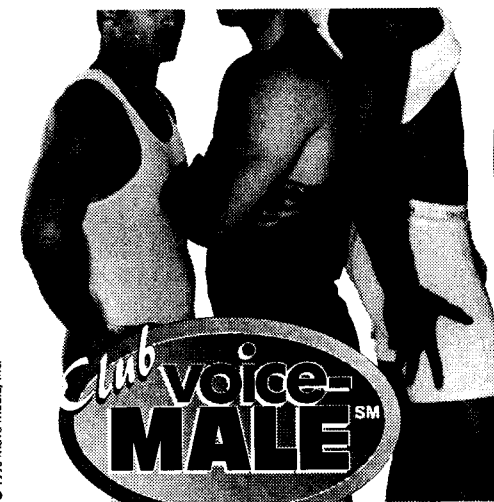

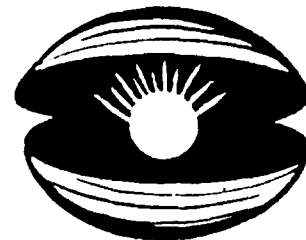

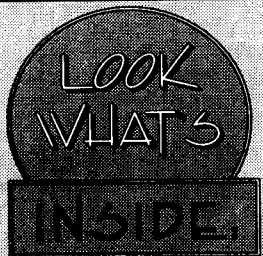

June 3, 1968 (30 years ago this week): Valerie Solanas, the founder and only member of S.C.U.M. (Society for Cutting Up Men), shoots artist Andy Warhol in New York City.

Who was Andy Warhol?

Famously, pop artist and avant-garde filmmaker Andy Warhol once wrote in the catalogue for a retrospective of his paintings, "In the future, everyone will be famous for 15 minutes." Warhol enjoyed a much longer time in the spotlight, in a career than spanned three decades and was punctuated by fabulous art openings, celebrity parties, and an assassination attempt by a disgruntled hanger-on. While Warhol's public life regularly made headlines, though, his private life was much more hidden.

The man who is generally credited with founding pop art was born Andrew Warhola in Pittsburgh in 1928, the son of Czech immigrants. His coal miner father died when he was young, and his mother helped support the family by selling tin flower arrangements that she crafted out of cans. Andy showed a talent for drawing and painting as a youngster and took free art lessons at Carnegie Institute. With financial support from his brother, a Good Humor ice cream man, Andy attended college at Carnegie Tech.

After graduation, the young artist moved to Manhattan, where he supported himself in commercial art. His first assignment was drawing women's shoes for Glamour magazine. By the mid-1950s, he had shortened his last name and was earning \$50,000 a year. Despite his financial success, however, Warhol was envious of his contemporaries, Jasper Johns and Robert Rauschenberg, who were younger but getting important gallery shows. When Warhol tried to break into the snobbish New York art world, he found that his years in advertising art damaged his credibility as a painter.

He had other liabilities, too - his exaggerated, effeminate mannerisms (patterned after his idol, Truman Capote) and his open homosexuality. Warhol's first gallery show was decidedly homoerotic, with paintings of beautiful male faces and of penises decorated with bows. At that time, Warhol had sexual relationships exclusively with men. Several of his boyfriends later admitted that Warhol was ambivalent about sex altogether, though he always surrounded himself with handsome young men. Self-conscious about his looks (he lost most of his hair in his twenties, forcing him to wear wigs), he steered his energy into his work and his public image. "Sex takes up too much time," Warhol told a friend, and he consequently spent long periods of time being celibate, though he enjoyed voyeurism.

In 1962, Warhol made a name for himself in the art world with his silk-screened paintings of folk objects such as Campbell's soup cans and Coca-Cola bottles. Warhol's pop art brought together his training as a painter, his experience as a commercial artist, and his working-class background. (His mother, he told people, always served Campbell's soup.) Most critics at first thought his work was horrible, but collectors and museums snapped it up anyway. Warhol progressed to celebrity portraits, including a series of Marilyn Monroes painted shortly after her suicide. Within a short time, he was a celebrity himself, attending glamorous parties with beautiful young women instead of men on his arm. He created his own public persona: the shy, kind of dumb eccentric with no inter-

est in sex.

Warhol the voyeur soon branched out into avant-garde filmmaking. One of his first projects was Sleep, a six-hour movie of his then-boyfriend sleeping. Eschewing professional actors, Warhol's casts were an unlikely combination of friends, transvestites, and street hustlers. He produced a series of films at a rapid pace at his studio in Manhattan, "The Factory." His best-known film, Chelsea Girls (1966), had a host of queer characters and was the first underground film to receive commercial distribution.

