Cuffed An interview with Milwaukee gay romance novelist Jermel Wilder By Paul Masterson

Perhaps you were lucky enough to meet 30 year old author Jermel Wilder at his Milwaukee Pride-Fest booth back in June. He was there promoting his latest book, a gay romance novel entitled *Cuffed*. Hopefully, you picked up a copy – it's a great summer read.

For locals, Wilder's wild and erotic ride in the 'hood may take them into familiar territory although probably in unfamiliar circumstances. His romance setting is Milwaukee, of course, but the setting is unique. His protagonist, Kwame King, is a black gay Milwaukee cop. His love interest is Braz Galarza, a drug dealer. "Boy meets boy. Cop meets crook." as the book's trailer goes. And Wilder, following the novelist's mantra "write what you know,' is doing precisely that. He's a gay black cop and the Milwaukee streets are his beat.

The title *Cuffed* is an appropriate double-entendre, of course. Beyond the reference to police restraints, *cuffed* is also urban for "inescapably involved", as in lovers.

QUEST spoke with Wilder about both his career in blue and his calling to write.

QUEST: First let me ask you what is probably on most readers' minds. How did you become a cop?

Jermel Wilder: It wasn't a dream. But I became a police aide when after I graduated Rufus King High School. It guaranteed a spot in the police academy. I never had a passion to be a cop. But, I am a bit of a super hero geek so it fit me well. I started when I was 21. Now I love it. I'm also a mentor for innercity kids and spark their interest n law enforcement. QUEST: Are there many LGBTs in the Milwaukee Police Department?

JW: There are other gay and lesbian cops. I am out although I'm not sure my colleagues how familiar they are that I'm a writer. Actually, I meet coworkers at PrideFest. A lot more people probably know than I can imagine right now.

QUEST: Is there an official outreach to the community?

JW: There's no official recruiting but the department is working on its relationship with the LGBT community. For example, MPD has in service courses about sensitivity towards transgender people and how to interact with them. The department is aware of the trans community stepping out more proudly. QUEST: How did you become an author?



JW: I've been writing since 2nd grade. I wrote stories in my notebook and included classmates to get them to read it. I'm a Pisces and love to tell stories and have a huge imagination. It allows me to escape reality and but create one as well. It's bringing thing to life. I wrote a novel in 2013, Season Sistahs. It was sort of Sex in the City style. Cuffed came out this year. I should also credit and thank my inner circle of friends for sparking my imagination and my family for their support and nurturing.

QUEST: How did Cuffed come about?

JW: It's funny; I haven't read a lot of gay romance. I read general literature. So when it comes to writing overall I never wrote a love story. I was torn about writing a mystery. I'm a big note taker and always putting ideas on paper. My mind just goes and goes, especially at night. When I write, I have to build an outline. That's how it came together. People love love and I wanted to make it a love story QUEST: Okay, you're a gay, black cop writing about love between a gay black cop and a gay black drug dealer. That's also a little out the norm for the genre. Are you writing for a black audience?

JW: No, not specifically. My audience is the gay reader generally. Women are a big part of my audience.

QUEST: And the story line?

JW: The idea evolved from a real work experience. If a criminal gets injured, he goes to a hospital and is accompanied by a police officer at all times until he's transferred to prison. Usually the process is strictly official.

I had a situation where I was a hospital guard. I was having a conversation with the man and he was telling me his life story. It dawned on me everyone has a story. People pretty much see a criminal as a criminal and a cop as a cop. I took our conversation and turned it into a love story. To show we are people too. We have a past and a present. It explores the mind of the people involved.

QUEST: And from there your story unfolds... action, love and sex ensue. It's definitely a page turner. I won't reveal more of the plot but you blur the lines between moral boundaries. In Kwame and Braz's world, right and wrong are fluid.

JW: Everyone is turned on by something forbidden. That's what this is. I wanted to go beyond the typical. The characters know who they are and have to cross moral lines by dealing with each other. When it comes to love there are uncertainties.

QUEST: You also self-published. That adds a

lot of demands and costs. How did you go about that?

