HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE WINNING 2011 MIDWEST IGRAB TOURNAMENT IN CHICAGO

Madison - The Madison Minotaurs Rugby Club ended their 2011 spring season with a shut out performance in the Midwest IGRAB Rugby Tournament held in Chicago last weekend, beating the St. Louis Crusaders (34-0), Charlotte Royals (34-0), Kansas City Carnivores (17-0 and 19-0), and the Chicago Dragons (12-0) in the Championship game .


The Madison Minotaurs represent the smallest city in the IGRAB League, which represents global cities including Sydney, New York, San

LALA's unique mix of music, culture, fashion and performance present a creative formula that is purely her own design. Born in Hong Kong from Chinese parents and raised in Canada, LALA is blending eastern and western traditions that speak to an entirely new generation of dance music fans. She'll perform her new dance smash, "I Miss You", at Milwaukee Pride on June 11th.

"My first introduction to music was through Bollywood," explains LALA. She was captivated by the colorful mélange of music, dance and fashion from Indian pop culture. "Even though my home life stuck close to our Chinese roots, I found myself drawn to East Indian traditions. Still, I knew I would need to reach beyond them if I were to make it in the United States."

Confident in her ability to sing, and testing the limits of her comfort zone, a young LALA experimented and exposed herself to all types of music. "I became deeply entrenched into the hip-hop and r&b worlds," she says. "I love r&b music because it allows you to stretch your vocals to the highest heights. All the greatest singers that I admire come from the world of r&b."

She began crafting lyrical hip hop rhymes that spoke to her culture and Asian influence. "But people saw it as

cultural music," LALA continues, "and I wanted to be more mainstream." Feeling she would never find true acceptance in hip hop, she resigned herself to explore even more genres. "I was drawn to dance music because I love to perform and the reaction from the crowds in clubs is instantaneous."

LALA hooked up with the remix/production team Maniacalm on the single "Never Forget You", a song that would become her first Billboard charting hit. "Maniacalm was looking for a singer to sing on the track, and when they offered it to me, I didn't think twice about it."

The single, released on Red Stick/Strictly Rhythm Records, caught fire in dance clubs and radio nearly instantaneously, rising to #5 on the Dance Radio Airplay charts. LALA and Maniacalm quickly followed it with the sonically stirring "I Miss You" (co-written by LALA), a song that is playing in clubs and on dance radio now and is about to begin climbing the Billboard charts.

"I am so grateful of the reception I have received from gay fans," says LALA. "They're the first crowd to really get me and understand my desire to be loved for my differences. When I'm on stage in front of my gay boys and girls, I feed off their positive vibe. I swear I would shower in it if I could."



If you were around "back in the day," and by that I mean, the last couple of decades of Milwaukee's gay 20th century, you may remember going to restaurants that catered to an almost exclusively LGBT clientele. Those places were a community response to either overt discrimination at mainstream venues or simply an option where we could feel comfortable. For the most part, they were owned and operated by members of the community.

Glass Menagerie immediately comes to mind. It opened in 1977 as the Sideboard, a restaurant attached

to the M&M Club serving a soup and sandwich lunch menu. In 1983 it became known as the *Glass Menagerie*. It featured a general menu of down-home food with specialties – like its famous Monte Cristo burger. Of course, it had a Sunday brunch and a traditional Friday fish fry. The restaurant expanded with the addition



of an atrium and a patio. For many, it was their favorite place to dine with friends. It closed, along with the M&M Club in 2006, ending nearly three decades of LGBT culinary history.

Another eatery with a somewhat checkered history was Walker's Point Café. It opened in the mid-1980's. It was located next to the old

1100 Club on South 1st Street and Washington Avenue. Anyone who remembers it fondly recalls its late night after-bar ambiance rather than the food. With a full diversity of patrons from drag queens to leather guys after hours, to young LGBT people during the day, Walker's Point Café offered a central meeting point for the community.

A relatively recent addition to the restaurant scene was the Tazzbah. It opened on the 1700 block of West Pierce Street in December, 2004. A beau-

tifully renovated old Milwaukee storefront, the Tazzbah menu offered sandwiches and wraps as well as the obligatory Milwaukee fish fry. It's auspicious opening and initial success, buoyed in part by the closure of M&M's, only sustained the business until late summer of 2007. Despite its excellent food and atmosphere, the

off-the-beaten-path location resulted in an ever-decreasing number of patrons.