The Factory attracted aspiring artists and filmmakers, and Warhol gave many, especially Paul Morrissey, their start. In 1967, Valerie Solanas, a radical lesbian who was the founder and only member of S.C.U.M. (Society for Cutting Up Men), dropped off a screenplay called "Up Your Ass," which she hoped Warhol would produce. Warhol misplaced the screenplay and tried to make it up to her by letting her appear in one of his films. The mentally unstable Solanas continued to hang around The Factory on and off for a year, waiting for her script to turn up and be produced.

On the afternoon of June 3, 1968, Solanas met Warhol outside The Factory and entered the building with him. Warhol later remembered that she was nervously fumbling with a paper bag. Inside, Warhol made phone calls and carried on business as usual. Suddenly, Solanas drew a pistol out of the bag and aimed at Warhol. No one paid attention until she shot the artist three times, almost fatally. Warhol was, in fact, pronounced dead at the hospital, but a doctor massaged his heart back to life. Though Warhol recovered physically and lived another 19 years, the incident scarred him emotionally. He retreated from filmmaking, exploring other creative avenues such as founding Interview magazine.

In 1987, Warhol died of a heart attack during routine gall bladder surgery. Six thousand people attended the public auction of his apartment's contents - everything from paintings by rivals Johns and Rauschenberg to a bizarre collection of cookie jars - which netted \$25 million. Ironically, appraisers found none of Warhol's own work in his apartment. "It's nothing in the end," he once said dismissively of his paintings. "My work won't last.... I was using cheap paint."

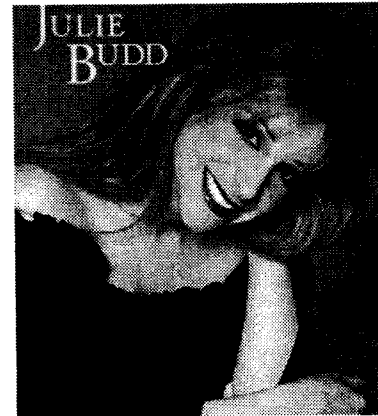

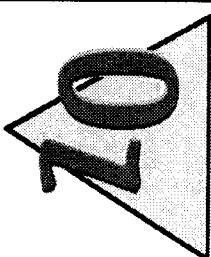

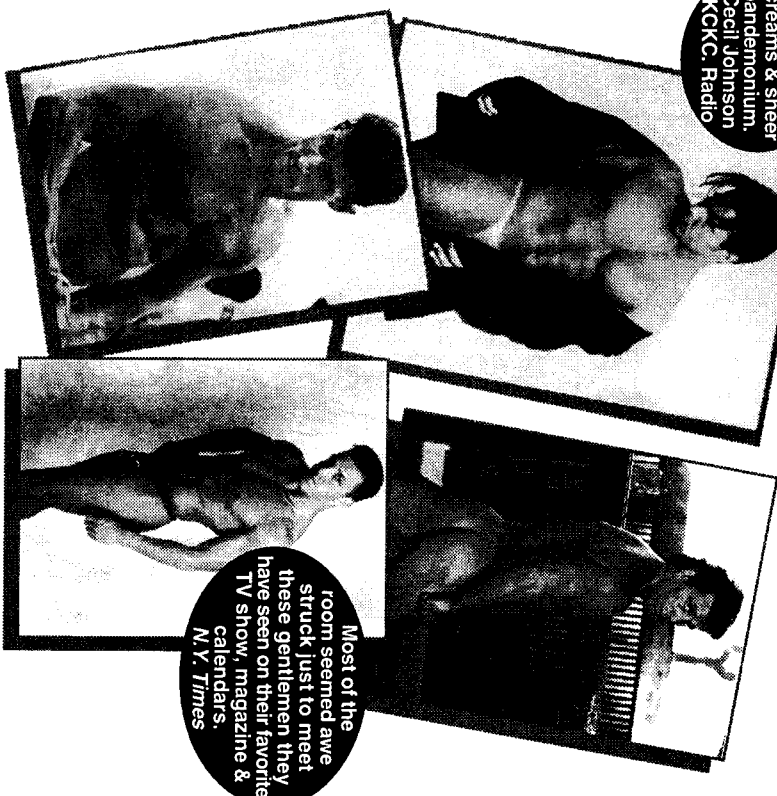
