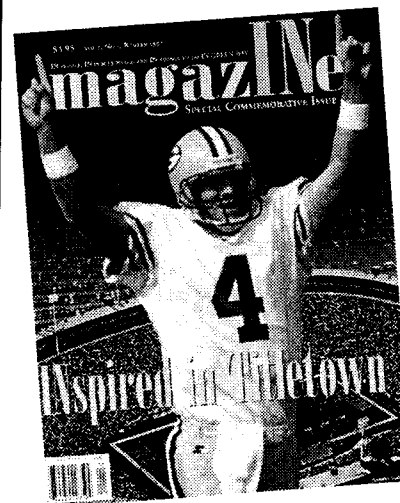

you currently a titleholder of?

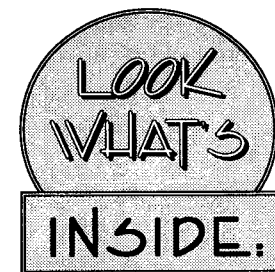
KJK: For this year's State Pageant, Miss Gay

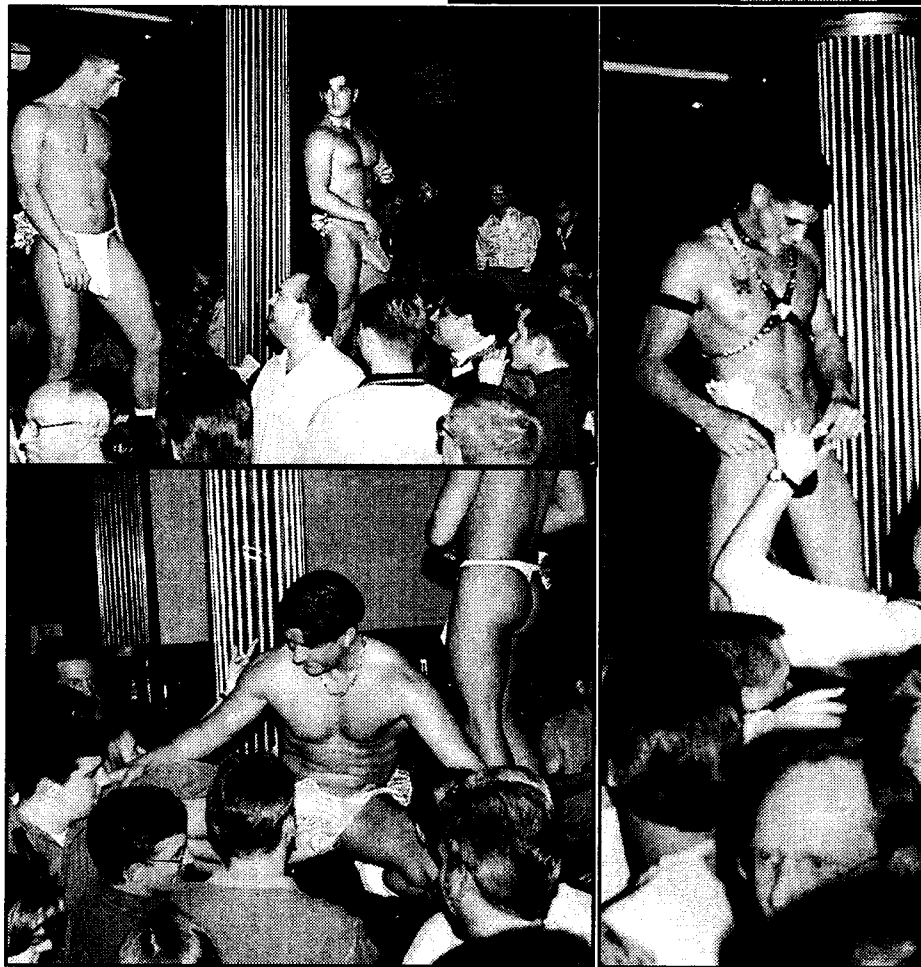

PAST/OUT

March 12, 1987 (10 years ago this week):
ACT UP is founded at a meeting in New York City.

How was ACT UP founded?

Ten years ago this month, the AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power was born, combining anger at the continuing epidemic with media savvy, artistic creativity, and street smarts to re-shape the way AIDS is viewed in the United States and around the world.

ACT UP by no means invented direct-action techniques for bringing about changes in the government and social responses to the AIDS epidemic. San Francisco activists held AIDS-related demonstrations as early as 1984, and in the months prior to ACT UP's founding, a group of Manhattan-based gay activists called the Lavender Hill Mob staged a series of protests. But ACT UP was different, both for its ability to draw large numbers of activists, and for its high media profile.

The idea for a new, widespread campaign to expand access to experimental AIDS drugs was generated by a remarkable evening at New York City's Lesbian and Gay Community Center on Tuesday, March 10, 1987. The scheduled speaker in the center's monthly writer's night, Nora Ephron, canceled at the last minute, to be replaced by author, playwright, and Gay Men's Health Crisis founder Larry Kramer. Kramer, who was the first person ever to call for funds to combat AIDS, had grown estranged from GMHC. But he remained committed to the idea that the gay and lesbian community needed to fight back against those he held most responsible for the spread of the disease - the government, the medical establishment, the media, and complacent gay leaders.

