Two years ago, when I was twelve, I had one of the most touching experiences of my life. I visited my uncle who was taking care of a man who had AIDS

I realized right away that something was wrong with "Bryan". He was extremely skinny and quite pale. But he was one of the nicest and most considerate people I had ever met. That next morning I woke up early, and Bryan was up too. I made him scrambled eggs. He said they were perfect - just the way he liked 'em. Then we talked about almost any topic you could think of. He finally told me that he had AIDS, and we talked about what it was like before he became ill. I didn't think of him as less a person because he had AIDS. I actually thought of him as a stronger person because he was able to live through it with such a positive attitude. He had a great affect on my life. My uncle later told me that our talk meant a lot to Bryan, and that I had a great affect on his life too. I came home with more knowledge and a better attitude than ever. I felt like Bryan was my brother, or at least I loved him like a brother.

A few days after I returned home from my uncle's, I received a call that Bryan had died. I cried for quite some time. I remember him still, two years later and will never forget that morning. I hope he will never either. I will remember Bryan as a strong and caring person, and no matter what happens to me, he will always be a part of my life and my heart.

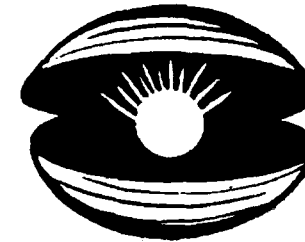

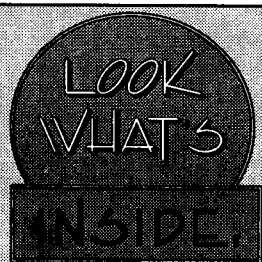



May 25, 1895 (103 years ago this week): Oscar Wilde is found guilty of "gross indecency" and is sentenced to two years at hard labor.

What were Oscar Wilde's trials about?

In the space of a few years in the 1890s, Oscar Wilde went from being Great Britain's most famous playwright to being its most famous convict. With the loss of his family, his money, and his freedom, Wilde's life turned into a drama all its own.

Wilde was born in Dublin in 1854 to an aristocratic family. His mother was a poet whose flamboyant personality and dress greatly influenced her son. Even in adolescence, young Oscar preferred scarlet and lilac shirts. At Oxford, his taste and wit stood out as much as his aptitude as a student. "I find it harder and harder every day to live up to my blue china," Wilde observed about the elegant furnishings he chose for his room at Oxford, and the droll comment circulated outside the university and throughout England.

By age 30, Wilde was famous in Europe for the snappy, highly-quotable epigrams that filled his published essays and peppered his speech. "I have nothing to declare but my genius," he told a customs officer in New York City, following a 1882 U.S. lecture tour that made him a celebrity on this side of the Atlantic, too.

But Wilde was equally well-known for his unorthodox clothing - velvet jackets with a green carnation in the buttonhole - and his effeminate mannerisms. The British paper, Punch, pronounced him a "Maryanne," a derogatory word for homosexual, and the New York Times labeled him "epicene," another word for unmanly. To silence the gossip, Wilde married in 1884 and quickly fathered two children.

Still, he couldn't suppress his sexual impulses. At 32, he began having sex with men, and over the next few years became more openly homosexual, a risky business in England at that time. Though sodomy was no longer a capital offense, Parliament passed the Labouchere Amendment in 1885, widening the definition of illegal homosexual acts to include "gross indecency" - oral sex - a crime punishable with up to two years in prison.

Wilde at first seemed oblivious to the repressive political climate. His homoerotic novel, *The Picture of Dorian Gray* (1891), was attacked in the press for dealing with "matters only fitted for the Criminal Investigation Department." Wilde created an epigram in his own defense: "There is no such thing as a moral or an immoral book. Books are well written or badly written. That is all." Still, he changed gears, writing a number of comedic plays for general audiences such as *The Importance of Being Earnest*, which brought him popularity and financial success. His personal style influenced many young men, who appeared at the opening of Lady Windermere's Fan in 1892 sporting green carnations.

When Wilde fell for the 21-year-old Lord Alfred Douglas (nicknamed "Bosie") in 1892, their affair proved Wilde's undoing. Bosie's father was the powerful Marquess of Queensberry, who decided that Wilde had corrupted his son. When Bosie refused to stop seeing Wilde, Queensberry began harassing the playwright, on one occasion leaving his card at Wilde's club with the message, "To Oscar Wilde posing Somdomite (sic)." Egged on by Bosie, Wilde unwisely sued Queensberry for libel in 1895.

