SSBL COMMISSIONER BRIAN REINKOBER INDUCTED INTO THE NAGAAA HALL OF FAME

"Our next honoree for the "Class of 2014" Hall of Fame comes to us from Milwaukee, WI, is none other than....Brian Reinkober." With that introduction the North American Gay Amateur Athlete Alliance (NAGAAA) announced the induction of Milwaukee Saturday Softball Beer League commissioner Brian Reinkober into the exclusive ranks of national LGBT athletic leadership.

The NAGAAA announcement cites Reinkober's 17 years in NAGAAA and his 12 years as SSBL commissioner. In addition to mentioning his participation as a player and manager on various SSBL teams, it also lists a litany of local league accomplishments including its expansion from six to sixteen teams, his role as co-director of SSBL's annual Dairyland Classic Tournament and the 2009 Gay Softball World Series (GSWS), as well as his work in developing SSBL Madison (it became an independent NAGAAA league in 2012). Reinkober established a relationship with the Milwaukee Brewer organization raising \$50,000 annually through SSBL volunteers concession staffing at Miller Park. This fund raising activity provided the financial resources for the league's expenses and significantly contributed to the 2009 Gay Softball World Series budget in 2009. He is also an inductee in SSBL's Hall of Fame.

Nationally, Reinkober has been a NAGAAA Milwaukee delegate since 2002, participated in numerous GSWS tournaments, and served as its Membership Chairman cultivating interest in gay softball throughout the country. He is currently Co-Chair of its Annual Giving Committee.

QUEST spoke with Brian Reinkober about NA-GAAA, SSBL, and his own personal history with gay softball in Milwaukee.

QUEST: For our readers who are unfamiliar with LGBT sports what exactly is the North American Gay Amateur Athletic Alliance (NA-GAAA) and what is the NAGAAA Hall of Fame?

Brian Reinkober: NAGAAA was formed in 1977 as the governing body of gay softball in the United States and Canada. It consists of 45 leagues. Milwaukee was one of its five original founding cities along with New York, Los Angeles, Toronto, and San Francisco. NAGAAA created the Hall of Fame in1997 as a means to acknowledge the achievements of individuals who have made an impact within the whole NAGAAA organization.

QUEST: How many people, nationwide, are inducted to the Hall of Fame each year? And, are you the first from Milwaukee?

BR: It varies depending on the nominations, provided those meet the criteria by a 2/3 peer vote. In 2004, for example, there were only 2. This year there are about a dozen new inductees. I'm the fifth from Milwaukee. The others are Tommy Salzsieder and Tom Theis, in 1998; Arturo Olazabal, 2007, and Mike Hughs in 2010..

QUEST: SSBL has existed since 1977. Along with PrideFest and most other local LGBT organizations, it is run entirely by volunteers. Your list of NAGAAA accomplishments omits that fact. Yet volunteers are the reason for SSBL's longevity and success. What motivates that degree of community engagement?

BR: Well, first and foremost, the reason why I got involved was Tommy Salzsieder. I saw what he gave to Milwaukee gay softball. At the time SSBL was not in the best shape and on the verge of collapsing. I couldn't' let that happen. I can remember sitting in the Ball Game with Tommy recounting stories of the fun they had back when they played at the Mitchell Domes. I knew that could happen again. Kurt Baldwin was my first assistant commissioner and we set out to revive SSBL. There were 6 teams at the time. We just wanted to play and keep the tradition going and have fun.

QUEST: Has gay softball changed since you first played for a gay team 17 years ago?

BR: A lot has changed. In 2003 social media didn't exist. It's now an added complexity. We used to send out letter to announce a meeting. But, in general the motivation is the same. From a Milwaukee standpoint everybody has always looked forward to playing. It's always in every one's head, even outside the season. But now there's a lot more interest in our league. We got incredible exposure locally and nationally when we volunteered at Miller Park. 2005-2011. SSBL worked over 390 games at a concession right behind home plate.



