Applicants must also meet the following monthly household income guidelines: one person, \$1,696; two person, \$1,938; three persons, \$2,179; four person, \$2,421. Add \$242 per month for household exceeding four persons.

The purpose of the home security installation program is to train 10 people previously unemployed so that they can gain placement in private sector jobs.

## Gourmet Alley

### TURKEY-SPAGHETTI BAKE

4 ounces spaghetti / 3 slices cubed bacon / half cup chopped onion / 1 clove minced garlic / 3 tbsps flour / one 16oz can cut tomatoes / one 10oz can cream of mushroom soup / half cup milk / 1 cup shredded American cheese / 2 cups cubed cooked turkey / one 10oz pac frozen peas (thawed) and 1/4 cup grated Parmesan.

Break spaghetti pieces in half, cook, drain thoroughly, should be about 2 cups. In large saucepan cook bacon, onion and garlic till bacon is crisp; blend in the flour. Add undrained tomatoes, mushroom soup and milk. Stir till thick and bubbly.

Add shredded American cheese; stir till melted. Stir in spaghetti, cubed turkey and thawed peas. Turn into 2 1/2 quart casserole, top with the Parmesan. Bake uncovered, 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

### TURKEY-BROCCOLI BAKE

Two 10oz pacs frozen broccoli / 1 tbspn lemon juice / 2 tbsps butter / 2 tbsps flour / half tpsn salt / two cups milk /

half cup shredded Swiss cheese / two cups cubed cooked turkey / 3/4 cup soft bread crumbs / 1/4 cup Parmesan, grated / 1 tbspn melted butter.

Cook broccoli to package directions, drain thoroughly, place in round 8x1 1/2" baking dish. Sprinkle with lemon juice. In saucepan melt butter, blend flour and salt, add milk, stir till bubbly. Remove from heat, stir in Swiss cheese till melted, add turkey cubes. Spoon turkey mixture over broccoli, combine bread crumbs, Parmesan and the melted butter, sprinkle over casserole. Bake, uncovered, 350 degrees, 20 to 25 minutes.

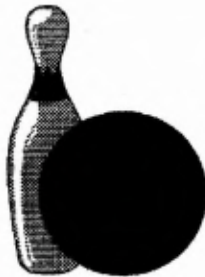