Kramer was expected to read from his works, and the audience was expected to listen politely and ask questions. That's not what happened. Instead, Kramer asked that the lights be turned up and he reminded those assembled that at least 32,000 people had died of AIDS. He invited two-thirds of the room to stand, and told them, "At the rate we are going, you could be dead in five years." He went on to attack the slow rate of release of new AIDS drugs, and implicated politicians like Mario Cuomo, publications like The New York Times, and organizations like GMHC in not pushing for more drugs to fight AIDS. Then he asked, "Do we want to start a new organization devoted solely to political action?"

During the question-and-answer period (which turned into a group discussion), the answer clearly became "Yes." Those assembled spread the word about Kramer's talk and two nights later 300 people met and created ACT UP. The organization's mission was later expanded to other issues, but in

1987 it devoted itself to pushing for the early release of any experimental drug that could combat AIDS.

ACT UP's strategy of in-your-face activism had its public debut on March 24, 1987, when more than 200 activists descended on Wall Street to protest the high prices for AIDS drugs being charged by Burroughs Wellcome, the pharmaceutical company which the Food and Drug Administration approved to market AZT. ACT UP brought traffic to halt, burned the FDA Commissioner in effigy, and had 17 of its members arrested in acts of civil disobedience.

The Wall Street action garnered considerable media attention, as did a protest at New York City's main post office on April 15. The post office was jam packed with New Yorkers filing last-minute tax returns and television cameras reporting on the rush to beat the deadline. The activists used the occasion to protest how few tax dollars were going to fight the epidemic. This protest also marked the first time ACT UP used placards with the slogan Silence = Death, usually printed next to a pink triangle. Throughout its history, ACT UP used these placards and other artwork to portray their ideas and feelings about the politics of AIDS.

A flood of other demonstrations followed this first month of initial organizing, as ACT UP chapters sprouted up around the country and attendance at meetings of the New York chapter reached 600 or more. The national headquarters of the FDA in Maryland were nearly shut down in October of 1988, and in September of 1989, half a dozen ACT UP members sneaked into the New York Stock Exchange, stopping trading for five minutes. Perhaps ACT UP's most controversial demonstration was known as "Stop the Church," when in December 1989 thousands of protesters picketed St. Patrick's Cathedral, and the media captured images of activists throwing condoms at priests and reported on one who deliberately dropped a communion wafer on the floor.

Although ACT UP has declined from its peak of more than 100 chapters worldwide, its members still push for more government action to fight AIDS. Its members have gained a reputation for in-depth knowledge of both the science and the politics of AIDS drugs, and it is no longer unusual for ACT UP members to be involved in high-level policy discussions. Not that the street demonstrations have disappeared - another Wall Street protest is currently scheduled for March 24.

KJK: I entered on a dare...Three of us were going to enter, [the other two didn't] and I just happened to win! I was scared shitless.

JL: What did it mean to you to be a titleholder?

KJK: A lot of people ask me this. In high school I was very shy, and being a titleholder, doing what I do, I got to meet a lot of people. I got to open up to a lot more people, and to be a lot more personal...I wasn't so shy any more; I wasn't afraid.

It was because it was like... (searches for the right word) an act. I used to do musicals in school, and it was [about] a character. Kelli Jo is a character. Basically, you get to portray this person—you get into her character. It's totally different.

I'm just so talkative now with people! I can just go up to people and just say "hi" or whatever, and just talk away. I never used to do that...that's one of the best things out of it.

JL: Any funny little stories from the past three years?

KJK: Oh, there's a lot of little stories...usually they're with DuWanna—she get's me in trouble, but she's my mentor. She's the first drag queen [I've ever seen] and she's taught me a lot...basically, I have a lot to thank her for. She got me into this, told me what you need to do, and... "if you ready to do it, do it, and if you're not..." this is what's going to happen. When I'm...with her, I learn something new everyday. Everyday.

JL: I run into her a lot.

KJK: She's Miss Titleholder Everything! (laughs) Everyone calls me the White DuWanna and her the Black Kelli Jo!

JL: What's your future plans onstage?

KJK: I'm going to state this year in September, hopefully to win—I'm not going to play. I have everything set and planned. I have a dress being made, costumes being made for talent and I'm going full force. It's my dream...Within [the] next five years I hope to have won that and Great Lakes. I did Green Bay and Emerald City back to back...

JL: Anything you'd like to share with people reading this article?

KJK: Thanks for all of your support and help, very much so. People have come up to me, people that I've never talk to, or thought that even knew me—it could be just one little thing they say, and it inspires me even more. This is basically for them.

Kelli Jo also wanted to extend heartfelt thanks to Todd, Greg and DuWanna for their support and guidance. I personally would like to thank Kelli Jo for doing this interview on her break during work. It was above and beyond the call of duty. Yet, that seems to be what makes a titleholder like the one and only Kelli Jo Klein so in demand!
