

PRESIDENT OBAMA ORDERS NEW MEDICAL RIGHTS FOR GAY PARTNERS

Washington DC - While last minute tax filers rushed to the Post Office, equality for LGBT people in the US took and important step forward on Thursday, April 15, 2010 as President Obama ordered his health secretary to issue new rules aimed at granting hospital visiting rights to same-sex partners. The White House announced the rule changes in a memorandum, which will also make it easier for gay men and lesbians to make medical decisions on behalf of their partners.

Obama instructed his Health and Human Services secretary to draft new rules that requiried hospitals receiving Medicare and Medicaid payments to grant patients the right to designate the person(s) who can visit and consult with them at crucial moments.

The rules would treat designated visitors, including those legally designated (such as durable powers of attorney and health care proxies) privileges the same as those immediate family members enjoy.

"There are few moments in our lives that call for greater compassion and companionship than when a loved one is admitted to the hospital." writes President Obama in the memorandum. "Yet every day, all across America, patients are denied the kindnesses and caring of a loved one at their sides -- whether in a sudden medical emergency or a prolonged hospital

stay. Also uniquely affected are gay and lesbian Americans who are often barred from the bedsides of the partners with whom they may have spent decades of their lives -- unable to be there for the person they love, and unable to act as a legal surrogate if their partner is incapacitated." said Mr Obama.

"Richard Socarides, who advised President Bill Clinton on gay rights issues, said that while the memorandum on its own did not grant any new rights, it did "draw attention to the very real and tragic situations many gays and lesbians face when a partner is hospitalized." wrote Sheryl Stolberg in the New York Times.

Ordering the Department of Health and Human Services to find a better way, was a hope of many of us in the LGBT community when Mr. Obama was inaugurated. Although Mr. Obama's order has no immediate effect, gay rights groups called it a major advance for the families of LGBT individuals.

"It's a huge deal," said David Smith, vice president of policy for the Human Rights Campaign, which worked with the White House to develop the memorandum." quoted the New York Times.

"Nearly every hospital in the country will now be required to provide hospital visitation rights to LGBT families." continues Mr Smith.



"President Obama's decision to direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to take steps to ensure that hospitals participating in Medicare or Medicaid respect the rights of patients to receive visitors and designate others to make decisions about medical care in the case of an emergency is the right one. It follows the lead of many states and makes a strong statement about who we are as a nation and what we value." writes Congresswoman Tammy Baldwin in a prepared statement. "President Obama's action tonight puts us another step closer toward our goal of equal rights for all Americans and I applaud his decision." says Baldwin.

GLAAD is encouraging journalists to talk with groups like the Survivors Network of Those Abused by Priests (SNAP), Call to Action, Voice of the Faithful, and other organizations that are giving voice to the victims of clergy abuse and calling for accountability by the church.

The most recent scandal concerning Priest sexual abuse stems from European investigations into alleged misconduct in Italy and included information relating to the current Pope, then Cardinal Ratzinger, and other top Vatican officials who had decided not to defrock a Milwaukee Priest, Father Lawrence Murphy who molested as many as 200 deaf boys despite pleas from Wisconsin clergy to remove him. The case in Italy is similar where 67 deaf men and women accused two dozen priests of raping and molesting children for years.

GLADD & DIGNITY USA URGE MEDIA TO USE CAUTION IN REPORTING VATICAN STATEMENTS

New York - GLAAD joined with DignityUSA in expressing concern about how media are covering recent comments about the Catholic Church sex abuse scandal by two Vatican officials: Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone and Rev. Federico Lombardi.

While traveling in Chile this week, the Vatican's second highest-ranking authority told reporters: "Many psychologists and psychiatrists have demonstrated that there is no relation between celibacy and pedophilia. But many others have demonstrated, I have been told recently, that there is a relation between homosexuality and pedophilia. That is true," said Bertone. "That is the problem."

Vatican spokesman Rev. Federico Lombardi elaborated on Bertone's comments, telling reporters: "Church authorities do not have the competency to make general statements about medical or psychological issues, which we, of course, refer to specialists. [Cardinal Bertone] was evidently speaking about

abuse on the part of priests and not in the general population."

"These are just the latest, desperate attempts from the Vatican to change the subject, said Marianne Duddy-Burke, Executive Director of Dignity USA. "It's time for our church leaders to stop looking for someone else to blame, and to confront the abuse of power and the cover-ups that are the real root of this scandal."

