wherever they live and without worrying about privacy," said Jim Graham, Director of the Whitman-Walker Clinic in Washington, DC. "MedExpress satisfies those needs."

According to Freeman, most insurance policies have yearly or lifetime caps, and the cost of treating HIV is staggering. "The average symptomatic patient takes as many as 13 prescriptions on a daily basis, and these can cost as much as \$14,000 per month. We want to help patients maximize their lifetime medical benefit through low-cost drugs and critical life-extending services."

MedExpress is designed as a "one-stop shop" for those living with HIV/AIDS. Accepted by most insurance companies, all insurance claims are handled through MedExpress.

For more information about MedExpress, or to order medications, call its toll-free number, 1-800-808-8060 each day from 9am to 9pm EST. Messages for a member advocate can be left on the line 24 hours a day. Member advocates may also be reached 24 hours a day, 7 days a week via pager.

Merck Offers New AIDS Drug Through Nationwide Lottery

Whitehouse Station, NJ — The pharmaceutical firm Merck & Company will conduct a nationwide lottery to choose 1,400 people with AIDS who are willing to try its new experimental drug called Crixivan.

Crixivan is part of a new family of medications in development called protease inhibitors. Early test results suggest that these compounds help to block an enzyme which plays a critical role in HIV's replication, potentially slowing the progression of the disease.

Merck is the second drug company to hold a lottery to choose subjects for protease inhibitor trials. In June, Hoffman-LaRoche announced it was seeking 2,200 volunteers to try its own protease inhibitor, called Invirase. Hoffman-LaRoche says it has received more than 10,000 inquiries.

Merck is giving preference to 300 individuals who had missed out on previous HIV drug trials. The remaining 1,100 people must already have very weak immune systems to be considered for the Crixivan study. Physicians and people with AIDS should call 800-497-8383 for more information.

Early HIV Treatment May Not Prolong Survival

London — A new study published in the *British Medical Journal* determined that early treatment of HIV infection may delay its progression to AIDS, but does not necessarily prolong survival. The findings reinforce the conclusion of the 1993 Concorde study in Europe, which cast doubt on the effectiveness of the early use of AZT for HIV-infected individuals who are asymptomatic.

Dr. Mark Poznansky and a research team at St. Mary's Hospital Medical School in London studied 436 patients who had developed AIDS between 1991-1993. Ninety-seven people learned they had HIV when they developed their first illness, having had no previous knowledge of or treatment for the disease. The 339 others had been tracked through clinics after they had tested positive for HIV as many as eight years ago.

The *New York Times* reports: "A comparison showed that those who received early treatment suffered fewer AIDS-related infections. Yet once they became ill they died, on average, a year sooner than those who were not treated until severe symptoms began. The overall time from acquiring infection to death was similar..."

"Most doctors feel when they are giving AZT early, they are increasing the asymptomatic period, but again and again they have learned that survival is the same," Dr. Merle Sande, an AIDS expert at San Francisco General Hospital told the *Times*. "Nothing that has delayed progression to AIDS has ever been shown to alter survival."

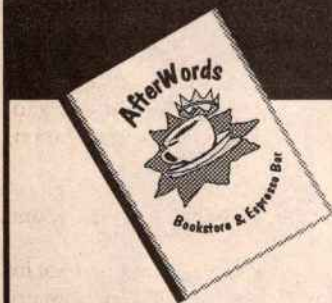

Chea's Song: An Interview with Author Chea Villanueva

"Jessie's Song" is Urban Dyke Drama

Jessie's Song, a rich collection of bold, aggressive and engrossing tales by Chea Villanueva, has just been published by Masquerade Books (Richard Kasak imprint, \$9.95). Written primarily as a series of letters, *Jessie's Song* recreates the outlaw lives of a group of urban dykes. Villanueva, a 41-year-old butch of Filipino-Irish ancestry, has created a sexy, gritty and heavily butch/femme book recounting many of her real life adventures and experiences. *Jessie's Song* is a solid piece by a writer whose style and language pulls no punches. Talking to Chea was great. She proved to be just as direct as her prose.

Owen: How closely do events in *Jessie's Song* reflect your own experience?

Chea: It's about 90% true, the names have been changed. The only things in the book that are complete fiction are "Smokey's Story" and "45 Minute Blowjob."

Have the real-life women whose names were changed commented on the stories?

They know who they are. The only people who haven't seen it are those in the actual story *Jessie's Song*. One of the women, Crystal, died. The other — I've no idea — I haven't seen her in years. I keep hoping one day the woman who is Jesse will pick up the book and read it. She would know who she was. Everyone else in the book is a really good friend of mine, especially those in "Girlfriends." If I do a reading in Philadelphia or New York, I even have them get up and introduce themselves.

What was your goal when you sat down to write the stories in *Jessie's Song*?

I just wanted to write a piece of fiction that reflected working class Lesbians. I didn't want to do a love story. I wanted to do short stories of women in prison, butches and femmes, reform school girls and Lesbians of color. Most of the time when you walk into a bookstore and want to read about women like that they're either in anthologies or some book that came out for academic purposes. There's not that much fiction out there for Lesbians of color and particularly for those of us who identify as butch and femme. It's my generation. It was something I knew and could write about and it interested me. I have a lot of friends who are butches and femmes and they're constantly looking for stories that reflect our lives, something that we can relate to. The best fiction on the topic is Leslie Feinberg's *Stone Butch Blues*, and now her lover, Minnie Bruce Pratt, has come out with *S/HE*.

And there's the great Joan Nestle anthology *Persistent Desire* too. Why do you think the butch and femme factor has been so under-represented in Lesbian literature?

