



Milwaukee - NomadicLIMBS, a Summer Dance Company is a group of talented dancers and artists from across the country led by Artistic Director Thom Dancy, a midwestern choreographer affiliated with Milwaukee Ballet and the San Diego Ballet.

LACAGE CLOSING? WELL NOT REALLY!

Milwaukee - An article in the Milwaukee Journal this past Thursday had the facebook rumor mill ablaze when it was revealed there were foreclosure proceedings on Milwaukee's largest and long running dance bar, LaCage (ETC & Montage).

After speaking with co-owner Michael (who is also an advertiser in this magazine) we can confirm the bar is not closing and most or all of the issues that caused a forclosure to begin have been resolved.

The bank holding the mortgage may have jumped the gun when they learned that property taxes remained unpaid as a result of an honest mistake. It takes time to sort out these issues but the foreclosure has stopped and the property taxes are up to date.

Michael expressed frustration over learning of the news story and claims the Milwaukee Journal made no attemp to reach him before verifying the information which they can get online as part of a public record once a foreclosure is begun. The Journal article says they tried to contact the owners with no results.

"If anything, this makes me even more determined to continue with LaCage," stated Michel in his telephone conversation with Quest.



WISCONSIN CREAM CITY CHORUS CONCERT ENDS 25-YEAR RUN

Milwaukee - The Wisconsin Cream City Chorus (WCCC) will hold its final concert, "Schlemiel, Schlimazel! Celebrating the Cream City and the Wisconsin Cream City Chorus," on Saturday, June 16. The concert, originally planned as a celebration of the Milwaukee itself, will instead focus more on the WCCC and its life in the Cream City over the last 25 vears. "Once we knew that this concert would be the finale of our as a voice in the LGBT community, the concept evolved," said Kristen L. Weber, the group's Managing Artistic Director. "Milwaukee took a bit of a back seat — which isn't to say that this concert is about the chorus itself; it's not. It reflects our message over the last quarter century."

According to Weber, the show's two performances (5 & 7:30 PM) will feature several medleys and other numbers focusing on various subjects near and dear to the chorus: "...the struggle against homophobia and the hope of building a better community, the fear and loss caused by AIDS, songs of love, folks songs, spirituals, and of course a healthy mix of show tunes." In additional, the second performance will include a bonus medley of some of the raunchier songs perfomed at the group's early cabaret concerts. Both performances include a silent auction.

A special highlight for many of the WCCC's earliest fans will be a reunion appearance by eight of the original "Creamettes," a sub-group of the chorus in the early years. The group, joined by their accompanist, will share three numbers near and dear to the



group's audiences in the late 1980s.

Tickets for the performance are \$12 in advance through brownpapertickets.org and chorus members. At-the-door tickets will be \$15 (\$13 senior/student; youth free). A \$30 package price for one ticket plus the WCCC's final CD, "This Is Our Legacy," is also available. The CD includes audience favorites and other numbers significant to the group and its history. HAPPY 15TH ANNIVERSARY: GLBT PARTNERSHIP of APPLETON

President Barack Obama and Vice President Joe Biden recently recharged the batteries of LGBT advocates and activists by publicly acknowledging their support for same-sex marriage. The president has described his views as "evolving". Some see the evolution of Obama's views as reflective of an acceptance which seems to be growing across the nation and in other parts of the world: Several states have recently opted to provide comparable marriage rights to gay persons. Many churches are now subscribing to an 'open and affirming' attitude toward their LGBT members, including the sanctification of unions. And more and more agencies, schools and

workplaces are initiating policies designed to recognize, respect and protect LGBT persons.

Here in Wisconsin we have much to be proud of regarding efforts to provide LGBT persons with equitable civil and constitutional rights. In 1982 Wisconsin became the first state in the U.S.A. to pass anti-discrimination laws specifically protecting LGBT persons. Twenty other states have since followed Wisconsin's lead.

Beyond the legislative arena, dozens of high schools, universities and communities throughout Wisconsin embrace LGBT organizations. These multifunctional groups provide support, social opportunities, advocacy, and often work to educate the





uninformed and misinformed about LGBT issues.