GLAAD urged the media to carefully examine the timing and apparent motives behind the comments.

"There's a clear pattern here," said Rashad Robinson, Senior Director of Media Programs at GLAAD. "Every day we seem to be seeing a new attempt by some church leaders to distract people from the real

issues at the heart of the abuse crisis. And as the desperation increases, the ugliness of the attacks seems to be worsening."



POSTER BOY FOR WORD OF FAITH MOVEMENT TO SPEAK IN MARSHFIELD AND JANESVILLE SPARKING CONTROVERSY

Marshfiled, WI- Michael Williams, once the 'poster boy' for the Word of Faith movement in America is the guest speaker of a three day conference April 29 through May 1. The 2010 Upper Midwest Gospel Revolution Conference at the Senior Center next to the Marshfield Public Library begins at 7 pm Thursday April 29. A 6:00 pm meeting on Friday April 30 and Satur-



In a press release sent to Quest, Jeff Robertson says Mike Williams, a gay preacher and the guest speaker of the three-day conference, has shared the same platform with popular evangelical Christians such as Joel Osteen of Lakeland Church in Houston, TX and Pat Robertson of the 700 Club television broadcast, but you won't find his message in much agreement with either Osteen or Robertson. Williams sums up evangelical Christianity to be based on a requirement to believe in Jesus Christ or suffer punishment in hell, "which is absolutely counter to the Gospel of peace and grace," says Williams. According to Williams, Christianity



preaches grace on the one hand and then binds it with a moral code and a future threat of judgment and punishment. "To know yourself truly and to set your own moral compass, it must be in the absence of the threat of punishment. Setting boundaries to God's grace does not control the morality of man" says Williams.

Williams gained notoriety being one of the first high profile 'Ex- gays' to openly acknowledge years later that he was in fact still gay. Williams decided to keep teaching spirituality despite those calling him no longer qualified.

The controversy of Williams' teachings have some in the Christian community upset calling Williams' message "unscriptural" and "sick" James Washburn, the organizer of the conference, says "Williams strictly teaches from the Bible putting verses in the context of chapters and chapters in the context of entire books of the Bible." According to Williams, people like to base an entire doctrine or belief on a verse or two, to which he replies, "I see your verse and raise you a chapter."

UNITED STATES ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL THOMAS E. PEREZ TO SPEAK AT THE MILWAUKEE LGBT COMMUNITY CENTER

Milwaukee, WI- Mr. Thomas E. Perez, the Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice will speak in the community room of the Milwaukee LGBT Community Center on Friday, April 23, 2010 at 10:45am. The event is hosted by the Milwaukee LGBT Community Center.

The U.S. Department of Justice Civil Rights Division is the institution within the federal government responsible for enforcing federal statutes prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, sex, disability, religion, and national origin. The Division was established on December 9, 1957.

"The Milwaukee LGBT Community Center is delighted to have the esteemed honor and pleasure of hosting Assistant Attorney General Perez as he visits Milwaukee. I am confident that we will gain invaluable knowledge and insight regarding hate crimes and other civil rights issues affecting our community from Attorney General Perez as a result of his highly anticipated visit," said, Dr. Maggi Cage, Executive Director of the Milwaukee LGBT Community Center.

Mr. Perez has spent his entire career in public service. From 2002 until 2006, he was a member of the Montgomery County Council. He was the first Latino ever elected to the Council, and



served as Council President in 2005. Earlier in his career, he spent 12 years in federal public service, most of them as a career attorney with the Civil Rights Division. As a federal prosecutor for the Division, he prosecuted and supervised the prosecution of some of the Department's most high profile civil rights cases, including a hate

crimes case in Texas involving a group of white supremacists who went on a deadly, racially motivated crime spree. Mr. Perez later served as Deputy Assistant Attorney General for Civil Rights under Attorney General Janet Reno. Among other responsibilities, he chaired the interagency Worker Exploitation Task Force, which oversaw a variety of initiatives designed to protect vulnerable workers. He also served as Special Counsel to the late Senator Edward Kennedy, and was Senator Kennedy's principal adviser on civil rights, criminal justice and constitutional issues. For the final two years of the Clinton administration, Mr. Perez served as the Director of the Office for Civil Rights at the United States Department of Health and Human Services. Mr. Perez was a law professor for six years at University of Maryland School of Law and was a parttime professor at the George Washington School of Public Health.



