Consenting Adult

Wow, I predict this will be the Gay novel of Fall '75. Laura Z. Hobson has written a sensitive, insightful and touching novel about the mother of a Gay son who, at 17, writes her a letter telling her he is a homosexual. The letter is written in 1960 and the novel continues through her struggles with this revelation until, 13 years later, she greets him at her door with his lover. Through analysis, college, rejection of his home, medical school and a contrived involvment in the Stonewall riot of June 1969, the story is told from the mother's viewpoint. Her odyssey through these events is beautifully told, and delightful reading. I can't recall being able to appreciate individual paragraphs or description in a long while. Read this one slowly! There will be much discussion of the politics, etc. of this novel including a promised article in an upcoming Advocate. Consenting Adult, Laura Z. Hobson, Doubleday, 1975. 246 p. \$7.95 cloth bound.