The 'evolution of attitudes' is arguably the result of education, and familiarity, as folks are interacting more and more with responsible, respectable, "out" LGBT persons. These unavoidable role models are on our televisions, in our politics, in the news and next door. But the challenge to attain acceptance and self esteem, as a group and on a personal level, has not and does not come without effort. Herein lies an appropriate segue to a model group that has been doing remarkable things in Wisconsin's Fox River Valley: The GLBT PARTNERSHIP.

In a world where groups and organizations come and go as quickly as spare change, the GLBT Partnership has not only survived, but has thrived for 15 years! The group has been meeting in Appleton every Tuesday since 1997, and has welcomed more than 2,000 youth during that time. But this is more than just an opportunity to sit and chat with likeminded individuals. In fact, the weekly meetings are chock-full of valuable educational opportunities and trainings. Plus, a variety of special events are organized each year (Night of Noise, Pride Prom, GSA Conference and World AIDS Day) which provide comradery and leadership development, preparing youth for their futures.

The GLBT Partnership of Appleton has offered hundreds of community presentations & trainings to area businesses, non-profits, schools, government groups, and community organizations. It has also birthed new groups that have spread its influence across larger age demographics and geographical areas: the GLBT Partnership of Green Bay, Spectrum groups in Green Bay and Appleton, and the S.A.F.E. group at Neenah's YOUTH GO organization. Youth in the Fox Valley now have 3 weekly options (Green Bay on Mondays, Appleton on Tuesdays and Neenah on Wednesdays) and adults have 2 weekly options (Appleton on Mondays and Green Bay on Tuesdays), as well as a monthly P-FLAG group that is meeting at the Appleton Harmony Café.

The model of Harmony Café has been called the "LGBT Center for the 21st Century" as it combines the programs and services of a typical LGBT Center, with a dynamic array of artistic and leadership endeavors, and offers safe space seven days a week. But the LGBT community is only one of many populations served by this remarkable entity. Harmony Café (with locations in Appleton and Green Bay) houses many programs and groups of all sorts, serving different needs and populations. "Being 'one of several' groups that meet here, the LGBT community enjoys integration with the greater community," says Deanna Tappy, Program Coordinator for Harmony Café, Green Bay. "And that has been one of the greatest strengths leading to the group's longterm success." Indeed, many would argue that acceptance and integration has been the dream of LGBTs all along.

An interview with Craig Bodoh, Time Coach

Tempus fugit,,, time flies is an ancient Roman adage one often hears. Times also flies when you're having fun they say. For some time is money.

For Craig Bodoh, a personal effectiveness consultant, time is his business. He knows time. One might say he's obsessed by time. Bodoh has coached individuals, companies, and even Milwaukee city employees how to productively use time. His frustration is the amount of time people waste. His mission is to train individuals into new time conscious habits.

Pursuing a career as specialized consultant, Bodoh falls into a specific category known as life coaches. The coach concept has become a market trend. Like personal trainers at the local gym focus on improving physical prowess, life coaches encourage people to alter negative behaviors. Others coach their clients through divesting of clutter, organizing sock drawers, parenting and dating.

Coaches have also become part of the LGBT lifestyle. Recently, the Gay Coaches Alliance (GCA), an organized founded in 2003 to organize a network of gay men's coaches, held its first international conference in upstate New York. Craig Bodoh attended as a guest speaker.

QUEST spoke with Craig Bodoh about coaching, its specific relevance to gay lifestyle, and the conference.

QUEST: Let's first talk about the coach scene. We see ads, yours included, for all sorts of self-improvement coaches. How does one know one even needs a coach and what does one look for in a coach?

Craig Bodoh: Clients are usually dissatisfied with something in their life and wants to change. They might be stressed out or disorganized. For gay men, GCA website offers a starting point. You look at the coach's background. Some have degrees or certifications. If that's important, that's fine. A local coach might be preferred but Skyping or email coaching might work for some.

