### TRIXIE, TRIXIE, TRIXIE

In case you live under a rock, or under a bridge, as the case may be, you might not know Wisconsin's new international TV celebrity, Trixie Mattel. Based on the name, you may have gathered Trixie isn't a Green Bay Packer, although she may at times wear similarly form fitting tights and shoulder pads. Trixie is a drag star and now one of a select cast of queens on the upcoming 7th season of *RuPaul's Drag Race* on LOGO TV.

Trixie, aka Brian Firkus, hails from a small town up north (really up north). Making his way to Milwaukee, he graduated UWM in Theater Arts. A singer/songwriter and professional make-up artist, he began his drag career performing during midnight screenings of *The Rocky Horror Picture Show*. From there, Firkus developed his drag persona, Trixie Mattel. A new generation drag queen, Trixie explores glamorous boy/girl gender ambiguity rather than traditional torch song female impersonation. With her unique style, ambition, and pure, unadulterated talent her career instantly took on an instant upward trajectory. Soon Trixie was the toast of the Midwest's drag circuit, playing the club scene from Madison and Milwaukee to Chicago. His unblended brand of drag became a cause.

Then the rumors started. It seems in the drag-blogosphere, the sudden social media absence of a high profile drag queen like Trixie can mean only one thing (aside from her demise). And that one thing is every drag queen's dream: a place on *RuPaul's Drag Race*. Trixie's absence was duly noted and the speculation began. But Trixie remained mum. That only fueled the fire of the ever churning rumor mill. Queens in the know were under a gagorder (the other kind of gag-order...the hush-hush kind) Then, appropriately enough, on Sunday, December 7th, Pearl Harbor Day, *RuPaul's Drag Race* announced the cast for its 7th season. Some hopes were indeed torpedoed. But Trixie made the cut. For Trixie, it was a day which will live in Fame.

Now for those unfamiliar, RuPaul's Drag Race is like Monday night foot-


ball for gays. It's the cultural phenomenon of drag taken from its gritty roots and raised to high entertainment. The format is like any other reality show. A season's cast is selected from thousands of video auditions. Mercifully, unlike American Idol, we don't get to see the fails. And, instead of being dropped on a desert island with a bag of rice and a silly headband (although that could be a fun drag challenge), the cast is flown to Los Angeles. Like the other reality shows, the contestants face challenges to push the limits of their talents. But, unlike those single skill competitions like singing or cooking, Drag Race demands much, much more. Drag, as an art, combines multiple disciplines - make- up artist, costume designer, actor, singer, dancer, comic writer, stand-up comedian, and fashion model. That range is put to the test with the varied challenges the contestants must face. It could be a high fashion photo shoot in a dunk tank or producing a video spot pitching RuPaul's make-up line. A panel of professional judges critiques each. Failure to perform to perfection results in elimination. Of course, in case of tie losers, there's a fall back to the classic drag "Lip-synch for your Life" challenge.

For Trixie Mattel and her competition, there's a lot at stake. Just being a contestant brings national recognition. There's the big cash prize for the winner, of course. Beyond that, winning practically guarantees fame and fortune with all the trimmings from product endorsements to film roles.

Trixie has the talent, the poise and the personality to be the next Drag Super Star. Con-Drag-ulations and Best of Luck, Trixie!

#### **THE OBLIGATORY LOOK BACK AT 2014**

Happy New Year! A bit belatedly, but I hope the new year, 2015, brings you, yours and the LGBT community all the happiness and success of the last.

2014 was indeed a rainbow banner year. Despite the polar vortex and all the drudgery of a typical Wisconsin winter, spring sprang with inklings of an impending Federal court decision on marriage equality. Then, late one Friday afternoon in June, just an hour before PrideFest's opening ceremony, the news broke: Wisconsin's state constitutional amendment banning same-sex marriage was struck down! As it happened, the American Civil Liberties Union's director, Chris Ahmuty, was on the dais for PrideFest's opening ceremony to accept the PrideFest Medal. The ACLU received the award for its support of the LGBT community and, especially, for its work in the pursuit of marriage equality. Within a week, 500 hundred LGBT couples tied the knot. Then, our Governor Walker objected and the State Attorney General van Hollen appealed. Not only did it stop future marriages but it also put those that had already happened in a legal limbo. Another Federal court decision in favor was also appealed. Finally, in October, the Supreme Court decided it wouldn't hear the appeal. Wisconsin finally had achieved marriage equality and the wedding bells rang again, this time for sure. By then, in anticipation, QUEST had already published its special wedding edition. Then, a month after the SCOTUS decision, the Wisconsin LGBT Chamber of Commerce held the state's first LGBT Wedding Expo. The Milwaukee event showcased over 50 wedding industry vendors.

