Green Bay - Excellent weather and a packed crowd combined to make Pride Alive come alive on July 9. Joanne's Park on Green Bay's east side was once again the location for the pride celebration that is a program of Rainbow Over Wisconsin. Over 3000 is the attendance estimate offered by Andrew and Andrea, co-chairs. Most everyone agreed attendance ap-

peared up from last year.

The food vendors were more than doubled from the previous year, and there was something for everyone's pallete. Other booths offered merchandise for sale or offered information on organizations or political parties. The main stage offered live bands all afternoon, and



DJ Cody from Chicago took the stage early evening.

One attraction that is grown again this year is the history tent. T-shirts, other artifacts from bars long past and lots of photos allowed people to get a glimpse of how things use to be.

After sunset the party didn't stop, it just moved. Shelter was the location for the Official after party called Fever (sponsored in part by this magazine) and featured dueling DJ's from Chicago, adult film starts on stage and of course DuWanna Moore and other female impersonator performing for a jam packed house. Meanwhile, Napalese Lounge entertained a full house until close with a special show featuring Elsie on stage.

In Gaylias: Operation Thunderspell, Kage puts a deliciously camp take on the spy novel.





"Hidden" by Tomas Mournian c.2011, Kensington \$15.00 / \$17.95 Canada 387 pages

You hated being "It".


In fact, nobody liked being "It" when playing Hide & Seek. "It" was the banished position, the spot for losers, the hardest role in the game.

Was it possible, after all, to find all the other kids and tag them before they had a chance to get Home? Not really, and besides – "It" missed the hiding part, which definitely displayed creativity.

And "It" missed the heart-pounding, screaming race to get Home in the end.

But Hide & Seek is just a game. In the new novel "Hidden" by Tomas Mournian, staying concealed may be a life-or-death matter.

Ahmed was drugged.



But even woozy, Ahmed knew that escape was essential. There was no way he was going to be sent back to SR, a "residential treatment facility" for gueer teens.



So when whispers turned out to be correct – that there was a certain truck stop near a certain sign in the middle of the desert where he could find help – Ahmed told his father that he had to "go".

And when two women motioned for him to follow them, he went...

Passed from vehicle to vehicle, Ahmed ended up in a bus station with a phone number in his hand and a ticket to San Francisco. But getting there – and finding the safe house he was told to seek – wouldn't be easy: there were men, bounty hunters, whose job it was to find runaway teens who could potentially embarrass their parents. And they were looking for him.


In the safe house, Ahmed became "Ben". Someone dyed his hair and told him that he couldn't look out the window. He was told that he couldn't leave, either, but the other kids living there found a way: there was a rooftop area, perfect for smoking and listening to music. It was comfortable, and semi-private. It was the perfect place to escape the drama of too many kids hiding.

It's only a book. It's only a book. It's only a book. Those are the words you'll want to remember while reading this pulseracing novel.

"Hidden" is an easy book to get caught up in. The first half is pure classic chase-scene, complete with evil henchmen, vicious dogs, and an Underground Railroad-like passage to safety. You almost want to look over Ahmed's shoulder for him, lest he get caught.

Then author Tomas Mournian switches gears by adding a tiniest amount of malevolence to the discomfort of a dozen varied personalities packed in a small area for an unspecified time. This only ratchets up the tension, making "Hidden" a heart-pounder.

Perhaps meant for older teens, I think this book is an excellent read for any adult, too. If you're looking for a book from which your attention may never escape, "Hidden" is one to seek.

WISCONSIN COURT UPHOLDS DOMESTIC PARTNER BENEFITS, LAMBDA LEGAL & FAIR WISCONSIN CELEBRATE VICTORY

Editor's Note: This story broke on June 20, just after we had gone to press and couldn't be included in our last issue. We posted it online immediately, but since some people are not able to use the internet, we are printing it here late.

Madison - On Monday, June 20, 2011 the Circuit Court, Branch 11 in Dane County Wisconsin upheld as constitutional the state's Domestic Partner Registry.

Wisconsin Circuit Court Judge Daniel R. Moeser wrote, "Ultimately, it is clear that Chapter 770 does not violate the Marriage Amendment because it does not create a legal status for domestic partners that is identical or substantially similar to that of marriage. The state does not recognize domestic partnership in a way that even remotely resembles how the state recognizes marriage. Moreover, domestic partners' have far fewer legal rights, duties, and liabilities in comparison to the legal rights, duties, and liabilities of spouses."