We raised money but also awareness for our league and our city. That lead to the national recognition from NAGAAA and the other 45 leagues. That's why we were awarded the Gay Softball World Series in 2009. It was third time Milwaukee was privileged to host. There were 126 teams. We proved that a little city like Milwaukee could put on the largest single sporting even in gay athletics We surpassed all expectations not only from Milwaukee but from everybody in the NA-GAAA organization. I should mention my co-director Mona Garcia and a fantastic support staff, and hundreds of volunteers... and our very own Ruthie and Velvetta.

QUEST: Currently, aside from the Milwaukee Gay Arts Center's and Hamburger Mary's, the bars sponsor teams. How is NAGAAA, and SSBL in particular, developing non-bar participation in a time when gay bars are in decline?

BR: Truthfully, Milwaukee is in a very unique situation. Two out of 14 teams this year are non-bar. In many other cities it's not just bars that sponsor. Nationally speaking, medical offices, restaurants, law offices, and even individuals sponsor teams. So that's probably another big change in the character of the sport. As for Milwaukee, I hope other groups will sponsor teams in the future.





QUEST: Why do you think other local LGBT organizations have been reluctant to form teams?

BR: I don't know. Our whole SSBL history as a sports activity came out of the bar setting. Back in the 70's that's where you met gay people. It allowed people to have a safe and protected place to play softball. The winner of the game would go to the other team's bar and buy a keg. That's where it's roots are. Our bars are our history...and a Milwaukee tradition.

QUEST: NAGAAA rules allow teams to have up to 3 non-LGBT players on the field. SSBL has increased that ratio to 50/50. Is that a strategy to forward the political cause of LGBT equality through integration or a just practical way of recruiting team members?

BR: SSBL changed the gay/straight ratio 10 years ago. We felt it was more inclusive. It was not meant as a political statement or strategy. We had several teams with straight friends and this allowed them to play. It was the natural thing to do. Over the years we've had non-bars and non-LGBT entities sponsor teams.

QUEST: What motivates straight men and women to play in a gay softball league?

BR: I think they just like the league and what it stands for. They like our organization. We're fun and it's all about having a good time in the summer. It's not about anything else.

QUEST: Your NAGAAA Hall of Fame citation mentions the Dairyland Classic? Can you tell us about that event.

BR: We've held the Dairyland Classic an annual national tournament since 1978. It used to be on Memorial Day weekend. In 2003 we moved the event to Labor Day in hopes of better weather. Since then, we've only had one day of bad weather when we were actually rained out. This year we expect between 30 and 40 teams. Wirth park in Brookfield is one of our venues and, depending on how many teams register, we may play at other fields.

QUEST: And, what about the future of Milwaukee gay softball? BR: SSBL is always growing. This year we have 230 registered players. It's full of good young people who are new to the league. This year and last we have a lot of 20-somethings join. I hope there are individuals waiting in the reeds to take over this organization. I'm confident those people exist in SSBL today.

QUEST: And yours?

BR: I'm in it for two more years, maybe longer. I'm very lucky and fortunate in that Milwaukee is very well represented in the sport. I'm completely honored to be part of it. I love Milwaukee and plan to stay here. But, change is good. I'd love to see somebody new come forward with fresh ideas and the energy that it takes to run a league such as SSBL. It's a lot of work but that is how an organization will grow.

Brian Reinkober's induction into the NAGAAA Hall of Fame takes place at the upcoming Gay Softball World Series in Dallas, TX, September 22-27, 2014.

THIS MONTH'S COVER FFEATURE AT D.I.X. RAISING THE BAR FOR RAISE THE BAR JUST COMES NATURALLY: AN INTERVIEW WITH A WINNING TEAM

Recently I had the pleasure to sit down with the core crew that provides a lot of the fun and mischief that takes place at D.I.X. Besides the before mention mayhem, the denizen of D.I.X. also do much good for our Community. Case in point, AIDS Walk Wisconsin: every fall for the past couple of years they have formed a team, planned highly anticipated fund raisers and all of sudden something wonderful came out of friends just coming together helping other friends. For the past two years D.I.X. has won the friendly competition of "Raising the Bar". The "Raise the Bar" concept was an idea of local philanthropist Joe Pabst, who with ARCW (the AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin, producer of AIDS Walk Wisconsin) brainstormed in how to re-engage the bars - primarily gay bars (and LGBT-friendly bars) into participating in the annual AIDS Walk Wisconsin. D.I.X. stands for where the North meets the South. Elizabeth the dedicated proprietress and Corey her brother who runs a bar in New Orleans keep the corner of 1st Street and East National Avenue buzzing now in their fourth successful year of business. The 25th annual AIDS Walk Wisconsin will be taking place on Sunday, October 12th, with fashion maven, "Project Runway" host Tim Gunn serving as Honorary Chair.

