Exchange phone numbers. Go out to a movie or dinner. Hang out at each others' homes. I want to become a friend and a boyfriend to another man as well as sexual partners.

As the weekend approaches, I take the those first few steps towards the life I want one more time. Maybe on the outside you won't be able to see any change. But when I start acting the way I would want another man to treat me, I feel better about who I am when I look in the mirror. I think that's important. What I'm trying to say is I think there's something else out there that I would be happier with, and it's time to start looking for it again.




Accepting the above means that I am normal when I say not only do I turn on to other men, I turn on to kinky sexual fantasies and fetishes.

And so do others every day, average solid pillars of our and non Gay communities. Animals don't.



PAST OUT

When did Rock Hudson's homosexuality become public knowledge?

Rock Hudson is an excellent example of the complex nature of the closet and public awareness of a prominent figure's homosexuality. Hudson was rumored to be gay from the earliest years of his career, yet some people denied he was gay even after he died of AIDS in 1985. As Hudson was both an active lover of men and the movie star who throughout the 1950s and 1960s seemed to personify manliness, his case is almost a textbook study of American anxieties over masculinity, sexuality, and

Born Roy Scherer Fitzgerald in 1925, Hudson made his first major splash as an actor in the 1954 film Magnificent Obsession, in which he played an unruly playboy who becomes a surgeon. As a 29-year old bachelor, though, Hudson raised evebrows throughout 1950s America, and articles with headlines such as "Too Busy for Love" appeared in the popular press. The scandalhappy Confidential wanted to do an expose on Hudson's homosexuality and even offered his lover \$10,000 to discuss the subject, but no story appeared. Some say that Universal Studios offered Confidential some dirt on another one of its stars in order to keep Hudson's sexuality out of the publication.

To quash the rumors, Hudson quickly married Phyllis Gates (who Hudson later claimed was bisexual, although she denied that). The three-year marriage temporarily boosted Hudson's neterosexual image. But in the following decades, as Hudson established himself as a leading man in feature films and on TV's "McMillan and Wife," rumors about Hudson continued to spread, although it was never discussed explicitly in print. In

1971, someone sent fake invitations to the wedding of Hudson and Jim Nabors (TV's Gomer Pyle) to several gossip columnists. Although the pair had been good friends, they were not lovers and certainly never married — but the hoax still seems to have hurt Nabors' career. In Hudson's case, none of the rumors seemed to slow his fame as a masculine idol — or his pursuit of handsome men.

In the 1970s, Hudson became friends with Armistead Maupin, whose serial novel Tales of the City about gay and straight San Franciscans appeared in the San Francisco Chronicle. Maupin (among others) urged Hudson to come out and break down stereotypes about gays and lesbians. Hudson consistently demurred, considering his sexuality to be private and objecting to the public spectacle of the gay liberationists with their parades (which he once described as marching with a jar of Vaseline). Nonetheless, Hudson threw parties for dozens of handsome men and joined Maupin in exploring the sexual playground of 1970s San Francisco.

Maupin later satirized Hudson by including him as a character in Tales of the City, albeit identified only as In one extended plot line, Maupin's gay character Michael Tolliver visits _____'s Los Angeles home, where he sleeps with ______ The movie star questions Michael's participation in the Gay Men's Chorus, contemplating why people make such a big deal out of being gay. Michael tells his host that gay organizations make it easier for gay people to be proud of their heritage ___ a heritage Michael informs ____ he's a part of.

Hudson was diagnosed with AIDS in mid-1984, although his disease remained a secret for more

than a year. When he appeared increasingly gaunt in his role on Dynasty and other public appearances, his publicists insisted that he was simply dieting. He looked particularly ill in his last public appearance, which ironically was a commercial promoting was a commercial promoting his old friend Doris Day's new show on the Christian Broadcasting Network.

In July 1985, news of

Hudson's disease hit the newspapers, garnering far more public attention about the disease than any previous AIDS-related story. Several newspapers and TV stations initially treated the story as proof that AIDS affected more than just gays, and drug users. Amazingly, some gay-run AIDS organizations cooperated with this farce. A representative of one such organization even told the press that Hudson's illness proves that "AIDS is not a gay white male disease."

Soon, however, the Chronicle and several other newspapers ran lengthy stories about Hudson's decades-long struggle with vastly different public and private lives. The media coverage of Hudson's illness was often ridiculous — several news outlets raised the question of whether Linda Evans might now be infected since she had kissed Hudson (her co-star on Dynasty) on TV. Tasteless jokes abounded (Why is everyone in Hollywood terrified of AIDS? Because they've all had a piece of the Rock), but the widespread attention brought public awareness of the ongoing AIDS crisis to a new level. Calls to AIDS hotlines soared, and private-sector fund-raising for AIDS research skyrocketed, boosted by a \$250,000 contribution from Hudson himself to iump-start the American Foundation for AIDS Research.


