



May 6, 1971 (28 years ago this week): The Gay Activists Alliance Firehouse an early gay community center, opens in lower Manhattan.

# What was the Gay Activists Alliance?

In the aftermath of the Stonewall riots of June 1969, a gay liberation movement quickly began to emerge, with organizations sprouting up first in New York City and then in cities around the country. These new groups used the word "gay" proudly in their names, instead of the more cautious terms like "homophile" favored by earlier gay-rights organizations.

At the front of the pack was the Gay Liberation Front, which got its start a month after Stonewall. The name was meant to echo that of the National Liberation Front of Vietnam, a Marxist group, but also to signify a far-ranging movement instead of one monolithic organization.

GLF staggered early on, suffering from a lack of structure and leadership. Meetings could be freewheeling and fragmented, with lots of infighting. Some of those involved became dissatisfied that the founders wanted to extend the group's focus to include issues like peace and ecology. Many women were disgruntled by the sexism they encountered in GLF. Some transgendered people also found themselves unwelcome. Before long, GLF members began to splinter off and form other groups. In December 1969, approximately 10 defectors from GLF worked up a constitution for a new organization they named the Gav Activists Alliance.

Unlike GLF, GAA declined to address non-gay-specific issues. It also created a hierarchical structure of officers, committees, and members, with meetings run according to Roberts Rules of Order. GAA embodied what one gay journalist called "middle-of-the-road radicalism." The group used radical tactics-like sit-ins and heckling and perfected the "zap," a surprise disruption. But GAA was interested less in effecting sweeping social change than in improving the lot of lesbians and gay men, mostly through legislative and electoral means.

GAA grew quickly after the group took a leading role in the demonstrations that followed the March 1970 controversy over the impaling of Diego Vinales, which set off a protest on which GLF and GAA cooperated, but which GAA largely orchestrated. A major coup for GAA was the enlistment of then-Congressman Ed Koch in trying to end police harassment of gay bars.

Shortly after the Vinales incident, GAA noisily disrupted several of Mayor John Lindsay's public appearances. In April 1970, the group zapped the mayor's speech at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and also the taping of his weekly TV talk show. A man from the group rushed onto the stage, crying: "Homosexuals want an end to job discrimination!" Other GAA-ers joined in, interrupting the mayor's conversation about pollution with guest Arthur Godfrey. "What good is environmental freedom if we don't have personal freedom?" a lesbian

Within days of the disturbance, GAA obtained meetings with both the deputy mayor and the chair of the city's Commission on Human Rights to discuss anti-gay discrimination and harassment. GAA initiated demands for a municipal gay rights ordinance, though it would take a full 15 years for such a bill to pass the city council.

In 1971, GAA set up headquarters in downtown Manhattan. The Firehouse, which opened on May 6, was an abandoned, turn-of-thecentury fire station in Soho that the group leased and transformed into

a gay social and cultural center. On the first floor, a large mural depicted various aspects of the lesbian and gay story - portraits of forefathers and foremothers like Walt Whitman and Gertrude Stein; a gay man behind bars; couples holding hands - interspersed with slogans of the day like "Gay Power."

In addition to general membership and committee meetings, the Firehouse hosted popular community dances. On Saturday nights, the meeting hall was transformed into a dance space that pulsed with disco music and attracted as many as 1,500 dancers, mostly men. Since gay bars in New York were still owned by the Mafia, the Firehouse provided an alternative to the seediness and danger of the bar scene at that time. For two dollars a head, gay people could dance all night and drink unlimited beer and soda.

Despite its accomplishments, GAA remained a very white, very male organization that fell under heavy criticism for its insularity and lack of attention to racism and sexism. Some women of color referred to the Firehouse as "a white boy's playhouse."

Over the next couple of years, GAA's focus became increasingly more social than political. In 1974, the Firehouse was burned by arsonists, and GAA never fully recovered from the loss. It finally dis-

The legacy of GAA, however, has lived on in lesbian and gay organizations like the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force and the Human Rights Campaign, in the zap-like tactics of ACT UP and the Lesbian Avengers, and in the gay community centers that dot the country. Like its predecessor, the New York Lesbian and Gay Community Services Center continued through the 1990s to charge only \$2 a head for social and cultural activities, and today it still serves as the hub of gay activity in the city.





The ad shows two men holding hands. Above a Bud Light logo is that brand's slogan, "Be Yourself and Make It a Bud Light." The local version of the ad also carries a tagline saying, "Proud Sponsor of the St. Louis PrideFest '99." Ramey, the alternative lifestyle manager for the Bud Light brand. said Tuesday that the brewery has been marketing to gays and lesbians for more than 20 years. But he said he knew of no other A-B ad that featured obviously gay people.

Anheuser-Busch is among a dozen or so major companies that have taken such a step, said William Waybourn, president of Window Communications, a company in Washington and Los Angeles that provides advertising, marketing and public relations services for companies trying to reach gay

audiences. Others include Camel cigarettes. American Express, Virgin Atlantic Airline and Absolut vodka, he said.

In the past, advertisers may have feared a backlash from anti-gay groups. But not anymore, Waybourn said.

Last fall's brutal killing of Matthew Shepard, a University of Wyoming student, also has made the public more sympathetic to gays"