We're here at D.I.X. with Chopper DJ spinning music for our listening pleasure while J.J. bartends, Anna, Marie, Eric, and Darren join in to share with me the following responses. Please enjoy and consider lacing up your walking shoes and taking part in the Silver Anniversary of this life saving and enhancing Walk.

Why are you so committed to The AIDS Walk?

It all started with Eric and his sister wanting to walk in memory of their uncle. The first year maybe ten people and they raised \$2,000. Not bad for a first attempt. Then the bar got involved and ten walkers turned into 50 walkers! A major increase and added interest and talent came with this. It started growing – fund raisers, events, the neighborhood got involved – Fat Daddies is their biggest ally. The straight bar next door opened their volley ball court up to them. D.I.X. is really a "Family Bar" everyone belongs here. We really are as diverse as the Community – a true rainbow! Everyone is welcome. Straights still come in here and enjoy the bar for what it is and what it was.

Is your dedicated commitment to the AIDS Walk, due in part for being an LGBT Bar?

It's nice to support something that affects our Community. In the Community, doing fund raising, breaking down the stigma of HIV/AIDS - after all HIV/AIDS infects everyone – it doesn't discriminate. This virus knows no age, ethnicity, economic differences – it's just there. And while people are living longer and better with HIV/AIDS they are still out there and still have needs – different from the past, but needs just the same. We don't think of this bar as a "Gay Bar" our intention is to be open and welcoming to all and everyone. And everyone is effected by HIV/AIDS whether they realize it or not.

What motivates you to participate in the AIDS Walk?

All the activities involved to make this contribution to ARCW. We don't just get together the morning of the Walk and do it... this is a commitment we enjoy all year long. We have fundraisers, auctions – silent auctions and date auctions, volley ball tournaments, carnival, soft ball, 50/50 Raffles, Cook Outs and "To the Top Tuesday Due on Wednesday" - all money is due in to ARCW the Wednesday before the Walk so the Tuesday before we go all out to make and break what we've done in the past. These are just some of the things we do to remind people, to get people involved. For instance we go all around Walker's Point and get businesses to donate gift certificates and we put together a date auction – someone "volunteers" to be the date and they come with an envelope that has cocktails at a bar and dinner at a local restaurant – the auction starts and bids and bills fly! People give of their time and talents from Klement's Sausage to Carnivore! The Peddle Tavern, our neighbors Seth and Ryan of Fat Daddies, beer vendors provide Brewer tickets, the Green Bay Packers gave us an autographed football – it's just a beautiful thing!

Can you share any tips on being a successful Team Captain?

Have fun with it! Make it exciting, build on the excitement! Having fun with bringing people together for a cause, involvement -- reminding people they can make a difference! We see our accomplishments and we want to do more! How do you top last time? Proactive! The results are so overwhelming people want to feel the high with us.

What is the name of your team and how many members do you have?

Team D.I.X. in four short years we've gone from 10 to 50 – not everyone actually does the Walk, but they do sign up and contribute, last year we had 35 Walkers and raised \$28,105.55! Our goal this year is to beat our record-breaking success of last year.

How do you motivate your team?

