

Bitchin' Pumpkin Torte

Here's an all-time favorite from Jeff of Jackson, Wisconsin. You've GOT to try it this holiday season. It's so good, and so easy. In fact, you can have the whole thing ready before the oven pre-heats! It's good...damn good.

- 1 can (16 oz) pumpkin
- 1 can (12 oz) evaporated milk
- 3 eggs
- 1-1/2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 box (18-1/4 oz) vellow cake mix
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup butter, melted
- Whipped topping

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Using a mixer, combine the first seven ingredients. Pour into a prepared 13x9x2-inch baking dish. Sprinkle they dry cake mix over the pumpkin mixture (dish will be full). Top with pecans. Gently drizzle or spoon butter over top. Bake, uncovered, for 50-55 minutes or until golden brown, and knife inserted in the middle comes out with moist crumbs. Cool. Serve with whipped topping. Refrigerate leftovers.

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

If you just love pumpkin, feel free to use 4 teaspoons of

pumpkin and leave out the cinnamon. You can swap out the pecans with walnuts or use a little bit of both. Feel free to cut back on the butter a bit if you'd like. You can also serve squares of the torte with vanilla ice cream.

Ruthie's Bitchin' Cookies

If you're making cookies this Christmas, this is the recipe for you. They may not be too fancy, but they truly kick ass. Featuring three types of chips and two types of nuts, these crispy cookies can't be beat. Best of all, the no-fuss recipe makes a huge batch which is perfect for hostess gifts, cookie exchanges or simply pigging out in front of the TV.

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup brown sugar, packed
- 2 eggs
- 1 tablespoon almond extract
- 2-1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1-1/2 cups each semisweet chocolate chips, milk chocolate chips and vanilla or white chips
- 1-1/2 cups chopped pecans
- 1-1/2 cups chopped walnuts

Preheat over to 325 degrees. In a large (I'm talking about a big-ass, large) mixing bowl, cream butter and sugars.

Beat in the extract. Combine the flour, baking soda and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture. Stir chips and nuts into dough. Cover and refrigerate 1 hour or until easy to handle. Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart onto greased baking sheets. Bake for 18-20 minutes or until golden brown. Remove to wire racks to cool.

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

If you don't have time to refrigerate the dough, skip that step. Sprtiz your spoon with cooking spray to easily drop the dough onto the cookie sheets. Make sure cookie sheets are completely cool when setting the dough on them. Warm sheets will make the dough spread too much during baking.

Merry and Gay Sticks

Here's simple recipe that doesn't involve an oven or stovetop. Wrap up some of these sweet and savory bites for gift giving during the holidays.

- 2 cups (12 oz) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 tablespoon shortening
- 1 package (10 oz) pretzel rods
- 40 red and/or green hard mint candies, crushed

Place chocolate chips and shortening in a 2-cup microwave-safe measuring cup. Microwave for 1 minute; stir. Do not allow to boil. Microwave for 30 seconds; stir. Continue to microwave at 30-second intervals until chocolate is smooth and melted. Break each pretzel rod in half. Dip the broken end halfway into melted chocolate; roll in crushed candies. Place on a waxed paperlined baking sheet. Refrigerate until set.

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

Jazz things up by drizzling melted white chocolate over the sticks if you'd like. You can also roll the sticks chopped nuts or red and green M&M candies instead of the mints.




ON THE COVER


Employment OpportunityHIV Prevention Research

The Center for AIDS Intervention Research (CAIR) in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin announces openings for two positions in a new National Institutes of Health-funded research project that will develop, implement, and evaluate the effectiveness of community HIV prevention programs for African American men who have sex with men (MSM). The project's objective is to determine if friend-to-friend HIV prevention approaches that work through natural social networks of African American MSM in the community can reduce sexual risk behavior, sexually transmitted diseases, and HIV infection. Both Research Associate positions require extensive experience, knowledge, and understanding of Milwaukee's African American MSM community including settings, ways, and places where African American MSM at high risk for HIV can be reached. For both positions, relevant community experience and involvement with organizations that serve African American MSM are more essential than prior formal research experience. Positions will require frequent field work on evenings, nights, weekends, and during nontraditional hours.

Research Associates will perform activities related to the identification of community settings in Milwaukee for reaching African American MSM and for carrying out community outreach to recruit, interview, and conduct HIV prevention activities with social networks of Black gay or bisexual men. The Research Associates will also be responsible for outreach-based recruitment of friendship groups of African American MSM in community settings, for interviewing participants, and for seeking to engage friends of already recruited men to also enroll in the research. Strong interpersonal communication skills and comfort in community settings where the target population meet are important position requirements. Relevant community experience may substitute for some educational requirements.

Both positions offer competitive salaries and excellent fringe benefits. In addition to a resume or completed job application, we welcome applicants to provide an accompanying letter that describes any additional formal or informal community experience, volunteer work, or involvement with community organizations that serve the targeted population if those experiences are relevant to these positions.





It is my supreme honor to share with all of you a quick pre Thanksgiving chat fest I had with the woman who has "Bopped" her way into our hearts, she has bravely shared her "True Colors". "Time After Time"


Cyndi You do it all! Act, sing, write songs, philanthropy, etc... - and you do it all sooo well - how do you see you? I love new challenges. Maybe that's why I am doing something different all the time. As you can see, I love to mix some old into something new with each performance. You should hear how "Girl" sounds with this tour. I have to say it's really good. Come to a show and you will know what I am talking about.