There were other major moments in 2014. Milwaukee PrideFest enjoyed a record breaking attendance of over 31,000 visitors. It also became a 503(c)3 charitable organization and expanded its board to include three new members. Among them is the first trans-woman to sit on its board, Jessica Baker.

Several Wisconsin volunteer organizations made local and national headlines in 2014. The North American Gay Amateur Athletes Alliance (NA-GAAA) elevated Brian Reinkober, Saturday Softball Beer League commissioner, into its prestigious Hall of Fame. In July, the Milwaukee's Black and White Men Together affiliate hosted that organiza-

tion's national convention. A dozen BWMT chapters convened here to hold seminars and enjoy the city's LGBT hospitality.

The LGBT Film/Video Festival returned to its traditional 11 consecutive day format, running eleven consecutive days. SAGE, Seniors in a Gay Environment, became a program of the LGBT Community Center. It also hired a new director, Scott Miller. Under its new president Bim Florek, GAMMA, Milwaukee's oldest LGBT social and recreational organization, expanded its programming and raised membership by a third, from 100 to over 135.

2014 was also a landmark anniversary year for many of the region's LGBT organizations. Brady Street East STD Clinic (BestD) and the Green Bay based Argonauts Motorcycle Club each celebrated 40<sup>th</sup> year anniversaries. FORGE, a Milwaukee based organization that advocates and educates for transgender rights, marked its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary..

Trixie Mattel, of course, made Wisconsin history as the Dairy State's first cast member on RuPaul's Drag Race.

It was a very good year indeed.

#### **Little Red Ribbons**

The Christmas decorations in the bar are always a well-kept secret. Each year on the day after Thanksgiving, the "regulars" rush to Rascals in Appleton to see what Todd has come up with this year. There is no point in trying to guess the theme for the year because the decorations have included everything from decorated wreaths, flocked branches with black lights creating a feeling of a winter evening, to a mannequin who's dress was decorated like a Christmas tree — and she even spun around on the stage.

One thing that isn't a well-kept secret at Rascals is the small Christmas tree that can be found standing next to the cash register at Rascals each year during the weeks leading up to Christmas. The tree is decorated with little red ribbons and brings Christmas joy to as many as 50 children each year thanks to the patrons of the bar.

Todd West, owner of Rascals in Appleton, started

the "Little Rascals Gift Project" in 2001 in association with the Appleton and Green Bay offices of the AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin (ARCW). Each year, Todd receives a list of names of children that are in some way affected by HIV or AIDS from ARCW. Every year, the "Little Rascals Gift Project" helps to ensure families who are under the financial burden of the costs of medication and treatment for HIV or AIDS are still able to provide Christmas gifts for their families – with a little help from the community. "It took a little organizing in the beginning," said Todd, "but now it has just become part of my Christmas routine each year." Patrick Krol, who has worked at Rascals since the project started, has noticed that it's become part of the customer's Christmas routine as well. "Each year, there are many of the same names on the list, but there are always a few new names there. too. It nice to see so many customers get involved," Patrick said.

Due to patient confidentiality requirements, ARCW is only able to provide the first names of

the children that are in need. Each red ribbon on the small Christmas tree at Rascals has the first name, age and gender of the child in which you are purchasing a gift for. You are asked to purchase gifts with a minimum value of \$25, wrap the gift and attach the red ribbon with the child's information to the gift. "I ask that the gifts be returned to the bar early so I can get them to ARCW in Green Bay early enough so each case worker can get them to the family before Christmas," Todd said. "This way, the family can choose to use the 'Little Rascal' gifts as a Santa gift for young kids if they want to."

With all the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, it's sometime easy to forget those that are under the tremendous stress of trying to stay healthy and provide a joyful time for their family. The "Little Rascal Gift Project" had another successful year in 2014! It is one way that Rascals in Appleton, with the help of their customers, is doing their part to help make Christmas a happy time for everyone in our community.

