PAST OUT

August 28, 1963 (35 years ago this month): The historic March on
 Washington for black civil rights, organized by Bayard Rustin, a gay
 man, takes place in Washington, D.C.

Who was Bayard Rustin?

Alveda King, niece of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has expended
 a lot of energy publicly condemning gay people and denouncing the
 gay rights movement. What she seems to have forgotten is that the
 man who taught her famous uncle about nonviolent protest and was
 a major architect of the black civil rights movement of the 1950s and
 1960s was an openly gay man named Bayard Rustin.

Rustin was born in 1912 in eastern Pennsylvania and raised by his
 black Quaker grandparents. Toward the end of his life, he noted that
 his activism was rooted more in Quaker pacifism than in his being
 black. After attending two colleges and graduating from neither,
 Rustin moved to New York City in the mid-1930s and enjoyed a brief
 first career as a singer and actor, playing opposite Paul Robeson in
 the Broadway musical, *John Henry*.

But activism, not acting, was to become Rustin's life work. In
 1936, he joined the Young Communist League, but became disen-
 chanted with the party when it abandoned its commitment to the
 desegregation of the armed forces at the start of World War II. Rustin
 quickly moved on to work with the Fellowship of Reconciliation
 (FOR), an international Christian pacifist organization. During his
 early years with FOR, Rustin became a disciple of Gandhian nonvi-
 olence. In 1944, he put Gandhi's principles into action when he
 defied his draft summons and had to spend 28 months in a federal
 prison. After his release, Rustin played an important role on the
 Committee Against Jim Crow in Military Service and Training,
 which was instrumental in the desegregation of the armed forces in
 1948.

Rustin became one of FOR's top figures and was rumored to be
 heir apparent to its leader. But his homosexuality and frequent casual
 sex hurt his career. In 1953, while on an FOR speaking tour, he was
 arrested in Pasadena on a morals charge when he was caught in a
 parked car having sex with two men. Rustin maintained that the men
 entrapped him, but he pled guilty anyway and spent 60 days in jail.
 Though Rustin had never been closeted, being arrested made him a
 liability to FOR, and he was asked to resign.

Rustin continued to work in the peace movement, taking a staff
 position with the War Resisters' League. But in 1956, Lillian Smith,
 a Southern white lesbian and author of the controversial novel about
 miscegenation, *Strange Fruit*, hooked Rustin up with the 27-year-old
 Martin Luther King, Jr., who was trying to organize a bus boycott in
 Montgomery, Alabama. King had academic knowledge of Gandhi's
 philosophy, but Rustin taught him how to actually employ the tech-
 niques of nonviolence. As King's adviser, Rustin and several others
 conceived the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), the
 grassroots civil rights organization that propelled King into the
 national spotlight.

To King's credit, he hired Rustin knowing about his sexual orien-
 tation and criminal record. King himself "was under such extraordi-
 nary pressure about his own sex life," Rustin later explained. "J.
 Edgar Hoover was spreading stories, and there were very real efforts
 to entrap him" and thereby discredit the civil rights movement.

Some black activists close to King were not comfortable with
 Rustin, whose promiscuity, they believed, might compromise the
 entire movement. At one point and for unknown reasons,
 Congressman Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. threatened to go public with
 the false accusation that King and Rustin were lovers. In 1960, in the
 interest of preserving the movement, Rustin quietly resigned as
 King's assistant.

In 1962, however, Rustin was back in the thick of things, at the
 request of veteran black organizer A. Philip Randolph. Randolph's
 1941 threat to bring 100,000 black protesters to Washington in had
 convinced Roosevelt to block discrimination in defense contracting,
 and he was once again planning a march to bring about government
 action. Recognizing Rustin's extraordinary organizing skills,
 Randolph asked him to draw up the blueprint for a massive civil
 rights march on Washington, to be held on the 100th anniversary of
 the Emancipation Proclamation. Though Rustin was the march's
 architect, black leaders were hesitant to name him as director, since
 his ties to Communism, his conscientious objection, and his morals
 charge arrest made him vulnerable to attack from civil rights oppo-
 nents. (Strom Thurmond did eventually attack Rustin on all of these
 points.) Randolph became the official march director instead, but he
 named Rustin as his assistant and turned the responsibilities of orga-
 nizing over to him. The March on Washington, which took place on
 August 28, 1963 and culminated in King's "I Have a Dream" speech,
 was a pinnacle of the movement for black civil rights.

