TURKEY-SPAGHETTI BAKE

4 ounces spaghetti / 3 slices chapped bacon / half cup chopped onion / I clove mineed garlie / 3 thispns flour / one 16oz can cut tomatoes / one 10oz can cream of mushroom soup / half cup milk / 1 cup shredded American cheese / 2 cups cubed cooked turkey / one 10oz pac frozen peas (thawed) and 1/4 cup grated Parmesan.

Break spaghetti pieces in half, cook, drain thoroughly, should be about 2 cups. In large saucepan exxik bacon, onion and garlie till bacon is crisp; blend in the flour. Add undrained tomatoes, mushroom some and milk. Stir till thick and hubbly. Add shredded American cheese: stir till melted. Stir in spaghetti, cubed turkey and thawed peas. Turn into 2 1/2 quart casserole, top with the Parmesan. Bake uncovered. 350 degrees for 45 minuites.

TURKEY-BROCCOLI BAKE

Two 10oz pacs frozen broccoli / I thispn lemon juice / 2 tblspns butter / 2 tblspns flour / half term salt / two cups milk /

half cup shredded Swiss cheese / two curs cubed cooked turkey / 3/4 cup soft bread crumbs / 1/4 cup Parmessan, grated / 1 thispn melted butter.

Cook broccoli to package directions, drain thoroughly, place in round 8x1 1/2" beking dish. Sprinkle with lemon juice. In saucepan melt butter. blend flour and salt, add milk, stir till bubbly. Remove from heat, stir in Swiss cheese till melted, add turkey cubes. Spoon turkey mixture over broccoli, combine bread crumbs. Paunesan and the melted butter, sprinkle over casserole. Bake, utexwered. 350 degrees, 20 to 25 minutes.