We don't have to - - they (the team) motivate us. Everyone is full of suggestions, ideas, they have contacts, and having new members to our team brings new, fresh insight. We're game to try anything. Our regulars know the Walk is coming up and they're looking forward

We did the world famous "Drag in the Bag", what a hot mess! Very fun, lots of laughs – a hoot! The Date Auction always goes over really well. In fact, so well we had two uninvited guests of the Milwaukee Police Department! They reminded us we didn't have a Burlesques License because our contenders stand on the pool table for all to see. When Milwaukee's Finest found out it was a charity auction they laughed and encouraged us on - so it is all good! The Paddles for the Auction became very popular with our patrons too! We used the Paper Paddles for the Auction – sold them for a dollar and they were repurposed in other manners as well! LOL The uber -festive auction brought a top bid of \$600 for two to enjoy cocktails and dinner on the town - - the man in demand one of the co-owners of Fat Daddies! So you see everyone does get involved! For Eric on a more serious note, he was really touched when two years ago D.I.X. won the competition and he had the honor to stand alongside Elizabeth, the owner of D.I.X. and receive the great news that they had won! "It was very humbling" - - and hearing our team mates chant D.I.X. - - feeling the elation and knowing you got something done and done right! The Summerfest Grounds all united to beat HIV/AIDS appreciating us and what we did, we are Milwaukee!

Do you have a message you would like to share to get people up and out to take part in this year's Walk?

Why not do it? It only takes a couple of hours out of your day. It's fun! Your presence even if you can't afford to give is important, you're standing in solidarity. Give what you can afford, volunteer, get involved. Take the time and take a tour of ARCW. It's an amazing place, we have so much to be proud of here in Milwaukee - - and statewide, including all the satellite agencies.

This is just a sampling of what a group of friends have done, from a simple very grass roots base and it's taken a life of its own. Want to take part and celebrate with D.I.X. ? The infamous Date Auction referred to numerously through this article, it is slated for Saturday, August 9 – come early, it gets crowded and don't forget your wallet! Thursday, August 21 will be a fashion show - - "Fashion Forward" held at Montage of La Cage – again partnering with neighbors. Saturday, September 6 The Volleyball Tournament at Fat Daddies and of course the cherry on the sundae of why this is all being done – The 25th Annual AIDS Walk Wisconsin Sunday, October 12th with honorary chair Tim Gunn all taking place on Milwaukee's Lakefront.

GAMMA LAUNCHES MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

Milwaukee GAMMA, one of southeast Wisconsin's first LGBT social organizations, has recently launched its summer membership drive. Founded in 1978, GAMMA began as an athletic association focused volleyball and running. Over the years, it evolved into a social outlet for men in the greater Milwaukee suburban area and beyond. Beyond athletics, the group held annual parties and other group activities for its membership. The organization currently boasts well over 100 members.

Voted Best Gay Association in Milwaukee by Wisconsin Gazette, today's GAMMA offers an ever expanding spectrum of social activities. These include organized sports like Volleyball and Monday Night Irregulars Bowling as well as bicycling, sheep's head, cribbage and board games. Some of its members meet and run with Frontrunners each Saturday morning. There is also a GAMMA Cooking Group that holds monthly communal cooking-in events. These feature an ethnic cuisine with participants providing a dish. GAMMA Out goes out on the town for fine dining, theater, and a monthly Happy Hour held at one of the city's popular watering holes. Its signature event is a monthly party at a member's home. A December Holiday Party and a summer cook-out are held annually.

Upcoming events include a night at the Milwaukee Chamber Theatre's August 14 Out reception and performance of *Master Class* and a day trip to the Bristol Renaissance Faire on August 22.

According to board president Bim Florek, GAMMA membership offers some great perks. "We are a large organization. But, our activities feature so many different things that everyone can find something to do with like minded members. Anyone can set up an event, post it on Facebook or list it in our monthly newsletter and invite members to participate. It can be just a game of cards or a camping trip," Florek said. The membership year is from July 1 to June 30, but new members may join any time. Annual dues are \$36 for individuals, \$57 for two persons receiving one newsletter, or \$16 for out-ofstate members. Dues are pro-rated based on the date of membership and are not tax deductible. For more information, call Bim Florek at (414) 418-9198. Glenn's recent cinema night foray was, well, challenging. Glenn might well dub the double feature of The Last Match (La Partida) and Floating Skyscrapers (Plynace Wiezowce) as "The further revenge of Brokeback Mountain."