# On Second Thought...

NEW ON DVD BOYS (Jongens) By Glenn Bishop



Before screening Mischa Kamp's Boys, Glenn challenged members of the monthly cinema circle (and knitting bee) to list their favorite coming out films. Certain films, Beautiful Thing, Latter Days, and Edge of Seventeen, would find their way to many of the lists, Glenn felt sure. Might people remember such extraordinary films as André Téchiné's enchanting Wild Reeds, Marco Kreuzpaintner's Summer Storm, and Eytan Fox's deeply poignant Yossi & Jagger?

As it turns out, the film dominating discussion proved to be Ang Lee's **Brokeback Mountain**, a film curiously back in the news thanks to Annie Proulx extraordinary claim: "I wish I'd never written the story. It's just been the cause of hassle and problems and irritation since the film came out."

"Shameless hussy," Glenn giving voice to what many surely thought!

The potent influence of Proulx's original short story and subsequent Best Picture Oscar-nominated Ang Lee film can be seen in several recent film releases, none more so perhaps than Stephan Lacant's Free Fall (Freier Fall) which has been touted as "Germany's answer to Brokeback Mountain."

If such a claim can be made of **Free Fall**, then, too, Tomasz Woszczynski's somber, sexually explicit **Floating Skyscrapers** might well be touted as "Poland's answer to **Brokeback Mountain**." And indeed, a similar claim might well be made of Antonio Hens' Cuba-set **The Last Match**.

Fortunately, no such claim can be made of Mischa Kamp's **Boys**, an evocative made-for-TV movie from the Netherlands.

Sieger (Gijs Blom), a young runner, is at the center of the narrative. As the film opens, Sieger and his best mate Stef (Stijn Taverne) have just recorded the fastest two sprint times and are duly promoted to the track team's relay squad, a distinct honor. Almost immediately Stef's confidence swells, giving him the courage to chat up a couple of girls. A bemused Sieger remains in the background, bashful and looking none too comfortable with the proceedings.

One begins to sense that Sieger actually prefers to remain on the outside. This is especially true with regard to his tumultuous home life where Sieger often finds himself in the role of buffer between his rebellious older brother Eddy

(Jonas Smulders) and his often exasperated father. One the one hand, older brother Eddy expects Sieger to keep his many secrets. On the other, Sieger feels duty bound to placate his father. In this role, Sieger plans a Father's Day surprise. Yet, even as turbulent as is the relationship between Eddy and his father, their relationship nevertheless is one which leaves Sieger, another in a long and illustrious line of "best little boys in the world" still on the outside looking in.

The promotion to the relay team brings about changes in Sieger's life. Sieger can, for example, see how proud his father is of his accomplishment.

More importantly, Sieger now finds that he's spending more time with another runner, Marc (Ko Zandvliet). Marc is something of a free spirit and unlike Sieger, Marc is completely comfortable with his sexuality. Unwilling to play it safe, Marc is crazy enough to ride his bike right into the local swimming hole, fully clothed. Later, after their teammates head off for home, Marc convinces Sieger to stay longer. The two lads spend the rest of the afternoon frolicking in the water and out; they even share their first kiss. It is difficult to imagine a more idyllic afternoon, at least until Sieger bisses.

least until Sieger hisses, "I'm not gay."

And from this moment, Sieger finds himself increasingly drawn in opposite directions.

Over the years, it is easy to imagine, Sieger and Stef riding their bikes across the gorgeous countryside, not a care in the world. Only now, spending time with Stef actually means spending time with Jessica (Lotte

Set within the cozy confines of the liberal Netherlands, it is to be expected that **Boys** lacks the onerous homophobia one encounters in the previously noted **Free Fall** and **The Last Match**. Similarly, **Boys** manages to avoid the dreaded **ABC Afterschool Special** earnestness which plague so many American offerings. The disappointing cinematic adaptation of Brent Hartinger's **Geography Club**, comes quickly to mind.

Belying its humble made-for-TV origins, **Boys** boasts striking visuals from cinematographer Melle van Essen, which lends the narrative a timeless quality even as the obligatory racing sequences are given an appealing dramatic flair.

Best of all are the performances of Gijs Blom (Sieger) and Ko Zandvliet (Marc). The growing relationship between Sieger, who has long settled for what was safe, and Marc, a little older and more confident thanks to his supportive family, is beautifully crafted and proving to be immediately compelling; the chemistry between the two young actors undeniable.

Reminiscent of **Beautiful Thing** and **Summer Storm**, director Mischa Kamp's **Boys** proves a gentle story of first love, one which went down rather well with Glenn's cinematic circle. Glenn offers **Boys** an enthusiastic thumbs-up.