But to win a libel suit, Wilde would have to have proven that Queensberry's innuendoes weren't true. During the trial, Queensberry's lawyer produced a damning letter from Wilde to Bosie, which Bosie had carelessly left in a jacket he gave to a male hustler. In the note, Wilde rhapsodized that Bosie's lips were made for "the madness of kisses." The jury decided in Queensberry's favor, and within hours of the judgment, Wilde was arrested for sodomy and gross indecency. Bosie quickly escaped to France. The theaters where Wilde's plays were running immediately deleted his name from their programs.

During Wilde's first criminal trial, 10 male prostitutes whom Wilde had solicited for sex testified against him. Wilde's eloquence alone saved him, when the prosecutor demanded his definition of a phrase in one of Bosie's poems: the "Love that dare not speak its name." Wilde's powerful speech on the noble, innocent nature of love between men met with applause from the spectators. Because the jury couldn't reach a verdict, another trial was scheduled.

Wilde's friends, including Irish poet William Butler Yeats, hired a yacht to transport him across the English Channel to safety in France, but Wilde stubbornly refused to go. On May 25, 1895, he was found guilty and received the maximum sentence of two years at hard labor. His wife promptly left the country, changing her last name and that of their sons to "Holland." (His grandson plans to restore the family name on the centennial of Wilde's death.)

In prison, Wilde was at first cruelly denied paper and pen. When he was finally permitted to write, he composed a passionate letter to Bosie, later published as *De Profundis*, in which he blamed himself for what was in fact a social injustice. "Desire, at the end, was a malady, or a madness, or both," he wrote. "I allowed pleasure to dominate me. I ended in horrible disgrace."

After his release in 1897, Wilde went abroad. Drained and bankrupt, he spent three years genteelly begging from friends until his death in Paris in 1900. Wilde's much-publicized ordeal sent many British homosexuals into the closet; even Bosie married. But the injustice Wilde suffered also had some positive consequences for awareness of lesbians and gay men. For the first time, millions of people recognized a famous person as gay, thus fostering the development of a gay consciousness and identity that helped lead to the modern gay movement.

