letter from the editor

In a few more issues, Quest will be starting our 5th year. We have been growing slowly making a few changes here and there but at all times trying to stay the easy to read resourse for entertainment in the gay community. At the same time we try to be a voice for some of the areas of our state that are not covered as well by In Step or Wisconsin Light. This is especially true of the Fox Valley/Green Bay area. Our office and printing facility is based here and it is easier for us to cover events here.

Quest combined with In Step & Wisconsin Light gives Wisconsin three distinct news and entertainment resources each with it's own flavor. This is unusual for a gay population as small as Wisconsin's. It's probably been able to happen because the Wisconsin Light, In Step and Quest were products of love. Being able to turn a profit from them was secondary.

Quest has yet to show a profit. In fact none of our local writers, photographers, typesetters and other helpers get paid. Past Out, our only syndicated column is paid for and so are the people who do the actual printing of the paper.

Ouest is the only Wisconsin based gay paper that has it's own printing facility. This affords us the opportunity to use higher quality white paper rather than newprint and be able to be in book form at a price no commercial printer could give us and still stay in business. We are proud to be totally gay owned and operated including the printing part of our operation.

We have recently added our own collator and stitcher (the part

that staples and folds Quest into a book) an investent worth over \$9000.00. This means Ouest can now be produced from start to finish in-house. It also proves our strong committment to our readers and the advertisers who make Quest possible.

We will be doing two issues that spar three

weeks each over the Christmas holidays and through January. This gives us a little time to relax and prepare for the next year's Quest. We will be making a few changes starting in year five to make room for even more articles and such without having to expand beyond our self-imposed forty page limit. As always we welcome your comments and suggestions and we look forward to serving you in the coming year.

Leather Fetish Continues...

Fall 1996, there was a fundraising drive by the B.T.B. Corp. for a G/L Community Center (G/LCC) about the time a proposed Lesbian B: Gay Transgender Community Center (LBGTCC) was getting our attention. Many of us thought there was a connection. I for one believed they were the same. They were r.ot.

The following is a summary of my inquires, calls and a meeting. All is documented and all parties involved are well aware of what is been written.

Having received no explanation, I wrote to the "powers that be" listed in the letters and brochures, asking if they would pull together the seeming loose ends in said letters and brochures.

Those powers appeared to be The Wisconsin Leathermens Association (WLA), The Beer Town Badgers (BTBI) and The B.T.B. Corporation (BTE2) with a Board of Trustees and a fundraising committee. Also a board of Directors and advisors associated with one or more of the

The WLA, BTB1 & BTB2 are corporate entities set up by Mr. Smits. All seem to be connected in one form or other with The G/L Community Center Trust Fund, aka The Community Center Trust Fund, aka The G/L Community Center Trust and/or The Community Center Endowment Fund. The above four names appear in literature received, but appear to be same fund, hereinafter referred to as

None was registered as a Trust when last I checked and whether one or four, also seem to be the effort(s) of Mr. Smits.

We learn the WLA, which is listed in one leather directory as a fund raising club, seems to have something to do with, perhaps even have some control of, the CCTF. WLA holds beer busts and after hours parties to raise money for its

The question is "is this money for CCTF or anther cause?". Some of the literature indicates least some of the money raised goes to CCTF as well as supports the "clubhouse".

How it does, I haven't been told, BUT all of the above mentioned corporations, fund(s) e.c. work together, all seem to be the effort of one individual and except for one mention of "assisting PWAs", all of the literature seems to indicate the primary function will be a "community center" - - of some sort yet to be determined.

We learned money raised by WLA goes other causes also. In a communication dated April, 1997, WLA. Inc., announced "This year we will not be sending out yearly financial report. This is because last year out report fell into the wrong hands." - - and - - "Last year the organization was able to give support to PrideFest 96, BESTD Clinic, the Community Center Trust, AIDs, and help maintain the Club House, which several clubs use for their meetings and events throughout out the year."

In the latest letter dated Nov., '97, we learn first that, except for the Community Center Endowment Fund, none of the above corporations and/or funds are mentioned, I quote

- 1. "I am again working with the Community Center Trust Fund in the second annual Fund Raising Drive for the Endowment Fund"
- 2. "gave one grant to a Milwaykee organization that fulfilled the qualifications of its charter"
 - 3. "we are pleased to announce the awarding of

\$300,00 from the (LBGTCC) Building fund. It is our hope that this gesture of good faith will demonstrate our resolve to work within the mainstream of the LGBT community. This should also end any confusion regarding the use of the money: received by our organization. " End quote:

To me, this raise more questions than answered. What happened to the other corporations? What confusion? What are the qualifications of its charter? Is the organization in item 2 the same as LBGTCC, if not who met the qual-



November 18, 1997 (20 years ago this week): The National Women's Conference meets in Houston and embraces lesbian rights.

What was the National Women's Conference?

From November 18 to 21, 1977, twenty thousand women, men, and children gathered to herald International Women's Year at the National Women's Conference in Houston. The event's keynote speaker, anthropologist Margaret Mead, called it "not only a historic occasion in the women's movement, but in the history of the world." The conference also proved to be a significant moment in lesbian-feminist herstory, since it marked a 180-degree turn in the way that the straight feminist mainstream of the women's movement dealt with the issue of lesbian rights.