Grubb's Pub which later became ETC, and is part of LaCage is the most recent to end food service (at least for now.) There were others restaurants that came and went over the course of the 1980's and 90's. Few lasted more than a couple of years. For hungry patrons, some bars still offer pizza, popcorn and peanuts. But it's just not the same.

Mona's Out and About

There's only one remaining LGBT owned restaurant in Walker's Point still catering to a community clientele. Mona's Restaurant and Nightclub at 1407 South 1st Street opened in 2003 with a full spectrum of amenities: a dance floor, bar and a restaurant with outside dining on the patio. Its menu has changed over the years but the mainstays like pizza, burgers, wraps and desserts have remained. Prices have always been reasonable.

A new menu is being launched for this summer season. Innovative new selections include specialty burgers, homemade pizza, barbecue chicken and lots of appetizers.

Owner Pam Norby has followed the taste trends of her patrons. She's planned the new

menu accordingly. "We are totally aware of new health consciousness in eating - a lot of the new menu is based on Dr. Oz's advice. There are salads with boiled egg and honey roasted peanuts, sweet potato fries, and veggie pizzas. Still, our customers have certain expectations so we'll continue to serve our classic dishes as well, like the Mighty Meaty pizza. But, above all, we know there's a range of tastes we have to satisfy. Variety is the key. There'll be daily specials like Cajun Chicken, Black Bean Chili, and more than a few surprises" Norby said.

"We've expanded the appetizer list, too. Some people just want a snack to go with their drinks. But again, we want to make even a light meal memorable as well as satisfying. Our staff is American and Mexican so our cuisine reflects those influences. We have a spectacular nacho recipe with Mexican queso fresco instead of the typical yellow cheese. It gives a fresh new experience to what has become dull standard fare. And, we'll have incredibly delicious Coconut Shrimp based on a Fort Lauderdale recipe. Again, there are classics like huge Mozzarella Sticks that bring us back to Wisconsin," Norby said.

PrideParade kicks off Mona's new Sunday Brunch

Sunday morning has long been an excuse to go out for brunch. Mona's new brunch menu will be launched on Sunday, June 12, to coincide with the PrideParade assembly right outside the restaurant. In the past, PrideParade participants have enjoyed Mona's as a first stop for the morning set up. This year they'll enjoy an entirely new brunch concept. Of course, it'll be served on Mona's outdoor patio.

"People love the patio. It's been especially popular with the brunch crowd. The brunch will be different than in the past. Rather than a buffet style we decided to go with fixed menu selections. We have 10 entrees to choose from. They range from the typical egg selections to a wide variety of omelets. Brunch will be served through the summer and fall on the patio as long as weather permits," Norby said.

Food service at Mona's is offered Tuesdays through Fridays from 4-10pm and, in addition to the brunch, from 6-10pm on Sundays. Due to bar events, the kitchen will be closed on Saturdays.

bookworm sez by Terri Schlichenmeyer

"Transition" by Chaz Bono (with Billie Fitzpatrick) c.2011, Dutton \$25.95 / \$30.00 Canada 245 pages

The face in the mirror is yours.

Yes, you recognize that chin, the eyes that droop when fatigued, the mouth that's etched parentheses around itself, as if to enclose something you said. That's your hair. Those are your ears. That's your nose.

It's you there in the mirror – the outside you – but inside, well, what you see isn't

what you know. In the new book "Transition" by Chaz Bono (with Billie Fitzpatrick), you'll read what it's like to feel like you're in the wrong body, and how a tiny Hollywood darling became a man.

On the wall of his home, Chaz Bono has a picture of himself and his parents, taken when he was a tod-dler. They all look happy, Bono says, but he doesn't remember that day, or much of his childhood.

What he does remember, though, is that he always felt like a boy, even though he was the daughter of Sonny and Cher.

Bono says that, as a child, he dressed in boy clothes as much as possible and answered to a boy's nickname. He played with boys at school and his best friend was a boy. Nobody thought much about it, he says. That's just the way it was.

Puberty was rough and Bono came out as a lesbian, but something still wasn't quite right. He didn't identify with women, gay or otherwise, and distant feelings of masculinity colored his relationships with them and with his family. Still, he lived his life as a woman: falling in love, starting a band, buying a house, and trying to stay out of the public eye.

Bono's father seemed supportive of his lesbianism. His mother had trouble with it. But happiness eluded Bono and he turned to drugs to cope with the frustration. By then, though, he thought he knew what he needed to do...