JW: Yes, I self published. It involved lots of steps. There's a lot of trial and error learning the business side. I took a 4 week course internet course with the Bestsellers Project that teaches the business of self-publishing. It taught me a lot. Costs all come out of pocket, And yes, it can be expensive: I had to find an editor, cover artist and models for promos. I did video trailers, set up a website and created a payment system for customers. Printing was a major part of the cost. I do marketing through social media.

QUEST: You were also at PrideFest promoting *Cuffed*. In fact, that's how I found out about you and your book.

JW: I did really well at PrideFest. I was surprised. It was definitely something I'd consider doing again in Milwaukee or at any Pride event. I'd recommend to anyone no matter what their business.

QUEST: So how does one get their own copy of *Cuffed*?

JW: It's available through my website, jrwilder.com, on Kindle through amazon.com and at **Outwords Books** in Milwaukee. I'm hoping to do a reading at Outwords, too.



GAY RUGBY 101 - The Milwaukee Beer Barons Rugby Club makes its Debut

On Saturday, August 5 from 2-7 pm the newly formed Milwaukee Beer Barons Rugby Club hosts its inaugural event, a Rugby 101 Tutorial at Wilson Park, 1601 West Howard Avenue in Milwaukee. A Beer Bash and Shenanigans follows at Woody's Bar.

Rugby 101 promises to teach participants how to ruck, scrum, lineout and the basic plays of rugby. The to-hour class is open to all (including all the letters in the LGBTQ community and beyond) regardless of body size or fitness level and no previous experience in organized sports is required. Those attending are asked to wear basic gym clothes – shorts and t-shirt – and to bring water and sunscreen.

The Beer Bash and Shenanigans at Woody's will provide the opportunity to hang out and talk to experienced rugby players from Chicago and Madison.

This newest expansion of LGBTQ athletics in Milwaukee is the result of efforts by a small cadre of rugby enthusiasts. Jacob Wingert, one of the organizers, is a 4 year veteran of the sport. Having played with the Madison Minotaurs, the state's only other gay rugby club, he'll provide the expertise and, with the other members of MBBRC, organizational talent.

"The idea is to do something new and unique.

We are talking to MGSN and SSBL for support and advice and to share resources. After the 101 we'll form a board for the team and organize a committee and get people to play an active role in the organization. We'll get a jersey design and a team crest. It will be a lot of effort and hopefully people will stp up and have fun with it," Winger said. MBBRC will elect a board modeled after the Minotaurs. The initial focus will be on attracting sponsors, fundraisers, and looking for a winter training space. "The idea is for people to discover a new hobby. The motivation to get in shape, meet people, and socialize, The enthusiasm is there to start playing in the spring. I feel that's realistic given the responses," Wingert said.

The Milwaukee Beer Barons Rugby Club will become the second gay rugby club in Wisconsin. The first, Madison Minotaurs has just celebrated its 10th anniversary. A social rugby club, it plays recreationally rather than competitively. The friendly matches are played for bragging rights and having fun. The team is part of the International Gay Rugby League (IGR), the organization formed to promote all inclusive rugby clubs worldwide. Currently there are over 80 clubs worldwide. "We're going to join IGR once we're a team", Wingert said.

"Retake" By Glenn Bishop



In July the gentlemen who compose the monthly cinema circle, normally a group which takes great comfort in keeping strictly to orderly routines, chose instead an outing to see a screening of the Broadway hit, **Falsettos**.

Eschewing any of the run-of-the-mill Marcus multiplexes, the decision was made to venture forth to Bay View and the fabulously restored Avalon Theater. Under the Avalon's night sky motif of blinking, star-like lights, Glenn and his confederates happily munched thin crust pizza and assorted appetizers whilst watching the acclaimed Broadway production.

Now, if only the Avalon Theater could always be at the disposal for Glenn and the monthly cinema circle.

Despite this delightful change of pace outing, Glenn and a smaller, more informal group chose a second July movie night and selected **Retake**, the debut film from Nick Corporon, best known, perhaps, for his short film, **Barbie Boy**.

Jonathan (Tuc Watkins), a straight-laced, buttoned-up kind of guy, is preparing for a trip. As if illuminating the relevant clues in a murder mystery prior to the murderer being unveiled, cinematographer Collin Brazie's camera is meticulous in capturing each item Jonathan packs into his suitcase.