NATIONAL DAY OF SILENCE 2010 IN MADSION

Madison. WI - Students in Madison and other cities in Wisconsin joined the thousands of students nationwide in participating in a Day of Silence Friday, April 16 to bring attention to name-calling, bullying and harassment that many youth encounter daily based on their actual or perceived sexual orientation and gender expression/identity.

Founded in 1996, the Day of Silence has become the largest single student-led action towards creating safer schools for all, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. From the first-ever Day of Silence at the University of Virginia in 1996, to the organizing efforts in over 8,000 middle schools, high schools, colleges and universities across the country today, its textured history reflects its diversity in both numbers and reach.

Students organized the first Day of Silence, its original name, at the University of Virginia. With over 150 students participating, those involved felt it was a great success.

Rea Carey, Executive Director National Gay and Lesbian Task Force sent in a prepared statement, "The Task Force salutes each and every student keeping silent today to advocate for schools that are free of bullying and harassment. We know that young people risk their safety every day in order to attend schools that provide cover to and ignore the bullies who can make their lives living hell while adults look the other way. Adults must act to stop the epidemic of school harassment that diminishes the safety of all, but particularly leaves young lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people isolated, afraid and desperate.

The recent suicide of 15-year-old Phoebe Prince in South Hadley, Mass., underscores in the most stark way the need for adults to intervene when they witness bullying of students. We've also heard the recent stories of two students who survived bullying at Itawamba Agricultural High School in Fulton, Miss. Constance McMillen was the victim of a mean trick by her fellow students and their parents when she was invited to a sparsely attended 'prom' while most of her other classmates partied at a different event. Meanwhile, Juin Baize was driven out of Fulton for wearing clothing the principal deemed 'a distraction.' He sought refuge and a better high school environment in Florida.'

Congressman Eliot Engel (D-NY) and Congresswoman Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) both urged participation in the event.

Rep, Engel introduced H.Con.Res 92 in 2009, with 40 co-sponsors, to support the goals and ideals of the National Day of Silence. Rep. Baldwin is one of the original co-sponsors. According to GLSEN's 2007 National School Climate Survey, nearly nine out of ten LGBT students report verbal, sexual or physical harassment at school and more than 30 percent report missing at least one day of school for fear of their personal safety.

"Sadly, violence and discrimination against LGBT youth is all-too-common in American schools. It is a national disgrace that students feel threatened in school simply because of their sexual orientation," said Rep. Engel.

"Lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender students

continue to face pervasive harassment and victimization in schools. As students use their silence to demand safe schools, we in Congress must use our voices to support them," said Congresswoman Baldwin, cochair of the Congressional LGBT Equality Caucus.

- GLSEN provieds these statistics: · More than 85 percent of LGBT students have been
- verbally harassed; · Nearly 20 percent of LGBT students were physically assaulted by their peers at school;
- · Almost 40 percent of LGBT students reported that faculty and staff never intervene when homophobic language is used in their presence.

GLSEN Executive Director Eliza Byard said, "These students are coming together to raise awareness

about the pervasive problem of anti-LGBT bullying in schools. That so many young people care about making their schools safer makes us hopeful that we can work together to make our schools welcome environments for everyone."

"The National Day of Silence brings an important focus to the bullying and name-calling that many lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) students have to endure while trying to attend school" said Joe Solmonese, President of the Human Rights Campaign. "All students, regardless of their sexual orientation and gender identity, should be able to receive an education in a safe and supportive environment.

Milwaukee's humorist and storyteller John McGivern debuts at Renaissance Theater-Steven Tomlinson, directed by lenny Wanasek. It's about more than crockery.

QUEST's Paul Masterson recently spoke to Mc-Givern about his latest performance.

QUEST: Tell us how the production came about.

John McGivern: American Fiesta was staged in New York City with great success. Renaissance contacted me about doing it a few years ago. Then the rights were released. But I still had to read in front the women at Renais-

QUEST: And, you got the part...

IMcG: Yes, I think I was the only one who auditioned.

QUEST: It's obviously about a collector's obsession with that all-American icon of pottery, Fiestaware. I sense a metaphor.

