PAST/OUT

Who were the first major-league athletes to come out?

The phrase "openly gay athlete" brings to mind Martina Navratilova, Greg Louganis, Patty Sheehan, and other stars of individual sports such as tennis, diving, and golf. But years before any of these sports figures came out, two big-league ballplayers had already made gay history.

Football is a brutal game that is associated with "traditional" masculinity. But it's also teeming with homoerotic undertones. The players huddle, head to head, arms wrapped around each other. At the start of a play, the quarterback grabs the ball from between the center's legs. After a touchdown, the players hug and pat each other's behinds.

Within this dual sphere of male aggression and bonding, David Kopay, a Catholic young man originally from Chicago, found a niche for himself. He played ball throughout high school and won an athletic scholarship to the University of Washington, where he was a halfback and co-captain of the Rose Bowl-winning team in 1964. At the end of his college career, Kopay was drafted as a running back by the San Francisco 49ers. Over the next 10 years, he played for the Detroit Lions, the Washington Redskins, the New Orleans Saints, and the Green Bay Packers. In his final years in the NFL, he was both a player and a coach.

At the same time, Kopay harbored a secret. "I always knew I was a bit different," he later said, "but I kept it kind of quiet." Kopay had his first gay sexual encounter with a Redskins teammate, tight end Jerry Smith (who died of AIDS in 1987). Though they had sex only once, the two remained friends and often roomed together when the team traveled. For a while, Kopay tried different ways of "curing" his homosexuality, even marrying briefly, but he eventually realized that he was and had always been gay.

Rumors about Kopay's homosexuality spread in the NFL. As his years on the playing field ended, Kopay found himself without any coaching offers and unable to get a sports-related job. "By the time I spoke out" about being gay, he recalled, "I really had nothing left to lose.... I just had to do it."

One morning, Kopay opened up the *Washington Star* and spotted an intriguing headline: "Homosexuals in Sports." The story was an interview with an anonymous NFL player, who talked at length about his double life in sports. Kopay recognized the player as his former roommate and lover, Smith, and decided to offer the reporter an interview himself. But unlike Smith, Kopay agreed to let the paper use his name. On December 11, 1975, Kopay's story as a "queer football player," as he later put it, made headlines. He was the first professional athlete to come out publicly.

Kopay didn't experience any direct backlash from coming out, though he never got the coaching job he wanted and eventually settled for a job as a linoleum salesman. In 1977, he published his autobiography, which became a bestseller. Kopay received positive letters from lesbians, gay men, and gay youth in particular, thanking him for his courage. He was also invited to speak at universities across the country. Though the movie rights to the book

were sold, no film was ever made. "I think the NFL maybe had something to do with discouraging anyone from doing a film version," Kopay speculated.

Around the same time that Kopay came out, another athlete was making a name for himself in that all-American sport, baseball. Glenn Burke, an African-American from Oakland, started playing professional ball for an L.A. Dodgers farm team in 1972 and became an outfielder for the Dodgers four years later. In 1977, he invented the "high five" during the Dodgers' final game of the season. When the Dodgers made it to the World Series, Burke reached the pinnacle of his career.

The Dodgers had high hopes for Burke. When he signed on, one coach said, "Frankly, we think he's going to be another Willie Mays." But playing for the Dodgers was complicated, because Burke felt like an outsider instead of part of the team. He was trying to hide his homosexuality, which he had known about for years.

Burke developed a "too close" friendship with Tommy Lasorda, Jr., the openly gay son of the team's manager. In 1978, the Dodgers' vice president pulled Burke aside and suggested he get married like his fellow players. But Burke remained single and soon found himself traded to the Oakland A's.

Halfway through his second season with the A's, Burke was released from his contract for reasons he never understood. He suspected homophobia, but his modest batting average and few home runs may have also contributed. No other team picked up Burke's contract, and at 26 he found himself without a career and unprepared for a life outside of baseball.

Two years after his release from the A's, Burke confirmed the rumors of his homosexuality in *Inside Sports* magazine, the first baseball player to come out. "It was more important to be myself than a baseball player," he said. Burke became active in San Francisco's gay community, playing on a gay softball team and joining Black and White Men Together.

Still, Burke remained bitter about his firing and began taking drugs to cope, eventually becoming addicted. As he later put it, leaving baseball "took a chunk out of my heart." He died of complications from AIDS in 1995 at the age of 43.

167 AIDS Advocates Rallied at Capitol March 25 - Push for Increased HIV Prevention

167 AIDS advocates from all parts of Wisconsin converged on the state capitol on March 25 to urge legislative leaders to increase state funding for AIDS prevention programs. The advocates met with 82 state representatives and senators to secure a \$50,000 AIDS prevention initiative. Advocates also asked for expansion of the state Medicaid program to cover people living with HIV disease and an increase in the state's historic AIDS care and treatment grant.

"The legislature must reassert its leadership in the fight against AIDS," said Doug Nelson, ARCW executive director. He added that the state's \$180,000 annual HIV prevention funding was dwarfed by the commitment of most other states and was surpassed by the state AIDS/HIV Program's administrative costs of \$216,900.