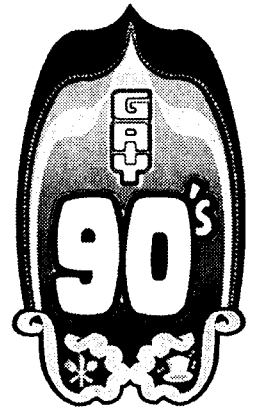

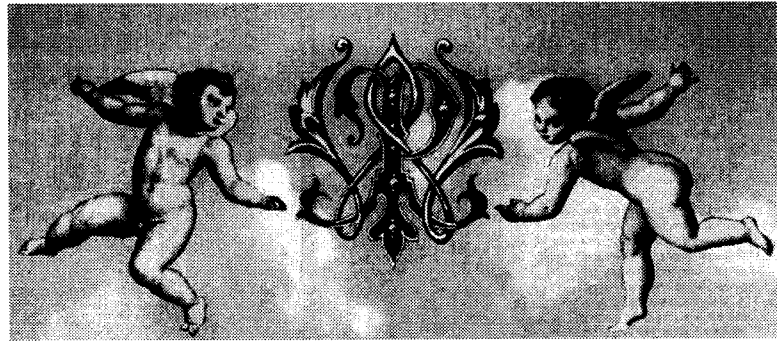
Psychic Thoughts

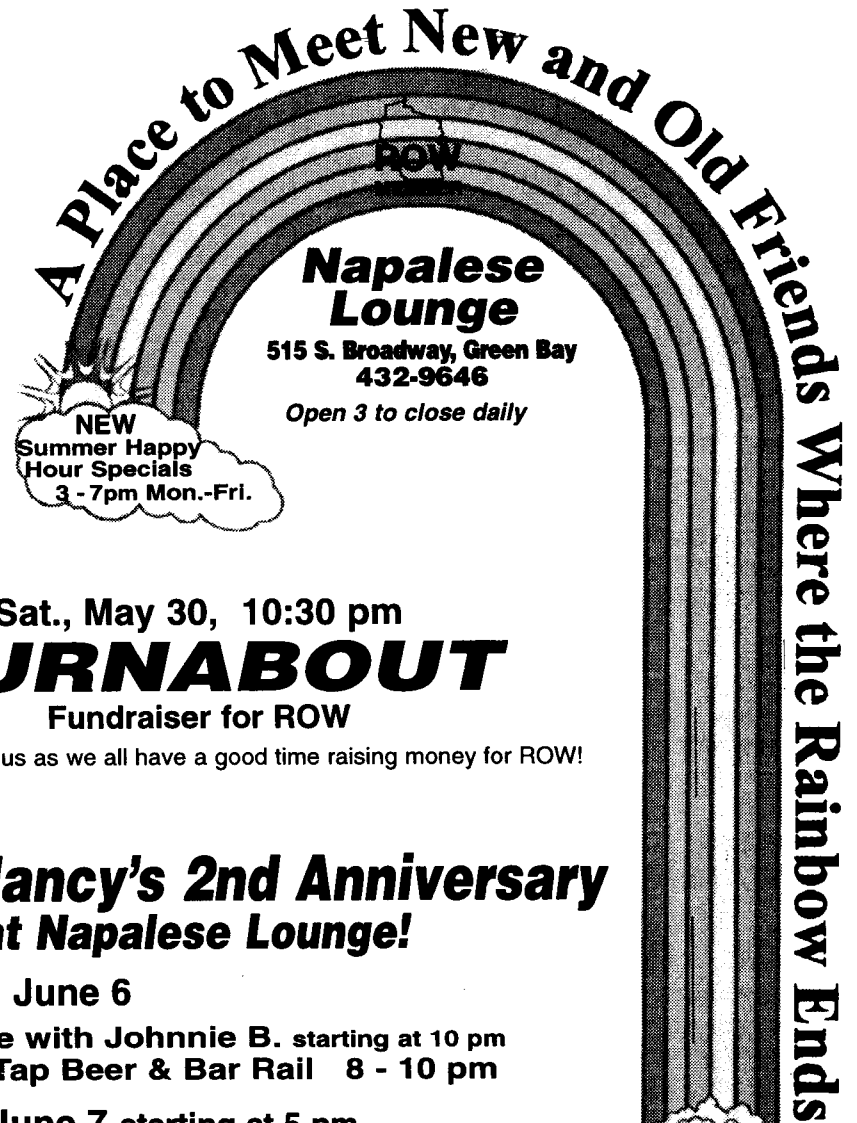
None of us likes to be laid out to criticism. There are times when we all feel as though we are always right and when this happens, take some

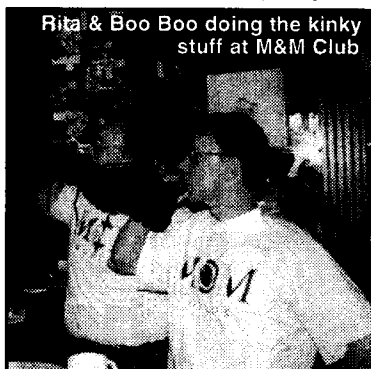
It is one of the few 3 day Pride events in the country and the timing should make this years even more successful. This is where you come in - - They need volunteers, so sign up early.

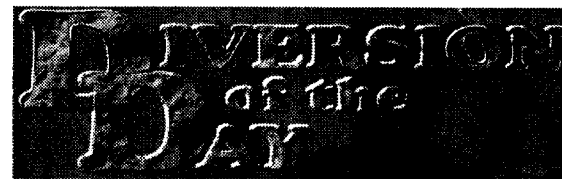
BTW, this happens to be the 5th week-end in August. What happens next year with only 4 weekends, we will have to wait and see, but I hope it is in August again.

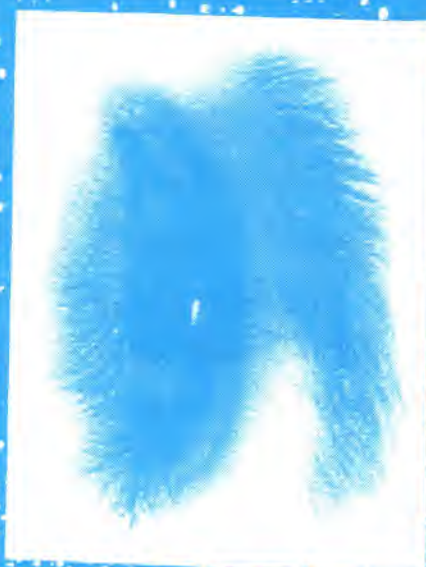