Though the march was probably Rustin's finest hour, he spent his
 entire lifetime as an activist, being arrested over 20 times for acts of
 civil disobedience. In 1964, he organized a public school boycott in
 New York City, in which 400,000 students, teachers, and school
 employees stayed home to protest the slow pace of integration. Well
 into his seventies, Rustin was still active in various causes, including
 the fight against AIDS. "He had work to do until the very end," one
 of his associates said after Rustin died in August, 1987, of heart fail-
 ure. "His utter devotion to causes was marked by the use of his last
 ounce of talent, the driving urge to talk, to plan, to organize."

Thinking maybe I might get some inside poop about the Wisconsin Leathermen's Association, I clicked on it - nothing. (I am still waiting to find out what makes this a club and why I and others can't join.)

Altho, I was sure the Firebirds didn't have a site, I clicked and was proven right. On to the BCB where I was surprised to find their site is no longer. Back to the favorite places menu, click on the BCB and got a blank page at the site. I am not sure what's up here. Is my computer literacy (or lack thereof) showing??

Three down, still no new information, just the Oberons to go - - now this one is the straw that did it.

To you non-computer persons, you may want to know that you can get a home page, e mail, web site or what have you, free. Such a deal. BUT - here's the kicker, the visitors to your site cannot get to you without commercials - - AND - - you had better know how to by pass them or your temp is going to rise. Well, I didn't and it did.

From the Boot Camp page, I clicked on Oberons and shortly got a lovely page full of Geocities brightly flashing buttons, inviting me to come in, explore them, sign up with them, etc. Is there a flashing button to bypass this page, instructions for getting to the Oberons or for that matter, one saying "you dumb shit, you screwed up." Bunk space, camping sites, hot showers, full gourmet kitchen facilities, free drinks, play rooms and parties which run into the wee hours of the AM.

Talk about letting your hair down. The atmosphere is so "mox nix", you can dress down or up. Most of the guys go very casual during the day, saving their finery for Saturday's sit down dinner and evenings when the weather cools down. Some of the hottest Leather men this side of IML gather here. For over 20 years, there is a Mr. Northwoods Contest. Some very hot men compete.

The site, which is constantly upgraded, has quite the amenities including patios, bars, dance floors, ETC. It is also the site of the ROW picnic. The MUDD party was also held here.

An Open Letter to Gay & Bisexual Men in Milwaukee

"I was recently fortunate enough to be able to attend the 20th Anniversary National Lesbian and Gay Health Association's annual health conference in San Francisco. Besides the obvious benefits of anything happening in San Francisco, I also found the conference to be incredibly challenging as an out Gay man confronted with issues of HIV prevention and Men men's health in 1998.

I attended a track of workshops and dis-

cussions entitled *Gay Men's Sexual Cultures* that dealt with tough, often controversial issues like drug use, barebacking, and leather sex. The purpose of the track was to get beyond the never ending debates and moralizations to openly discuss how these topics affect our sexual lives, as Gay and Bi men, and how we need to address them in the context of the health of our communities.

On a national level, we debate circuit parties and Sex Panic!; on a local level we debate sex in parks and other public places. For the health and well-being of our communities, we need to discuss these important issues with one another and how they impact our lives. We need to ask questions such as: 'What are the meanings behind our sex lives? How does the kinds of sex we have define who we are as Gay or Bi men? How does sex fit into the rest of our lives and needs? and How can we respect individual choices around sex and sexuality that may be perceived as being outside of community norms? If we can't discuss these issues among ourselves, then who can we discuss them with?'