QUEST: Coaching requires command of a specific talent. Personal trainers study kinesiology, kitchen coaches have culinary training. How did you become a time management coach.

CB: My degree is in education. I went through a career transition. As part of that training, I did a time management workshop decide to pursue it myself. I did group training sessions. People asked if I did 1 on 1 consulting and I fell into personal consulting from there.

QUEST: How long have you been practicing? CB: I began my business, Personal Effectiveness Plus in 1990. Now I have a website at http://www.gainingtime.com/

QUEST: Why do we waste time?

CB: Well, modern life has so many distractions and demands it's becoming increasingly challenging to

make appropriate choices. Most people are in a reactive mode versus proactive mode. That means they focus on the urgent things in their lives rather than on the most important things.

QUEST: Like the urgency of social media?

CB: Technology is a huge distraction in general...phone, computer, social media...are all part of the distraction from our priorities.

QUEST: What about down time. Is that wasting time or is it an effective and necessary use of time?

CB: Down time within reason is a necessary thing but not when it becomes an escape. Escapism can be part of a balance but for some it allows them to avoid responsibility.

QUEST: How does a client address avoidance. CB: A client needs to get a hold of all the demands on personal and professional time. I help assist that and compile data. I assess that information with the client and ask if that's how he wants to use their time.

QUEST: What about avoidance as a symptom of a deeper psychological problem?

CB:We're not trained psychologists but if there's an apparent problem beyond just a need to prioritize the use of time. A good coach will advise a referral. Conversely. if a psychologist sees the need he or she might refer a patient to a life coach. Some have



works of coaches they work with. It's a reciprocal arrangement.

QUEST: How compliant is an average client and what's the measure of success??

CB: Some are not aware of were their time goes. It's a wake up call for some to understand how they spend their time. If the client wants to change, they do. Most are. That's why they've come to me in the first place. Depending on the client's goals, that outcome is a personal measure of change.

QUEST: How long do you usually work with a client. CB: There's no set average. It may be several visits over a period of time. Three or four initially. Some feel a need for more support and accountability. Then there may be reinforcement sessions.

QUEST: What's the role of accountability?

CB: The client is the coachee. The coach holds the client accountable. It could be a phone or email conversation. The deadlines are negotiated and built into the process. Maintaining that is the reason for success or failure.

QUEST: Why gay coaching?

CB: Because there's a comfort level knowing a coach has the same perspective or life history. If a gay man is interested in making change, having a gay coach is extremely important. The openness in a coaching relationship is necessary for honesty. Coaching can only be successful if the client is honest with his coach. If the client needs to go back into the closet to find a coach, the whole exercise would be compromised. I think it's important for gay men to know that there are coaches out there to assist in a transformation to more positive. To my knowledge, I'm the only one in Milwaukee.

QUEST: How long has the gay coaching field existed?

CB: The GCA was founded almost a decade ago. Based the obvious need in the community, various coaches founded the organization. There are now 30 listed on the GCA website.

QUEST: Still, people might be skeptical because there isn't a professional degree required as a credential. Anyone can call himself a coach. Is a crystal shaman a viable coach? Are there coaching degrees?

CB: There may be coaching degrees offered in the future but there are training institutes that offer certification. GCA is a membership organization. There's a review process and if approved, the coach's profile is added to the website. Someone who does therapy with crystals could be a coach. Even a closet organizer coach can be legitimate and very valuable. An unorganized closet could be a symptom of avoiding decisions. But in the phase of finding a coach, the client can interview the coach and find out about the philosophy and methods used by the coach to see if there's a match. Most coaches offer a free session to see if there's compatibility.

QUEST: What is the usual cost?

CB: The cost is all over the map. Depending on experience and scope of services, some coaches have a fee and a retainer. Others are just fee based. The range is \$75-200/hr. It's not typically covered by insurance.

QUEST: What was the GCA conference about?

CB: It was the first ever. Topics were around assessments, building businesses. I was invited as a presenter, coaching coaches in time management. The participants represented the spectrum of coaches It included executive coaches, business coaches, massage therapy, a couple of psychotherapists and myself, of course.

