BODY BUILDING PART III

An article in the *Sun-Times* recently said that exercise is good for some kinds of depression, citing cases of moderately depressed people who were relieved by jogging at least three times a week. It all has to do with chemistry.

I'm sure there are quite cheerful people who get little exercise at all, but even they can benefit from some exertion if only for the sake of their circulatory systems.

Then too there is the sheer pleasure of exercise. This is not to be found without crossing the barrier of old habits. In other words, a lot of people are addicted to sitting around, exerting themselves as little as possible, as a habit.

My main interest is not so much in exercising for the cardiovascular system as it is in using weights. However, it is important to get the heart and lungs going too. Weight lifting does not do this in the continuous manner provided by running, swimming, bicycling, or dancing. Thus one of these should be part of your whole body-building program (but do not do any exercise without a complete check-up from your friendly neighborhood physician).

Some people can learn how to enjoy the effort of exercising, but get bored with repetitive motions. So if you swim, vary your strokes. You will find that just naturally you will want to do a few more lengths of the pool each time as you get used to it, and you will want to do some lengths very fast and some slowly. Don't push it.

All you need for swimming is an

enormous pool of water, which will cost you money. Therefore for most of us the most practical form of cardiovascular exercise is dancing. Several discos are on all week and provide space for dancing and dance exercise, which you can do all by yourself.

You can do calisthenics to the time of the music (e.g., jumping jacks) if you don't know how to dance. Aim for eventually keeping in reasonable fast motion for at least ten minutes at a time (checking beforehand with your family physician). If you know ballet, do plie's in the various positions, for instance.

If you are a beginner to exercising, just do some dancing first and swimming if possible and then after about a week of this start doing push-ups at home. The first day just do a few — don't do as many as you can do. You

can also do some squats, which is just knee bends. If you overdo these exercises the first time, you will be very sore.

Two days later do them again and add a biceps exercise: straighten out your right arm and then let it come up slowly toward your right shoulder, resisting with your left hand. This will give your right biceps and left triceps (back of the arm) some good exercise. Then change sides.

After you get used to these simple exercises for a few weeks you can start adding other resistance movements and more calisthenics, keeping up your running, dancing, or swimming. Exercise at least three times a week.

If you can prove to yourself that you will do these exercises regularly you can add something like a Bullworker, which is a device that comes with complete instructions for home workouts. When you feel that you can sustain a regular program, it is time to join a gym.

Gyms are usually fairly expensive. If you can find one that doesn't have a hard sell, you're better off. The harder the sell, the more they're interested in selling than in anything else. Some places offer a whopping first year charge and very small charges in succeeding years (because they know most people will quit in a few weeks and never return). This kind of gym is a great money saver, but *only* for those who like exercise and who will be going to work out for years.

I myself have to go to two different gyms to get everything I need. The one with the pool has only one Olympic bar and a few chromium weights and a lot of shiny machines. It is decorated with red velvet wallpaper! The one without the pool looks like a damp basement but it has 15 Olympic bars and everything else.

People are always saying there is nothing to do in Milwaukee. No action.

Even people in Milwaukee often say that.

But it is a superficial observation and very unfair.

Milwaukee with the **G.P.U.** (Gay People's Union), **Sistermoon Feminist Bookstore and Art Gallery**, the **Farwell Center**, and about the most active gay softball leagues in the country; and bars like the **Beer Garden** and **Shadows** and **M&M** that serve good food as well as drinks, has one of the most comodius, and together gay communities in the country.

But on the surface Milwaukee looks like a town with no action.

It is not a 24-hour town; the buses do not run all night, and not that good

in the day; you can't just flag a cab down, they won't pick you up, you have to call and make an appointment; the bars are only open until 2am (3:30am on Saturdays); the **Parkway Theater** shows gay films only once a month, and no one remembers any live sex going on in the theater; the parks are as well kept as your mother's living room, and probably no live sex goes on there either.

Unlike Chicago, there are no street corners for hustlers only; you hardly ever see anyone downtown late at night; there are not 40,000 crazies walking the streets at all hours looking for something; and there does not seem to be a major fire in the city every four hours. No action.

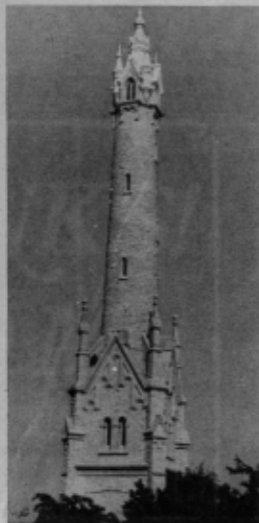

the no-action pattern and are more hidden than closeted in Milwaukee.

The **Milwaukee Club Baths**, one of the cleanest and most comfortable baths—you can actually sleep there—is located at 704-A W. Wisconsin Ave., directly across from the Greyhound Bus Depot. But because "A" means alley, and they have no sign—just their club emblem on what looks like a back door—it's hard to find even when you know where it is.

But that's Milwaukee: You have to



take off the shell to get to the meat.

If you come to town as a stranger, you will have to put some effort into finding places and meeting people.

From the Greyhound Bus Depot and Club Baths it is about a \$2 or \$3 cab ride to one of the two major complexes of gay bars.

One complex is at S. 2nd Street and National Avenue. There is **Shadows**, a bar, a lounge, and super restaurant that makes a good headquarters for newcomers; across the alley is **Your Place**, a real smooth place with disco and a well-trimmed beer garden where lots of young people go. Of course Wisconsin has an 18-year-old drinking law.

Within walking distance of **Your Place** is the **Phoenix** which has two bars, one for talking and one for dancing, one for Frank Sinatra and one for disco; next door is the **C'est La Vie** and life

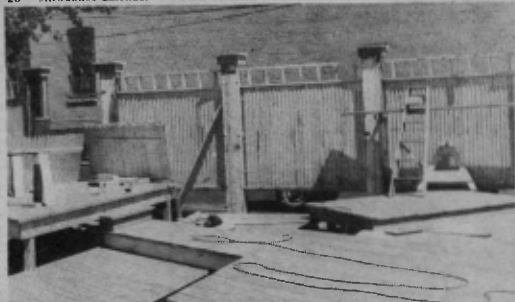

there goes quite trashy and well, a lot of Milwaukee street people hang out there, and you can hear Patti Smith on the juke box. Down the street is the **Ball Game**, a homey bar for the mature and sportsminded. The **Sugar Shack** is a real together lesbian bar in the area that will welcome gay men, but not chauvinists.

The other major complex of bars is another \$2 cab ride away. It includes the **Factory**, the warmest disco in town; the **Wreck Room**, perhaps Mil-

waukee's most famous bar: it is a casual bar for men in Levis and leather; and finally the **M&M** lounge, show bar, snack bar, where many of the professional gays hang out.

Milwaukee is only 90 miles and \$10 away from Chicago.

But in terms of attitude, which they don't show, and togetherness which they do show and have, Milwaukee is perhaps years ahead of Chicago.

Milwaukee is not an action city for people who are "looking for something", it is a city for people who are looking for themselves.

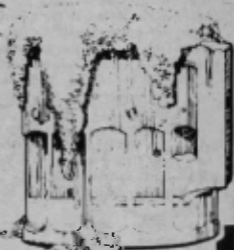