IMcG: It's one big metaphor about the hunt. Steven, the gay boy from Oklahoma lives with his Mexican-American partner, Leon. They go to Canada to get married. Then it's back to Oklahoma and the odyssey begins. His mother rejects the notion of her son in a gay relationship. She says, "why do you come home and talk about things we try to forget?" As they leave town, they discover a size 7 Fiesta bowl for \$500. The dealer refuses to sell it to them and gives them a Bible instead.

OUEST: Then the hunt for Fiesta continues...

JMcG: of course... but, Steven only looks for red or blue pieces. Now the metaphor refers to the red and blue states. The play is about Steven and Leon's experiences in those states and the people they meet as the journey progresses. The whole process is that journey from discovery to recognition.

QUEST: For the collector, the psychology varies. The obsession is in the hunt to find every piece of a set or every pattern. American Fiesta is about that purpose, isn't it?

IMcG: Some collectors, like Steven, pursue perfection while others find solace in damaged goods. There's a scene in which he gets a piece from eBay. He finds a flaw and rejects it completely. His partner, Leon, says "I'm glad we didn't meet on eBay." It's heart wrenching. Another character is a blind woman w h o takes damaged pieces and repairs them. Ultimately it's all about our relationships and memories. OUEST: You're a

the show fit your performance style?

JMcG: American Fiesta is exactly that – a story worth telling. It's a good theatrical piece because it takes different perspectives. The play is a solo show; I play around 20 characters – some are women, like Steven's mother. The piece is sweet... lovely... speaking to so much. It's much more than a simple story.

storyteller. How does

QUEST: Gay marriage is a hot political issue – espe-

cially given the circumstances here in Wisconsin. It sounds like American Fiesta avoids confrontation in deference to being sweet and lovely.

JMcG: Not at all! Yes, it's political. It's incredibly political. It's about the right to marry but not as a constitutional issue. Steven spells it out when he says exactly that: "everyone deserves the right to marry. How else can you get your mom to release you?" People will walk out of the show with a clearer sense that it's not solely about blue and red politics but an inalienable human right... an inherent rite of passage for everyone.

QUEST: This is a very relevant gay play but some in the LGBT community criticize you for not being more of an activist. They would say you have the ear of an essentially non-LGBT audience but haven't used it to advance LGBT rights.

IMcG: My career started with gay shows in 1994 at the Bailiwick Theater in Chicago, Comedy Central in '95 then I did a Toronto gay and lesbian festival, "We're funny that way."

Now, the majority of my audience is straight – and older. There are always lots of lesbians. The gay men you can count on one hand. Some say I'm not part of the community because I don't do a specifically "gay" show. But, my stories have to be "gay" because I am. I mention my partner and the stories are from a gay perspective and sensibility.

QUEST: So, your message is delivered quietly.

JM: I like that. Yes, it's delivered "quietly." I do think I do a service. People come out of my show thinking... and recognizing our community. They're being changed "quietly." It's like the guerilla gay bar movement. I went to a guerilla gay bar night. People were like "look at all the handsome men. My god, they're all gay!"

QUEST: Back to American Fiesta...is there a happy ending?

IMcG: HELLO!



"A Hundred or More Hidden Things" by Mark Griffin

Everybody has an opinion.

Half the country votes one way, the other half votes differently. Issues are favored in that corner and vilified in this one. You might love doing something that would horrify someone else, so you keep your opinions to yourself.

And then there are those who march to a different drummer, seemingly unaware or uncaring about what others think – which describes the life of Vincente Minnelli in many ways. In the new book "A Hundred or More Hidden Things" by Mark Griffin, you'll read about the life, work, and eccentricities of this enigmatic man.

Lester Anthony Minnelli was born in 1903, the sixth child of Italian-American parents. Baby Lester was practically born on the stage; his father and uncle owned the Minnelli Brothers Mighty Dramatic Company Under Canvas, and his mother was a performer with the troupe.

As soon as he was old enough, Lester left his family in Ohio and moved to Chicago. Extremely creative (he loved to draw and design), the job he landed as window dresser for a major department store was perfect for him. It was also a perfect time to design a new life for himself.

Lester Minnelli changed his name to "Vincente" and shaved four years off his age. He also changed his background: for the rest of his life, he denied that he had an older brother who was developmentally disabled. Transformation complete, Minnelli emerged a new man and moved to New

York. Broadway was the obvious place for someone with such creativity, and Minnelli flourished. Though he was happy in New York, he tried Hollywood but didn't like it and returned to the Big Apple. When a friend convinced Minnelli to try film-making again, it was a turning point in his career, and personally.


