June 7, 1977 (20 years ago this week): Dade County, Florida, repeals its gay-rights ordinance, setting off a string of other such repeals around the country.

What were the civil rights setbacks of the late 1970s?

The decade after Stonewall was a heady time for the American gay and lesbian civil rights movement. Gays and lesbians were more visible than at any previous time in American history, and laws that penalized private same-sex behavior were repealed in many jurisdictions. In addition, more than 40 municipalities passed laws protecting citizens from discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation. Although conservative forces opposed these changes from the start. the battle was not truly joined until 1977 and 1978, when a series of cities across the country voted on whether or not to keep such gay-rights laws on the books. The strategies used by both sides in these referendum campaigns helped set the boundaries and the tone for hundreds of future skirmishes over laws protecting gays and lesbians from discrimination.

The site of the first such popular vote on gay and lesbian rights was Dade County, Florida, whose nondiscrimination ordinance drew the ire of orange juice spokesperson and former Miss America runner-up Anita Bryant. In January 1977, Bryant testified before the Dade County commission that a proposed gay-rights ordinance threatened "the rights of the overwhelming number of Dade County constituents." When her emotional testimony failed to sway the commission, she formed an organization, "Save Our Children," to begin collecting the 10,000 signatures necessary to force a referendum on the June ballot.

At first, many gays and lesbians did not take Bryant's campaign seriously. But when the 37-yearold singer's organization collected more than 6 times the number of signatures necessary, gays and lesbians in South Florida and around the nation began organizing for the June election. Led by Jack Campbell. who owned a nationwide chain of gay bathhouses, the Miami gay and lesbian community raised \$350,000 in contributions from around the country. Hundreds of gay bars stopped serving orange juice, and dozens of volunteers flew to Miami to canvass neighborhoods and work the polls. An elaborate media strategy was developed, emphasizing broad themes of human rights and freedom.

But in the end, Bryant's message was more convincing: gays and lesbians were a threat to America's children, and any law that prevented employers from firing homosexuals increased the opportunities for a new generation of children to be recruited into the gay lifestyle. The expected opposition of traditionally liberal constituencies such as blacks, Jews, and workingclass voters did not materialize, and the ordinance was repealed on June 7 by 202,319 to 83,319. Gays and lesbians in South Florida were devastated.

But the war had just begun. Bryant, thrust into the limelight by the Dade County battle, began a nationwide tour of cities which had passed gay-rights legislation. Organizations similar to "Save Our B I A N C O Children" formed in many municipalities

to fight the gains of the gay and lesbian movement. The spring of 1978 was a particularly difficult time

for gay and lesbian rights. In April, St. Paul. Minnesota, the capital of a traditionally liberal state, repealed its gay rights law by a nearly two-thirds popular vote. The next month, Wichita repealed its gayrights protections by almost five-to-one. Within weeks, gay rights were also repealed overwhelmingly in another liberal haven: Eugene, Oregon.

In each city, national forces on both sides sent money and personnel, but the defeat of gay-rights was ultimately based on a simple message to local voters: gay rights are bad for your children. For example, the anti-gay forces in Eugene included the following line in their literature: "Other areas adopting prohomosexual legislation have observed an increase in V.D., public indecency, and boy prostitution. Vote YES to protect your family, job, and community."

The momentum against gay-rights laws finally hit a firewall in the fall of 1978 when two anti-gay measures were defeated on the West Coast: California's Briggs Initiative, and Seattle's Initiative 13. The Briggs Initiative outlawed gay and even pro-gay teachers from teaching in public

schools, and Initiative 13 threatened to repeal Seattle's non-discrimination law. Each measure lost because of specific, local reasons, but the overall effect was to stall the movement against local gay-rights laws. In California, while early polls showed the Briggs Initiative with a comfortable lead, a concerted campaign by gays and straights throughout the state combined with a late endorsement of the "no" position by California's most prominent conservative, Ronald Reagan. In the case of Seattle, a strong emphasis on the value of the "right to privacy" for gays and straights alike

worked in concert with the negative publicity for the initiative's backers when one of the police officers who initiated the measure killed a black youth while on

The widespread publicity over these anti-gay initiatives caused the issue of non-discrimination to be the first public battle over homosexuality in the post-Stonewall era - which perhaps explains why "gay rights" and "non-discrimination laws" have become virtually synonymous in America's lexicon. Even though the two decades since Bryant's first battle have been wrought with controversy over AIDS funding, the military, marriage, and adoption, the assumption that gay equality means simply adding or keeping "sexual orientation" as a protected category along with "race," "sex," and "religion" has been quite resilient.






