



August 29, 1867 (131 years ago): In Munich, Germany, Karl Heinrich Ulrichs becomes the first person in the world to publicly proclaim the need for homosexual rights.

#### Who was Karl Heinrich Ulrichs?

The currently popular idea that homosexuality is innate and that gay people are therefore entitled to full civil rights didn't get its start with today's search for a "gay gene." More than 130 years ago, Karl Heinrich Ulrichs, a German lawyer and journalist, began exploring the reasons why he himself had felt "different" since childhood. Ulrichs postulated a biological theory of homosexuality and devised a system of classifying individuals who had previously been labeled "sodomites" or "pederasts."

Born near Kirchdorf, Germany in 1825, Ulrichs knew he was different from other boys at a young age, when he experienced ridicule from his classmates for his effeminacy. He fell in love for the first time at age 10, with a fellow student at the local boys' school. As a teenager. Ulrichs began writing secret love poems to other boys, and he continued to compose passionate poetry for men throughout his life. His first gay sexual experience seems to have occurred when he was 25.

Trained as a lawyer, Ulrichs worked for a number of years as an assistant city attorney in Hanover. An "incident" in 1854, which he never elaborated on but was probably related to his homosexuality, made him leave public service and take up journalism. Ulrichs wrote widely on topics such as law, politics, and language

Privately, Ulrichs intellectualized his own experience of "difference" for many years. Then, the 1862 arrest on a morals charge of a prominent lawyer named Schweitzer outraged Ulrichs and spurred him to put his thoughts into a letter to his sister and other family members - probably the first coming out letter in history.

Ulrichs told his family about his "feminine spirit"; they encouraged him to try to change. He also outlined for them the system of sexual classification that he had formulated from both ancient mythology and the new science of embryology. According to Ulrichs, human embryos had a common "germ" of sexuality; they were physically the same until the 12th week of development. At that time, the genitals of some changed and became male, while others stayed the same and were female. A number of those who became physically male, however, remained female in spirit. These individuals were "Urnings" or "Uranians." Ulrichs saw them as the spiritual descendants of the Greek goddess Aphrodite, daughter of Uranus. Those who were "truly male," both physically and spiritually, Ulrichs called "Dionings" - the descendants of a second Aphrodite, the child of Zeus and Dione. In this rather crude way, Ulrichs created the categories of "homosexual" and "heterosexual," though he used different terms for them.

Over the next few years, Ulrichs elaborated on his system in a series of self-published pamphlets collectively titled "Researches on the Riddle of Love Between Men." The first five appeared under the pseudonym, Numa Numantius, but the remaining pamphlets bore his own name. Though he eventually devised a name for lesbians ("Urningin"), Ulrichs was primarily concerned with finding an explanation for male (i.e., his own) same-sex desires. As he wrote to his family, "To justify myself, and to do it completely, is now nothing less than my life's work."

Since Umings were born, not made, Ulrichs considered it cruel and unfair to prosecute them. He submitted a resolution to the

Congress of German Jurists in the hope of changing existing laws against Urnings. But the Congress never responded, and Ulrichs raised money from fellow Urnings to attend the jurists' annual conference in Munich and present his statement. On August 29, 1867, in front of 500 lawyers, Ulrichs called for equality under the law for Urnings. His statement met with cries of "Stop! Stop!" until the commotion forced him to step down from the podium before finishing. Since his interest in Urnings was deemed a sure sign that he was one himself. Ulrichs's speech was both a historic coming out and the first public endorsement of homosexual rights.

Ulrichs's writings brought him into contact with many other Urnings, and he expressed his intention to form an "Urning union." But the plan fell through when he became disillusioned about legal reform in Germany and emigrated to Italy in 1870. His ideas, however, had enormous influence on others and fostered the development of a range of scientific theories about and names for those with same-sex desires. In May, 1868, Karoly Maria Kertbeny, a doctor, coined the terms "homosexual" and "heterosexual." In two pamphlets published the following year, Kertbeny, who was heterosexual, supported Ulrichs's position that the state should not meddle in consensual sexual behavior.

Sadly and ironically, Ulrichs's ideas were misused by other scientists. In 1886, neurologist Richard von Krafft-Ebing, to whom Ulrichs had sent his pamphlets in hope of finding a supporter, published his theory of homosexual psychopathy - that homosexuals were born mentally ill but could be "cured." This idea persisted in psychiatry until 25 years ago and is still believed by some religious conservatives.

On a brighter note, Ulrichs's writings also sparked the gay rights movement in Germany. In 1897, two years after Ulrichs's death, Magnus Hirschfeld, who had read Ulrichs's work, founded the first gay rights organization in the world. The following year, he published a collection of Ulrichs's pamphlets. Ulrichs's revolutionary idea that "there is no such thing as an unnatural love" lives on today in the modern gav rights movement.

#### Medical College of Wisconsin Seeks HIV Positive Older Adults for Life Quality Research

In one of the first studies of its kind, the Center for AIDS Intervention Reaearch (CAIR) at the Medical College of Wisconsin has initiated "Project Enhance," an effort to identify and evaluate the needs of older adults living with HIV/AIDS. In the process, CAIR is seeking HIV positive adults 47 years of age or older to enroll in the study.

"The vast majority of research examining quality-of-life issues among persons living with HIV disease has focused on younger persons," says Timothy G. Heckman, Ph.D., assistant professor of psychiatry and behavioral medicine and principal investigator of the study. "This is one of the first efforts to learn about the needs and life circumstances of older adults living with HIV disease."

The study is supported by a one-year grant from the National Institute on Aging and will be conducted in three phases. During the first phase, 36 HIV positive adults will be interviewed to identify issues that reduce their life quality and make it more difficult for them to cope with daily stresses. Phase two will involve surveying 80 HIV positive adults and learning more about various aspects of their lives, including quality of life, distress levels and perceived social support. The study will conclude with a pilot test of an intervention to determine if the life quality of older adults living with HIV can be improved through their participation in a small-group, professionally-led coping improvement program.

The study's co-investigators are Kathleen J. Sikkema, Ph.D., associate professor of psychiatry and behavioral medicine, and Arlene Kochman, M.S.W./C.S.W., project coordinator; both are at the Medical College of Wisconsin and are affiliated with CAIR.
