Action Wisconsin Report

The adoption of policy position statements, regional response to anti-gay protests and plans for the Annual Meeting kept Action Wisconsin members busy in the last month.

On April 22-23, AW's Board of directors drafted and adopted eight policy position statements to provide focus to the group's mission statement. The positions mandated the organization to monitor and respond to the actions of the Radical Right, to work to advance, support and protect LBGT civil and legal rights, to network with local, state and national LBGT communities and organizations. Other positions support HIV issues, the physical and mental well-being of the LBGT community, women's health issues, the positive media visibility of the LBGT community, and accurate youth education on LBGT issues.

The Board also began work on drafting its 1995-96 budget, reviewed the activities of the nominating committee and laid plans for the Annual Meeting to be held in Milwaukee on June 10 on the Pridefest '95 grounds. AW's first full-term regional and at-large representatives will be elected during the event.

On May 2, AW's Region III held its quarterly meeting in Green Bay. The region is networking with members of state's gay Republican Log Cabin club to respond to the recent anti-gay protest campaign to Mel White's scheduled address on campus by the College Republicans at UWGB. The region's members also passed advisory resolutions recommending the availability of absentee balloting at the Annual Meeting and AW marching as a unit in the Wisconsin Pride Parade June 11. The search continues for candidate to fill the second regional seat on the AW board.

Action Wisconsin's next scheduled board meeting will be June 3 in Madison.

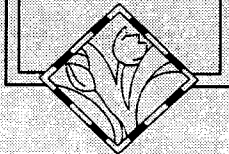

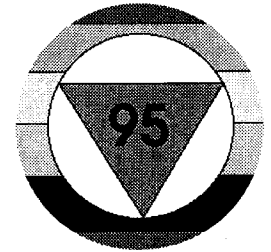

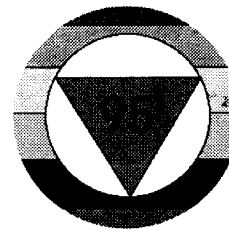

"KEEP HOPE ALIVE"

A Mission and Message of Self-Empowerment

Here's a story having its beginnings in about mid-1985. Mark Konlee, a man going into his forties, had arrived at a critical stage of gripping physical exhaustion and breakdown to health. He was chronically ill with symptomology mimicking that seen in an immune dysfunction characteristic of A.I.D.S. Mark was experiencing a fatigue so comprehensive that he was unable to carry out simple, usual activity of any nature. Mark Konlee was fearful that he had A.I.D.S. Mark, in fact, did not have A.I.D.S. What was so troubling and perplexing was his set of symptoms - low energy, unremitting fatigue, fever sweats, weight loss, G.I. distress, recurrent fungal infections and more. Mark, in 1985, was a very sick and disabled man. Also, no surprise he was in terror! His roster of friends and companions was thinning out. He'd already lost (to A.I.D.S.) and was continuing to sustain loss of important persons in his life. In a final thrust of resolve, Mark packed up and resettled in the country, surrounded by mostly field and foliage. In this setting, embraced by nature's peaceability, Mark set himself the chal-

VUK's II CLOSES

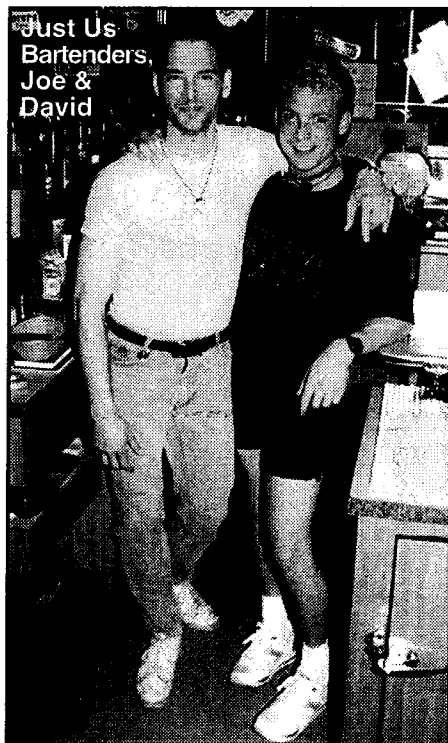

Gay Guide Reaches Crucial Point

PV volunteers will determine success or failure. Active participation by Positive Voice, GLEE-DA and Northern Womyn member volunteers as trained advertising sales representatives will determine the success of the second phase of the development of the *Gay/Lesbian Guide to Northeastern Wisconsin*, according to committee member Lloyd Schaefer.

The committee is completing the research phase of its work and is developing a memoran-

dum of understanding for the three co-sponsoring organizations' boards of directors. Committee members have done outreach research in area gay taverns and conducted interviews with identified community leaders on their personal professional and business networking. "The next phase of the guide's work demands significant volunteer involvement," Schaefer said. "We need people to commit for several day's work now or the guide cannot proceed."