The last time you played Milwaukee was PrideFest June 2009. You return Tuesday, December 7 and Wednesday, December 8 to play Potawatomi Bingo Casino's Northern Lights Theater. What's your take on our humble Hamlet, Milwaukee?

What's not to love? I had a blast at PrideFest in 2009. Can't wait to be back again to party with you all.

"Memphis Blues" is your current opus; you seem so passionate about this album. What is your favorite selection? That's tough. I love them all. All of the tracks on this album were selected because I've admired them my entire life. I had so many songs in mind. For me the best part of the blues are the songs that tell stories. I look for elements that are uplifting, about perseverance and strength. When Alan Toussaint first hit the keys in 'Shattered Dreams, I knew we had something special in the studio. It was also the moment where I knew this had to be part of the play list.

My personal favorite Cyndi Lauper masterpiece is "At Last"! Your interpretation and cover of such classics as: "Walk On By", "La Vie En Rose", and the title number "At Last" is without compare – any special memories of this 2003 work of art? Wow that is so nice of you. The whole project was so fantastic to do. Working with Russ Titelman who I always wanted to make a record with. Got to record with Sarah McLaughln COME ON and the one and only Tony Bennett...great memories.



What does Cyndi Lauper listen to? Do you have a pet performer, group, and/or genre?

Of course, some of my favorite artists are female blues artists. They were the ones who first got me hooked on the genre -Ma Rainey especially.

I also love the Gossip. Beth Ditto and I started writing a song together a few years back when we were on the True Colors tour together. love the Cliks. Love. love. love Lucas. I would love to write with him one day. We talk

about it a lot but haven't had the chance. Love the Nationals and the Hives. I did collaboration with them a while back. I also would love to work with Jack White.

I personally remember seeing you here in the Brew City at Summerfest, 1997! You opened for Tina Turner. You were five months pregnant, wearing a form-fitting leotard. How is your 13-year-old son, Declan, doing? Is it true you named him after Elvis Costello?

Declyn is a character and a great kid. My husband and I are convinced he is going to follow us into the industry in some way. He is creative and smart and funny and gorgeous... wow I sound like a typical mom but he is a great kid. Elvis Costello's given first name is Declyn and I am a huge fan, but we were just looking for a name for our son that reflected his dad's Scottish roots... so we didn't name him after E.C. but we felt our Declyn was in good company sharing name with one of our favorite artists.

In closing, anything you would like to share with our readers here in America's Dairyland?



Well it's that time of year again Christmas is back upon us with New Year's right around the comer. And with this year's big thing being how to stretch your Christmas dollar I though this month we would talk about what you can do with your piercings after they are healed. Well I hope most of my readers know what to do but I am sure that more than a few of them require flash cards to figure it out. So let's get to it and see what wild and crazy things my sleep deprived brain can come up with.

First and most obvious I hope, would be to change your jewelry. That's right there are many different styles of jewelry from rings to studs, to dangles, to weird stuff made out of bone and stone. All of these things can be placed in healed piercings with no risk of harm to the wearer although there are a few things you should keep an eye out for. The big one being wood body jewelry. Wood is a very porous material and thus can be bad when placed in piercings which are not 100% healed. The skin can actually attach itself to the wood; the wood can actually absorb skin and the smells which go along with having large gauge piercings etc. So when buying wood the number 1 thing is to look at the polish. All wood, and to be very honest all body jewelry, should always have a mirror polish on it. This will ensure that there are no pores of the jewelry open to your body and you won't have any problems down the road.

Secondly one of the easiest, albeit not so painless, ways to change your piercing is to change the thickness of the jewelry. Now after reading that line you probably think it is really painful to stretch a piercing. And to be very honest it is very easy to stretch a piercing, the piercing will feel "tight" and you may feel a slight burning sensation for the first few hours but after that it will subside. Now there are a few things to remember when stretching piercings as a rule you should not stretch more than one size at a time as going larger can, and usually does, cause a piercing to tear and then you have to heal it all over again. The exceptions are the smaller sizes usually you can stretch 2 sizes when working with gauges smaller than 12g. This all depends of course on which body part you are stretching how old they are and a host of other things so for the sake of this let's just stick with one size per stretch. After a piercing is stretched you should wait about 3 weeks before stretching again to allow your body to get used to the new size and to allow the skin at the piercing site to relax enough to the point where it won't rip if you try to stretch it again.

One of the other ways you can mix things up is with charms, novelty beads, and novelty balls. Charms can be added to almost every single piercing very simply. You just take a ball off in the case of a barbell or the bead out in the case of a ring and

There are a few other types of charms with actually replace the bead on a Captive bead ring and they can also provide a nice change in looks. Novelty beads and balls are easy and inexpensive ways to change up jewelry. Beads/balls can be jeweled, glow in the dark, colored, and much more. And they can be placed on fresh, or healing, piercings as well so these are very versatile.

Speaking about all of this I do feel I should bring up the topic of why you would want to change your piercing. Well apart from looks you can gain some increased sensitivity, especially if said piercing is a genital or nipple piercing. By changing the size, Shape, thickness, or weight you can trigger a very large increase in sensitivity and sexual gratification. Hence why I recommend every person with genital piercings should change up their jewelry every 3-6 months to keep the sensitivity up. This will also prevent you some experiencing a so called "drop" in sensitivity at the site of your piercing after about 6 months. In reality you don't lose sensitivity you just get

used to the level you are at. If you change the jewelry, even slightly, your body picks up on this change and your sensitivity will jump right back up.