On March 20, 2009, he says "I drove myself to the doctor's office... I felt only confident

that what I was doing was right."


"After all the years of fear, ambivalence, doubts, and emotional torture, the day had finally come. I was on testosterone, and I have never looked back – not once."

Author Chaz Bono says at one point that he was never very good at transitions. He did a pretty good job at this one, with a few minor bumps.

"Transition" is filled with angst, anger, sadness, and pain, topped off with wonderment and joy. It's also repetitious, contains a few delicately squirmy moments, and its occasional bogginess is a challenge for wandering minds.

For wondering minds, Bono is quick to defend and explain away his family's reluctance to accept his gender reassignment, but he's also willing to admit to being hurt by it. Still, contentment and awe shine forth at the end of this book, and readers will breathe a sigh of relief for it.

If you can face the slowness that crops up in "Transition" now and then, you'll find it to be a pretty good memoir. For you, it's a book to put your hands on.


Still, after the set, Skip assures me there's hope. "I got another text," he says. "You're right. He spelled out what he wants this time."

"Not in a text," Skip smirks. "If he wants sex, he needs to ask for it in person. Until then, forgetting to reply is the best way to remind him he needs practice."







Before flexing his muscles on MTV's *The Real World*, Scott Herman was a self described 'weakling'. At 12, he found weights in his father's basement and embarked on a rigorous six-days-of-the-week two-hours-each-day fitness program. He also changed his diet to a high carbohydrate plan of pasta, bagels, rice, and grilled chicken; then added Syntha-6, a protein supplement, along with multivitamins for added nutrients.

Ten years of training has given Scott Herman superhero looks and the confidence to match. He doesn't deny that the muscles help him in the dating arena, but he says they've also given him the strength to stand up for what he believes is right.

In response to the recent LGBT attacks and gay teen suicides, Scott has been a vocal advocate against discrimination. "It's not a problem we can ignore any longer," he says. "I've learned when you ignore bullies; they find someone weaker to pick on. Maybe it's the big brother in me speaking, but I want to be a shield for guys who may not be strong enough to take a stand."


In his latest shoot, Scott was convinced to take a dip in a cold New England lake in his underwear. The photographer said it would be symbolic of the dip he has taken in his fight for gay rights. Lucky for us, Scott bought it.

Where did you shoot these latest photos? They were shot in a lake in Maine.

Early spring in New England is still chilly.I am a New Hampshire boy. The cold is my friend.

No one said the life of a model was easy.

It isn't that the shoots are super hard. It's sitting around for long hours that can be a drag. I'm always on the go. When I arrive at a shoot, I want to bang out the pictures as quickly as possible.



Are you willing to do anything to get the perfect shot? Most anything. (laughs)

Would you shoot a swimwear spread in the arctic? Heck no. I give everything I do 110% but my Dad taught me a valuable lesson when I was young. He said, "Work smart, not hard". I'd prefer a swimwear spread in front of a green screen where they bring in a graphic artist to superimpose arctic scenes into the background.

Would you swim naked in a leach-infested pond? I may be a model but I ain't stupid (laughs).

There was a serious side to the lake shoot. I did it as symbolic nod to the dip I have taken in the fight for gay rights.

What made you take the plunge to publicly announce your support of gay rights?

I have spent my whole life standing up to bullies. I first became publicly involved with the gay community while filming "The Real World: Brooklyn". We did a lot of work with gay teens during the show.

Studies show that gay teen suicide attempts are four times that of heterosexual youth.

In high school, one of my friends came out junior year and I saw how the other guys treated him. I didn't like it. I remember thinking enough is enough. I had to do something about it so I made it known that if anyone picked on him, they would have to answer to me.

Were you as fit then as you are now?

I found fitness when I was 12. I was a very quiet, introverted, weak kid. I needed an outlet for my frustrations and so I began to workout in my basement with my Dad's old weight equipment. The basement was my place of Zen. I could be anything I wanted to be down there. I could push myself as hard as I wanted and each day became physically and mentally stronger. Fitness gave me confidence.

Is it true you were working as a fitness trainer at 14?

Not exactly. I started working at Gold's Gym when I was 14. The other trainers took me under the wing and I would offer advice to new members. I found I genuinely enjoyed teaching others how to better themselves. I was training people full-time at 18 and making a pretty decent living from it.

Do you agree that accepting differences in others is part of a healthy lifestyle?

