Present plans call for distribution of the Calendar every other Thursday evening. We also will be expanding the circulation of the magazine from about 1.500 copies to an immediate 3.000 copies (and more, if needed). The magazine will continue to be distributed free through our advertisers. In addition, copies of the magazine will be distributed in Chicago, Madison, Green Bay, and other Northern Illinois and Wisconsin communities.

Dan Di Leo, 41, is a native of Chica-

go, but grew up in Milwaukee where he attended Pius High School and studied journalism at Marquette University. He later worked for five years as a reporter for the Milwaukee Sentinel until he was drafted. He served almost sic years in the Army, working as a German translator-interpretor in the intelligence field.

Ralph Paul, 45, was born in Chicago, and grew up in the Northern Illinois and Southern Wisconsin area. He still has family ties in Elkhorn.

DiLeo has 24 years of newspaper background, having worked for papers in Milwaukee, Rockford, and Decatur, III., and most recently for the Chicago Sun-Times

Force and then returned to the Midwest where he graduated from broadcasting school in Chicago, where prior his entering the publishing field, he served as a broadcast instructor.

In 1976 Ralph Paul began a News and Events hotline for the Chicago gay community. Later he published Gay Chicago Magazine and GCNews Journal and a Gay Chicago weekly newspaper. The two publishers joined forces in November, 1977 and in April, 1978 began publishing Gay Chicago Magazine in a format similar to the copy of the Milwaukee Calendar you are now reading.

It's somewhat ironic that we should wind up acquiring the Milwaukee Calendar, because it was the Calendar, then being published by Frank Thalacker, owner of the Finale and now Shadows, that gave us the idea for the present format of Gay Chicago and now the new Milwaukee Calendar.

The two publishers have done extensive traveling, but both have a warm fondness for Milwaukee, which we both refer to as our "dream" home. In all of our visits to Milwaukee, and especially throughout the gay community, we have found Milwaukeeans to be some of the friendliest people in the country and we are looking forward to being a part of the Milwaukee community, both gay and straight, for many years.

While we will continue to live and operate our business and editorial offices in Chicago, we will make the Milwaukee Calendar a strong publication for Milwaukee and Wisconsin.

You'll see us around town each week gathering data for the Calendar of Eyents listings, taking photos and obtaining information for articles about what is happening in Milwaukee. Of course, we'll need the help of members of the gay community. We won't be

able to publicize an event or party or whatever unless you give us the information. We've made it easy for you to call us (toll free). Our Milwaukee telephone number is 344-9030 and our offices are open Monday through Saturday from noon to 5pm.

One of the successes we've had with Gay Chicago Magazine is to provide as complete and accurate Calendar of Events listings as possible. We're sure we are missing a few items in this first issue, but because of the short deadline we had to produce our initial copy of the Calendar we were unable to get in touch with everyone. We hope to rectify that situation by our second publication.

PRIDE WEEK COMMITTEE PLANS A WEEK OF GAY ACTIVITIES

The Milwaukee Gay and Lesbian Pride Planning Committee has come up with a week of events to mark Gay Pride Week, which begins at noon Saturday, June 21, with a picnic in Mitchell Park (behind the domes on 27th Street). The following day, Sunday,

June 22, there will be an ecumenical service at the lake front, followed by a street festival in an area near the Wreck Room and Factory.

On Monday, June 23, a gay art show will be unveiled at the UW-M gallery. The show will run through July 11. Tuesday, June 24, has been designated as Harvey Milk Day in honor of the slain San Francisco supervisor. A candellight vigil will be held at the War Memorial to commemorate the victims of the holocaust.

Wednesday and Thursday, June 25 and 26 will be devoted to a gay film festival. The exact time and location of the showing of the two gay films has not yet been set. On Friday, June 27, there will be a gay talent show in the Wisconsin Room at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

On Sunday, June 29, the committee is trying to arrange for several buses to take members of Milwaukee's gay community to Chicago to participate in the annual Gay Pride Parade through Chicago's New Town. Ticket information and details on the bus trip will be announced later.

On the Street

With the warm weather approaching, there's going to be a lot of guys shedding their shirts and donning their shorts. 