#### **BACON-STUFFED CINNAMON ROLLS**

Yes—you read that correctly. Bacon...stuffed...cinnamon rolls. Holly balls! If you've never baked anything before, this is a great place to start. Two ingredients, a sweet-savory combo and bacon! These are ideal for lazy Sunday mornings, brunch donations or treating last-night's trick! Did I mention...BACON?!

### 5 bacon strips 1 (17.5 ounce) tube Jumbo Cinnamon Rolls with Icing

Prepare bacon strips according to package directions just until cooked. Drain on paper towels. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Remove packaged icing and set aside. Slice cinnamon roll dough into five rolls (if not already pre-sliced). Carefully unroll a cinnamon roll and top with a slice of bacon. Re-roll. Repeat with remaining cinnamon rolls and bacon. Set rolls on a

baking sheet spritzed with cooking spray or covered with parchment paper. Bake at 350 degrees for 18 to 20 minutes. Drizzle with icing. Refrigerate leftovers.

#### **Ruthie's Culinary Clues**

Be sure to purchase the cinnamon rolls that come in a tube, and not those that come frozen in a pan. You can try preparing this recipe without cooking the bacon first. Just be sure the bacon is sliced thin and is cooked through via the oven before serving the rolls. These cinnamon treats are actually better the next day. Simply reheat in the microwave for a minute or two.

#### **SLOW-COOKED CHEESY NOODLES**

A stick-to-your-ribs combo of mac 'n cheese and buttered noodles this easy slow-cooker sensation is sure to become your new favorite. This recipe serves a lot, so it's perfect for trailer-park potlucks, redneck weddings and trashy barbecues, but it's also a great way to warm up during a chilly night at home.

1 (16 ounce) box of elbow pasta
4 eggs
1-1/2 cups heavy whipping cream
1 (12 ounce) can evaporated milk
1/2 cup butter, melted
Dash hot sauce, if desired
1-1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
4 cups shredded cheddar cheese



Prepare pasta per package directions; drain. Lightly beat the eggs in a very large bowl. Stir in the cream, evaporated milk, butter, hot sauce if desired, salt and pepper. Stir in 3 cups cheese and cooked pasta.

Spritz a 6-quart slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Add pasta mixture. Top with remaining 1 cup cheese. Cover and cook on high for 3 hours. Switch to low and cook an additional hour. Refrigerate leftovers.

#### **Ruthie's Culinary Clues**

This dish has a browned, chewy crust around the edges and a soft buttery center. Yum! There are 4 cups of shredded cheese in this sucker! Feel free to mix things up and use a few different varieties if you'd like. Toss in a handful of cooked and cubed ham, chicken or turkey for a heartier dish.

#### **PULL-APART PIZZA LOAF**

This appetizer comes from Jeff and Tony of Jackson, and it friggin' rocks! Featuring lots of melted cheese, pepperoni and a golden crust, it comes together in minutes. Jeff and Tony bake the cheesy bread in a bundt pan for easy flair but you could bake it in a 13x9-inch baking dish, too. What a great party pleaser! Thanks for sharing the recipe guys.

2 (16 ounce) cans of Jumbo Buttermilk Biscuits
1 (5 ounce) package sliced pepperoni
1/3 cup olive oil
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
2 cups shredded Mozzarella cheese
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
2 tablespoons Italian seasoning
1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
Pizza or spaghetti sauce

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Separate biscuits and cut into quarters. Cut the pepperoni slices into halves. In a large bowl, combine the biscuits, pepperoni and oil. Stir in green pepper, Mozzarella cheese, garlic powder, Italian seasoning and Parmesan cheese. Set mixture into a bundt pan, fluted tube pan or 13x9-inch baking dish heavily coated with nonstick cooking spray.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 minutes or until the top is golden brown. If baking in a bundt pan or tube pan, invert warm loaf onto a serving plate. Serve warm with sauce for dipping. Refrigerate leftovers.

#### **Ruthie's Culinary Clues**

This loaf is best served straight from the oven. If baking in a bundt/tube pan, you may need to run a butter knife around the edge of the pan to loosen the loaf a bit. You can use grated Parmesan cheese with great results, but the final loaf may not be quite as cheesy. Don't like green peppers? Leave 'em out? Like sliced black olives or chopped onion on your pizza? Add them to the recipe. This makes a wonderful appetizer, but you can serve it alongside salad and/or soup for a kick-ass meal.