"The law is clear - the domestic partnership law does not violate the Wisconsin constitution," said Christopher Clark, Senior Staff Attorney in Lambda Legal's Midwest Regional Office based in Chicago. "The research the court provided in its ruling today is a showcase of material proving that the proponents of the antigay marriage amendment repeatedly told voters in 2006 that the Marriage Amendment would not ban domestic partnership benefits."

In June 2009, Wisconsin Governor Jim Doyle signed domestic partnerships into law, granting limited but important legal protections to same-sex couples, including hospital visitation and the ability to take a family medical leave to care for a sick or injured partner. Wisconsin Family Action, an antigay group, brought a lawsuit in Dane County Circuit Court arguing that the domestic partnership law is a violation of Wisconsin's constitutional amendment banning marriage equality. Shortly thereafter, Lambda Legal successfully moved to intervene in the lawsuit on behalf of Fair Wisconsin and five same-sex couples.

"We are pleased that the Court upheld the limited protections provided by domestic partnerships because they are essential in allowing committed same-sex couples to care for each other in times of need," said Katie Belanger, Executive Director of Fair Wisconsin. This is an exciting day for Wisconsin. Domestic partnerships marked our state's first step toward full equality in nearly 30 years. Judge Moeser's decision will ensure that we can continue advancing equality for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender Wisconsinites in the years ahead."

Cambridge, Massachusets to pay gay married employees more than straight employees

Cambridge, Mass. — Cambridge, Mass., plans to offset the federal government taxes same-sex couples have to pay in by adding extra money to the paychecks of gay and lesbian employees who are married to their

same-sex spouses.

It is intended to fix what the City Council calls an "unfair" imbalance in the way the federal government taxes health care benefits for same-sex couples.



This will add a total of \$1,500 to \$3,000 to the 22 workers' annual salaries, an unusual move considering the economic woes state governments are facing around the nation.

"This is about equality," Cambridge City Councilor Marjorie Decker told the Associated Press. "This is a city that models what equality really means."

None of the thousands of legally married gay and lesbian couples in Massachusetts can receive the federal benefits offered to heterosexual married couples because the federal Defense of Marriage Act doesn't recognize same-sex marriages. Those benefits include Social Security survivors' benefits, immigration rights, family leave and the ability to file joint tax returns.

Hopefully DOMA will be repealed in the future and the federal government will recoginze these inconsistancies in states that allow gay marriage or civil unions.

Creator of Queer As Folk Series Coming Back to Showtime Channel With New Gay Series

Russell T. Davies the man who brought the American version of Queer As Folk to Showtime has another series in the works featuring gay men.

"Cucumber", now in the development stage will differ from the older series in that the lives of the characters are not going to be about the young and handsome men featured prominantly in the original "Queer As Folk." Instead, it's going to focus more on older gay men and some of their jealousy to the types of characters that would've been found in the original QAF.

Davies who is better known for his hit sci fi series "Doctor Who" and "Torchwood." He has been tied up doing the Who series and spinoffs and is now finally getting back to this story that had apparently been in development since as early as 2007.

While we wait for "Cucumber," you can always sate yourself with the delicious fourth season of "Torchwood" that moved from BBC America and is now on Stars Premium Channel. (I'm waiting for it to show up on Netflix.)

John Kerry Defends Obama's 'Evolving' Gay Politics

The President supports recognizing gay and lesbian couples with civil unions, and said he's "evolving" on marriage. LGBT activists and allies have criticized President Obama for that statement.

Senator John Kerry, disagrees and made remarks in an op-ed published Sunday in the Boston Globe.

Pundits ask whether President Obama can afford to "change" his position on gay marriage. It's a phony debate about a real issue.

Marriage is deeply personal - our positions are based on unique combinations of reason, belief, and experience, not polling and politics.

Everyone is entitled to his own view, in his own time, including the president.

While Kerry agrees the president should be able to move at his own pace, the senator also insists, "The America we aspire to doesn't have any second class citizens," and concludes, "Although it sometimes take too long, America always ends up on the right side of history."

"Is this a journey for all of us?" Kerry concluded. "Yes – and appropriately so, because it's a journey for our country. And although it sometimes takes too long, America always ends up on the right side of history."

Kerry stated it was time for Congress to repeal the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA).



John Becker and Michael Knaapen were one of the first 440 couples who registered as domestic partners in Green Bay Wisconsin when it began August 3,2009. The couple has since relocated after taking his position as Director of Communications and Development with Trouth Wins Out in Vermont.