Throughout his life, friends and colleagues knew Minnelli as a quiet, reserved man who, though obviously brilliant behind the camera, seemed reluctant to give directions to performers. Many noticed his fondness for wearing women's make-up, which led to rumors of homosexuality. Others denied those rumors, pointing to Minnelli's four wives as proof otherwise.

When Vincente Minnelli died in July, 1986, the truth died with him.

Author Mark Griffin says that he became fascinated with Vincente Minnelli films one summer when he was struggling with typical adolescent issues. His friends hassled him about his obsession, but that focus served him well: he used it to create a well-written biography.

"A Hundred or More Hidden Things" includes an exhaustive list of Broadway stars and shows in which Minnelli worked, as well as a filmography. What fans are going to want out of this book, though, is more of Minnelli's personal story and an answer to the was-he-or-wasn't-he gay question. Though Griffin wasn't able to nail down anything definitive, judging by this book, he sure tried.

If you're a theatre fanatic, old-movie buff, or if you want a fascinating biography that accurately



depicts a time long gone, look for this one. In my opinion, "A Hundred or More Hidden Things" is a pretty good book.

It's Your Mother at the Boulevard

A mother is a universal truth. We all have one. A mother represents that common bond and common bane of all humanity.

The Boulevard Ensemble Studio Theatre closes it's 24th season with the regional premiere of a new work by Patricia Durante and Betsy Tuxhill's, *It's Your Mother*, directed by artistic director, Mark Bucher. It's a tribute to, a plaint about mothers. It presents sundry true confessions, anecdotes and those ubiquitous guilt-tinged phone messages all wrapped into a reality based play – in this case, specifically, the mother-daughter dynamic.

But, in a conversation with Durante, she explained that the roles could be altered to suit. Although written by two women from the perspective of daughters, scenes can be cast according to preference. For example, the married couple can be same-sex of any gender.

The 75 minutes play is a sequence of vignettes and scenes of maternal moments punctuated by 21 quintessential motherly messages on the answering machine. There's a lot the audience can relate to.

The meager set is typical barebones Boulevard. A few chairs, a table and an old couch become a car, assorted living rooms and offices. The back wall is full of framed photos of the cast's mothers. It's basic and works but it puts extraordinary demands on the cast's ability to focus the audience and convince it to see beyond the barren stage.

Opening with a cacophonous Bucherian overture of voices, the stage is set for the exploration of all



things maternal. Then, two vignettes introduce the theme of adult children dealing with mothers. The first depicts sisters on a car ride to that obligatory family Thanksgiving at mom's house. They review the childhood roles they'll recreate in deference to those traditional delegations of duties from cleaning to table setting. For the sake of common sanity, they list topics of conversation to be avoided (such as tattoos and failed marriages). The next scene is a daughter's first visit home after leaving for college. The daughter's nose piercing and boyfriends preoccupy the mother's interrogation.

It's a slow start. Enacting the ride on a couple of chairs makes the extended dialogue seem a bit longwinded. The first mother-daughter scene begins with the mother's admonishments and ends with well-tempered dialogue. It seemed a tentative.

From there, the energy picked up. The intermit-

tent but persistent phone messages and scenes bring the play through the arc that defines the often exasperating disconnects as well as the underlying ultimate connection of the mother-child relationship. There's humor, sentiment and emotion.

In one scene entitled "Is she the man?", mother (Amanda Schlueter) and daughter (Melissa Keith) watch TV soaps while they discuss gay and lesbian relationships. The mother insists on applying hetero-normative gender role expectations. If a gay man is masculine or a lesbian doesn't wear panty hose, they must be "the man." The traditional stereotypes reign despite the daughters attempt to bridge the generational gap.

A delightful wedding planning session with Christine Horgen, as the overbearing mother who has obviously already decided on every detail, and resigned daughter Nicole Gorski reminds us never to declare a war of wills against mom. She's already won before the first shot is fired.

The cast of 15 women and one man manages to move through their monologues and scenes with a momentum. Brooke Wegner, as only-child in therapy, delivers a moving performance as she describes her relationship with her mother. Her introspective silences are as well delivered as her lines.

All in all, It's Your Mother succeeds in what it sets out to do – it lets the audience laugh and cry, recalling their individual stories that are probably not so different, if not completely identical to those recounted in the play.