I challenge all of us to get to know one another and explore who we are as Gay

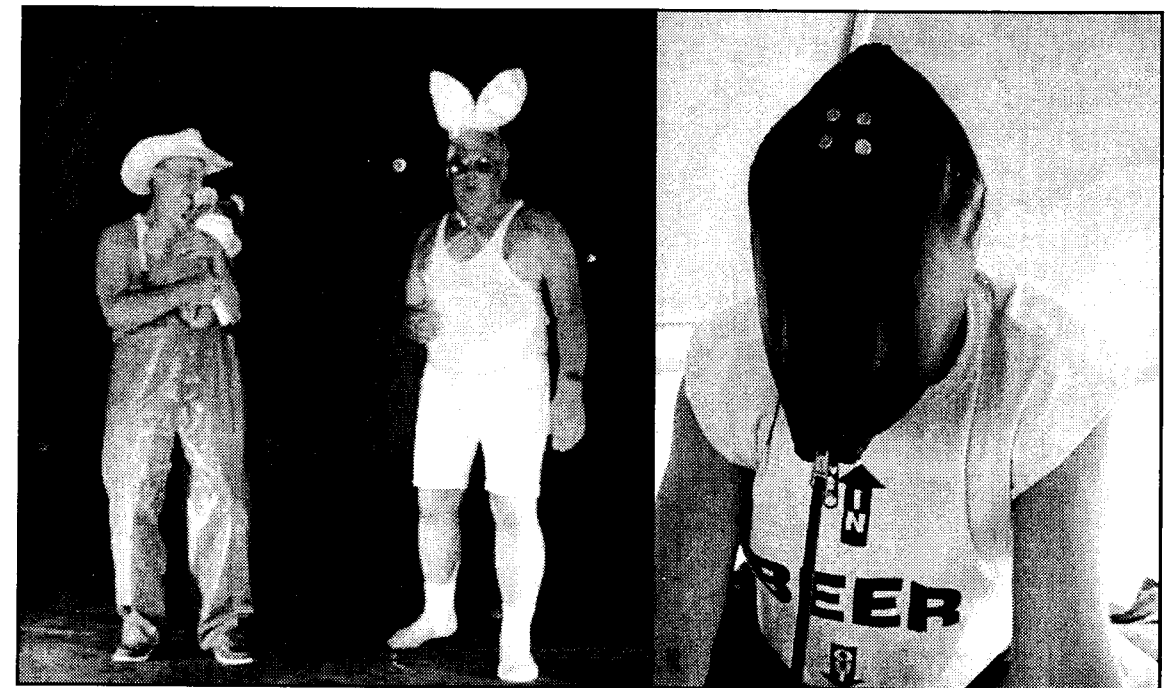

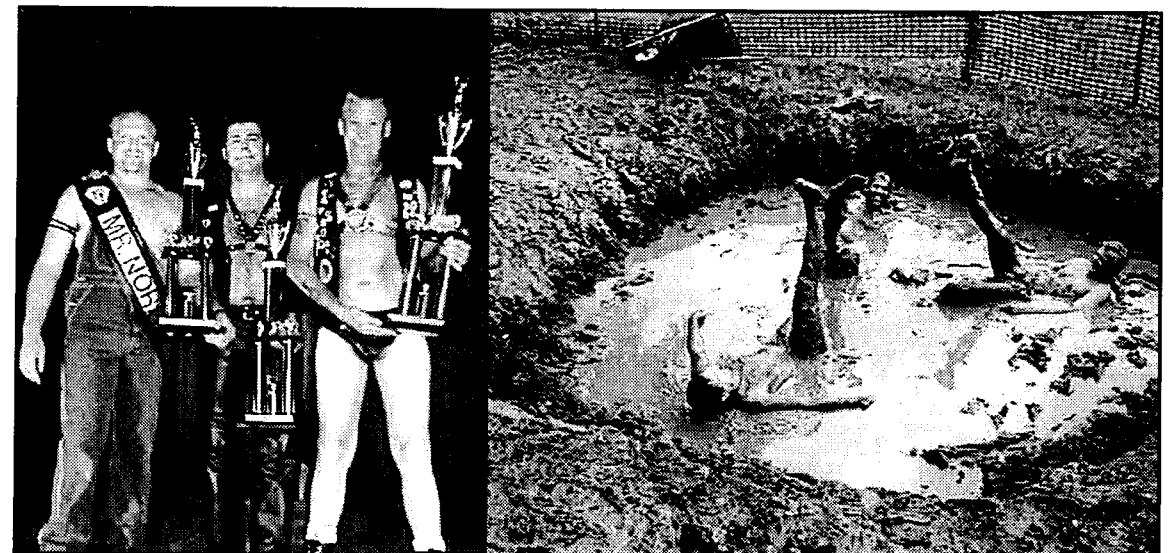