Verbal Acumen

A Dramatic Reading at MGAC, July 21, 22

According to its authors, Dr. Ray Proctor and Olivia Dawson, Verbal Acumen might just be a play about friendship. It might question the intricacies of African-American friendships. It might be a play about intellect versus intuition. It might be a play about finding and defining love. It might have a rousing Gospel number. It probably won't have an angry black man or a pregnant teen mother or mention liberal white guilt, privilege or entitlement. It might be about how two lives can intersect for a period of time and two people find a way to be honest with each other. It might be a play about nothing at all.

But it's not. Verbal Acumen negotiates the terrains of pretense, race and friendship. Sometimes it interrogates the complexities of being black in a world that is not. Occasionally the play talks about expectations and what happens when those expectations are not met. At times, it looks for ways to be black and gay...to exist...on stage and in the world without being a stereotype. Parts of the play focus on rejection and tenacity. But mostly it's just a play about two people who learn to love each other, in spite of themselves.

About seven years ago Ray Proctor met Olivia Dawson in The Next Act Theatre's production of Between Men and Cattle. Proctor was a doctoral candidate at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, pursuing a PhD in Shakespeare Studies. He received his PhD earlier this year. Dawson was a professional actor working in Madison, Milwaukee and Chicago. Dawson subsequently enrolled in the MFA program at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The pair became roommates, friends and colleagues. They now live in Chicago.

QUEST spoke with Dr. Proctor and Ms. Dawson about their work and its intentions.

QUEST: Let's start with a basic question. How did Verbal Acumen come about?

Ray Proctor: We were looking for some way to express ourselves to lift our spirits. We were finishing school at UW Madison and both in a place of transition. We were looking for something to keep us focused on why we are in theatre.

Olivia Dawson: We had a conversation and it turned into a scene. We passed the laptop between us creating the dialogue. In the original scene we're in a coffee shop talking about men – about what we liked and didn't like. When it was done, we thought "We can't perform this in front of people."

RP: Olivia and I lived together so we had a storehouse of things that happened to us. We rehashed the episodes and conversations we had while living together. We added more and more until we had a play.

OD: When we finished a scene we had to ask ourselves, is it offensive? We hope it's not.

QUEST: So the situations are all real?

RP: Yes, we cut and shaped them by fictionalizing them but they're real and distinct. Shaping the conversations into a play made it about our friendship. What happened to us is the dramatic action.

OD: We are polar opposites. That translated well to the page. We couldn't have made it up.

QUEST: It sounds like the plot is about the two characters forming a relationship.

RP: Correct. The characters are Eva and Benny. It's about their barely knowing each other to becoming best friends.

QUEST: How do your define their relationship?

OD: Both characters comprise the lead in the play. They're equal as individuals but one entity as a relationship. Yet they are two completely different characters. People comment on the relationships. We didn't want Eva to come across as a faghag. We shaped her as a presence. Eva is her own woman.

RP: We worked to find an equal voice. Their story is important. There's a humanity that belongs to the canon of the American voice in theatre. Yet the story of the gay black guy doesn't get told honestly. Benny is gay, dating interracially and a successful academic. The same is true for the Eva in this case because it's not about her oppression and pain.

OD: It's just about two real characters. Eva is not a churchwoman with lots of kids. Some of what Eva talks about is about race. She's but she's not about anger and Angst.

QUEST: Traditionally black American theatre presents those issues of oppression and anger and certain core characters. How does your play fit into that? Or does it?

RP: It's not a black play. It's a play first. It's from an African American point of view. But those who

have seen it across the ethnic demographic respond by saying "it's a play about us."

OD: The archetypes in black theatre are standardized. They have become caricatures Our characters aren't present in black theatre. Our characters are inconsistent and complex. It's just two characters and how they grow together. It's conversations that are personal. The play's universality is there exactly because it's personal.

QUEST: But, Verbal Acumen deals with racial issues...

OD: We didn't consciously write about race but it's so much a part of our lives that it is in us. We didn't consciously do that. Race as a theme really appears unintentionally. It's always a part of the world we live in.

QUEST: Who should see the play?

OD: Everybody. Everyone will take away something that speaks to them.

RP: The straight white male might not get it. They are very rarely the topic of discussion. It wasn't done on purpose. They should still see it, of course, but it's not about them.

Verbal Acumen is directed by Sherri Williams-Pannel and features Ray Proctor, Olivia Dawson, Bear Bellinger and Penelope Walker.