According to Schaefer the committee will train volunteers on how to approach business and professional resources, present the guide's prospectus and negotiate listing and ad placements. All resources will have been contacted by letter prior to meetings with the volunteer sales force. "No one will be going out and calling on people cold," Schaefer said.

lence of self-healing.

Within three years, one man's experiment with holistic healing initiatives blossomed into an international network named "KEEP HOPE ALIVE." Now, what to make of all this!? This book and the efforts of Mark Konlee have been highly praised by some medical doctors around the world. KEEP HOPE ALIVE receives literally hundreds of letters and calls monthly from persons with HIV-Disease or A.I.D.S. expressing gratitude for the holistic protocols recommended by the organization. The book and newsletter are also subscribed to by many other health care workers, including nursing personnel, licensed

nutritionists, chiropractors, homeopaths and others. Many A.I.D.S. organizations, here and abroad, are under subscribership to the materials of KEEP HOPE ALIVE.

"HOW TO REVERSE IMMUNE DYSFUNCTION" and the book's supplement,

"Positive Health News," present a very challenging and debate-stimulating set of views about HIV/A.I.D.S. The overriding message of KEEP HOPE ALIVE is that HIV disease and A.I.D.S. is controllable, easily manageable and curable if the individual sufferer will undertake of his/her initiative the task of self-treatment. This message is reiterated over and over in the literature of KEEP HOPE ALIVE and in the words of Mark Konlee, the lone architect of the organization and of its literature. 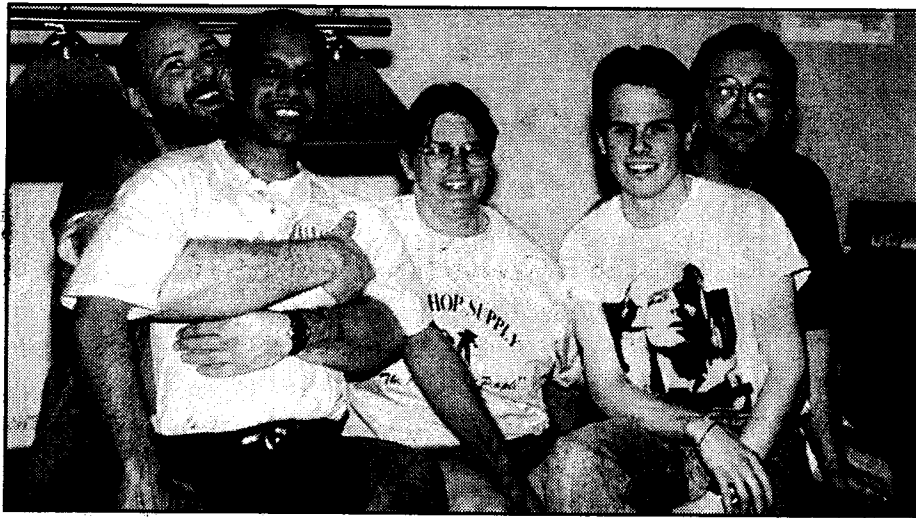

Mel White Calls for Dialogue

500 attend speech at UWGB

Categorizing the current political debate on gay civil rights as "shouting at each other across an ever-widening chasm," gay author, minister and activist Mel White called for serious dialogue between the Religious Right and the gay community in a speech heard by 500 at the University of Wisconsin Green Bay May 4.

In prefatory remarks before his main address White congratulated the College Republicans at UWGB for standing up for their beliefs and getting their message out but cautioned the group that the real work of coming to mutual understanding required "sitting down at the same table to talk things out."

The "get to know us (gay people)" theme echoed throughout White's 40-minute address, which was filled with humor and a vivid account of his personal spiritual journey and his work as ghostwriter for such Religious Right figures as Pat Robertson and Jerry Falwell.

White also chided the mainstream media for ignoring the growing wave of anti-gay violence. White contrasted the coverage of the shooting of the two abortion clinic doctors with lack of

reportage of the hate-motivated murders of 12 Texas gay men in the last year. "Homophobia is the last socially acceptable prejudice," White said.

White cited economic worries, particularly among white males, as a contributing influence in the growth of intolerance and the "urge to purge." White also alluded to the growing militia movement which apparently had ties to the Oklahoma City bombing as being "as anti-gay as they are racist and anti-federal government."

At a reception following his talk, White dialogued at length with members of a Green Bay Lutheran evangelical youth group, which also held a prayer service outside the student union prior to the event - the only demonstration conducted despite expectations of more widespread protests based on the heightened level of controversy in the three weeks which preceded the speech.

Introductory remarks by 10% Society president Kurt Anderson referenced the series of flyers circulated both on and off campus during April condemning White's talk and homosexuality in general, some of which were authorized and paid for by the junior GOP. "Several students and student groups have turned what was to be a focus on gay and lesbian issues into one of religion and money," Anderson said.

Anderson went on to provide a detailed breakdown of funding for the event, which was co-sponsored by the campus groups 10% Society, Office of Student Life, Good Times Programming Board, Residence Hall and Apartment Association, Student Senate,