It sure is. It's so important to be surrounded by positive energy. It is truly the lifeblood of your existence and to reaching your goals! I found that standing up for my friend in high school gave me a sense of power.

How so?

It was the first time I realized how powerful it is to stand up for what is right. If I can be a shield that gives strength to others, then that is what I am going to do.

Were you prepared for the negative feedback you would receive for supporting gay rights?

Not at all. I didn't realize the enormity of the hatred out there.

How has the fitness community reacted to your stance?

For the most part, they've been ok. However, some people continue to leave pretty rude comments on my Youtube videos. They call me fag lover. I get called gay a lot-like it's a bad thing. At the end of the day, I could care less what anonymous fools say because most of them would be too cowardly to say those words to my face. They have to wake up every morning and look at themselves in the mirror. I am not going to waste my time on their nonsense.

The locker room has long been a place for athletes to air discriminatory remarks against gay men. Do you react when you hear teammates jokingly calling each other fairies?

To be honest, I used to use words like "gay" and "fag" with my friends simply because I didn't realize why it was wrong. My brother and his friends have called me a "fag" for as long as I can remember. I didn't know what it meant when I was younger. I only knew it was meant as an insult. Now that I know better, I do not use these words and if I hear them being used "jokingly" I say something.

What do you say?

I simply point out that when you call someone gay in a negative way, you are saying that being gay is wrong.

How do you feel about gay men in the locker room?

Changing in front of anyone doesn't bother me. You can Google search my name and see me in my underwear. It's no big deal to me.

Would you feel comfortable showering next to a gay athlete?

I have never cared much for showering in front of other guys, straight or gay. I value my privacy.

What other issues are you passionate about?

My number one passion is fitness. I love to exercise and push myself to new limits. I also like to push others to meet their fitness goals.

In this busy world, why is important we set aside time for fitness?

Fitness is more than just looking good. It is important to set time aside for fitness because your need to take care of your body if you want to live long enough and enjoy a full life. Exercise is a great way to release stress and negative energy. You will be a happier human being if you exercise.

How much time is necessary?

The average person should spend no more than 45 minutes to an hour exercising a day. It's all about building a routine. Once you make fitness a perma-

nent part of your life, it always will be. Also, be sure to stretch in the morning when you wake up and before you go to bed.

How has being fit changed your world?

I owe my whole life and career to getting involved in fitness at a young age. We all have a purpose in life. I was lucky to have been able to find mine in fitness.

Does your partner share your passion?

She does. She would have to. This is what I do for a living. Scott Herman Fitness is my life and to have someone not involved would make for a huge gap in our relationship. I need someone that is going to support me 100%.

Does she share your feelings about gay rights? She sure does. I couldn't be with someone who didn't have an open heart to everyone.

Scott, it's commendable that you would come out publicly in support of gay rights. But if you knew then what you know now, about all the criticism and hate mail you would receive, would you have been so vocal in your stance for gay rights?

I know in my heart what the right thing to do is and I will continue to do it no matter how hard the journey may be.

rather bring this issue to a psychological level. You seem to be dumping all your emotional waste on her. You cannot justify your immoral actions of mistreatment just because you subscribe to a sexist misinterpretation of God's will.

Based on your comments, you seem to be quite arrogant. Incase you haven't heard, the

price of vanity keeps going up every year. (Factor THAT into your relationship equation.) You have a history of emotional volatility. It is not her fault you have poor affect regulation. It does no good to vent your anger out on your wife. To employ a truism, if you drop a rock on your foot, it does not do any good to get mad at the rock. Yet, you habitually resort to violence to resolve conflict. I guess, when the only tool you have is a hammer, you tend to view everything as a nail. This sort of unnecessary posturing only serves to pollute the web of the relationship. You need to develop other coping mechanisms to deal with your temper.

I strongly recommend individual therapy (not couples therapy) for you and your wife by a licensed psychologist (not pastoral counseling). You need more than just counseling by your church (although that would not hurt). I refuse to believe that your men's Bible study group condones the way you abuse your wife. The reason I recommend separate counseling for the two of you and not couples therapy is because the problem lies with you, not her. She may need to see a counselor to work on her self-esteem, but she is not responsible for your behavioral choices.

You stated that she "makes" you mad. No one makes you feel mad without your participation. You need to learn how to be in control of your own thoughts and actions. Take a 10 minute timeout if need be. There are several cognitive and behavioral techniques that you can implement to monitor your emotional state and control your anger. You can get the details of these techniques when you meet with your private therapist.