The conference was the brain child of Bella Abzug, intrepid congresswoman from New York City. Abzug engineered a bill setting aside five million dollars in federal funds to finance International Women's Year. From 1976 to 1977, individual states held women's conferences to elect delegates for a national conference in Houston. The purpose of the Houston conference was to adopt a set of feminist resolutions and recommendations for President Jimmy Carter, urging him to pay attention to women's issues.

It would have been easy for the straight feminist majority at the conference to skirt lesbian issues altogether - they'd been doing it for almost ten years. In the late 1960s, when groups such as the National Organization for Women (NOW) were first firing up, a common "charge" leveled against feminists was that they were man-hating lesbians. There were, in fact, many lesbian activists who helped build the second wave of feminism and found groups like NOW. But homophobic straight feminists shuddered at the idea of being called lesbians and were quick to deny the accusation. Betty Friedan, the author of The Feminine Mystique, dismissed such talk as a "lavender herring." Friedan's phrase was appropriated by radical lesbians in the early 1970s. who changed it to "lavender menace" and used it as a rallying cry on tee-shirts and outtons.

Straight feminists, pre-Houston, also tried to impose a gag order on the lesbians in their ranks. If lesbians openly discussed the need for lesbian rights, the straight majority reasoned, it might "discredit" the entire women's movement. Better for everyone to concentrate on more universal issues like the Equal Rights Amendment. In other words, lesbians could dedicate their time to the feminist agenda, but they shouldn't try to set it.

All this in-fighting took its toll on the women's movement, sending many lesbians running in the

other direction - often working at first for gay rights groups and later (when faced gay male sexism) establishing their own network of lesbian liberation organizations. By 1977, the deadline for states to ratify the ERA was rapidly

approaching, and the women's movement desperately needed the boost of a National Women's Conference in order to continue the fight.

The Houston conference turned out to be one of the high points of the contemporary women's movement. The official delegation of 1,442 was a model of diversity, with lesbians and straight women, white women and minority women, all represented roughly in proportion to their numbers in the general population. The delegates ranged in age from 16 to 84, with students, homemakers, prostitutes, nurses, politicians, and scientists all represented. A quarter were poor women, many on welfare. Many men and children also attended in support of the women in

In all, the delegates passed 25 resolutions, with a statement on "sexual preference" one of the most hotly debated. To the surprise of many of the lesbians in attendance, Betty Friedan did an about-face. publicly advocating for lesbian rights and warning delegates that "because . . . there is nothing in the ERA that will give any protection to homosexuals, we must pass this resolution." Though the resolution used the word "preference" instead of "orientation," its no-nonsense call for full civil rights for lesbians (and, by virtue of its gender-free language, gay men, too) was way ahead of its time. It outlined for the president a strategic plan of national and local legislation to ban discrimination based on "sexual or affectional preference" in employment, housing, the military, and other areas; the repeal of all sodomy laws; and protections for lesbian mothers in cases of child custody and visitation.

But Carter failed to take the conference or any of its resolutions seriously. The Christian Right, however, did take action, holding a "pro-family" rally in Houston on November 19. In a newspaper ad for the rally, an innocent little girl asked, "Mornmy, when I grow up, can I be a lesbian?" - clearly a shocking idea to the crowd of 15,000 who gathered to protest the conference. Speakers included Phyllis Schlafly, Bob Dornan, and, on film, Anita Bryant, Jesse Helms sent a supportive telegram. A leaflet passed among the rally-goers declared, "The ERA will legalize homosexual 'marriages' and permit such 'couples' to adopt children." Though a few of the players have changed in the last twenty years, the rhetoric of those who oppose the lesbian and gay movement has been quite consistent.



Lew Rawles will like a bunch of leather men to exchange pamphlets with the radical religious rights at the entrance to PrideFest 98. - -Pamphlets, trash barrels and rubber gloves will be provided. I'll get more info about this as the time gets closer. Some of you talented persons out there should be able to come up with appropriate placards to carry

Last issue, I said I would be talking about the Argonauts Charities. There were a couple of points that need final word on so I am going to hold off for a while.

Not to fear, there is always something I can go on about. As mentioned above, just this past week many of you received another appeal to give to the "Community Center Trust Fund, in the second annual Fund Raising Drive for the Endowment Fund". Before I saw the above mentioned letter, I had 3 conversations asking if I had learned about the fundraising efforts of this and other funds, trust funds, endowment funds etc. which are coming from the direction of The Boot Camp and I thought it best to close the subject with what I do know and charge you with any follow-up. -- First a bit of history.

Early 1996, we became aware of the B.T.B. Corporation, a fund raising arm of the Beer Town Badgers Inc., soliciting funds for a G/L Community Trust Fund. What surprised many of us is that Mr. Si Smits was the solicitor. To our knowledge, he was not associated with the Beer Town Badgers (BTB1), having bowed out prior to some issue involving the Club and its treasury,

> which ended up in court. The brochures and accompanying letter offered nebulous explanations and goals. This is not unusual for a fledging idea trying to get off the ground and because of this, some who claimed to know, talked it up. Some thought it was for the Leather community, by the Leather community; a leather archive/museum, a library and still others felt there would be a leather community center.

Financial assistance for PWAs was mentioned. The list went on.

Overall, an exciting idea, ready to support, but which seemed without direction.

April 4, 1996, in this column, after I dashed off a note to Si asking for more info, I wrote "Give it a chance to unfold. I am sure Si will fill in the community," here was no reply.
