





December 10, 1924 (74 years ago this month): In Chicago, Henry Gerber obtains a state charter for the Society for Human Rights, the first gay rights organization in America.>

## What was the first gay rights organization in America?

Almost 30 years before Harry Hay and his friends founded the Mattachine Society, a nonprofit corporation called the Society for Human Rights paid \$10 for a charter from the state of Illinois and took its place as the earliest documented gay rights organization in the United States. The written purpose of the Chicago-based group was so vague that the government clerk who processed the application for a charter undoubtedly had no idea that he was helping to make queer history.

The guiding light behind the Society was Henry Gerber (1892-1972), whose family had emigrated from Bavaria to Chicago in 1913. Immediately after World War I, Gerber served with the U.S. Army's occupation forces in Germany and there became acquainted with the work of gay rights pioneers, including Magnus Hirschfeld and his Scientific Humanitarian Committee. Gerber was particularly enthusiastic about a group called Bund fur Menschenrecht (Society for Human Rights), which advocated for a mass movement of gay people. He began subscribing to German homophile magazines and making frequent trips to Berlin to participate in the city's lively gay culture.

His experiences in Germany fueled Gerber's desire to launch a similar movement in the United States for what he called "homosexual emancipation." Soon after he returned to Chicago, where a gay subculture was forming, Gerber set out to achieve his goal. Besides wanting to help himself and others like him, Gerber also had hopes of fame and glory. "If I succeeded," he wrote later, "I might become known to history as deliverer of the downtrodden, even as Lincoln."

During breaks from his job with the post office. Gerber drafted a declaration of purpose for a proposed Society for Human Rights. The statement's wording was lofty, vague, and drawn from the idea, prevalent at that time, that homosexuality was an "inversion" of normal sexual behavior. Gerber set down as the Society's main intent "to promote and protect the interests of people who by reason of mental and physical abnormalities are abused and hindered in the legal pursuit of happiness." Nowhere in the statement could he dare words like "homosexual" or "invert."

Once he'd written the declaration, Gerber had a hard time finding anyone to sign it, even though it was a nebulous statement about human rights. He finally talked a half-dozen of his friends into working with him, and their seven names appeared together on the 1924 charter. 'The average homosexual,' Gerber later complained, "was ignorant concerning himself. Others were fearful. Still others were frantic or depraved. Some were blase... We wondered how we could accomplish anything with such resistance from our own people."

As part of the group's mission, Gerber hoped to institute a series of educational lectures for gay men on sexual self-control, "especially urging against the seduction of adolescents," he wrote. He also wanted to publish a newsletter called "Friendship and Freedom" to keep gay people informed about the group's activities. The publication, too, would downplay sexuality in order to gain the sympathy of the general public and, in particular, legal authorities.

Gerber soon found that gay men who were afraid to sign the Society's

declaration of purpose also hesitated to donate money to the group or add their names to its mailing list. He wrote and mimeographed two issues of "Friendship and Freedom" by himself and financed them out of his own pocket. Because of the financial drain on Gerber, only two issues were ever published, although they were not widely circulated, and indeed, no copies of "Friendship and Freedom" remain.

Gerber's greatest challenge as a gay activist came in the summer of 1925. Although most of the members of the Society were, like Gerber, bachelors, the vice-president of the organization, Al Meininger, had a wife and children. When Meininger's wife found out about his double life, she reported him to a social worker, alleging that he and his friends performed "strange doings" in front of the children. An article appeared on the front page of the Chicago Examiner under the lurid headline "Strange Sex Cult Exposed." The three officers of the Society - Gerber, Meininger, and an itinerant preacher named John Graves - were arrested and prosecuted. The policemen who raided Gerber's apartment at 2 a.m. took his typewriter, personal diaries, and all the files of the Society. But because the arrests were made without a warrant, a judge eventually dismissed the case, and the three men were released.

Though Gerber got his typewriter and the Society's papers back, his diaries were never returned. They were confiscated by postal inspectors who were investigating if "Friendship and Freedom" had violated the federal law against sending obscene material through the mail. Gerber subsequently lost his post office job, and his ordeal marked the end of his fledgling gay rights group. Disheartened, he moved to New York City and re-enlisted in the Army, serving for another 17 years.

For the rest of his life, Gerber remained an active gay rights proponent, publishing a number of articles and reviews on gay then es, sometimes under the pseudonym "Parisex" and sometimes under his own name. His account of the founding of the Society for Human Rights in a 1962 issue of ONE magazine is one of the few remaining records of that historic organization. After its demise, more than two decades would pass before American gays and lesbians would once again form political organizations to protect their interests.

## Quest Adds \$40,000 in New Press Equipment

Just one issue before *Quest* begins year six, the small upstart Wisconsin based gay publication will bring online a new state of the art two color AB Dick printing press and a new laser plate making system. Total value of the package is \$40,865.00 to be paid for over the next five years. This is the fifth year in a row that *Quest* has invested in equipment. This addition brings a third printing press to the operation but adds many capabilities not available before to this gay owned press house.

The new plate making system relys on the same polyester based plates that run through a laser printer, but the new set-up has much higher resolution and much larger plates. *Quest* will be able to do a more professional job of printing with this set-up. This system remains the same pollution free non-silver based and non-phtotographic process that *Quest* has used for four years now.

In addition to making a better publication, the press equipment will allow us to take in outside jobs. We now have the capability to print four color glossy stock, do full bleeds and other things full print houses do. We will not be opening a walk-in printing facility but will take outside printing jobs that we are asked to bid on, or we go out and sell. This will bring *Quest's* capabilities full circle with design, publishing and printing. No other Wisconsin based publication gay or straight publishes a paper for the Les-Bi-Gay-Trans communities and also owns it's own printing house. Metra out of Detroit is the only other publication like this in the midwest that we know of.


Quest will remain the small "easy to pocket and take with you" publication it is now. We fill an important niche in the market of Wisconsin gay publications that include *In Step* and *Wisconsin Light*. As always, we do not try and duplicate what they already do best. We are mainly an entertainment guide and in addition, we provide a badly needed news outlet for the smaller markets outside Milwaukee.

Our advertisers report they are getting exceptional results in and outside the Milwaukee markets, sometimes getting better results than in other gay or straight publications. As we struggle to get the bars in Milwaukee to accept *Quest* as a choice for their advertising needs, we are expanding our advertising sales to include other businesses as well. We hope to fully diversify the type of advertsing in *Quest* by the end of year six: something we have been trying to do this past year and which mimics the efforts of *In Step, Wisconsin Light, Lavender Lifestyles* of Minneapolis and hundreds of other publications around the globe.

Quest-Online is also going through some major changes this year. We will be expanding our web area for the Leather-Fetish community and begin selling ads for the online site which for most of this year has been the only Wisconsin gay publication to have an active web site. You can find Quest-Online listed in the Gay net Cybersocket directory of over 1,700 web listings under Gay Ezines and publications along with others such as Lavender Lifestyles and Gay Chicago Magazine.
