tn 1875 the collective moved to Californic where they recorded Olivia's best salling album. Uris Williamson's The Changes and the Changed. Hand corried from listener to listener and store to store, the album sold over 250,000 copies.

During its 15th anniversary year, Olivia will release an album with rock/blues belter Diane Davidson on Second Wave, a subsidiary label. Other plans include the release of The Changer and the Changed on compact disc and the recording of Lucie Blue Trambley's secand Disvis album. Olivia has also expanded its mail order catalogue to include videos, iewelry. other independent label alhuma, and gift items.

"Fifteen years is a real milestone. We're celebrating by again stressing the grassrouts, our natural audience who appreciates quality music by incredibly talented women," mays blufact. "We plan for Olivia to celebrate its 100th an-Divacuary, so we're working now for the financial stability and prestive growth that will take it into the naxt century."

POTLUCK RECIPE OF THE MONTH

By request of LOTS of women, we are including the recipe for the fruit pizza that has been at a number of the last potlucks.

FRUIT PIZZA (12 servings)

Margarine - 1/2 cup Powdered sugar - 1/4 cup All purposs finue - 1 cup Mix together like a pic crust and pat into a grassed pizza pan and edgemake at 350 degrass for 10 minutes until light brown.

Granulated augar - 1/3 cup Neufachtel cheese - 8 oz. OR cream cheese - 8 Oz. Ventils - 1 tsp. Max and apread carefully on cool crust

Fresh apples, sliced - 3 Mandarin oranges - 16 oz. Canned pineapple - 20 oz. Fresh blueberries - 1/4 lb. Green grapes - 1/4 lb. Drain nanned fruit (save juine), mash fresh fruit and arrange on pizza (any fruit may be uned).

Gernstanch - 2 Thien-Juice from canned fruit, plus weler in equal 1 cup Gernwlated sugar - 1/2 cup lemon juice - 1 tap. Cook until thick, 5001, pour nwrz feuit. (You may aprinkle geated nheene and/or nuts on top.) Ne-Frigerate.

Greenpeace is launching a new offensive in the war on whaling. They're going after Japanese and Icelandic wholing interests at their financial source, by blooking their countries' lumralive fish exports.

Japan and Iceiand continue to kill wholes even though it is forbidden, by saying they are only doing so for scientific research. International Masling Com-BIBBIOR haa condemped Japanese and Icelandic ventures se nothing more than whale slaughter for profit. At last year's meeting, the IWC turned down Japanese and lumiandic resourch proposals and saked both governments to rectad whaling permits.

Yet the killing goes on Japan just concluded its illegal kill of 300 minks whales. For the second year in a row, Iceland deficied the ING mornturium and sleughtnred endangered fin and soi whales.
