



Was Susan B. Anthony Queer as a One-Dollar Coin?

March 13, 1906 (92 years ago this month): Feminist reformer Susan B. Anthony dies in Rochester, NY

Was Susan B. Anthony a lesbian?

Susan B. Anthony, the most famous American feminist, never married, dedicated her life to women's causes, surrounded herself with female friends, and had an intense romantic friendship with Anna Dickinson, one of her colleagues. Ninety-two years ago, Anthony died holding the hand of Anna Howard Shaw, another unmarried feminist, who lived for many years with Anthony's niece. Whether Anthony was a sexless career woman or as queer as a one-dollar coin is a question that has confounded lesbian and gay historians.

Mainstream historians have amply chronicled the facts of Anthony's life. She was born in western Massachusetts in 1820 and moved as a young child with her family to upstate New York. Her Quaker parents instilled in her their beliefs in peace, social justice, and equality for all. Like many Quakers, Anthony's father and brothers were active in the anti-slavery movement. Her father owned a series of cotton mills and always refused to purchase cotton from slave plantations.

Anthony's parents also believed in education for their daughters, at a time when few girls learned to read or write. Anthony attended a Quaker academy in Philadelphia but had to leave when the Panic of 1837 bankrupted her father. She came home and at age 17 became a teacher to help support the family.

She began her activist career in the 1840s, when she started volunteering her time for the Daughters of Temperance, trying to bring public attention to the effects of male drunkenness on women and children. Though she was interested in feminism, Anthony did not attend the famous women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, New York, in 1848. It wasn't until a few years later, when she read a newspaper account of a fiery speech by suffragist Lucy Stone, that Anthony began to make the transition from temperance work to women's rights. Without the vote, she realized, women would never be able to influence public policy on other important issues, such as temperance and abolition.

For the next 50 years, Anthony worked tirelessly for the women's rights movement, crisscrossing the country on speaking engagements and appearing before Congress every year from 1869 to 1906 to lobby for a woman suffrage amendment. In addition to public speaking, she wrote extensively on women's rights and published a feminist newspaper called The Revolution with Elizabeth Cady Stanton. She and Stanton also co-authored a multi-volume work, History of Woman Suffrage, which they self-published in installments from 1881 to 1902.

Perhaps Anthony's finest hour came in 1872, in a protest that queer activists a century later might call a "zap." Attempting to test

the Fourteenth Amendment, which gave suffrage to black men but not to women. Anthony, three of her sisters, and several supporters marched to the polls in Rochester, New York, and demanded ballots. They were successful (Anthony cast her vote for a straight Republican ticket), but two weeks later, Anthony was arrested and forced to stand trial. The court found her guilty and imposed a \$100 fine - a huge sum in those days, when a woman's annual teaching salary was not much higher than that.

Anthony died 14 years before women achieved the vote. Ridiculed in her own time, she is today recognized as an important historical figure. A statue of her and other feminist pioneers was recently moved from the basement to the rotunda in U.S. Capitol, and she is the only woman to have her image on a U.S. coin (at least for now - the U.S. Treasury recently announced plans for a new, redesigned dollar coin). But while mainstream historians have extolled her political contributions, they have generally ignored her personal life, assuming that she had none because she never married. Queer historians, however, have uncovered the romantic friendships of Anthony and other feminists and speculated on these women as proto-lesbians.

Gay historian Jonathan Ned Katz studied Anthony's unpublished letters to Anna Dickinson, a feminist orator. "My dear Chicky Dicky Darling," Anthony wrote to Dickinson in 1868. "Now when are you coming to New York. . . . I have plain quarters — at 44 Bond Street - double bed - and big enough to take you in. . . ." In another letter, Anthony encouraged Dickinson "not to marry a man" and spoke of wanting to hold her in her arms again. Were Anthony's intimate words merely the way women addressed each other at the time, or are they clues to her sexuality? Some queer historians warn against reading letters like these with twentieth-century eyes, while others maintain that any woman who makes a life with other women was a lesbian. There are lively arguments on both sides.

We'll never know what Susan and "Dicky" did in their big double bed. What is clear is that Anthony's ties with her many female friends and companions were central to her emotional life - much as they would be for a lesbian today. She was an independent woman who eschewed marriage and children, sought out and treasured the company of women, and devoted herself to pursuing a feminist social revolution. And that's about as "queer" as a nineteenth-century woman could get.



ON OUR COVER! The BESTD Story!

The BESTD Story is a long history of volunteers providing health care services to greater Milwaukee. In the early 70s, a group of concerned and caring people responded to the rising incidence of sexually transmitted diseases in Milwaukee and the lack of sensitive, accessible resources. Their discussions and encouragement from the Milwaukee Health Department and the Wisconsin Division of Health resulted in the founding of the BESTD Clinic in October, 1974.



Locally initially in rented quarters on east St. Paul in what is now the Third Ward Cafe and then on Farwell Avenue, the Brady East STD Clinic, Inc., moved to its present facility in 1982. The first floor rented space was modestly adapted several times and while inadequate, was fully used by willing volunteers and an increasing number of clients. In 1990, Dr. Roger Gremminger, a physician volunteer, board member and building owner, gifted his property equity to BESTD. In the years since, the assumed mortgage was paid and a systematic process of building restoration and renovation was undertaken as funds became available in the Clinic's modest budget.

Quest recently sent a staffer to see for himself.

Erv Uecker, obviously a key man, gave us a nickel tour. We discovered private counseling rooms, examination areas, a waiting room, reception area, etc., all sparkling clean and 'showing efficiency'. A group of ten or twelve men was meeting upstairs, all HIV positive fellas sharing concerns.

Over dinner at Mimma's, a great Italian restaurant across the street, (thanks, guys, for your hospitality) Erv and his partner of 40 years, Ross Walker, we learned BESTD Clinic is an **all volunteer** organization which serves 10,000 needs a year...that's 200 people a week who come to BESTD for help....and get it! Together, Erv and Ross give 100 hours per week to BESTD (they are angels)!

"We do not solicit for volunteers, they simply call and offer to help. There's a special aura about BESTD," say Erv and Ross. Doctors, nurses, lab techs, pharmacists, counselors, reception folks, housekeeping and maintenance personnel, office help -- no paychecks or perks. "The satisfaction and joy of joining with others to provide quality and professional services to all who comewithout question, judgement, hesitation or charge - is simply great!"

"We are grateful to Milwaukee for providing the roots of our birth and for the nurturing and responding people who, without hesitation, offered their help in founding this unique and nationally almost one-of-a-kind health care Agency. The Volunteers, who *are* BESTD Clinic, pledge their continuing professional, sensitive and caring service to ALL who come to us for help and it is done willingly and without charge."

In the past we noted little stores opened in Eau Clair and other places, but alas, many are short lived due to lack of support from the community.


Recently there has been a spurt of new little businesses in several of Wisconsin's smaller communities. Memories By Mickeal is the latest.