Once he arrives in San Francisco, **Retake** takes on a noir-esque feel as Jonathan heads out to where the working boys display their wares. As he coolly eyes up the talent available it is evident that this isn't Jonathan's first time at the rodeo.

Jonathan sizes up a shaggy, dark-haired lad but before the transaction can happen, another rather scruffy hustler takes the initiative and jumps into the front seat. Despite a decided lack of enthusiasm, Jonathan acquiesces as he and Scotty (Kit Williamson) drive off to Jonathan's hotel.

Scotty's expectations are simple and he's rather put-out when Jonathan asks him to put on some cologne that he has brought. Glenn immediately

There is something marvelously fresh and original about director Nick Corporon's debut feature film, **Retake**. Sure, there are plenty of films about gay male hustlers and especially some fabulous road trip films, from **Adventures of Priscilla**, **Queen of the Desert** and **My Own Private Idaho** to such essential lesbian films as **Cloudburst** and the acclaimed. **Carol**.

Nick Corporon's screenplay for **Retake** opens with a nice film noir feel. Tuc Watkins' taciturn Jonathan fuels the sense of danger by heading off to the seedy hangout for San Francisco's male hustlers, rather than simply turning to the internet's seemingly infinite options for hiring an escort.

Corporon then adds a degree of creepiness to the story as Jonathan adds props for the lads role playing 'Brandon,' the cologne and the wig. Jonathan insists that Adam wear the clothes he puts out every morning; presumably these are clothes from the real Brandon.

As their journey progresses, Adam can't help but start to put the pieces together and in the process might be falling for Jonathan. Indeed, there is real chemistry between Graye's Adam and Watkins' Jonathan, their relationship having increasingly blurred their initial roles as hustler and client.

Overall, Glenn and the gentlemen of the monthly cinema circle found much to like in **Retake**'s bittersweet tale of love, of grief and loss.

guessed the expected response, "Is there something wrong with the way I smell?"

Still, it is Jonathan's dime and Scotty complies. Scotty even submits to wearing the brunette wig that Jonathan has also brought along. Jonathan has hired Scotty for sex, granted, but with a bit of role play, where Scotty is to take on the persona of 'Brandon,' a young man, who is, according to Jonathan, "a bit temperamental and rough around the edges." Yet, despite the cologne and the ridiculous wig, the encounter with Scotty just doesn't work and Jonathan coldly dispatches the lad.

Is it later that night, or perhaps the next and Jonathan is back on the prowl. This time the shaggy, dark-haired lad hops into the front seat. As he and Jonathan drive off, Adam (Devon Graye) as we will eventually learn to be his name, takes a moment to size up his client. He guesses, correctly, that Jonathan isn't going to be like his usual tricks, "I feel that you require something more intricate."

Unlike Scotty, Adam is willing to role play and to take on the persona of 'Brandon.'

The encounter goes well; Jonathan even manages not to pull off Adam's wig whilst having his way with the lad, for surely that must be a wig thought Glenn.

Come next morning Jonathan has a proposition, that Adam, as 'Brandon,' will accompany Jonathan on a road trip to the Grand Canyon. Adam will be well compensated, yes, but will be subject to certain rules.

'Brandon' will not ask Jonathan any personal questions. 'Brandon' will be willing to pose for "Polaroid" moments which happen at various, often quite random times. In general, 'Brandon' will do whatever Jonathan tells him to do.

Adam agrees and the two set off on their road trip. As 'Brandon,' Adam is certainly game, taking time to question Jonathan for details about the young man he is impersonating, learning Brandon's favorite movie, book and non-alcoholic beverage. Yet as willing as he is to go along with the role play, Adam increasingly chafes under all of Jonathan's rules.

As their journey continues, even Glenn's guessed that the real Brandon was the love of Jonathan's life but what happened to him? And what awaits Adam when they reach their destination, the Grand Canvon?






Speaking of Palm Springs – Bob (M&M Club) Schmidt breezed into town for family reasons and I had an enjoyable time with him – as always reminiscing.