Even those with even a nodding acquaintance with Shakespeare know that in Elizabethan times only men were allowed to tread the boards, something Gwyneth Paltrow's Viola rails against in the Oscar-acclaimed 1998 film, Shakespeare in Love, "Stage love will never be true love while the law of the land has our heroines being played by pip squeaked boys in petticoats."

Guilty pleasure confession: Glenn has long been truly, madly, deeply in love with the film, Shakespeare in Love. What's not to love? As soon as Joseph Fiennes' doe-eved William Shakespeare appeared, Glenn was smitten. There was much to enjoy even during Fiennes' few off-screen moments, from Judi Dench's fabulous, Oscar-winning turn as Liz the First to Tom Stoppard's equally praiseworthy screenplay.

And unlike Shakespeare's original tale of star-crossed lovers, the film's final scenes are not unnecessarily littered with dead bodies.

This brings Glenn to Alan Brown's **Private** Romeo, a hot new DVD released just in time for Pride season, where as Hamlet was once wont to exclaim, "the play's the thing."

Inspired by Joe Calarco's acclaimed stage production, Shakespeare's R&J, Private Romeo sets its scene at a nearly deserted military academy. A surprisingly youthful instructor is leading his class of cadets in a play reading of Romeo and Juliet.


The play, however, doesn't take a curtain call when the bell tolls the end of class. From the classroom to the basketball court to the weight room and on to even the shower room, Shakespeare's tale unfolds.


The conceit in choosing to adapt Romeo and Juliet with a cast of male students is fraught with misadventure; many might dismiss Private Romeo as devised simply and quite shamelessly to cater to a gay male audience. Yet director Alan Brown and his strong, engaging cast are likely to bring a fascinating twist on this familiar love story to all moviegoers.

Taking lead roles are two promising Broadway actors; Seth Numrich takes on Romeo whilst Matt Dovle is his Juliet.. Both young actors instill in their characters a marvelous freshness and innocence. Notably, they even manage Shakespeare's iambic pentameter with aplomb.

Indeed, Glenn is enthusiastic about the performances of all of the key players. In addition to Numrich and Doyle, special mention must also be given to Hale Appleman's dangerously sexy Mercutio and Chris Bresky's delightfully original Nurse.

As a double feature, Glenn thought it absolute genius to pair Private Romeo with Romeos,





an intriguing German film released early this

Romeos, too, is love story, focusing on the relationship between Lukas (Rick Okon), a young, transitioning FTM with Fabio (Maximilian Befort), a sexy, fit and dangerous young man who encompasses for Lukas everything he hopes to become. Although not actually based upon Shakespeare, Romeos finds its star-crossed lovers with rather more than simply a family feud to overcome.

Over the course of Romeos, the film follows Lukas' transformation, physically as well as soBuy it, rent it or forget it...

Ever the romantic, Glenn is delighted to offer praise for both Private Romeo and Romeos, two films which prove "Love looks not with the eyes but with the mind."

As Shakespeare's star-crossed lovers, Seth Numrich and Matt Doyle are nothing short of beguiling. Thanks to director's Alan Brown's fluid, intimate filming, it is impossible not to feel how alive in the moment they are; their sense of urgency.

Brown's choice of setting, however, reaps no benefit. Reveille played on a boom box? Dorm rooms barren of all but the meagerest of personal possessions? Budgetary constraints surely proved the deciding factor. Still Glenn couldn't help but imagine the school's caretaker "tsk-tsking" whenever one of the cast or crew hung even a poster.

A deserted high school is clearly not the cinematic equivalent of a bare stage upon which Shakespeare's plays are often performed.

Romeos is compelling in large part, due to Rick Okon's mesmerizing, fearless performance as Lukas. His is a story too rarely told. While Lukas can be frustratingly self-absorbed, his personal journey proves nothing short of compelling.


Sandy's contagious laughter, positive energy and dedication to fighting AIDS will be missed by all whose life




