





Tea Leaf Readings

Tea leaf reading, properly called tasseography, belongs to the vast range of divination methods involving images and symbols. In a tea leaf reading the reader interprets a sign in the bits and pieces and then will relate to you what was seen. The techniques for creating a reading of tea leaves is very simple. Interpretations, however, may take some practice, for it requires the reader of diviner first to recognize the images, second to interpret the meaning of each one, and third, to combine the different symbols into a coherent message. All of these steps require both imagination and intuition. Imagination allows the reader to see the possibilities, while intuition points the way to a true interpretation.

You can use coffee grounds as well as tea leaves. In both cases, choose a white cup with no inside pattern or decoration. The subject of the reading should drink the tea or coffee, leaving a small amount of liquid. Holding the cup in the left hand, he or she should swirl the liquid three times clockwise, trying to make sure that the leaves (or grounds) are carried up to the rim of the cup without spilling over. The subject then inverts the cup into a saucer, holding it for a count of seven to allow the liquid to drain away. When the cup is turned right side up again the reader then examines and interprets the images which have been created. The handle of the cup should point towards the reader.

Many leaves imply a full life just as many specific images suggest several issues important to the person. If their meanings contradict, then the subject is confused or undecided. Lårger images, however, will show more powerful influences and this distinction may help him or her make decisions. In gen-

eral, dots will emphasize a sign's importance as will the image of a finger pointing at a sign.

Some readers consider signs on the left of the handle as denoting the past and on the right as the future. More commonly, the signs hear the rim of the cup refer to the present or near future, while those towards the bottom refer to the past. For some readers, specific signs at the top is considered lucky, the bottom unlucky.

In a reading that I had done some time ago, there were birds, which I was told denoted some unexpected good news because they were around the top of the cup. There was also a clock which meant good health. A sign of fire was also in the cup which meant that I had to take my time in making decisions, because as they old saying goes, "Haste makes waste."







If one synchronized swimmer drowns, do the rest have to drown too?



April 6, 1927 (71 years ago this week): New York state passes the "Padlock" Bill, which outlaws the presentation of homosexuality on the Broadway stage.

What was the "Padlock" Bill?

In the 1990s, Broadway plays with gay characters and content, like Angels in America and Rent, have won Pulitzer Prizes and Tony Awards. But 71 years ago, three plays with only subtle queer content caused an uproar that resulted in the passage of the "Padlock" Bill in the New York State Assembly. This law - passed in the midst of Prohibition - barred the presentation of homosexuality in Broadway productions and remained on the state's books for the next 40 years.

The brouhaha started with the opening of the play The Captive at the Empire Theater in New York City in September 1926. Originally written in French by Edouard Bourdet and titled La Prisonniere, The Captive concerns the intense relationship between a married woman, Irene, and another female character, Madame d'Aiguines, who never appears onstage but pursues Irene by sending her bunches of violets as signs of her affection. Bourdet wrote the play from the perspective of Irene's husband, Jacques, and saw it as "the story of a man's great sorrow." not as an exploration of lesbian love. Irene finds her own Sapphic infatuation appalling: "It's like a prison to which I must return captive, despite myself," she tells Jacques.

Critics in Paris hailed the play as a masterpiece when it debuted there in March 1926, and French florists reported a sudden and overwhelming shortage of violets. But when imported to this country, The Captive's subject matter horrified critics, particularly Brooks Atkinson, the influential New York Times drama critic, who labeled the theme "twisted" and "revolting." The "loathsome possibility." Atkinson wrote, of an intimate relationship between two women is "never mentioned, scarcely hinted at, [vet it] hangs over the drama like a black pall." Arthur Hornblow ranted in Theater Magazine that The Captive was "a sad commentary on the decadent times in which we live."

All the controversy stirred up by the press made audiences swarm to the theater, where many were baffled by the subtle treatment of the play's theme. Still, they gave thunderous ovations to the play's stars, Basil Rathbone, who later achieved movie fame as Sherlock Holmes. and Helen Menken, a respected stage actress married to Humphrey Bogart. The Captive was that season's hottest show, carrying a whopping \$5 ticket price when most plays cost less than half that. The New York Herald Tribune reported long lines to buy tickets, which scalpers offered for as much as \$25 apiece.

The real trouble started when the press learned that two other "immoral" plays were set to open on Broadway in early 1927. The Drag and Sex, both written and produced by screen siren Mae West, featured gay male characters, who were generally considered even more objectionable than lesbian ones. Interestingly, neither of these plays depicted homosexuality in a positive fashion. In fact, West whose style would later be copied by many a drag queen - hoped that her plays would "call attention to a tragic waste of life that is spreading into modern society."

Local politicians began discussing the need for censorship of "sex perversion" in Broadway plays. Mayor Jimmy Walker cautioned producers to keep plays "clean." Committees of producers, actors, and playwrights met to discuss ways to "purify" their work to avoid official sanctions. But the New York district attorney felt pressured by conservative religious groups, including the Catholic Church, to take direct action. On the evening of February 9, 1927, police raided The Captive and Sex (The Drag had not yet opened), arresting the producers and casts of both. "Most of the actors became hysterical." Menken later recalled. Because she was a friend of the mayor's, however, he sent his personal limousine to escort her to night court

West avoided prosecution by agreeing to close Sex immediately and to call off production of The Drag. But Gilbert Miller, producer of The Captive, was determined to keep his show running, and it did in fact play for five more performances after the raid. Miller's bosses finally pressured him to close down, which he did to great financial loss - \$80,000 in box-office revenue had to be returned to ticket holders. In the trial that followed, a judge leniently ruled that the treatment of The Captive's subject matter was delicate and artistic, though suitable only for mature audiences.

Plans to revive The Captive failed, however, because the state assembly rushed through a bill proposed by the district attorney. The so-called "Padlock" Bill passed on April 6, 1927, making it a misdemeanor to produce or participate in any play "depicting or dealing with the subject of sexual degeneracy, or sex perversion." In addition. any theater in which such a play appeared risked losing its operating license - hence, the nickname "padlock."

Though it was not strictly enforced, the Padlock Bill encouraged a measure of self-censorship in the theater community, resulting in decades of plays with closeted lesbian and gay characters from The Children's Hour to Tea and Sympathy. The Padlock Bill remained on the state's books until the revision of the penal code in 1967.