Can it be almost ten years since Ang Lee's spectacular adaptation of Annie Proulx's acclaimed short story screened at Milwaukee's fabulous Oriental Theatre, Heath Ledger mumbling his way into the collective hearts of middle-America? - Indeed it can.

Some months back, loyal Quest readers might remember, Glenn quite favorably reviewed Stephan Lacant's Free Fall (Freier Fall), a film touted as "Germany's answer to Brokeback Mountain." Many thanks to the lovely folks at Wolfe Video, by the way; had they not thoughtfully decided to emblazon the claim on the DVD box, poor Glenn might never have been able to correctly connect the dots.

Much like **Free Fall** and indeed the Ang Lee original, Wasilewski's Floating Skyscrapers boasts two attractive, fit young men as protagonists. Kuba (Mateusz Banasiuk) is a talented swimmer in his mid-20s; his home life consisting of a demanding live-in girlfriend Sylwia (Nieradkiewicz) as well as a rather creepy, incestuous relationship with his domineering mother. When Sylwia drags a reluctant Kuba to an art gallery opening, Kuba quickly knocks back a couple of cocktails and then chats up lantern-jawed Michal (Bartosz Gelner). Thanks to the alcohol, some weed and a healthy dose of mutual pent-up desire, the two soon become inseparable.

Even as their fledgling relationship begins to blossom, director Tomasz Wasilewski's spare screenplay and Jakub Kijowski elegantly austere cinematography quickly and effectively casts a decided pall over the proceedings.

In scene after scene, Kuba is forever striding purposefully down long, uninhabited corridors or silently swimming clearly delineated lanes, his sense of isolation proving almost palpable. One particular scene of a lone Kuba jogging a solitary path left Glenn momentarily disconcerted; had Glenn briefly nodded off giving a mischievous guest the opportunity to slip Free Fall into the DVD player. Nope, just another similar scene highlighting Kuba's increasingly oppressive isolation.

Rounding the turn and heading into the homestretch, poor Michal is only briefly introduced al-

NEW ON DUD the last Match (La Partida) & Floating Skyscrapers (Plynace wiezowce) By Glenn Bishop though he's on time and evidently all in for the

now obligatory lube-less butt-fuck scene.

At the very least visually, The Last Match and Floating Skyscrapers could not offer a starker contrast. Floating Skyscrapers is all cool, muted colors; grey dominates, with an assortment of expansive urban spaces invariably devoid of any life. If Ang Lee (or more rightfully Annie Proulx) provided the narrative inspiration, then perhaps it is Tom Ford's stunning, heavily stylized A Single Man influencing director Tomasz Wasilewski and cinematographer Jakub Kijowski.

Alternatively, **The Last Match** is alive with bright colors with scene after scene almost radiating heat and humidity. Streets are shown filled with people and bustling with activity.

The two toothsome, shirtless lads from the DVD box cover are Reinier (Reinier Diaz) and Yosvani (Milton Garcia), two friends living in the slums of Havana. Most days are spent playing pick-up games of soccer with other similarly unemployed local lads. In fact, Yosvani is employed although hopelessly miscast as a strong-arm man for his soon to be father-in-law Silvano (Luis Alberto García, suitably menacing), a dodgy pawnbroker and black marketeer.

Theirs is a community best characterized as one of hopeless dreams, staggering poverty and inevitable desperation. Reinier dreams of buying a motorcycle, not a wimpy one like Yosvani's but a powerful Suzuki which would allow him to outrace even the cops. Alternatively, Yosvani imagines a time when he and Rei might be together.

Reinier boasts a wife, an infant son and a shrew of a mother-in-law but no job. When really broke, Reinier takes to a bit of "out and around" or in plainer terms, prostitution. Somehow, he's not a "fag" despite his nocturnal activities presumably because he's getting paid and, of course, by refusing to bottom.

Juan (Toni Cantó), an amiable tourist from Barcelona becomes something more than a simple hook up. Indeed, Rei even thinks to take Juan home to meet the family.

"Yikes!" exclaimed Glenn.