I'd have to blame a lot of it on the women's movement of the '70's. There was a time when it was taboo to have those labels on you — everyone seemed into androgyny and grew their hair and wore flannel shirts and combat boots. Often, you were made very unwelcome in the Lesbian community if you wore a suit or a dress. Even in the bars there was a lot of ostracism. It just wasn't talked about until *The Persistent Desire* came out.

What was the core of what you wanted to say about working class Lesbians, or were you mainly concerned with working class visibility?

Remember the *Newsweek* cover with the two Lesbians who were the all-American girl-next-door type? It bothered me. The portrayals of Gay men and Lesbians that are all over the media look like glamour boys and girls who have money and travel. I don't know anybody like that. I wanted to write a real-life adventure with no glamour girls and everybody holding a 9 to 5 job, some on welfare, some in prison. I wanted to portray a side of the Lesbian community that will not get any media attention.

What made you decide on the letter style of the extended "Girlfriends"?

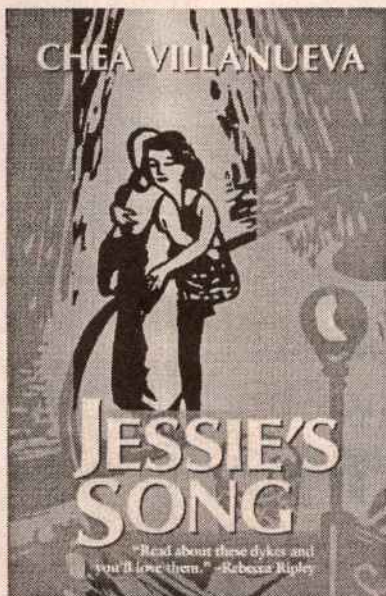
It started off as a joke. I grew up in Philadelphia and moved to New York. Of course, there was all this telephone calling and letter writing back and forth with all the gossip. It was a joke with my friends who said there's so much gossip going on in this group, we should write about it. It started with letters that began, "Dear So-and-So, Wait 'til you hear what happened last weekend..." It just felt right to continue in that style.

What do you want people to feel upon finishing the book?

I want them to like it and not be bored. It's pretty fast. It's one of those books you can just pick up and read through in a night. It's not going to take you a couple weeks. It's for people with short attention spans.

Pearl's determination to be a writer is so strong. Was yours always that way as well?

Pretty much. I've been writing since I was about 10. I got in a lot of trouble just for telling my family I wanted to grow up and be a rich and famous writer. In our family, you didn't do stuff like that. You either quit school when you were 16 and helped pay the rent, or you finished high school but didn't go on to college. That was too much to ask for. My family was not happy about the writer thing, so I used to hide my work. They didn't even know I was writing until I was 21 or 22.

How did being half Filipino and half Irish affect your identity when you were growing up?

I grew up pretty mixed up. I didn't know many Filipinos, especially in school. There was one, but she moved away and then I was the only one. We basically grew up in a black and Puerto Rican neighborhood, so that's who I identified with. I knew I wasn't white. No one believed I was half Irish too, so I dropped that part and just said I was Filipino, but people didn't know what that was, so mostly they just thought I was half black or Puerto Rican. I just kept my mouth shut and didn't say anything.

How does all that affect your writing?

There's always characters in my stories that are of mixed race. It's important for me to have that mixed heritage in there. We get left out a lot. It's even more important in the book I'm working on now.

Which is —

It's another book of short stories called **Butch Tales**. It's almost finished...It will be less erotic than **Jessie's Song**. The new stories aren't written in the first person. It's a new style for me.

What Lesbian's books have been your biggest influence?

The Persistent Desire, Stone Butch Blues. I also like Sapphire's work. She writes mainly poetry, but [it's] hard core. She's a realist too. All her poems stem from different events in her life and in the news. She doesn't write a lot of pretty words down; everything is in black and white and in your face. She writes the truth. She's about my age, lives in Harlem, and has had some rough times. I've known her for some time and am really proud of where she is now in her writing. She's another

working class writer and my role model. I've always liked her work and wanted mine to be good like hers too.

What's your favorite thing about being a writer?

The travels I can take with my mind. I can go anywhere. There are parts of my past I wish I could return to. When I write about it I can go back and see those people I'll never see again. It leaves me with a nice feeling to write about them.

Thanks Chea, good luck with the book.

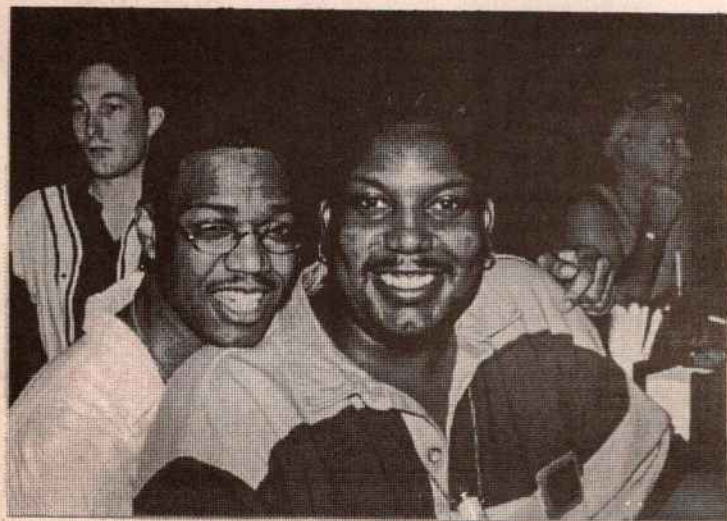
