


ne of the big expenses of putting on a concert is the cost of the music which has to be purchased. The per-copy cost of the sheet music from which we study and prepare varies widely with the type and length of the piece [it can go as high as \$7.\$10]; however, an average price of \$2.50 per copy is roughly correct.

If you consider that the Cream City Chorus requires 50 copies of any song which we are preparing for performance, and that a performance contains approximately 25 songs, you begin to appreciate how much it costs to buy the music which we sing at a concert.







GALA Choruses is a non-profit, tax exempt corporation with offices at 4016 SW 57th Avenue, Portland, OR 97221.