The way Teresa (Mirta Ibarra) dotes on Juan is truly grotesque, first plying Juan with her "delicious croquettes" and later flattering him shamelessly, "You remind me if some count or marquis." In fact, Teresa is merely pimping her son-in-law out, hop-

ing the middle-aged tourist will take Rei back home with him to Spain, to first marry him and then sending for the rest of them.

Right from the start it is clear that Yosvani's heart isn't in having sex with fiancé Gema

Watch it, DVR it, or forget it...

Even as many of those in Glenn's familiar cinematic circle increasingly grumble about films with subtitles, there is the reward here of an intriguing double feature of films which explore parts of the world where there remains deep-seated homophobia and religious oppression which continue to make it difficult for gay youth to be honest with themselves and with their families.

Cuba is the setting for The Last Match, where notions of masculinity further complicate the emerging relationship between Rei and Yosvani. The conservatism of Poland is rendered in Floating Skyscrapers with such a somber palette that tragedy will surely be unavoidable.

Indeed, both The Last Match and Floating Skyscrapers, offer highly authentic portrayals of love affairs between two young men. Unfortunately, once brought together, the taunt narratives which characterize both films hastily spiral into a melodrama that is as unsatisfying as it is unexpected.

Not, perhaps a double feature for all LGBT moviegoers and occasions, Tomasz Wasilewski's Floating Skyscrapers and Antonio Hens' The Last Match are definitely worthy dramas and both well worth the price of admission.

"I have never been this excited about a record," explains an enthusiastic Jason Walker from his home in New York City. When Bill Coleman suggested I cover it, I was all for it."

"Jason Walker's diva vocals are among the best in NYC," says Bill Coleman, president of the dance music label, Peace Bisquit. "We have talked about collaborating on something for years and when this project came about, I knew the time was now."

Jason Walker grew up in Pittsburgh, singing in blues bands and his church choir. He hit the national spotlight with a winning performance on TV's It's Show Time at the Apollo. Soon afterward, he was signed to JVM Records, a label headed by dance music icon Junior Vasquez. Over the next five years, Walker released two albums, "This Is My Life" and "Flexible". Initial dance floor response has been extraordinary. ""I played the song on new years in Australia and the crowd went nuts," exclaims Dagger. "It's a pure sing along anthem!"

His partner, Marc JB agrees, "It gets the dance floor goin' crazy. We love Jason Walker. It was a pleasure working on his amazing vocal."

DJ Grind, one of the most sought-after upand-coming DJs on the gay circuit, is also praising the track. He premiered his mix at White Party in Miami and at his Mardi Gras New Orleans event, as well as on his podcast show.

"Sometimes the stars just align on a project and everything works out," says Coleman. "We couldn't be more pleased than with Jason and Bimbo's inspired take of Tell It To My Heart. The timeless song gets a modern update by the only guy on the planet who could not only sing it, but do it justice by making it all his own."



BARBARA Q BBQ CHICKEN DIP

Thank you Miss Barbara for emailing me this finger-licking dip! What a great way to use leftover chicken and the slow cooker! Your free Bitchin' Kitchen T-shirt is on the way to your Brookfield home.

2 cups chopped/shredded cooked chicken 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, cubed 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese 1 cup ranch salad dressing 1/4 cup chopped cilantro 1/4 cup chopped green onion 1 tablespoon garlic powder 1/2 cup prepared barbecue sauce Crackers, celery sticks or pita bread wedges

Spritz a slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. In a large bowl, combine the first eight ingredients; pour into slow cooker. 

Art in skin needs to be somewhat rudimentary to prevent color bleed and increase the longevity of the tattoo. So much detail gets lost in the healing process and the ravages of time.

Basically what I'm saying is this. All those tattoos you are seeing that look almost like a photo? They will never last unless they are really big pieces. All those artists showing how small and intricate they can make their tattoos, in 5 years it will probably look like a blob. All this artists whose colors look so bright it's almost like they were drawn on, usually they are enhanced with a photo program from the App Store for \$1.99.

So make sure you investigate your artist thoroughly, look at HEALED versions of their work, check everything you can about them! Tattoos are after all permanent!


