BOARD REPORT

Treasurer Steve Byers reported a balance sheet amounts of \$1848 in assets and \$1824 in liabilities, making the organization stable financially. Timely renewals and increased new membership is encouraged in order to meet upcoming financial obligations.

PR Chairman Steve Rademan reported publicity efforts for the upcoming AIDS Forum hosted by CCBA. Volunteers are needed to distribute posters and assist in publicizing the event. Various premium items are under consideration as publicity vehicles for the Association. We have cooperated with Series 9 by providing a welcoming card to all participants listing the CCBA Business Members.

Membership Chair David Koetz reported plans for a major new membership campaign to begin in October. Special emphasis will be on educating current members on the best techniques to attract new members to CCBA.

Development Coordinator Jerry Johnson reported on activities of the Outings group, and suggestions for upcoming educational programs.

Affiliated Organizations director Dave Wiggins reported on the success of the Investment Club and his ongoing involvement with the Cream City Association Foundation. In addition, CCBA's active involvement with the Milwaukee AIDS Project was reported.

Business Enhancement Committee Chairman Jim Manders reported that the Business Directory is on schedule, and suggested alternative plans to replace the Fall Business Bash. It was decided to allow the committee to create a specially focused business program for the October meeting.

President Marc Hauptert reported on his involvement with individuals working for broader support of AIDS projects in the community. Several new developments are in the works, and word about them will be coming shortly. Areas of concentration include focusing efforts of various

YOU AIN'T HEARD NOTHIN' YET!

In September, CCBA is replacing its traditional meeting with an event of major significance to our community—gay and straight: The Community AIDS Forum.

The Forum is hosted by CCBA, in cooperation with the Milwaukee AIDS Project and the Cream City Association Foundation.

The format for the Forum will be a panel of experts in the field, with ample time for questions and comments between presentations.

Included in the panel will be: Ann Guidici Fettner, Medical/Science reporter for the New York NATIVE Newspaper (which has had the most extensive national coverage of AIDS); Dr. Paul Turner of the Medical College of Wisconsin and the Milwaukee County Medical Complex; Susan Dietz, RN, Director of the Milwaukee AIDS Project; and Mark Behar, PA-C, AIDS Program Advisory Board of the US Conference of Mayors. The panel will be moderated by Joanne Williams, Medical Reporter for WITI television.

The honorary chairperson for the Forum is Karen Lamb, PhD, RN, of the Medical College of Wisconsin.

The Forum will begin at 7:00pm and end at 10:00pm. Doors will open at 6:00 for informal gathering. Light food and beverages will be sold before and during breaks in the program.

The Forum is being held on Thursday, September 12 in Memorial Hall of the War Memorial Center, 750 N. Lincoln Memorial Drive. Registration fee is \$3.00, payable in advance or at the door. Advance registration is encouraged by sending the fee to CCBA, P.O. Box 92614, Milwaukee, WI 53202 or calling 445-5552 before September 9.

All CCBA members and friends are encouraged to invite several friends to attend this important program. Information to be covered is unavailable elsewhere. Topics to be covered include: the latest findings about the syndrome and its treatments, local education and prevention efforts, and the worldwide prospects and problems in research.

The Community AIDS Forum is co-sponsored by various local gay-supportive and health organizations. Their cooperation in disseminating information about this program is deeply appreciated.

Recently we lost a good friend and strong member of this Association. Del Pascavis, amid headlines and questions, was interred on August 1, having been killed in his home the week before.

The sympathy and solace of the Board and membership of CCBA goes out to those who knew and loved Del. His energy and enthusiasm will live on in those of us fortunate enough to have known him. He was a staunch supporter of CCBA, and was a vital link to other important gay-supportive organizations with which we regularly deal. He will be missed. In the terms I referred to in last month's Newsletter, he really did "make a difference."

We as a community seem to be reminded of our mortality more and more frequently lately. Losing friends and acquaintances to violence and disease shocks the system, but out of our grief can come new strength and rededication.

Gay people have been presented with some of life's most difficult and insidious hurdles to success and happiness. We've tempered ourselves through years of hiding, intimidation and abuse. The process has strengthened us as a people and now we need to redouble our efforts to face yet other attacks.

AIDS has presented us with both tragedy and hope. Experiencing the strength and courage of people with AIDS

must surely move each of us to reach out and extend a hand of unity to our neighbors to fight this enemy. We must build upon and share in the strength that is evident around us.

Another distinguishing feature of our gay community is its humanity and compassion. Every ounce of that aspect of our lives must be exercised these days to respond to all the challenges around us.

The CCBA Board has gone on record as being strongly supportive of individuals and organizations providing education, prevention and services to people with AIDS. We strongly encourage all members and friends to give generously of their time and money to fight this syndrome.

In that regard, we are proud to be hosting one of the first large community meetings to educate people about all aspects of AIDS. Despite the condensed, repetitive material we see every day in the mainstream press, our community is sadly uneducated about AIDS. I encourage EVERY member of CCBA to attend this important event, and bring as many friends as you can contact. We have kept the registration fee very low, to allow people every opportunity to participate. Given the quality of the panel of presenters, this should be the most significant educational effort to date.

We CAN help save each other's lives by sharing this important information. Be there!
