

AGE DISCRIMINATION

Age also matters, because that's the way society sees you first. "Oh, my, what a lovety son," "He's not my son, he's my lover!"


But. Age doesn't matter. It does not refer to anything vital, tangible, or critical. 40, 28. 33, 64 does not describe anything specific.
