

FARWELL CENTER'S FUTURE UNCERTAIN DUE TO SALE

The future of the Farwell Center. the gay community center of Milwaukee became uncertain this week as the building was out up for sale.

The Gay People's Union of Milwaukee presently rents the space at the Farwell Center, located at 1568 N. Farwell. The board of directors of GPU was scheduled to meet at press time Tuesday, Nov. 17 to discuss the future of the building, which has a \$75,000 sale price.

Amona the questions to be considered Tuesday night were should an offer be made on the building; and if so, what kind of offer can be made; does the community want a gay community center; and, is there someone in the community willing to make a major contribution to help finance the purchase of the building.

According to Paul Demarco, president of GPU, the organization is looking for all kinds of suggestions. He pointed out that the Farwell Center over the years has grown too small for the numerous gay organizations which are and want to use the facilities. Without the Farwell Center there could be a major loss of some services. including the VD clinic, the hot line and meetings spaces for gay organizations.