Logic records releases "Maria", the debut single from BLONDIE's first collection of original material in 16 years.

They did everything that interested them-including the first rock/reggae and rock/disco. To some they were punks-mocking rock dinosaurs and Debbie the cover girl on Punk Magazine. Whatever they did, it all came out sounding great!

The new album, *No Exit*, the seventh BLONDIE album of new material, was produced by Craig Leon, who actually worked on their first album with legendary producer Richard Gottherer.

BLONDIE remains one of the biggest hit making bands of our time. Hearing *No Exit* is truly surprising because it's a perfect evolution of BLONDIE as we knew it. It's as if the band continued to develop, to tighten even, despite the fact that they weren't together. The trademark elements are still there: that perfect, propulsive beat; Debbie's unmistakable voice, seductive, soulful yet ironic;

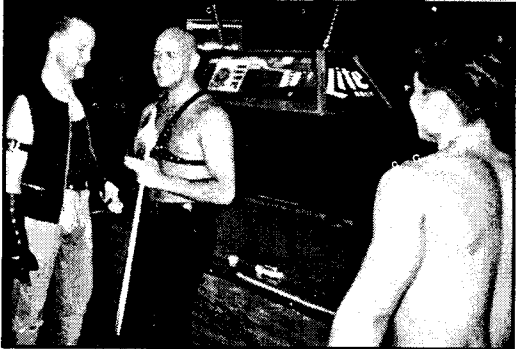

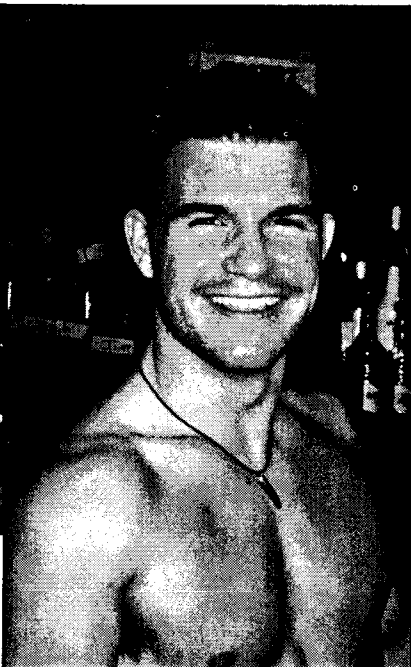

What To Wear In A Leather Bar A Beginners Guide. Part Two

Last issue, I tried to give an overview of what
Leather Man means to various people. This
issue, let's stick to selecting a wardrobe suitable
for the run of the mill leather bar or event.

The first thing you should strive for is an

STOP - - Do not think you have to look like
a "Castro Clone". No matter what image you
choose, there will be exceptions to suit your
taste and give you an individualize "look". A

little can go a long way. Some folks find exces-
sive metal, rings, tattoos etc., ugly and disgust-
ing, so beware of being too different if you are
trying to meet in the main stream. Since you
answer only to yourself, accessorize to your
hearts content especially if you are looking for
a special perv, kink or friend.

Leather is cheap here in the states but not ne-
cessarily of bad quality. A starter outfit for under
\$400.00 can be expected and you can do it piece-
meal. For those on a limited budget, I suggest the
following order to pull your wardrobe together.

1. Boots, if only one pair, make them black.
They can be lace up (military, logger, lineman,
brogans and other work types) or pull on (engi-
neer, western or wellingtons). Price - Fleet Farm,
Wal-mart, KMart - \$100.00 give or take. Outlet
stores for brand names like Red Wing,
Chippawa, Caroline and Whites give you a more
distinctive boot & the price increase should be less
than double. Look them all over before buying.

A cheap looking boot, can not be improved
on but it don't take a Wesco to look good. To
see the difference, look at the Milwaukee Bike
Cops. You can almost see "cheap & wimpy"
stamped on some of them. Others say - -
"friggen A, I'm hot". I personally believe that
men with proud and hot boots, have a good,
solid masculine opinion of themselves. The
next time you see a pair of hot boots (cop or
not), watch the man in them. He will be stand-
ing straighter and walking sprightlier than the

man in similar but wimpier boots. You Booters
know of what I speak.

2. Leather vest - Changing Times (Brady
Street), Leather Empire and Real Leather Outlet
(Loomis, just north of I 894) \$ 65.00 or less.
One draw back - - most of what is on the mar-
ket, is snapped, buttoned or zipped up the front
and most guys with out bikes, don't dig that. It
would be well to consider getting custom made
or seeking out a Gay leather outlet before you
snap one of these up. The price will be about
double BUT it will be what you want and for
eons, you will be comfortable wearing it.

3. Leather Jacket, all of the above places and
just about everywhere else, about \$100.00 the
last time I looked. The above items are made
for companies like First Gear and more than
likely by cheap labor in some far off Asian
country. The style and quality might be a little
less than hoped for - - BUT if you can handle
the above, it will do for now.

Much of Harley-Davidson, Drag, Vanson
and the like are now claiming their garments are
made in the USA, the quality is better to damn
good. Some of the price tags will bring on
sticker shock - - but look them over and if you
like, wait for a sale to buy.

some up scale sources as well as the creme