A reading with discussion to follow takes place Thursday & Friday, July 21 and 22 at 7:30pm in the Milwaukee Gay Arts Center, 703 South 2nd Street in Milwaukee's Historic Walker's Point neighborhood. 



The prospect of a cinema night featuring a Casper Andreas marathon left Glenn decidedly ambivalent. After all, hadn't Glenn misgivings of Andreas' debut, **Slutty Summer**, specifically the absurd DVD box cover photo of a handsome young man coyly reaching over to grab something more than a handful of popcom from the cute lad in the next seat?

Yet Glenn found this low-budget rom-com a pleasantly entertaining film boasting an engaging cast of quirky characters, plenty of scathingly brilliant one-liners as well as an ample yet unexpectedly restrained amount of lean male flesh.

Any promise shown in **Slutty Summer** proved a distant memory during the viewing of the subsequent **A Four Letter Word**, a loosely connected sequel which put Jesse Archer's party boy Luke under the harsh glare of the spotlight. Here sadly, Glenn found the warm glow of summer long past and the quirky, rather lovable characters of **Slutty Summer** having somehow managed to misplace their charm.

In Violet Tendencies, only Markus (Andreas) and Luke (Jesse Archer) return, joined by the former The Facts of Life favorite, Mindy Cohn. Cohn, who has spent the awkward, post-The Facts of Life years playing Velma in a variety of Scooby-Doo spin-offs, here plays Violet," the last fag hag in Manhattan."

For once not cast in the role of host, Glenn became puzzled when a seemingly unceasing stream of **The Facts of Life** anecdotes were followed by gales of laughter." Who is Jo Polniaczek?" Glenn asked at one point even more clueless than ever. "Why is she a lesbian icon?"

A quick IMDB check confirmed that The Facts of Life ran an astonishing nine seasons, spawning four TV movies including a 2001 Reunion. Thanks to those wacky folks at Wikipedia, Glenn also discovered that Cohn's character Natalie proved to be rather the naughtiest of The Facts

of Life gals; Natalie being the first of The Facts of Life to lose her virginity when she slept with her boyfriend Snake on their one-year anniversary. But surely there couldn't have been a little African-American girl on the show named Tootie? Not really?

In Violet Tendencies, Cohn is rather less lucky in the affairs of the bedroom as Jesse Archer's uneven screenplay follows Violet in her fabulous if indeed sexually unfulfilling role as fag hag to a cute cast of gay thirty-something ragamuffins. Besides her sexually generous roommate Luke (Archer), there's Luke's hair-stylist boyfriend Darian (Adrian Armas), Violet's co-worker Riley (Samuel Whitten) plus his novelist boyfriend Markus (Andreas).

The film's opening scene, a shameless commercial for a popular gay social networking website, finds Violet newly crowned as "the last fag hag in Manhattan." Yet as she walks home, alone, again, Violet has something of an epiphany and decides her new honor has got to go.

But how?

Night after night Violet has cuddled up with a big jar of Dickies Nut Butter and whilst donning the

sexually confident persona Salome, she has routinely scraped the bottom of the heterosexual barrel with Frisky Friends dating service. Instead of finding a soul mate, she has been far more likely to end up with a "nooner" nightmare with a guy possessing a Postal fetish.

Yet even when she does connect with Mike (Christopher L. Graves), by all appearances a nice, normal guy, Violet begins babbling about her FUPA (Fat Upper Pussy Area) and warning her date off any cheese

Buy it, rent it or just forget it...

As off-putting as the film's shameless shilling of ManHunt.net is, producers Andreas and Archer struck gold in securing Mindy Cohn for the pivotal role of Violet. Always engaging, Cohn invests Violet with vulnerability, resilience and heart, little of which can actually be found in Archer's screenplay. Surrounding Violet, her boys fare rather less well. All are lookers, particularly Whitten's Riley. Yet Archer's screenplay, relying on a barrage of one-liners, fails to provide needed depth to flesh out other story lines, particularly Markus' attempts to convince Riley of the merits of gay fatherhood or Luke's inability to commit to his hunky boyfriend Adrian.

Is it too bitchy for Glenn to suggest that Archer is perhaps past his sell-by date to believably play slut puppy Luke?

Best of all, there's ample beefcake provided by Zeus (Marcus Patrick), a go-go boy with a bright smile as well as the proverbial heart of gold, Even when the narrative begins to meander, there's always Zeus, happily somewhere in the background, slinging about his wellstretched thong.


